




Exploring survival and redemption in Where the Wildflowers Grow

Leigh is the lone survivor of a prison transport bus crash. Fleeing her past and the police, she finds sanctuary on a rural Alabama flower farm. Leigh forms deep bonds with the men who live and work on the farm. They reveal their own traumas while Leigh reckons with secrets she's carried for years. With new life blooming around her, Leigh discovers she's not too broken to find peace. Acclaimed author and librarian Terah Shelton Harris portrays the healing power of storytelling in her new novel.

What does Leigh mean when she says, "Daddy had given me the tools to *survive* but he hadn't given me the tools to live." Leigh was raised in survival mode. Everything taught to her was geared toward being strong, how to endure suffering, suppressing her emotions, and how to keep going when things got hard. As Leigh says, "Living is a runon sentence-never-ending, a collection of experiences that strengthen you along the way." It's in those experiences on the Flower Farm that Leigh understands what that really means. She learns to be vulnerable and to experience connection. For the first time in her life, she feels safe enough to dream, to trust, and rest. Not just to survive, but to live.

How does living with other trauma survivors contribute to Leigh's sense of belonging?

Leigh survived by hiding her pain and believing no one would understand. Loneliness had become her armor and companion. But living with Jackson, Tibb, and Luke, hearing their stories and witnessing how they were healing, helped her feel less alone.



Slowly, she began stitching herself back

together, not into the person she was before but someone softer, stronger, and no longer alone.

Why is it so important for Leigh and the other characters to tell their stories out loud?

For Leigh and the guys living on the Flower Farm, telling their stories out loud is an act of release. A way that they can reclaim their power. Leigh carried her pain in silence but speaking it out loud makes it real but also removes the weight of it. Releasing it means it's no longer theirs to carry alone. By saying it out loud, she can no longer pretend it didn't happen. It's a way of honoring and facing it.

How do meditation and yoga help Leigh "identify and face the pain?" Leigh spent so long in survival mode that she forgot what it meant to truly care for her mind and body. Through meditation, she uncovered something deep about herself that she had never considered. That realization cracked open the door to her healing. Yoga, too, was a way back into her body, a reminder that her body mattered.

How does connecting with nature help Leigh heal?

Nature doesn't ask anything of Leigh. It just is. Having her hands in dirt, walking barefoot, helps her slow down and teaches her to notice things again. She learns to listen, not just to the wind, but to herself. In that, she begins to soften and trust her place in the world again. That's what helps her begin to heal, what makes her feel, for the first time, rooted.

The novel features one of the famous quilts from Gee's Bend, Alabama. Have you been to the Airing of the Quilts Festival there? I've had the pleasure of attending the Airing of the Quilts Festival in Gee's Bend twice, once while researching for the book and again just because I fell in love with the area. The

quilts, originally made by formally enslaved residents, were created out of necessity, to stay warm during cold nights, using whatever materials they had on hand. And what an elegant way to solve a simple problem. They had no idea that their quilts would one day be celebrated as works of art and admired around the world.

What has been your favorite reader response to this book so far?

As writers, we spend so much time deep in the process, thinking, writing, and rewriting, with the hope that readers will connect with what we're trying to say. *Where the Wildflowers Grow* is about grief, trauma, and the slow, often messy work of unpacking both. So when readers "get" the book, when they see the heart of it, when they tell me they feel seen, or that it gave them language for something they've been carrying, there's no better feeling. It reminds me why I write in the first place.
