These bulls are being selected to use on an Angus-influenced commercial operation in south-central Nebraska. This ranch prides itself on raising high-quality females, marketing select groups of bred females in the fall, and retaining all of their own replacements. A small percentage of the bull crop is marketed by private treaty to local commercial cattlemen. All cull progeny are retained and fed at a local feedyard, where they are sold on the grid. This operation has built a strong customer base for sound, maternally functional cattle that can be versatile regardless of the marketing plan.
