MEMORANDUM OF TELEPHONE CONVERSATION

SUBJECT: President's Telephone Conversation with the Amir
of Kuwait (U)

AND PLACE: The Oval Office

The President initiated the call. (U)

The President: Hello your Highness, can you hear me okay? This
is George Bush. (U)

The Amir: I hear you fine. (U)

The President: I want to share our thinking on our efforts to
achieve our mutual objectives in the Gulf. Frankly, I think we
have made considerable progress. I think the entire world
supports our efforts, and I view that as a clear tribute to the
righteousness of our cause: that is in getting Iraq to withdraw
and the restoration of your government in Kuwait. However, it is
costly -- the invasion and sanctions -- in that it's hitting
many countries hard. I know you are willing to support this. I
am thinking of your prompt and generous support to Turkey. I
know you have been generous in your talks with us to defray some
of our costs as well. And we are grateful for this. Today, I
made a proposal for international compensation for countries most
affected by Iraq's invasion. I just hung up from talking to
Chancellor Kohl. What I wanted to ask is if you would, I would
like to send Secretary Baker to see you. He will be talking with
leaders in Europe on how to coordinate our help to people
requiring assistance. What I wanted to ask you is to receive him
next week. We need to stay together on this. So I've asked him
and Secretary Brady to go to Japan, Germany, Free Kuwait, and
other countries. If you are willing to see him, I would be most
grateful to you. (S)

The Amir: First, I would like to thank you for this call. Also
I want to thank you for what you and the United States are doing
for Kuwait. I appreciate your efforts and the Kuwaiti people
appreciate your efforts on our behalf. With regard to your
request, I will be happy to welcome and receive Secretary Baker.
I believe we need to look into these matters and share your
belief in the need for cooperation. (S)

The President: Well, I look forward to hearing from Jim Baker. And your Highness, any time you need to call, just pick up the phone. (Ø)

The Amir: Thank you. I wish you success and if there is anything, if I have any ideas to discuss, I will pick up the phone and do so. (Ø)

The President: Thank you, your Highness, and good bye. (U)
