MEMORANDUM OF TELEPHONE CONVERSATION

SUBJECT: Telephone Conversation with President Mubarak of Egypt (U)

PARTICIPANTS: The President
President Mubarak of Egypt
Notetaker: C. David Welch

DATE, TIME August 30, 1990, 2:54 - 2:56 p.m. EST
AND PLACE: The Oval Office

The President: Hosni, how's my friend? (U)

President Mubarak: I'm doing well, George. (U)

The President: You don't sound as upbeat as usual, my friend. Anyways, I just wanted to tell you that I just announced a major proposal for international compensation for countries, like Egypt, that are most affected by Iraq's invasion and sanctions compliance. I would add the comment that Egypt is at the top of our list. We will encourage others and we will help also. (C)

President Mubarak: I am relying on you mainly, George. (C)

The President: We will be talking to you about the FMS problem in the next few days. (C)

President Mubarak: On this FMS debt, I just paid you \$90 million today. (C)

The President: Your appeal is at the top of my list. I have to get it through Congress. But I thank you again for all you have done. (b)(1)

(b)(1) I have now said this publicly, that now is not the time to go, as much as I wanted to see the boys. (b)(1) (C)

President Mubarak: You know me, George, (b)(1)
(b)(1) You know you are welcome in Egypt anytime. (b)(1) (C)
