Dear Sir:

I am writing to request any supportive measures you may be able to provide through your office regarding current military mailing standards.

My only son is in the Navy, aboard the USS Detroit and like thousands of other American sons; he's in the Middle East.

The USS Detroit has had a major problem for two years with the water recycling system and now that its in the Red Sea, the high salt content is causing it to take three times the amount of time to desalinate the water. Showers are every four days in over 100 degree temperatures.

We thought we could, and would be supportive by sending mail frequently and packages to keep the spirits up. Lots of people are sending small drink packets i.e. Gatorade, etc. which serves a dual purpose...a treat but also a necessity in pushing fluids to prevent dehydration.

F.P.O. New York, New York 09567-3015 is where we have to send all our outgoing mail, and just three weeks into the game plan, they have stopped accepting packages and put a weight limit of 12 ounces on any outgoing mail to our military service people. Seems they can't handle anything more because it would mean hand sorting packages that the automatic sorters won't accommodate.

We have a few thousand people over there granted, but we have a few million people over here who are still getting their pound of junk mail daily with no weight limitations. I realize that there are Federal rules about mailing things but this rule seems to have been made up real quick for the convenience of mail sorters. There have been packages to military in times past that have circled the world to reach their destination, but we as Americans were never denied the right to send them. This is a slap in the face to the military service men and women; as well to the families who are trying in whatever means to be supportive of them. Please help.
