Dear Mr. President:

Next week, two Kurdish leaders, Jalal Talabani, the Secretary General of the Patriotic Union of Kurdistan, and Hoshiar Zebari, a representative from Mustafa Barzani's Kurdish Democratic Party, will be visiting Washington.

I am writing now to request that you consider a brief meeting, or at least a photo opportunity, with these two leaders. Incidentally, it is my understanding that they will be meeting with a number of Members of the House and Senate.

Your willingness to meet with these representatives of the Kurdish people would be an important demonstration that the United States has not forgotten the Kurds, who still face a very dangerous situation in Northern Iraq.

At a time when the United States is stepping up the pressure on Saddam Hussein to comply with the relevant United Nations resolutions concerning the destruction of his weapons of mass destruction, a decision on your part to meet these Kurdish leaders would be particularly appropriate, since it would unmistakably demonstrate your ongoing commitment to another dimension of the Iraqi problem: the welfare and well-being of the Kurdish people.

If, for scheduling or other reasons, it is not possible for you to meet with these leaders, I'd hope that at least one senior official from your Administration would be willing to meet with them.

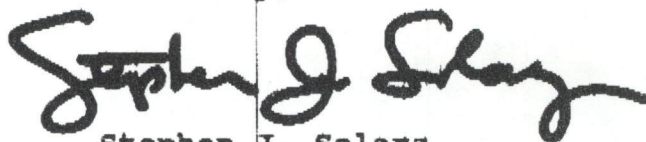
