Dear Jack:

I have just received your letter dated March 20. As usual, I appreciate your sharing your thoughts with me.

I understand the sensitivity and centrality of Jerusalem. I have made known my views, reflecting U.S. policy as it has been for over two decades. Rather than reiterating what I expect you already know, let me simply say that I am now interested most in putting this issue, and the distracting debate, behind us and focusing on the peace process. There is a moment of opportunity available, and I don't want to lose it.

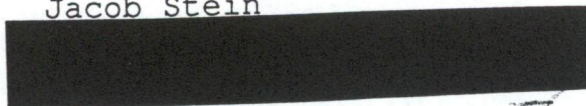
