Dear Mr. Frank:

Thank you for your recent letter to the President expressing your concerns regarding the tragic events that took place in Jerusalem on October 8, 1990, and the United States support in the United Nations Security Council for the adoption of Resolution 672.

The Administration though it important to be on record opposing what we believe was excessive use of deadly force by Israeli security personnel. Our position was motivated by a genuine concern over what had taken place and the desire to see such occurrences avoided in the future. It did not, however, imply any criticism of Israel's policy governing access to the holy places of Jerusalem, which has been praiseworthy; nor was it a vote in any way intended to minimize the harm done to those of the Jewish faith whose prayers were interrupted by stones. There can be no justification for that. Furthermore, our policy on Jerusalem remains unchanged: Jerusalem should never be divided again and its final status should be decided by negotiations.

The United States supports the efforts of the Secretary General to fulfill the mandate given him by Security Council Resolution 672. We have welcomed the Government of Israel's invitation to his representative to come to Israel to carry out his responsibilities, and supported Resolution 673 on this basis.

The events have been tragic, and we continue to urge all parties to exercise the utmost restraint in the future. The tension and violence painfully attest to the need for progress toward a negotiated settlement of the Arab-Israeli dispute, an endeavor we are dedicated to advancing.

As you know, the U.S. commitment to Israeli security and well-being has been a cornerstone of American policy in the Middle East since Israel's creation in 1948. Significant economic and security annual assistance to Israel is an acknowledgement of the continuation of that commitment. Our assistance helps build a strong and secure Israel which is in the interest of the U.S. and in the interest of peace.

Dear Mr. President,

On behalf of the Jewish Community Relations Council of Greater San Jose, which is an umbrella organization of Jewish organizations, synagogues, and lay people, I am writing to express our shock and concern over the United States' sponsorship of a U.N. Resolution of condemnation of Israel, regarding Israeli actions in quelling the riots on the Temple Mount on October 8. The resolution, and the tone of our government's response, will serve to support the most extreme elements in the Palestinian community. This action can only encourage Saddam Hussein's intransigence and aggression.

We, along with the entire American Jewish community, express our regret over the loss of life that resulted from Monday's rioting. Israel has appointed an independent Commission of Inquiry. It is premature to render judgements before that body issues a report. A condemnation of Israel may in the short term help to maintain Arab nations' support of the multi-national effort against Iraq's brutal invasion and occupation of Kuwait, but it can and will ultimately reignite the violence in the West Bank and Gaza, and strengthen Saddam's hand.

Because of Israel's sensitivity to Islamic worshippers, only a small police force was in place. It is therefore especially ironic that Israel is now condemned for having an insufficient police force in place. Israel has in fact been rigorous in its protection of all holy sites - Christian, Moslem and Jewish. This vividly contrasts with the situation when Jordan controlled these sites.

We believe that the United States must unequivocally state that attacks on worshippers at Holy Sites will not be condoned. Such attacks echo the tragedies of our Jewish history which Israel's leaders cannot be expected to ignore. We ask that you not lend your own prestige, and that of the United States, to those who only seek to reignite the violence in the Middle East.

We urge you to not permit Saddam Hussein to divert attention from the threat he represents to world peace and stability.

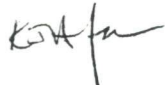

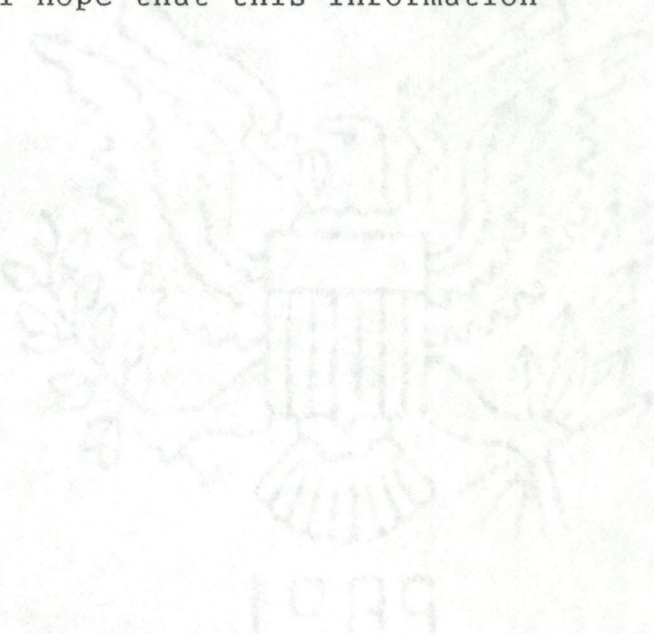
