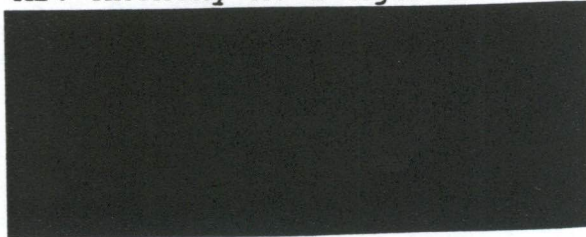

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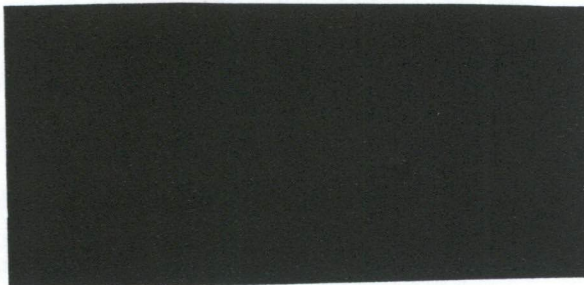

Dear President Bush,

I am writing to protest American support for the United Nation's condemnation of Israel. I have no sympathy for people killed in the act of attacking innocent worshipers at the Western Wall. I feel that the Israelis were well within their rights to open fire on rioters engaged in a ferocious and racist attack on worshipers at one of Jerusalem's many holy places.

Chosing only to condemn the Israeli attempt to restore order and protect innocent civilians totally ignores the Arab violence and provocations. One sided resolutions such as this can only serve as an incentive to worse violence on the part of the Arab population of Jerusalem and further deflect world attention from Iraqi atrocities in Kuwait. This was clearly a propaganda coup for the radicals, such as Arafat and Saddam Hussein. Truth is not decided by a show of hands. The Arabs were clearly the culprits in the recent fighting on the Temple Mount and no number of U.N. resolutions will change that.

Though abandoning a valuable ally like Israel may be in our interest in the short term for geopolitical reasons, it does not change the fact that this resolution was unjust. It was a very shabby way to treat a country that is our friend. Also, should we find ourselves at war with Iraq we will be in desperate need of dependable, powerful allies such as the Israelis. The benefits we gain from our close relations with Israel are too high a price to pay for any short term gains this would give us with the Arab states. Our short term gain might well turn into a long term loss if after abandoning Israel we in turn are abandoned by our Arab "allies."

I have been a member of the G.O.P. for thirteen years, and it saddens me to see what I perceive as Israel bashing by our government. Therefore I would urge you to take action to restore our close ties with Israel such as moving our embassy to West Jerusalem, increasing our military aid to Israel, and forgiving their military debts.

I know you are a very busy man, but if it is at all possible I would appreciate hearing your thoughts on this matter.
