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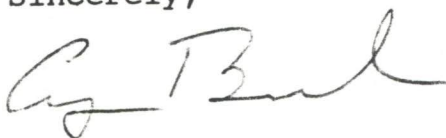

Dear Mr. President:

Today I write to you as a member of the New York City Council and a Democrat who jumped ship early in the campaign to support your candidacy for President in 1988.

Recently I have had the pleasure to work closely with the State Department, and particularly with Mr. Dennis Ross who was very helpful with a case involving the Egyptian government and an Israeli relative of one of my constituents.

My current district contains perhaps the largest concentration of Jews outside the state of Israel. I recall it was this district that while overwhelmingly Democrat in voter registration, almost unanimously voted for Rudy Giuliani in the Mayoral race and for Senator D'Amato and President Ronald Reagan during their respective campaigns. It was also this district that in 1988 supported your bid for the presidency largely turning their backs on Mr. Dukakis, the democratic nominee.

I need not tell you that the perceived strain in relations between you and the Israeli government weighs heavily on the minds of many of my constituents. Be that as it may, I feel that you have a great deal to offer during a second term and I believe that I can be helpful.

In that regard, I would most welcome the opportunity to meet with you to discuss these and other related matters in further detail. In addition, I feel I have some ideas that can be of great benefit to you.

I look forward to meeting with you.
