Dear Mrs. Bell:

President Bush has asked me to thank you for your message concerning his recent summit meeting with President Mikhail Gorbachev. The President appreciates the many comments and suggestions he has received concerning this meeting.

During this Washington Summit, the United States and the Soviet Union made substantial progress toward building a more peaceful and stable world. The agreements signed by President Bush and President Gorbachev include a very important accord to curb the production of chemical weapons, as well as to destroy the vast bulk of declared chemical stocks, and an agreement limiting nuclear weapons testing. Progress was made on negotiations to reduce U.S.-Soviet strategic nuclear forces and conventional military forces in Europe. In addition, agreements were reached on a number of economic issues.

President Bush and President Gorbachev also held intensive discussions on the events that are transforming Europe and on other international issues such as the situation in the Baltic States; Soviet emigration practices, including those concerning Soviet Jews; and developments in Afghanistan, South Africa, and Central America. Candid discussions produced a new level of understanding that will enhance future efforts to address the U.S.-Soviet differences.
