Dear Mr. President:

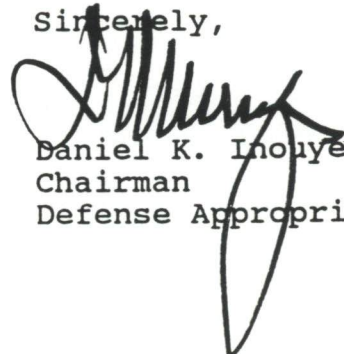
Thank you for your letter of September 26, 1990, requesting my support for the proposal to forgive Egypt's foreign military sales debt.

As you know, I have long believed that peace and stability in the Middle East is as much a function of not only political reform, but also economic prosperity. This is true for all the countries of the region, particularly those which are burdened by scarce natural resources, a severe shortage of adequate housing, a large per capita debt and severe budgetary shortfalls resulting from the current Gulf crisis. More than ever, an imaginative economic package is needed for the region, one which recognizes not only the needs of specific countries, but also their inter-dependence.

It is for this reason that I have decided to support your proposal to cancel Egypt's FMS debt -- a proposal which I view as the first in a series of bold attempts to help our friends and allies in the Middle East to meet their pressing development and security needs. I know you share my concern for the continued prosperity of those countries which stand with us in this uncertain hour and trust that you will look favorably on additional proposals to enhance their economic well-being which I plan to offer.

Once again, I am pleased to support your proposal for Egyptian FMS debt relief and look forward to working with you in this budget cycle to see that the broadest possible support is provided to our friends in the region.

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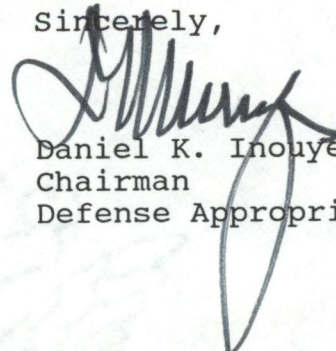
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
