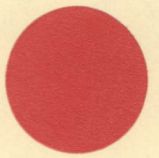

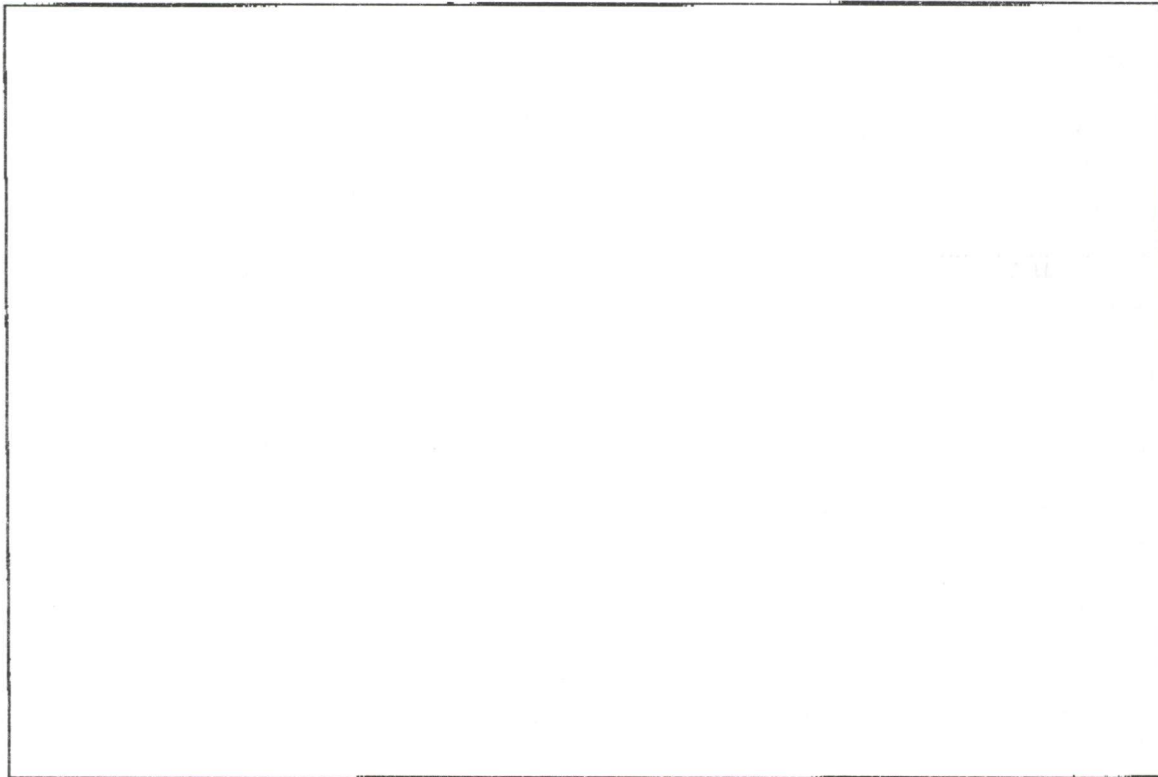

STATEMENT ON H.R.I

The Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America, having supported every major piece of civil rights legislation enacted during the past thirty years, reaffirms its support for and commitment to, in the words of its 1964 convention resolution, "legislation protective of the rights of all Americans to equal employment opportunity "without regard to age, race, color, sex, religion, creed or national origin." In an effort further to protect equal employment opportunity for all Americans, the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America will actively support a civil rights bill that does not compel or have the effect of encouraging, directly or indirectly, the use of racial, religious or gender quotas in hiring or advancement in employment.

The Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America believes that the legislation introduced in the House of Representatives as H.R.I, in its present form, includes provisions that might lead many employers to conclude that they should use racial, religious or gender quotas in hiring and promoting employees in order to avoid expensive litigation with unpredictable potential liabilities, even though the hiring standards and practices of these employers are based on appropriate business considerations relating to job performance. Under the circumstances, the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America opposes H.R.I in its current form. It is our hope that Congress and the Administration can together fashion civil rights legislation which meets our above stated concern while, simultaneously, increasing the legal protection assuring equal employment opportunity.

The Union's Institute for Public Affairs will work with other national Jewish organizations, the Leadership Conference on Civil Rights, the Congressional leadership and the Administration in an effort to ensure full consideration of our concerns in the drafting of final legislation which we can support.

We would also hope that any civil rights legislation that may be enacted includes meaningful protection for the rights of employees to enjoy reasonable accommodation in the workplace for their religious requirements, including Sabbath observance.
