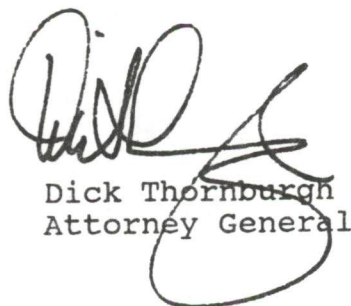

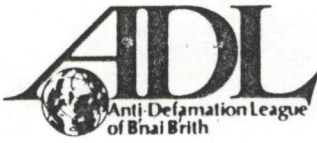

Chief Gates is recognized throughout law enforcement as an authority on terrorism, civil disorders and the applications of air support.
