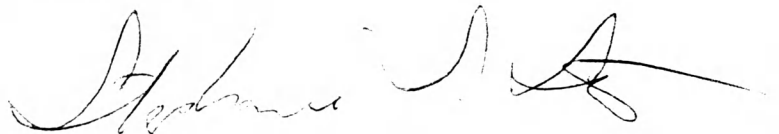
Dear Mr. and Mrs. Butts:

Dear Mr. President:

ACORN, the Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now, is sponsoring, along with First Fidelity/First Union, Fannie Mae, Mellon/PSFS, PNC/MidLantic Bank, Prudential Insurance and United Guaranty, a community banking event called ACORN & FRIENDS BANK FAIR '96. The event, now in its ninth year, is to be held on Saturday, May 11, 1996; from noon to six PM at the Pennsylvania Convention Center, One Convention Center Place, 1101 Arch Street, Philadelphia. We would like to extend to you an invitation to participate in this event, to work in partnership with our local lending institutions, city government, non-profit organizations and other corporations in spotlighting opportunities that exist to expand housing availability and affordability and to briefly speak to the issue of community reinvestment, public/private partnerships and community/business partnerships at the opening of the event.

Bank Fair '96 is designed to be a citywide meeting, drawing people from neighborhoods throughout the city, bringing the banking and low and moderate income communities together, to help foster a better relationship between these communities and the various financial establishments invited to the event; to answer questions and to give information about programs that will have a positive effect on our communities. We would also like to take this opportunity to extend an invitation to chair a workshop describing affordable housing initiatives, community and business partnerships or other issues you feel are important to our community. We always try at the workshops we hold at Bank Fair to have the most senior level people possible to conduct the workshops so our people get the most authoritative answers to their questions that is possible and also that the senior staff have the opportunity to communicate clearly their intentions to us on the issues raised in the workshops. We also want to provide the opportunity for policy makers to interact with the people who are directly affected by those policies. We will also reserve table space for the local HUD office at the event. We have also contacted Ms. Karen Miller at our local HUD office inviting them to this years ACORN & FRIENDS BANK FAIR '96.

The Bank Fair model originated here in Philadelphia and has been duplicated in cities throughout the U.S., not only by ACORN, but other organizations as well. Last years Bank Fair was our most successful ever, drawing over to 13,000 people from neighborhoods throughout the city and beyond.

HUD Secretary Cisneros & Mayor Ed Rendell were our featured speakers at the event. Throughout these past nine years, our goals for this event have remained the same: to bring together the banking and low and moderate income community; to provide information that will assist low and moderate income borrowers with their financial needs, to help meet the needs of small business, to enlighten and update the community about the progress that has been made in our relationships with the hosting banks and institutions, to help foster a better relationship between banks and the community and to show how best our community can be served by the financial institutions invited to this event. Like our previous events, we will be having workshops on personal finance and budgeting, credit, home improvement and ACTION loans, mortgages, small business loans and development, city & federal housing programs and community involvement. Refreshments will also be served.

Last year you spoke with my husband George Butts (who serves as National President of ACORN Housing Corporation) at the national association of Realtors convention in Los Angeles and mentioned to him that you were looking forward to opportunities to work together so we would, again, like to extend to you the opportunity to participate in the ACORN & FRIENDS BANK FAIR '95 and hope that you will take advantage of this opportunity to reach out to the community and help break down the barriers that have existed between our community and the banking and financial community.

We are enclosing some materials from last years event, along with information about the workshops to give you a more complete idea of what a Bank Fair entails. I would appreciate if you or your representative would contact me as soon as possible to let me know if you can attend the ACORN & FRIENDS BANK FAIR '96 to help continue the tradition of success we've had in previous years. 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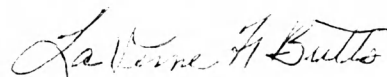
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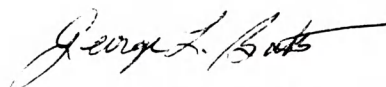
