Robin:

According to Embassy Ka'du, there is a total ban on adoptions at this time and the issue has been in limbo during the governmental crisis of this summer. That is not to say that there will be a solution now that there is a new government. The Embassy responded to a congressional from Sen. Dodd in June and wrote to (b)(6) in July, with a personal note from Sandy.

In this particular case there is apparently a question as to whether the child qualifies as an orphan. This centers around whether the father actually abandoned the child and his current marital status. These legal questions must be resolved before the child could be legally adopted. Peter reports that to keep the process moving, our consular folks are investigating to determine the child's status even though this should normally be done after the adoptive parents have met the GON requirements.

A concern for all is that we not create future road blocks to other American prospective adoptive parents by riding roughshod over the adoption officials, especially while legal questions remain as to the child's adoptability.
