SUBJECT: Special Envoy to Women in Europe

Following up our conversation outside the Oval Office, October 19th, I would like to propose a dual hat designation - U.S. Ambassador to Austria and Special Envoy to Women in Europe -- to reflect the work I am currently doing. The change will be in title only, with no additional cost to the State Department; I will absorb all costs personally for the second set of responsibilities, and it will not diminish my primary bilateral role.

Context: Representing the United States in Austria I find myself in the heart of an evolving Europe as the emerging democracies go through their challenging transition, and as our socio/economic ties with the EU become increasingly critical to European stability. In relation to both situations, our administration's commitment to the empowerment of women as a foreign policy objective comes at a critical time, particularly in this Beijing implementation period.

In extensive travels throughout Central and Eastern Europe, I have found that while the desire for freedom may be intrinsic, the practice of democracy must be learned. Democracy represents both a promise and a challenge, and the success of the transition will depend on the participation of all citizens -- half of whom are women. As the First Lady said in Beijing: "Women must enjoy the right to participate fully in the social and political lives of their countries if we want freedom and democracy to thrive and endure." This is certainly evident in the emerging democracies, for women tend to think cooperatively rather than competitively; they can be a powerful economic engine; and, with a natural focus on their children and families, they tend to make choices that reflect a long-term view.

I believe our work in foreign policy must now include finding ways to bring women into the political, economic, and social mainstream. This is work that crosses borders, and that should rely heavily on NGOs as sources of creative thinking and fresh energy.

My Work in this Area to Date: A spin-off of my activities in Vienna has been a regional initiative I fund personally, to help European women create professional networks locally and abroad; to bring them together to share experiences, skills, and ideas; and to increase public and

government awareness of their essential role in a democratic society. I have been able to reach hundreds of women in the emerging democracies through personal meetings, and hundreds of thousands through speeches, television interviews, and newspaper and magazine stories. As a result of these activities in the past two years, I have become a *de facto* representative of U.S. support for their efforts. I speak so not representing myself or Austria, but the United States and, more specifically, this Administration.

Most recently, when I suggested we might convene in Vienna women from throughout the new democracies -- as a speaking venue for the First Lady -- Dick Holbrooke suggested that the meeting would be better in Prague or Warsaw. I commented that it would not be appropriate for me to organize that from my bilateral position, and he suggested that I could be designated a "roving ambassador" for women. Coincidentally, after observing a session I led with a group of women leaders in Prague this summer, Joe Duffy's assistant at USIA, Iris Burnett, also suggested I be named "Ambassador-at-Large for Women."

In addition, DAS Dick Hecklinger and Stu Eizenstat recently asked me to conceptualize an EU-U.S. women's link. Stu told me recently he envisions my playing a leading role in organizing those activities. Similarly, John Kornblum has asked me to compose language describing the "full participation of families in society," for OSCE purposes.

An Example: A concrete example of my activity may be useful. I was invited to come to Kiev to keynote the Beijing Preparatory Conference for Ukraine. In addition to granting me country clearance, Ambassador Bill Miller hosted a group of woman leaders in his home to discuss with me the status of women in their country. On recommendation of his USIS staff, I also had two other appointments with NGO and parliamentarian leaders, dealing with women's legal rights and the situation of women in politics.

Five developments came from that 24-hour visit. First, I wrote about what is happening to women in Ukraine in Austrian and Colorado newspapers, and spoke about it on Austrian radio, in total reaching well over two million readers/listeners. Second, I was asked to return to address a full session of the Parliament (with country-wide television coverage) on the day they considered legislative changes to end discrimination against women. Third, I soon am hosting eight Ukrainian women leaders in my home for a three-day seminar (all costs, including travel, funded by me personally), to link them with Austrian and American women - political, business, and NGO leaders. Fourth, I will be addressing the situation of Ukrainian women on a World Net program from Washington on November 13th, thus highlighting the issue for Ukrainian media.

Similar scenarios are true of Slovakia, the Czech Republic, Croatia, Poland, Hungary, Slovenia, Macedonia, and Bosnia.

Other Ambassadors: Being a bilateral Ambassador myself, I am very sensitive to the issue of propriety when visiting another country. Every trip I have made has been not only coordinated with the American Ambassador, but has also included events designed by their USIS staff, hosted in their Residences or Chanceries, attended by them or their spouses, with

media coverage arranged by their press staff. So it has been a joint effort, with me coming in, as it were, as a resource person, and the Embassy and Ambassador becoming publicly identified with this issue in a way that well may not have otherwise.

Although the title I am asking for specifies "Europe," I expect 95% of my effort will continue to be in the new democracies, where women have taken a giant step backward in the past five years in terms of employment, political representation, and social welfare, and where the NGO structure is fledgling.

Domestic Considerations: In a time when we are concerned about building a domestic constituency for our foreign policy, I believe the timing of such a designation would be fortuitous. I speak before numerous women's groups in the U.S., for whom this signal of commitment on the part of the Clinton administration would have particular meaning.

Administration Support: On October 19, 1995, per your suggestion, I did not broach this idea with the President. But I did tell him I was meeting with women across Europe, speaking in his name. He said this work was very important, and asked me to continue throughout the development of this work. I have not been working in a vacuum, but rather have been in close touch with the First Lady's office and have reported on it numerous times through conversations and cables to Dick Holbrooke, Tim Wirth, Dick Moose, Peter Tarnoff, Joe Duffy, the Vice President, the First Lady, and others and have received continuous words of support.

Implications for my Bilateral Work: Interestingly, the Austrians have taken great pride in the regional work of "their" American Ambassador. These activities have been described in the most glowing terms in the press, and I'm frequently asked to speak on these themes within Austria. I think this is because: 1) there are no difficult issues between our two countries; 2) I've been able to meet Austrian expectations or hopes vis a vis Washington; 3) Charles and I are both extremely active within Austria; and 4) Austrians think of Vienna as having a regional role.

Cost: There will be no cost to the State Department for this work. I will pay for all staffing, travel, and other expenses myself. (For your information, I now fund my own transportation and other costs connected with my activities in this area, and I also fund three full-time staff members.)

My role vis a vis women in Europe has evolved to a quite active level. It would now be very helpful for me to carry a title to accompany the work, both for the sake of clarity, as well as to ensure that this administration receives unambiguous credit for these efforts. Thank you for taking a look at this. I think this action would be mutually beneficial -- in my work here and for the Administration. And I look forward to hearing from you.

Dear Melanne,

Charles and I received much appreciated notes from the President and First Lady recently. Thanks for your part in that.

Here are various pieces I've written related to women in the new democracies. I hope you find them useful.

Hillary is in such demand over here! What a role model she is. The pre-advance plans have just crossed my desk for her trip in July. Think about how I might help. I have contacts wide and deep with women leaders -- our kind of activists in Krakow, Prague, Budapest, Bratislava, and Ljubljana. In some cases, my contacts go significantly beyond those of our embassies in these cities. I'd love to join up with the group and to assist in the planning.

I'm also enclosing David Gergen's piece about Ron. I thought it very important. I'm including a piece I wrote as well.

I was moved in an odd way by the deaths of Ron and Steve. For two weeks, I obsessed on not having been at the Memorial Service at the National Cathedral. Over and over I lay awake at night, trying to go back and change that day. Finally, I've realized that it wasn't the church service day I wanted to change, but a week earlier. I wonder how many of us have, in our imaginations, sat in that cockpit, and pulled the steering wheel to the right.

Your and Phil's coming to the Cantata meant a lot to me. I really didn't know if you would make it, given all you had gone through. I remember your words at the end. I hope they had a healing purpose for many who were there.

Melanne, you are in my thoughts every day. Using whatever intuitive powers we have, I send you love, and patience, and even occasionally serendipitous fun. Please give me a call whenever I can be of help to you or your bosses. I am writing them more often, not because I expect a response, but because I remember how I felt when you said, "Hillary never heard how the meeting in Madrid went." So I will do my bit to be sure there's more closure.

Meanwhile, I'm now working on a project to channel economic assistance to the estimated 7,000 widows from Srebrenica whose husbands and sons were killed by Serbs last summer. These women, now in Tuzla, are faced with finding homes, feeding and educating their children, and beginning new lives while still struggling to know the fate of their men. On July 14, the anniversary of the massacre, I'm planning an event in Tuzla to focus international attention to their plight and to bring concrete help to the NGOs working with them. Queen Noor of Jordan will participate, and we are inviting other prominent women leaders to join us. I know you visited some of these women recently. But if Hillary wants to be involved in any way, please let me know.

Dear Swanee,

Thank you for your work representing me in meetings with women leaders throughout the new democracies.

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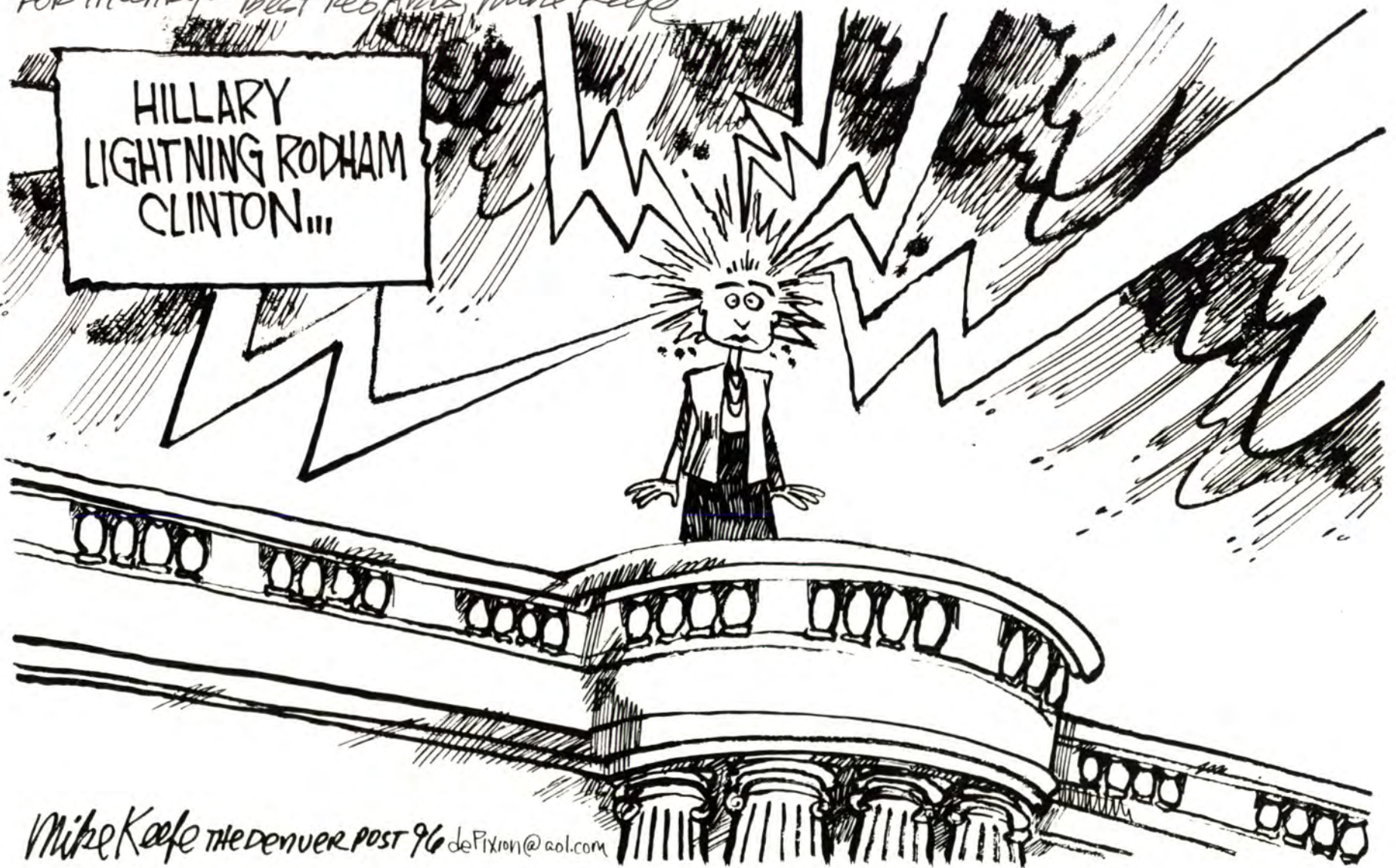

Dear Hillary,

This is not the first note I've written you recently, but it is the first I've sent. It has seemed presumptuous to take your time to read my notes of thanks for your personal support and appreciation for all you're doing for this country.

Now, however, I must respond to your recent public words about the level of meaning that makes our lives worth living, and the social implications of that spiritual level.

I will not discuss your ideas except to say that some day I hope we will be able to do just that. It would be a conversation that would quickly cut through to a quest we share.

You know me perhaps as an advocate for women and children, a community activist, a fundraiser, or a political donor. What you may not know is that there are long-tended roots beneath that work, roots nourished by Bonhoeffer, Tillich, Niebuhr, and others. Eight years in theological seminaries nurtured those roots, culminating in both a Masters in Religion and ultimately a Doctor of Theology with a dissertation on Harvard's Robert Coles as a paradigm for a much-needed bridge between the disciplines of pastoral care and ethics. "The Socio-Ethical Dimensions of Empathy" maintained that to speak of care for individuals without attempting to change the systems that impinge on them is unacceptably inadequate. It is not enough to listen sympathetically to a black illiterate mother describe her hopelessness. The response must include systemic redress of racism, sexism, and reform of public education as well.

That belief about the importance of systems to lives of individuals forms the conduit between my own faith and my political and community activity. Even though I was raised fundamentalist Southern Baptist in Dallas, as an adult I have come to understand "personal faith" as having social implications -- even demands. Like you, I don't often talk about that core as I do my work. But I am very aware of it.

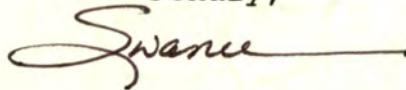
So your words are like old friends to me. Yet it is no surprise that many in Washington are baffled by your pondering "the politics of meaning." Such concepts fail to thrive in the rarified air of that town. Those same cynics must shake their heads at Al Gore's description of the global environmental crisis as "an outer manifestation of an inner crisis that is, for lack of a better word, spiritual." As though in a dialogue, he immediately adds, "as a politician, I know full well the special hazards of using 'spiritual' to describe a problem like this one.... But what other word describes the collection of values and assumptions that determine our basic understanding of how we fit into the universe?"

Well, let them scratch their heads. I've long believed there is some value simply in coming forth with the unanticipated. You have defied the expectations of those who admire you for your sharp-edged rationality. They now are witnessing in you (whether or not they recognize it) that, in Tillich's words, "faith is the act in which reason reaches ecstatically beyond itself."

So don't be daunted by those who are puzzled. It's probably good for them -- and for you too.

And someday, perhaps when you're out of office, we'll have time to talk about all this.
