The **King Hussein Foundation** was established by Royal Decree in 1999 as a national and international non-profit, non-governmental organization to serve as a living monument to the late King's humanitarian vision and legacy. The Foundation will work to sustain and build upon his lifelong commitments to education and leadership, environment and health, and democracy and peace.

The King Hussein Foundation seeks to inspire and support future generations to achieve tangible progress in these fields and to equip dedicated and compassionate future leaders with access to the resources and experience needed to say, "I will at least have done my best."

THE VISION CONTINUES

His Majesty King Hussein bequeathed us an inestimable legacy. Throughout his life, his words, actions and the force of his faith provided inspiration and vision for his beloved Jordan, the Middle East, and the world.

King Hussein's vision and legacy have become our challenge. His leadership demonstrated what could be accomplished. It is up to those he inspired to carry that vision forward, to continue the work of realizing his dreams.

• **EDUCATION AND LEADERSHIP**

King Hussein believed passionately in the power of education to shape the future, providing both the keys to prosperity and the tools for sound and creative leadership. His compassion gave him a profound insight into human development, seeing people as our most precious resource, and their well being as our foremost priority. He knew that in Jordan, a country of limited natural wealth, the greatest resource - and greatest potential - lie in the minds of the people.

The King Hussein Foundation will therefore foster education in a number of areas, to encourage innovation and excellence in teaching, to inspire capable and compassionate future leaders, and to expand scientific and professional training to prepare citizens for the challenges of the new millenium.

Specifically, the King Hussein Foundation will strengthen and expand the capacity of existing institutions, which His Majesty supported, including the **Royal Endowment for Culture and Education (RECE)** and the **Jubilee School**.

RECE awards scholarships for graduate studies in fields vital to Jordan's future development as determined through RECE's own groundbreaking research on the country's workforce needs. RECE places particular emphasis on supporting outstanding women and science and technology students in the pursuit of their studies.

The Jubilee School, an independent co-educational secondary school, was established, in 1993, to commemorate His Majesty King Hussein's Silver Jubilee. Its mission is to develop the academic and leadership potential of promising scholarship students from the country and the region, with special emphasis on students from less developed areas of Jordan.

The School provides a unique educational environment, which promotes creative thinking, leadership and conflict resolution skills, science and technology expertise and social responsibility.

The School's **Center for Excellence in Education** advances national and regional educational standards through the development of innovative curricula and training programs, and workshops for public and private school teachers and administrators.

• **HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT**

The King Hussein Foundation will sponsor research into issues of environment and public health; encourage national and regional conservation strategies and efforts; and support cancer research and treatment programs.

In late 1999, the KHF joined forces with the International Youth Foundation's global campaign, **"Children's Hour"** to encourage every working individual to donate the earnings from the last working hour of this millennium to the world's children. Proceeds from KHF's Jordan campaign will be used to support research and treatment programs for children with cancer.

In February 2000, the KHF and the Middle East Complex Company (LG Electronics) entered into partnership to promote children's health and improve the quality of life of hospitalized children. LG Electronics will donate and equip children's wards with **multi-media learning centers** in hospitals throughout Jordan. The first, which will be launched in spring 2000, will serve children with cancer at Al Amal Cancer Center in Amman.

The King Hussein Foundation will sponsor research into issues of environment and public health and will work in association with **Al Amal Cancer Center** - Jordan's first comprehensive cancer center serving the nation and the region.

In 2000, The KHF will support an **Environment and Cancer Research Fund** to finance a national research program on the role environmental factors play in the etiology of the development of cancer. The program will design and conduct epidemiological studies to test the link between environmental hazards and malignancy, study the socio economic impact of cancer and its risk factors on the population and the benefit of protective policies, and implement educational programs on protective and safety measures. It will include research on industrial and occupational hazards, tobacco, and water pollution.

The KHF will also strive to finalize the establishment of the **National Children's Hospital**, a long cherished dream of King Hussein. The Hospital is designed to provide specialized pediatric care to the children of Jordan and other Arab countries. Construction designs have been completed for a site adjacent to and linked with the King Hussein Medical Center in Amman.

• PEACE AND DEMOCRACY

"The truths are: that basic human rights are inalienable, that peace is indivisible, that relationships between nations and people must be reciprocal and that justice is the only foundation for security.

We must create peace. We need a sense of security in our private and national lives; we need hope for our children; we need trust with our neighbors; we need opportunities for our development and faith in the moral conscience of the world and in our own destiny. King Hussein was dedicated to the principles of democracy, justice and peace within Jordan and among nations. He sought to translate his deep and abiding faith in Islam, his humility and sense of fellowship with all people into systems of governance that promoted dialogue and equity within the framework of traditional Arab and Islamic principles.

The KHF will initiate and support programs that emphasize active participation in the democratic process and promote dialogue, tolerance and understanding for peace. These initiatives will advocate for equity and respect for human rights and seek to contribute to national and international efforts towards sustainable development.

The Foundation has applied for the United Nations' Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) 2001 Participation Program Grant for an **"Education for a Culture of Peace"** project. The project will promote a culture of peace by sponsoring dialogue, coexistence programs and educational materials for schools and academic institutions in Jordan

• MUSEUM AND LIBRARY

The Foundation will also support the establishment of a national museum and library archive on His Majesty's life and work to serve as a meeting place for scholars and thinkers engaged in furthering His Majesty's goals.

• INTERNATIONAL LEADERSHIP PRIZE

The King Hussein Foundation will award an annual International Humanitarian Leadership Prize.

HER MAJESTY QUEEN NOOR OF JORDAN

Her Majesty Queen Noor was born Lisa Najeeb Halaby on 23 August 1951, to a distinguished Arab-American family. After receiving a B.A. in Architecture and Urban Planning from Princeton University in 1974, Queen Noor participated in international urban planning and design projects in Australia, Iran, the United States and Jordan from where she traveled throughout the Arab World to research aviation training facilities. Subsequently, she joined 'Royal Jordanian' airline as Director of Planning and Design Projects.

Their Majesties King Hussein and Queen Noor were married on 15 June 1978. They have two sons: HRH Prince Hamzah (born 29 March 1980) and HRH Prince Hashim (born 10 June 1981), and two daughters: HRH Princess Iman (born 24 April 1983) and HRH Princess Raiyah (born 9 February 1986). Their family also included the children of His Majesty's previous marriage, HRH Princess Haya and HRH Prince Ali, and Ms. Abir Muheisen.

Since 1978, Queen Noor has played a major role in promoting international exchange and understanding of Middle Eastern politics, Arab-Western relations and current global issues throughout the world.

In Jordan, Queen Noor initiates and sponsors projects and activities which respond to specific national needs in the areas of education, health, women and children's welfare, human rights, conflict resolution, community development, environmental and architectural conservation, culture, and public architecture and planning. She is actively involved with international and United Nations organizations that address global challenges in these fields.

In 1979, the Queen established the **Royal Endowment for Culture and Education (RECE)**, which conducted the first development research on the country's specific manpower needs and awards scholarships, with special emphasis on outstanding women, for graduate studies in fields vital to Jordan's future development.

In 1980, the Queen convened the first **Arab Children's Congress**, an annual gathering of young people from throughout the Arab world designed to promote understanding and solidarity.

In 1981, Queen Noor, founded the annual **Jerash Festival for Culture and Arts** to promote Jordanian, Arab and international cultural and artistic interaction at one of Jordan's most important archaeological sites.

In 1984, Queen Noor assumed responsibility for the implementation of an educational project to commemorate His Majesty King Hussein's Silver Jubilee. **The Jubilee School**, an independent co-educational secondary school, was established to develop the academic and leadership potential of outstanding scholarship students from the country and the region, with special emphasis on students from less developed areas of Jordan. The School provides a unique educational environment which promotes creative thinking, leadership and conflict resolution skills, scientific and technological expertise and social responsibility. The School's **Center for Excellence in Education** advances national and regional educational standards through the development of innovative curricula and training programs, and workshops for public and private school teachers.

The **Noor Al Hussein Foundation (NHF)** was established in 1985 to consolidate and integrate the Queen's expanding development initiatives. The Foundation initiates and supports national, regional and international projects in the fields of integrated community development, micro finance, women and enterprise development, child and family health, education and culture. NHF programs successfully advanced and modernized development thinking in Jordan by promoting individual and community self-reliance, grassroots participation in decision-making and project implementation, equal opportunity with special emphasis on the empowerment of women, and intersectoral cooperation.

The NHF, in co-operation with the Jordanian Government and United Nations and international organizations, has designed and implemented innovative projects and programs, sensitive to local values and traditions which have received international recognition as development models for the Middle East and the developing world -- the **Quality of Life Project**, the **Women-in-Development Project**, the **Institute for Child Health and Development**, the **Jubilee School**, the **National Handicrafts Development Project**, the **National Music Conservatory**, the **Performing Arts Center** and the **Jordan Micro Credit Company**.

In 1995, His Majesty King Hussein directed Queen Noor to establish and chair a **National Task Force for Children** to monitor and evaluate the condition and status of Jordan's children in accordance with Arab and international conventions on the rights of the child and Jordan's National Plan of Action for Children. The NTFC established the **National Coalition for Children** as a forum to coordinate and promote partnerships among specialists and public and private institutions and NGOs involved with children's affairs and a national **Research and Database Unit**.

The **King Hussein Foundation**, chaired by Queen Noor, was established by Royal Decree in 1999. The Foundation is a national and international non-profit, non-governmental organization dedicated to give meaningful expression to the late King's humanitarian vision and legacy with emphasis on democracy and peace, education and leadership, environment and health. In 1999, the **The Jordan Society**, a non-profit organization initiated by the Queen in 1980 to promote understanding and closer ties between Jordan and the United States was renamed the **King Hussein Foundation - USA**.

Queen Noor chairs the **Al Amal Cancer Center** – Jordan's first comprehensive cancer center serving Jordan and the region and an active patron of several Jordanian national institutions working in the areas of women's welfare, child development, humanitarian relief work, environmental and archaeological conservation and protection, the arts, aviation, and athletics.

Internationally, Queen Noor is Patron of **The World Conservation Union (IUCN)**, Honorary President of **BirdLife International** and Board Member of **WWF International**. She received the United Nations Environment Program **Global 500 Award** for her activism in environmental protection, in promoting awareness and in initiating community action for the preservation of Jordan's natural heritage.

The Queen is the President of the **United World Colleges (UWC)**, a network of 10 equal-opportunity international colleges around the world, which foster cross-cultural understanding and global peace. She is Chair of the advisory board of the **Center for the Study of the Global South** at American University, as well as Chair of the international advisory committee for the **United Nations University International Leadership Academy**, which is the first global leadership training facility as well as the first UN institution to be initiated and established in the Middle East. Queen Noor is Honorary Chair of the **McGill Middle East Program in Civil Society and Peace Building** which brings together Jordanians, Israelis and Palestinians to improve the living conditions of the region's poor. Queen Noor is also an advisor to the global initiative **Women Waging Peace** and Patron of **International Alert's Women and Peacebuilding** campaign, which focus on women's role and contribution to peace building and conflict resolution.

She is Ambassador of **Future Harvest** - a network of international research centers located around the world that seek to make agricultural issues and the need for international agricultural research more immediate and relevant to policymakers, the media and the general public. She is also on the board of the **The Hunger Project**, an honorary member of the General Assembly of the **SOS-Kinderdorf International**, and a member of the International Council of the **Near East Foundation**. The Queen is a Trustee of the **Mentor Foundation**, a global youth drug abuse prevention initiative and board member of the **Seeds of Peace**.

Queen Noor has assumed an advocacy role in the **International Campaign to Ban Landmines (ICBL)**. She is on the international advisory board of the Nobel Prize winning **ICBL** and patron of **Landmine Survivors Network**.

Upon her marriage, Queen Noor received Jordan's Grand Cordon of the Jewelled Al Nahda, and shortly after, the Grand Collar of Al Hussein Bin Ali in addition to official decorations from around the world. In recognition of her efforts to advance development, democracy and peace, the Queen has been awarded numerous honorary doctorates in international relations, law, and humane letters, and international awards.

Queen Noor speaks Arabic, English and French. She enjoys skiing, water skiing, tennis, sailing, horseback riding, reading, gardening and photography.

REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT
ON THE DEATH OF HIS MAJESTY KING HUSSEIN OF JORDAN

The Rose Garden

THE PRESIDENT: Today the world mourns the loss of one of its great leaders, King Hussein of Jordan. I mourn the loss of a partner and friend. He was a magnificent man, and like so many, I loved and admired him.

King Hussein once wrote, "I believe we must live with courage and will. I must do so because, regardless of any difficulties I face, when the time comes for me to lose my life, I would at least have done my best."

He did far better than that. A humble man and a king; a leader whose nobility came not from his title, but his character; a man who believed that we are all God's children, bound to live together in mutual respect and tolerance.

King Hussein was ennobled. Many times his life was threatened, but each brush with mortality ennobled him. He learned that God only gives us a limited number of opportunities and that we must make the most of them. Surely, he did.

As he survived, Jordan survived. He grew in wisdom, and so did Jordan. He grew in stature, and so did Jordan. He won the respect and admiration of the entire world, and so did his beloved Jordan.

We remember his voice, each word slowly said, followed by a pause, a moment for silent reflection, as if he were reminding us that it is wise to think before we speak, to speak before we act. His manner was as strong and calming as his message.

We remember him piloting his plane, traveling wherever his cause took him; flying at night in the years when courage and stealth were required just to speak to one's enemies; soaring in the sunlight above Jerusalem when the peace he forged with Israel made that possible again.

He once said, "The beauty of flying high in the skies will always, to me, symbolize freedom." King Hussein lived his life on a higher plain. With the aviator's gift of seeing beyond the low-flying obstacles of hatred and mistrust that heartbreak and loss place in all our paths. He spent his life fighting for the dignified aspirations of his people and all Arab people. He worked all his life to build friendship between the Jordanian and American people. He dedicated the final years of his life to the promise not only of coexistence, but of partnership between the Arab world and Israel.

Indeed, he understood what must be clear now to anyone who has flown above the Middle East and seen in one panorama at sunset the lights of Amman and Tel Aviv and Damascus shining in the sky, that in the relationship among peoples who share this small,

sacred corner of Earth, one thing, and only one, is predestined -- all are bound to be neighbors; the question is not whether they will live side by side, but how. God willing, soon all will see what he saw and preached. There can be no peace, no dignity, no security of any of Abraham's children until there is peace, dignity and security for all of them.

During the Wye Summit, when the talks were not going so well, he came out within a few short minutes and changed the tenor of the meeting. Though frail with fighting for his own life, he gave life to the process many felt was failing. The smallest man in the room that day was the largest; the frailest was the strongest. The man with the least time remaining reminded us we are working not only for ourselves, but for all eternity.

To Queen Noor, I extend the heartfelt condolences of the American people. At times such as these, words are inadequate. But the friendship that joins Jordan and the United States, for which your marriage stood and your love still stands, that will never fail. You are a daughter of America, and a Queen of Jordan. You have made

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

Hillary and I are deeply saddened by the news that King Hussein of Jordan has passed away. I had prayed this day would not come soon. But God has called King Hussein to his reward. The prayers of all Americans go out to the royal family and the Jordanian people.

No words can convey what King Hussein meant to the people he led for nearly half a century. Words cannot convey what he meant to me as a friend and inspiration. Through good times and bad, through health and illness, he showed the power of a strong will applied to a worthy cause. It takes a rare kind of courage to be a peacemaker -- the courage to learn from the past and imagine a better future. When peace finally comes to the Middle East, his name will be inscribed upon it. That day, King Hussein will smile on us one more time.

I had the honor of seeing him just a few weeks ago, as he was about to return home. There was no hint of the struggle he was waging. Instead, he spoke with his usual passion and humanity about Jordan's well-being, the future of the Arab world, the Palestinian cause, and peace with Israel.

To Queen Noor, to Crown Prince Abdullah, to the King's family, and to the people of Jordan, Hillary and I send our condolences. The United States stands with you -- today, tomorrow, and in the future. I ask all Americans to remember this good man and his

family.
