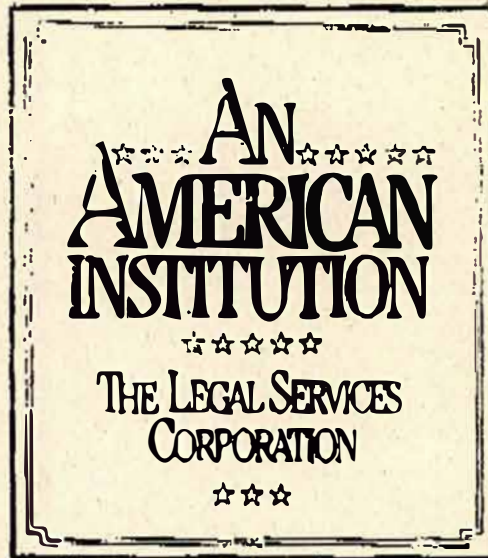

This dispute continued into 1983 when Senator Hatch reopened the issue in his July hearings. See, fn. 29, supra.

92. On Friday, June 11, 1981, a group of 21 national business leaders (e.g., W. Michael Blumenthal, chairman, Burroughs Corporation; Irving Shapiro, former chairman, E.I. duPont de Nemours and Co.; Thomas Murphy, former chairman, General Motors Corp.) sent a letter to every member of Congress urging support for continuation of the federally-funded civil legal services program. In addition, Advocates to Save Legal Services, a blue-ribbon panel supporting legal services, was formed in April of 1981. The co-chairmen were Walter Mondale and James Pearson (former Republican senator from Kansas). Over 150 prominent lawyers, former legislators, government officers, law school deans, business and labor leaders were included.

The Coalition consisted of the older organizations: NLADA, Project Advisory Group (PAG), Organization of Legal Services Back-Up Centers (OLSBUC), National Organization of Legal Services Workers (NOLSW) and the National Clients Council (NCC) and a range of newer organizations that had formed which included: Minority Caucus, Rural Advocacy Group, Women in Legal Services, Farmworker Caucus and National Association of Indian Legal Services Programs.

96. LSC's House supporters gave tremendous credit to the ABA. For example, Tom Mooney, the minority staff person for the House Judiciary Subcommittee, stated: "The credible lobbying (on this issue) was done by the ABA; they dumped money and time and lawyers into this project. They were the biggest help." Rick Goldstein, a staff aide to Rep. Barney Frank, commented on the effect of the ABA in diffusing hostile reaction to the social activism image of legal services:

But a lot of conservatives just had a sense of fairness, and were being very heavily influenced by the

Dear Melanne:

In reflecting further on the event at the White House, the principal emphasis appears to be focused on the observance of the first 20 years of the Legal Services Corporation and on the remarkable contribution of a great number of people in that effort. Equally important, however, and some would say, more so -- particularly in the current climate -- is the need to concentrate on the immediate and near term future in order to assure continuance of the program as we know it. One of my many learning experiences of the past nine months has been the discovery of major pockets of resistance to adequate funding for Legal Services, and Congressional attitudes ranging from indifference to hostility. In view of this, there is an essential need to build on the White House event in order to create a supportive environment throughout the country that will directly affect the views of those upon who we are dependent for our existence. This is one reason for seeking to promote the private bar presence at the White House observance because Legal Services needs the close cooperation and support of the profession to help us establish the presence we seek in local communities.

I do not know yet whether Roberta Ramo will be part of the program or whether or not anyone else will talk about our plans for the future (i.e., designating the week in May 1995, commencing with Law Day as Legal Services Week during which we would hope the major figures in each state, including elected officials, would participate in a number of events).

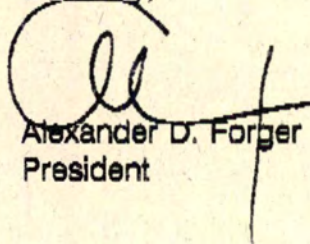

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The moral strength of the United States of America is rooted in the fundamental principle of liberty and justice for all. The Preamble to the Constitution reminds us that our great nation was founded, first and foremost, "to establish justice, and secure the blessings of liberty." Our Founders understood that liberty and justice go hand in hand.

The very nature of justice demands that it be available to all. Justice cannot be rationed. Justice cannot be accorded to some and not to others. The words "Equal Justice under the Law," inscribed over the portal of our highest court, represent a promise made to all Americans.

Twenty years ago the Legal Services Corporation was created to help keep that promise, promoting equal access to justice by making high quality legal assistance in civil matters available to those who would otherwise be unable to afford it.

In designing the Legal Services Corporation, Congress recognized the need for an independent entity, protected from political interference, to support local programs, accountable to their own communities, that provide poor Americans with legal representatives charged with the full freedom to protect their clients' best interests according to the highest standards of professional responsibility.

For two decades the Legal Services Corporation has fulfilled that mandate, supporting local legal services programs that operate under the direction of their own Boards of Directors made up of clients and representatives of the local bar. Today the Corporation supports 323 programs operating over 900 neighborhood offices across the nation. In addition, more than 130,000 private attorneys volunteer their time in activities associated with local legal services projects.

Legal services programs have provided assistance to more than 1.5 million people every year, vindicating their rights, resolving their disputes, and offering a means of helping themselves improve their lives. Dedicated attorneys, paralegals, staff, Board members and volunteers have worked with unflinching commitment under often adverse conditions to serve their clients' interests. Legal Services has won the respect of the judiciary, the organized bar, and the client community. For many Americans the existence of legal services has renewed their faith in our government of laws.

On the twentieth anniversary of the Legal Services Corporation I reaffirm our nation's commitment to equal access to justice and I voice my deep respect for those who have given so much to keep that principle alive over the years.

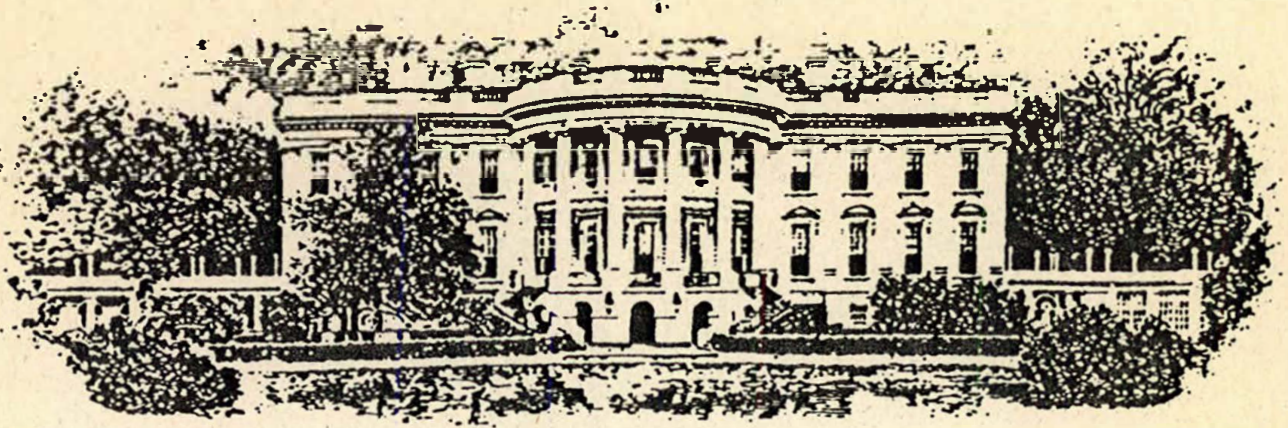

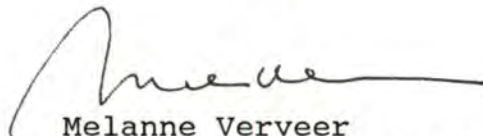
Dear Justice Powell:
