Hello Lissa! The Mosaic committee is putting together the program book for the May 3 event for which Mrs. Clinton has offered her good name as honorary chairman. They need as soon as possible (drop dead date is April 12) a letter from Mrs. Clinton to include in that program. I've attached a copy of last year's letter.

Mosaic has raised over \$900,000 for the event so far--extraordinary! Save the Children stands to get over a half million dollars if the expenses stay within reason. The one thing that Mosaic wants from Save the Children is our help in turning out VIPs--including government officials and press. STATEMENT BY THE OFFICE OF THE FIRST LADY

Washington, D.C. — The Office of the First Lady today notified sponsors of the Mosaic Foundation's May 3rd gala benefit that First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton would no longer be able to serve as the event's honorary chair.

A letter released by the Office of the First Lady to Princess Haifa Al-Faisal, chairman of the Mosaic Foundation Board of Trustees, said:

"As you know, First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton lends her name every year to numerous charitable causes. For the past three years, she has been pleased to serve as Honorary Chair of the Mosaic Foundation's gala benefits, which have generated much-needed support for St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital, National Race for the Cure, and Save the Children. While we understand that only a limited number of invitations are extended to the diplomatic corps, it has come to Mrs. Clinton's attention that the event's sponsors have chosen not to invite representatives of the Israeli government because certain Arab states do not recognize the state of Israel.

Under these circumstances, Mrs. Clinton will no longer be able to serve as honorary chair of the Mosaic Foundation event."

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
