EXCLUSIVE: INSIDE THE COLORFUL WHITE HOUSE OF HILLARY CLINTON

AS FIRST LADY, she has overseen the redecoration of more than 25 rooms at the world's most prominent home, The White House. But when it comes to choosing furnishings for the first private home she and her husband will share in more than 18 years, Hillary Rodham Clinton admitted to me, "It's a bit overwhelming." It's nice to know that even a first lady can panic at the sight of an empty room.

While decorating from scratch might be unfamiliar to her, I doubt Hillary will have any trouble choosing colors for their next residence. She says yellow has been her favorite for rooms since childhood. "Every home Bill and I have lived in has had yellow in it; one was yellow on the inside *and* the outside." On a private tour of the Clintons' family quarters at the White House (see the accompanying story by Doris Athineos, pages 96–103), the central hall and living room literally embraced us with the cheery, light-evoking hue. Other clues to Hillary's personal palette are revealed by the state rooms that were redecorated under her direction. Particularly memorable for me is the Blue Room, which is more dramatic than ever, dressed in a historically correct but intensely bright sapphire blue. A similar charge of blue is found in the art glass the Clintons display prominently in their upstairs spaces.

As Hillary and I sat together and paged through the *Traditional Home Signature Style* book on decorating, she quickly focused on certain objects and details. A Chinese Art Deco rug caught her eye, as did the hand-painted cornice in an Arts and Crafts-style home. And she *aahed* over billowing taffeta draperies in, yes, yellow. As she browsed the pages, I wondered if the Clintons' new home would have a decidedly eclectic twist to it.

While she is contemplative about her next home, Hillary openly expresses bittersweet sentiments about leaving the White House. "Even now, after being here eight years, I see new details every day—or see them differently," she remarked. Although she was overdue to tape a video and was hosting a dinner that evening, she lingered for parting words and handshakes. A commonplace gesture for a president's wife, of course, but a gesture that felt genuine.

My inside look at the White House has changed my perception of 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue. It may be wedding-cake white on the outside, but within, it's as colorful as its history.
