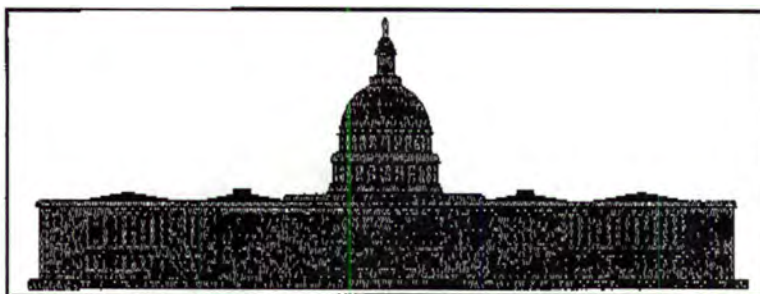

Subject: Russian PKU Specialists U.S. Visit

As part of the follow-up to our January, 1995 meeting with the First Lady, Bristol-Myers Squibb (BMS) has entered into a relationship with the Clinical Hospital of the St. Petersburg Pediatric Academy and the Georgetown University Children's Medical Center. Dr. Rennert, Chairman of Georgetown's Children's Medical Center, has put together a one-day training program for two prominent Russian PKU specialists:

- Dr. Alexander Baikov, and
- Dr. Natalia Kopilova

Dr. Baikov is in the Russian Ministry of Health and heads the Russian Federation and Moscow City Center of Neonatal Screening. He was with Mrs. Yeltsin when Ambassador Pickering symbolically presented her with BMS donation of PhenylFree on behalf of Mrs. Clinton.

Dr. Kopilova is the Chair of Children's Nutrition at the Moscow City Center of Neonatal Screening. Doctors Baikov and Kopilova will be accompanied by Julia J. Sporykhina, a BMS employee in Moscow.

Doctors Baikov and Kopilova will arrive Tuesday night (4/15/96) and will be in Washington until Saturday (4/20/96).

I appreciate your scheduling them to meet with Milann and your help in arranging a White House and VIP tour of the Monuments.

Enclosed is a copy of their personal data and an agenda for their Georgetown session.
