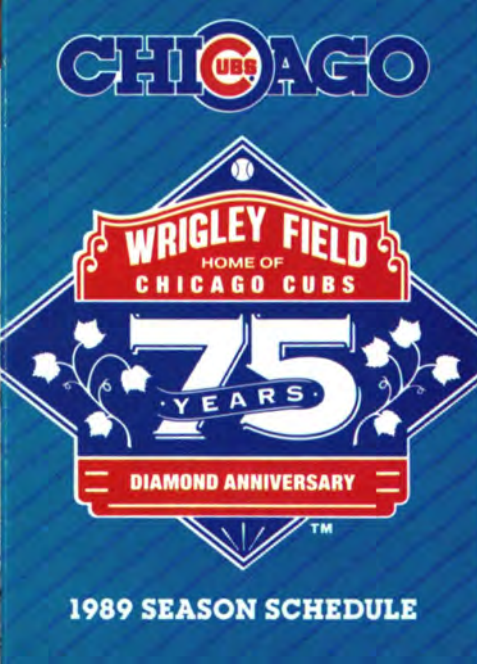

1992 FANTASY GUIDE

A marriage made in baseball heaven

Marriages and fantasy baseball are often at odds, with a husband more devoted to his team and boxscores than his wife and children.

But fantasy baseball didn't have that effect on Dick and Linda Kirschtens, of Chevy Chase, Md.

Linda was a fan of the game and a lifelong Cubs fan, but she remained aloof from the SHAG fantasy league that Dick played in for years. However, after enjoying success two years ago in a small office league based on pitching, Linda asked to become Dick's partner in SHAG last season.

Dick agreed, and a husband-wife franchise was born.

"Like any rookie, my job was to learn," Linda said. "Dick had been rating players, yet I hadn't a clue as to what went into those ratings, or even who some of the players were."

The Kirschtens ranked players in order of preference, and highlighted players they thought would be overlooked or underrated by their fellow owners. Linda decided to enter the names on a computer disk, to familiarize herself with the players and provide a readable reference for draft night.

That last bit proved helpful, for according to Dick: "I've always ended up with a jumble of lists on different pieces of paper that started sticking together as soon as I put the first beer glass on top of them on draft night."

Draft night

Linda was apprehensive as the couple drove to Joe Theismann's sports bar on draft night. But keeping all the papers straight wasn't the root of her jitters. It was thinking about her reception as SHAG's first female owner that had her nervous.

Linda wasn't the first woman to attend the draft, though. The year before, an owner's daughter had filled in for her father. She was there again last year, and Linda "was awfully glad to see her."

The draft went smoothly, with the Kirschtens grabbing David Cone and Barry Bonds in the first two rounds. Dick had had only one strategic idea during his offseason preparations for the draft: "Any Oakland starter ought to win at least 15 games, and Mike Moore, coming off a bad year, might be a bargain." He had forgotten about Moore by draft day, but Linda didn't.

"That was the first time I'd ever been to a SHAG draft with a partner who actually remembered anything said in strategy sessions," said Dick. He added that their "impulse purchases" were fewer than he expected.

"That's not to say we didn't have to indulge Linda's passion for the Cubbies by drafting Mike Harkey. Shortly after, he broke down, enabling us to pick up Scott Erickson, just starting to move toward a 20-win season."

'Miss pitching'

Thanks to Linda — dubbed "Miss Pitching" by the league commissioner — the Kirschtens were pretty strong on the mound. But holes abounded in the offense, glaringly at first, second base and in the outfield. Dick said it was due to a combination of injuries and incompetence. "Let's face it," he said. "Not once has the commissioner referred to me as 'Mr. Hitting.'"

The Kirschtens began making moves, primarily stockpiling their pitching reserves. Most decisions were made over breakfast, sparing Dick the past experience of "odious partners who don't return phone calls." The negotiations between husband and wife were civil, but hardnosed. And again, Linda showed her prowess at picking pitchers.

"At one point, I thought it might be gallant to keep Stan Belinda, thinking Linda might be charmed that I considered his name a good-luck omen," Dick said. "After weighing the choices, Linda scribbled her decision on a scrap of paper — Alejandro Pena. He finished 8-1-15 with a 2.40 ERA."

Linda's recollection of the various crises that occurred during the summer is a bit un-

clear, but she said each was an eye-opener in terms of how the league operates: "How to use the 'sub' hitter; what to do with players who are injured and when; what kind of balance — ERA vs. strikeouts, batting average vs. stolen bases — you're looking for when picking up a player."

But she said the most enlightening realization was that regardless of the figuring and fidgeting, much of a team's failure or success depends on luck. She notes the case of Pena, who wasn't getting much time with the Mets and was traded to the sizzling Braves a week before SHAG rosters were frozen.

'Happy vacation'

The Kirschtens took their "summer" vacation at their customary time — late September and early October. They were in the hunt for a second-place finish and took high hopes (and a calculator) to the West Coast. The time difference made it difficult to keep up with the boxscores from back East, but after visiting three or four news-

stands, they managed to piece everything together.

"I'm talking happy vacation," Dick said. "For the first time, there were no funny looks as I tried to organize each day around the search for newspapers."

The papers were filled with good news. Over the last 10 days of the season, their batters combined for a .321 average and their pitchers a 2.68 ERA. After residing in seventh place in mid-September, the Kirschtens surged to third place in the 22-team league, coming close to second.

Dick figures such a strong finish with a rookie partner means a pennant this year.

She and Dick returned to Theismann's for SHAG's Awards Night. "Everyone was friendly, and I wasn't nearly so aware of the 'gender gap' as I'd been six months earlier — which made me think I'd imagined it in the first place."

(She added, "incidentally," the team that edged the Kirschtens out of second place was the other with female participation).

Art of compromise

The Kirschtens said a husband-wife fantasy baseball partnership isn't for everyone. Both parties have to love the game and each other. Both parties must be willing to share the sports section. And both must be honest in their views about trades or pickups, willing to compromise, or at least flip a coin.

Spring approaches, with Opening Day in close pursuit. Soon fantasy league baseball will make six-month widows out of thousands of women. But couples meeting the Kirschtens' requirements might find co-ownership can work, and it can be a lot of fun.

If not, at least it worked and was a lot of fun for Dick and Linda Kirschtens in 1991.

The Hot-Stove Reading League

Baseball's Winter Meetings are long over. Free agents have negotiated whopping contracts. Trades are still in the wind. Before you know it, pitchers and catchers will be in camp. While the game's powers-that-be are busy at work, now is a great time for semi-idle fans to catch up on their reading. And since more than 100 baseball books rolled off the presses in 1991, there are plenty of titles from which to choose. After a season-long perusal, here's a recommended reading list.

BASEBALL UNIFORMS OF THE 20TH CENTURY: Official Major League Baseball Guide (Sterling, \$35), written and illustrated by Mark Okkonen.

This is one of the most handsome baseball books ever. It presents a team-by-team uniform history in words and pictures, plus a year-by-year look at uniforms since 1900. Newspaper headlines from each year provide perspective.

Such oddities as the shorts worn by the White Sox, night satins of the Boston Braves and St. Patrick's Day greens of the Cincinnati Reds are included, along with various patches, belts, socks, caps, and even numbers. In all, Okkonen covers 3,000 uniforms from 92 years.

TOTAL BASEBALL: Second Edition (Warner Books, \$49.95), edited by John Thorn and Pete Palmer.

This updated edition of a reference book first published in 1989 is a great bargain at 2,629 pages—or less than two cents per page. There are no photos, so every inch is packed with reference material: player records, year-by-year histories, post-season stats, voting for awards and Hall of Fame, plus ball parks, the minors, Negro Leagues, families, media coverage, scandals, women in baseball, and even the hobby of collecting.

BASEBALL IN '41 (Viking, \$19.95), by Robert W. Creamer.

Ted Williams plays a major role in this book, though Creamer takes



great pains to explain that much more happened in 1941 than Williams' .406 season or Joe DiMaggio's 56-game hitting streak. Creamer makes a strong case that '41 was, besides the end of the pre-war era, the best baseball season ever. Injecting the history of those turbulent times, Creamer recollects such figures as Leo Durocher, Larry MacPhail, Bob Feller, Hank Greenberg, Williams and DiMaggio.

THE CHICAGO CUBS: An Illustrated History and THE ST. LOUIS CARDINALS: An Illustrated History (Prentice Hall Press, \$24.95), by Donald Honig.

Twin volumes capture the flavor and feeling of two of the game's most colorful teams. Because both books devote more space to photos than prose, they resemble hard-cover team yearbooks that span a century rather than a single season.

TED WILLIAMS: A Portrait in Words And Pictures (Walker & Company, \$24.95), edited by Dick Johnson, written by Glen Stout, with guest essays.

Last year's 50th an-

niversary of the Splendid Splinter's remarkable .406 season prompted several tributes, but none better than this heavily illustrated work. It contains rare photos of Williams as youngster, soldier and fisherman, plus reprints of famous cartoons from *The Sporting News* and 24 pages of detailed career stats.

PERFECT! 14 Pitchers Of Perfect Games (McFarland & Company, \$25.95), by Ronald A. Mayer.

A redefinition of baseball rules adopted in 1991 cost Ernie Shore (1917) and Harvey Haddix (1959) their perfect games. But Mayer wisely includes them on the list of 14 pitchers who had a one-game moment of glory—retiring all 27 hitters they faced.

The heartbreak of Haddix, perfect for 12 innings before losing 1-0 in the 13th, is captured in words, as is the exuberation of Jim Bunning, a father of seven who was perfect on Father's Day. Chapters detail each pitcher's career, plus the box score of each "perfecto."

THE SPORTS ENCYCLOPEDIA: BASEBALL (St. Martin's Press, \$18.95), by David S. Neft and Richard M. Cohen.

The 11th edition of this paperback remains a valued source for baseball writers, researchers and fans. It contains detailed year-by-year statistics of each league and team, listings of award winners, yearly and lifetime leaders and career player records. It chronicles the game by

dividing it into various periods (i.e. the DH era).

I HAD A HAMMER: The Hank Aaron Story (HarperCollins, \$21.95), by Henry Aaron with Lonnie Wheeler.

The home run king traces his steps from boyhood in the segregated South to stardom in the majors. But Aaron doesn't gloss over the battles with racism that occurred along the way: living apart from the team during spring training, eating in separate restaurants and coping with hate mail that attacked a black man for threatening the records of a white baseball legend. He also reveals the underlying racism that still pervades baseball.

THE HOME RUN HEARD 'ROUND THE WORLD (HarperCollins, \$19.95), by Ray Robinson.

This time the focus is 1951, and the Brooklyn Dodgers are still fighting for that elusive pennant. Of course, they won't get it—finishing on the wrong end of Bobby Thomson's dramatic homer. Robinson brings the Polo Grounds and Ebbets Field back to life as he recalls the Gi-



ants' race to the pennant after a mid-August deficit of 13 1/2 games.

WE COULD'VE FINISHED LAST WITHOUT YOU (Longstreet Press, \$16.95), by Bob Hope.

No, not that Bob Hope. This one was an Atlanta Stadium usher before he became publicist and promotions director—with freedom to do anything necessary to draw fans of what used to be baseball's worst team: ostrich and bathtub races, cash giveaways and a Farrah Fawcett look-alike contest. There's plenty of baseball in the background, but always with promotions in the foreground.

THE BASEBALL CARD FLIPPING, TRADING AND BUBBLE GUM BOOK (Ticknor & Fields, \$10.95), by Brendan C. Boyd and Fred C. Harris.

This irreverent look at the game through its cards is the funniest baseball book ever written (eat your heart out, Jim Bouton). Inspired explanations accompany full-color baseball cards and poke fun at everyone.

BASEBALL'S WORST TEAMS: On A Clear Day, They Could See Seventh Place (Dell, \$8.95), by George Robinson and Charles Salzberg.

Had this been written at the end of the '91 season, it could have included the 57-105 Cleveland Indians. Even without them, the authors found some pretty bad teams—ranging from Joe Garagiola's 1952 Pirates (42-112) to the original Mets 10 years later (40-120) and, most recently, the 1988 Baltimore Orioles (54-107).

For Fergie, Fame's a Family Affair

A special person will be in the audience July 21 when Ferguson Jenkins goes into the Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, N.Y.

Ferguson Holmes Jenkins, who played in the Canadian Negro league, not only is Fergie's father, but his best friend. It was Ferguson Holmes' advice that carried his son to the Hall: "Whatever you start, finish."

"I never forgot that," Fergie Jenkins said. "I even heard it from [former Cubs manager] Leo Durocher. He'd give me the ball and say, 'Here it is, Jenkins! Go nine!' He must have got that from my dad."

Thanks to members of Legion Post 431 in Chatham, Ontario, Canada, Ferguson Holmes will be coming by bus to the induction ceremonies. He's 84 and has crippling arthritis.

As a young man, Ferguson Holmes spent his winters as a chef on steamers in the Great Lakes. When only child Fergie was a boy, his father settled down in Chatham to a variety of stable and chauffeur jobs.

Fergie's daughters from a previous marriage, Kelly Lorraine and Dolores Rene, also are planning to attend.

There will be two missing persons, however. Jenkins' mother, Delores Louise, died of cancer and second wife, Mary Anne, passed away at age 31, just a few days after Jenkins' January 8 election.

His mother was blind from optic-nerve pressure while Fergie was being born. But it didn't dissuade her. She belonged to Chatham's Blind Sertoma Club, serving as its president for two years, and once bowled a 270 by holding on to a guide rail.

"I would be with her to tell her what was still standing—the seven pin, the nine pin," Fergie said.

"One of my greatest games came when she 'saw' me pitch for the first time. I didn't know she was coming until the second or third inning, when someone told me where she was sitting. I did what dad always said and finished what I started. She was so proud. I still miss her."

And, of course, he'll always miss Mary Anne. She seemed to be recovering from a December 9 auto accident, "but pneumonia set in and it was pretty quick after that," Jenkins said.

However, Mary Anne's son from a previous marriage, 11-year-old Raymond, is expected to be in Cooperstown, and possibly Samantha Jenkins, who will almost be 2 years old.

"Raymond knows his mother won't be coming back," said Jenkins, who lives in Guthrie, Okla. "We talk all the time, cooperate together. He's becoming a little man. Our daughter calls for her mother sometimes when she wakes up, but mostly she calls for me. I'm right there as soon as I hear her."

Those Memorial Days

April 8 marked the Baltimore Orioles' final opening day at Memorial Stadium. After 38 seasons in the venerable old park on 33rd Street, the team will move into a new park in Camden Yards for the 1992 season.

Memorial Stadium is "baseball's best-kept secret," says Bob Wood in his 1988 book "Dodger Dogs to Fenway Franks," a diary of a summer-long tour of all 26 major league ballparks. While to some fans Memorial Stadium may lack the nostalgia associated with classic parks like Fenway Park, Wrigley Field and old Comiskey Park, this season will be the last to discover exactly what Wood had in mind.

On your next trip to Memorial Stadium ignore the traffic and parking conditions and concentrate on the rarity of a tree-lined approach through a residential neighborhood to a major league ballpark. Then as you enter Memorial Stadium, notice how the decades of activity and aromas seem to be locked into the structure of the stadium itself.

Think back to that day in April of 1954, when a young vice president named Richard Nixon threw out the first ball to welcome the Orioles' major league return to Baltimore. Recall the Hall of Famers who have performed there—Brooks Robinson, Frank Robinson, Jim Palmer, Mickey Mantle, Al Kaline, Ted Williams, Carl Yastrzemski, Harmon Killebrew and others. Think of the excitement generated by six World Series (with three championships), two additional American

League East Division titles, some near misses and one All-Star Game.

Look to the third base area—Brooks Robinson's hot corner—and to the pitcher's mound, where Jim Palmer perfected the art of pitching from a backdrop of those white houses behind center field. His delivery motion kept batters on the defensive and helped put him into the Hall of Fame.

Beyond center field, notice the trees and grassy embankment within the stadium—unusual in the modern age of ballparks. During the first two seasons, a hedge served as the center-field fence, connecting the ends of the outfield grandstands and making the home-run distance a Ruthian 450 feet instead of the current 405 feet.

Look at the shortstop's area, where Cal Ripken's defense and consecutive-games streak (plus his power hitting) have destined him for a ticket to Cooperstown. Look to the bleachers, so often the target of dingers off the bats of sluggers like Eddie Murray, Jim Gentile and Boog Powell. As late as 1976, some bleacher seats sold for 85 cents, the last time a seat in a major league ballpark could be had for under a buck.

Now look back to home plate, the site of many celebrated rhubarbs between Earl Weaver and the umpires, and down the left field line, at 309 feet the shortest in the major leagues. Down that line is the site of the tomato patches, where Earl Weaver and

groundskeeper Pat Santarone did battle for many seasons. Down the right field line—also 309 feet, and the next to shortest right field line in the majors behind Fenway Park's 302 feet—is the spot where Al Kaline's 3,000th hit fell in 1974. In both outfield corners, the sharp angles of the walls breaking toward center field caused decades of havoc for visiting outfielders chasing weird caroms.

Also notice the American League team flags along the top of the stadium, indicating the league standings in order, beginning in the far reaches of the outfield and working back to the upper deck area behind home plate. Atop the left-field bleachers is a flag simply marked "Here," designating the spot where a Frank Robinson home run in 1966 flew out of the ballpark. It hadn't happened before, and it hasn't happened since.

As you leave Memorial Stadium, read the words on the facade, which dedicate the park to those who fought and died in the world wars. At the bottom of the inscription are the words, "Time Will Not Dim the Glory of Their Deeds." Nor will time dim Memorial Stadium's contributions to the lore of major league baseball.

We look forward to Camden Yards, but what we leave behind will be sorely missed.

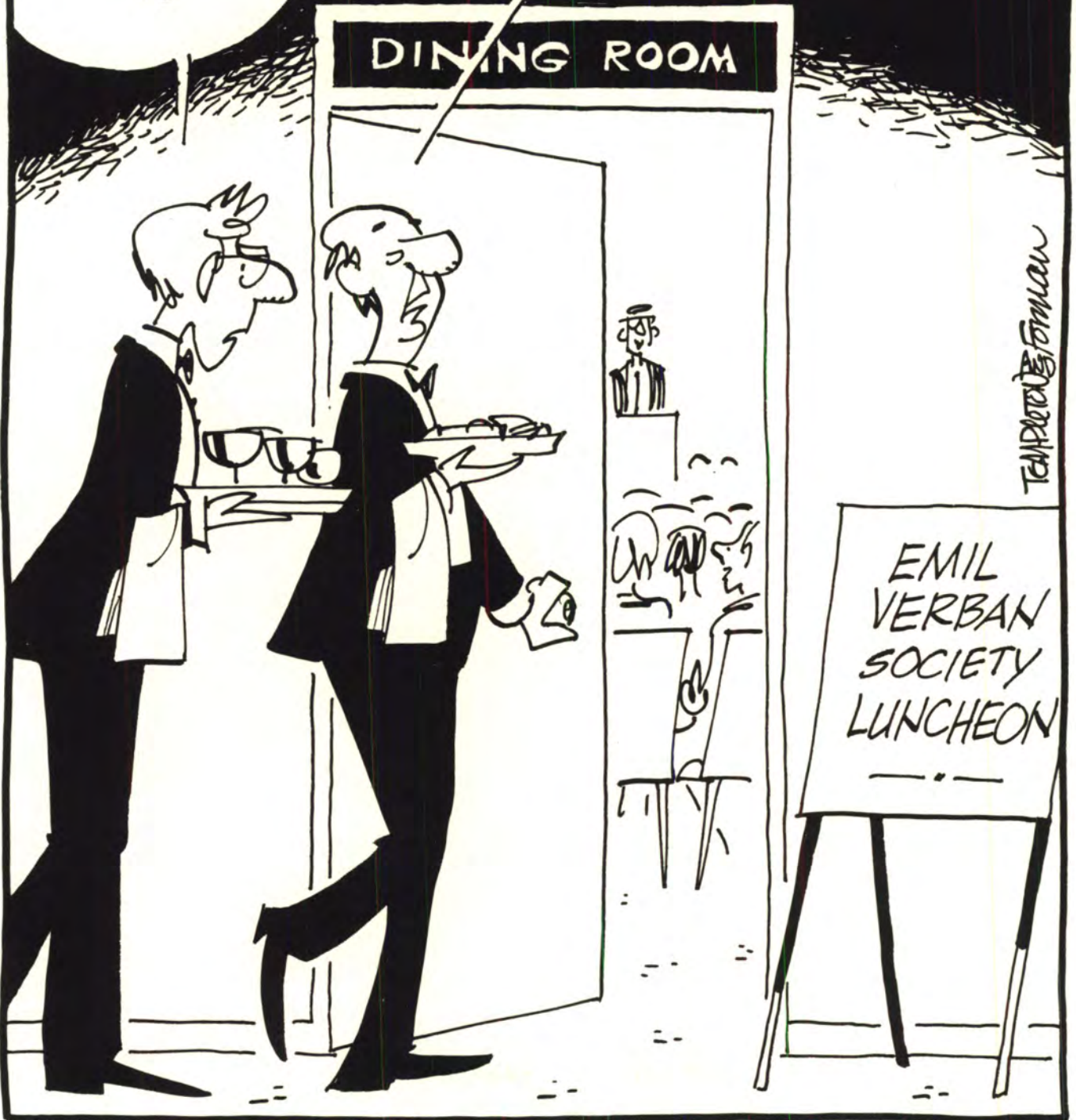
