1. PLEASE PASS THE MESSAGE AT PARA 2 FROM THE SECRETARY TO OUTGOING PRESIDENT WEIZMAN. THE DEPARTMENT DOES NOT PLAN TO RELEASE THE TEXT OF THE MESSAGE BUT HAS NO OBJECTION IF GOVERNMENT OF ISRAEL WISHES TO DO SO. NO SIGNED ORIGINAL WILL FOLLOW.

2. BEGIN TEXT:

DEAR MR. PRESIDENT:

AS YOU LEAVE OFFICE, I WISH TO EXPRESS MY GRATITUDE FOR YOUR EXTRAORDINARY DEDICATION TO THE CLOSE PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN ISRAEL AND THE UNITED STATES AND TO OUR JOINT SEARCH FOR A LASTING PEACE BETWEEN ISRAEL AND HER NEIGHBORS. WE ARE NOW ENGAGED IN A MAJOR EFFORT AT CAMP DAVID TO SECURE AN ENDURING PEACE FOR ISRAEL AND THE PALESTINIANS. OUR WORK HERE STANDS AS A TESTAMENT TO YOUR COURAGEOUS VOICE, WHICH CONSISTENTLY AND UNFAILINGLY UNDERScoreD THE NEED FOR ALL PARTIES TO LEAVE THE PAST

BEHIND AND TO MOVE INTO A SHARED FUTURE OF HOPE AND UNDERSTANDING. AS YOU COMPLETE A LONG AND DISTINGUISHED CAREER, YOU CAN TAKE SATISFACTION IN KNOWING THAT YOUR VISION WILL ENDURE.

REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT ON THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF
VIETNAM BILATERAL TRADE AGREEMENT

THE ROSE GARDEN

THE PRESIDENT: GOOD AFTERNOON, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, JUST
A FEW MOMENTS AGO, AMBASSADOR BARSHEFSKY AND MINISTER VU
KHOAN SIGNED AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND
VIETNAM THAT WILL DRAMATICALLY OPEN VIETNAM'S ECONOMY,
FURTHER INTEGRATE IT INTO THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY AND
INCREASE TRADE BETWEEN OUR TWO NATIONS. AND SO FROM THE
BITTER PAST, WE PLANT THE SEEDS OF A BETTER FUTURE.

THIS IS ANOTHER HISTORIC STEP IN THE PROCESS OF
NORMALIZATION, RECONCILIATION AND HEALING BETWEEN OUR TWO
NATIONS. IMPROVEMENTS IN THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE UNITED
STATES AND VIETNAM HAVE DEPENDED FROM THE BEGINNING UPON
PROGRESS IN DETERMINING THE FATE OF AMERICANS WHO DID NOT
RETURN FROM THE WAR.

IN 1994, WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE MEMBERS OF CONGRESS STANDING
WITH ME HERE AND OTHERS, I LIFTED THE TRADE EMBARGO ON
VIETNAM IN RESPONSE TO ITS COOPERATION ON THE POW/MIA ISSUE.
A YEAR LATER, I NORMALIZED DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS BETWEEN OUR
TWO NATIONS TO FURTHER THIS GOAL. AS FURTHER PROGRESS WAS
MADE IN 1996, I APPOINTED FORMER CONGRESSMAN PETE
PETERSON--HIMSELF, A FORMER PRISONER OF WAR - TO BE OUR
UNITED STATES AMBASSADOR IN VIETNAM.

WITH THE INDISPENSABLE HELP OF KEY CONGRESSIONAL ALLIES,
ESPECIALLY SENATOR JOHN KERRY AND SENATOR JOHN MCCAIN,

SENATOR BOB KERREY AND SENATOR CHUCK HAGEL AND SENATOR CHUCK ROBB; REPRESENTATIVE RICK BOUCHER, REPRESENTATIVE REYES, WHO IS HERE, REPRESENTATIVE MANZULLO, REPRESENTATIVES LANE EVANS, KOLBE, BEREUTER AND MCDERMOTT, THIS PROCESS HAS WORKED.

SINCE 1993, WE HAVE UNDERTAKEN 39 JOINT RECOVERY OPERATIONS WITH VIETNAM, AND THE NUMBER OR 40 IS UNDERWAY AS WE SPEAK. ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-FIVE AMERICAN FAMILIES HAVE RECEIVED THE REMAINS OF THEIR LOVED ONES, AND WE'RE IN THE PROCESS OF IDENTIFYING ANOTHER 150 POSSIBLE SETS OF REMAINS. TIME AND AGAIN, THE VIETNAMESE PEOPLE HAVE SHARED THEIR MEMORIES WITH AMERICANS. AND WE, TOO, HAVE SOUGHT TO HELP VIETNAM IN ITS OWN SEARCH FOR ANSWERS.

OUR NATION HAS ALSO FELT A SPECIAL SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY TO THOSE PEOPLE IN VIETNAM WHOSE FAMILIES WERE TORN APART DURING AND AFTER THE WAR. IN THE LAST FEW YEARS, WE'VE MADE TREMENDOUS PROGRESS IN RESETTLING TENS OF THOUSANDS OF VIETNAMESE REFUGEES IN THE UNITED STATES, CLOSING YET ANOTHER PAINFUL CHAPTER.

AND VIETNAM HAS DONE MUCH TO TURN ITS FACE TOWARD A CHANGING WORLD. IT HAS WORKED TO OPEN ITS ECONOMY AND MOVE INTO THE MAINSTREAM OF SOUTHEAST ASIA AS A MEMBER OF THE ASSOCIATION OF SOUTHEAST ASIAN NATIONS AND APEC. OUR TRADING RELATIONS HAVE ALSO GROWN. WHEN I TOOK OFFICE OUR EXPORTS TO VIETNAM TOTALED JUST \$4 MILLION. TODAY, THEY STAND AT \$291 MILLION.

THE AGREEMENT WE SIGNED TODAY, WILL DRAMATICALLY OPEN VIETNAM'S MARKETS ON EVERYTHING FROM AGRICULTURE TO INDUSTRIAL GOODS TO TELECOMMUNICATIONS PRODUCTS, WHILE CREATING JOBS BOTH IN VIETNAM AND IN THE UNITED STATES.

WITH THIS AGREEMENT, VIETNAM HAS AGREED TO SPEED ITS OPENING TO THE WORLD; TO SUBJECT IMPORTANT DECISIONS TO THE RULE OF LAW AND THE INTERNATIONAL TRADING SYSTEM; TO INCREASE THE FLOW OF INFORMATION TO ITS PEOPLE; BY INVITING COMPETITION IN, TO ACCELERATE THE RISE OF A FREE MARKET ECONOMY AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR WITHIN VIETNAM, ITSELF. WE HOPE EXPANDING TRADE WILL GO HAND IN HAND WITH STRENGTH AND RESPECT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS AND LABOR STANDARDS. FOR WE LIVE IN AN AGE WHERE WEALTH IS GENERATED BY THE FREE EXCHANGE OF IDEAS AND STABILITY DEPENDS ON DEMOCRATIC CHOICES. BY SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT, VIETNAM TAKES AN IMPORTANT STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION.

WE'VE BEEN WORKING ON THIS AGREEMENT SINCE 1996, AND THERE

ARE MANY PEOPLE WHO DESERVE RECOGNITION. I WANT TO SAY A SPECIAL THANKS TO OUR TRADE REPRESENTATIVE, AMBASSADOR BARSHEFSKY; OUR DEPUTY USTR, RICHARD FISHER; JOE DAMOND, OF USTR, FOR WORKING SO HARD IN THE LAST FOUR YEARS TO TURN AGREEMENT INTO REALITY.

I WOULD ALSO LIKE TO THANK THEIR VIETNAMESE COUNTERPARTS: TRADE MINISTER VU KHOAN; CHIEF NEGOTIATOR NGUYEN DINH LUONG. AND I WANT TO SAY A SPECIAL WORD OF THANKS ALSO TO VIETNAMESE AMBASSADOR LA VAN BANG AND TO OUR AMBASSADOR PETE PETERSON, WHO HAVE WORKED SO HARD TO BUILD TIES AMONG OUR NATIONS AND OUR PEOPLE.

AND LET ME SAY, AGAIN, IT IS MY OPINION THAT NONE OF THIS WOULD HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE HAD IT NOT BEEN FOR THE VISIONARY AND BRAVE AND RECONCILING LEADERSHIP OF THE AMERICANS IN THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS WHO SERVED, MANY OF WHOM SUFFERED, IN UNCLAS SECTION 03 OF 09 STATE 135341

VIETNAM; ESPECIALLY THOSE WHO ARE HERE WITH ME AND THE OTHERS WHOSE NAMES I MENTIONED EARLIER. OUR DEBT TO THEM AS A NATION IS IMMENSE.

THIS AGREEMENT IS ONE MORE REMINDER THAT FORMER ADVERSARIES CAN COME TOGETHER TO FIND COMMON GROUND IN A WAY THAT BENEFITS ALL THEIR PEOPLE, TO LET GO OF THE PAST AND EMBRACE THE FUTURE, TO FORGIVE AND TO RECONCILE. AS ALL OF YOU KNOW, THAT IS WHAT WE ARE NOW TRYING TO ACHIEVE AT CAMP DAVID IN WHAT MANY BELIEVE IS THE MOST DIFFICULT OF ALL HISTORICAL CIRCUMSTANCES.

THIS DAY IS ENCOURAGING TO ME, AND I WILL TAKE THE ENERGY I FEEL HERE FROM ALL THESE PEOPLE BACK TO CAMP DAVID AND MAKE THE ARGUMENT THAT THEY SHOULD FOLLOW SUIT. THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

Q. MR. PRESIDENT, YOU'VE TALKED ABOUT GOING TO VIETNAM. ARE YOU PLANNING TO GO TO VIETNAM AFTER THE APEC MINISTERIAL IN NOVEMBER?

THE PRESIDENT: I HAVEN'T MADE A DECISION YET.

Q. MR. PRESIDENT, HAVE YOU SEEN THE VIDEOTAPE OF THE BEATING THAT A SUSPECT APPARENTLY TOOK AT THE HANDS OF THE PHILADELPHIA POLICE YESTERDAY, AND ARE YOU CONCERNED ABOUT IT? HAVE YOU ASKED ANY OF THE AUTHORITIES TO LOOK INTO IT?

THE PRESIDENT: NO, I HAVEN'T SEEN IT, BECAUSE I'VE BEEN PRETTY ISOLATED IN THE PEACE TALKS; BUT I'VE BEEN BRIEFED ABOUT IT. THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT IS LOOKING INTO IT. AND WHEN I WAS IN BALTIMORE ON THE WAY DOWN HERE TODAY, I SPOKE

BRIEFLY WITH MAYOR STREET. AND HE ASSURED ME THAT HE WAS GOING TO GO HOME AND HANDLE IT IN THE APPROPRIATE WAY, AND I TRUST HIM. HE'S A STRONG MAN AND A GOOD MAN, AND I THINK HE WILL DO WHAT IS RIGHT.

Q. SIR, IS ANY SUBSTANTIAL PROGRESS BEING MADE AT CAMP DAVID? AND THERE SEEMS TO BE SOME CONFUSION ABOUT WHETHER YOU WILL ALLOW THE PALESTINIAN OPPOSITION FIGURES TO COME IN TO SEE CHAIRMAN ARAFAT.

THE PRESIDENT: I THINK I SHOULD SAY NOTHING ABOUT WHAT'S GOING ON A CAMP DAVID; THE LESS I SAY, THE GREATER OUR CHANCES OF SUCCESS.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

WHEN PRESIDENT CLINTON ENDED THE TRADE EMBARGO ON VIETNAM.

-- THE BILATERAL TRADE AGREEMENT, IF APPROVED BY CONGRESS, GRANTS VIETNAM NORMAL TRADING RIGHTS (NTR) IN EXCHANGE FOR COMMITMENTS TO OPEN ITS MARKETS TO U.S. TRADE AND INVESTMENT.

Q. WHAT IS THE IMPACT OF THIS EVENT ON OVERALL U.S. FOREIGN POLICY?

A. FOLLOWING VIETNAM'S DECISIONS TO JOIN THE ASSOCIATION OF SOUTHEAST ASIAN NATIONS AND THE ASIA PACIFIC ECONOMIC COMMUNITY, VIETNAM'S SIGNATURE OF THE BILATERAL TRADE AGREEMENT IS A NEW MILESTONE ON THE PATH TOWARD VIETNAM'S FULL INTEGRATION INTO THE GLOBAL ECONOMY AND THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY.

-- WE HOPE EXPANDED TRADE WILL GO HAND IN HAND WITH STRENGTH AND RESPECT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS AND LABOR STANDARDS.

-- WE LIVE IN AN AGE WHERE PROSPERITY IS PROMOTED BY THE FREE EXCHANGE OF IDEAS AND STABILITY DEPENDS ON DEMOCRATIC CHOICES. BY SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT, VIETNAM TAKES AN IMPORTANT STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION.

CONTEXT: ON JULY 13, PRESIDENT CLINTON ANNOUNCED THE SIGNING OF THE U.S.-VIETNAM BILATERAL TRADE AGREEMENT BY USTR BARSHEFSKY AND TRADE MINISTER VU KHOAN. THE AGREEMENT, IF APPROVED BY CONGRESS, PROVIDES VIETNAM NORMAL TRADING RIGHTS (NTR) IN EXCHANGE FOR COMMITMENTS TO OPEN VIETNAM'S MARKETS TO U.S. TRADE AND INVESTMENT. THE SIGNING COINCIDED WITH THE FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE NORMALIZATION OF BILATERAL RELATIONS AND IS THE NEXT MAJOR STEP TOWARD COMPLETING THE PROCESS OF NORMALIZING RELATIONS WITH VIETNAM.

6. INDONESIA: ASSISTANCE TO ATTORNEY GENERAL

Q. CAN YOU GIVE US DETAILS OF THE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE THAT THE U.S. IS APPARENTLY PROVIDING TO THE INDONESIAN ATTORNEY GENERAL?

A. AS PART OF A COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAM OF ASSISTANCE TO HELP THE INDONESIAN GOVERNMENT REFORM AND STRENGTHEN ITS JUSTICE SECTOR OVER THE NEXT SEVERAL YEARS, THE U.S. GOVERNMENT -- AT THE REQUEST OF THE INDONESIAN GOVERNMENT -- HAS PROVIDED TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE ON INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION OF GROSS HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS TO THE INDONESIAN COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS (KOMNASHAM) AND THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE. THIS ASSISTANCE HAS BEEN RENDERED THROUGH SEMINARS LED BY INTERNATIONAL EXPERTS WITH WAR CRIMES EXPERIENCE AND FUNDED JOINTLY BY THE U.S. AND INDONESIAN GOVERNMENTS. THE USG HAS ALSO PROVIDED ASSISTANCE IN ESTABLISHING A WITNESS PROTECTION PROGRAM FOR INDONESIA.

THIS ASSISTANCE IS IN ADDITION TO TRAINING PROVIDED AT THE INTERNATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY IN BANGKOK, ADMINISTERED JOINTLY WITH THE THAI GOVERNMENT, WHERE INDONESIAN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS AND THEIR COUNTERPARTS IN THE REGION WILL PARTICIPATE IN A NUMBER OF INTENSIVE COURSES COVERING A RANGE OF LAW ENFORCEMENT ISSUES.

Q. IS AMBASSADOR KARTMAN GOING TO MEET HIS NORTH KOREAN COUNTERPART IN BERLIN NEXT WEEK?

EVENTUAL NORMALIZATION OF RELATIONS WITH THE DPRK IS CLEARLY ENVISIONED IN THE AGREED FRAMEWORK, AS THE DPRK IMPLEMENTS THE FRAMEWORK AND TAKES OTHER STEPS TO ADDRESS ISSUES OF CONCERN TO THE U.S.

CONTEXT: CANADIAN FOREIGN MINISTER LLOYD AXWORTHY SAID ON THURSDAY HIS COUNTRY WAS MOVING TOWARD NORMALIZING RELATIONS WITH PYONGYANG. AXWORTHY SAID HE HOPED TO DISCUSS RELATIONS WITH NORTH KOREAN FOREIGN MINISTER PAEK NAM-SUN IN BANGKOK ON JULY 25 OR 26. MARGARET HUBER, A SENIOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS OFFICIAL, IS CURRENTLY IN PYONGYANG.

9. FIJI: THREAT TO DEMOCRACY

Q. WHAT CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT THE CURRENT SITUATION IN FIJI?

A. OUR TRAVEL WARNING FOR FIJI WAS UPDATED YESTERDAY TO URGE AMERICANS TO DEPART FIJI BECAUSE OF THE INSTABILITY RESULTING FROM THE ONGOING POLITICAL CRISIS, AND THE RECENT TAKEOVER OF RESORTS IN FIJI.

-- WE UNDERSTAND THAT NO ADDITIONAL RESORTS WERE TAKEN OVER BY PROTESTORS YESTERDAY, THOUGH FOUR RESORTS REMAIN UNDER THEIR CONTROL.

-- WE HAVE NO REPORTS OF INJURIES TO AMERICANS IN FIJI AT THIS TIME.

-- THE EMBASSY CONTINUES TO COMMUNICATE WITH PRIVATE AMERICANS IN FIJI TO DETERMINE THEIR WELL BEING, UPDATE THEM ON THE SECURITY SITUATION, AND TO URGE THEM TO DEPART.

Q. WHAT CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT FIJI'S NEW GOVERNMENT?

A. WE UNDERSTAND THAT THE GREAT COUNCIL OF CHIEFS HAS NAMED FORMER VICE PRESIDENT RATU ILOILO TO BE PRESIDENT AND JOPE SENILOLI TO BE VICE PRESIDENT. NO NAMES HAVE BEEN GIVEN FOR PRIME MINISTER AND CABINET MINISTER POSITIONS.

Q. DOES THE U.S. AGREE WITH THE AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT'S CALL

FOR GEORGE SPEIGHT'S PROSECUTION?

A. A BLANKET IMMUNITY DECREE HAS BEEN ISSUED BY THE GREAT COUNCIL OF CHIEFS (GCC) FOR SPEIGHT AND HIS SUPPORTERS FOR POLITICAL CRIMES THEY COMMITTED BETWEEN MAY 19 AND JULY 13. WE AGREE WITH THE AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT'S VIEW THAT NO IMMUNITY IS WARRANTED FOR THE CRIMES COMMITTED BY SPEIGHT AND THE OTHER HOSTAGE TAKERS.

Q. HOW DOES THE U.S. VIEW THE PLAN ANNOUNCED AT THE GCC TO RESERVE THE POSITIONS OF PRESIDENT AND PRIME MINISTER FOR INDIGENOUS FIJIANS?

A. WE HAVE CONSISTENTLY CALLED FOR A RETURN TO CONSTITUTIONAL GOVERNMENT AND RESPECT FOR THE RIGHTS OF ALL UNCLAS SECTION 07 OF 09 STATE 135341

IF ASKED:

Q. DOES THE U.S. GOVERNMENT CONTINUE TO RECOGNIZE MAHENDRA CHAUDHRY AS PRIME MINISTER? IF NOT, WHY NOT?

A. AS WE HAVE STATED, IT IS CLEAR THAT AN EFFORT TO SEIZE POWER THROUGH UNCONSTITUTIONAL MEANS HAS BEEN UNDERWAY IN FIJI. THE U.S. HAS CONSISTENTLY CALLED FOR A RETURN TO LAWFUL, CONSTITUTIONAL GOVERNMENT IN FIJI. UNFORTUNATELY, FIJI'S POLITICAL CRISIS CONTINUES.

IN ADDITION, WE ARE DISAPPOINTED THAT THE HIGHLY OBJECTIONABLE "GAG" RULE LANGUAGE ON INTERNATIONAL FAMILY PLANNING REMAINS IN THE BILL.

-- THE BILL'S FY 2001 FUNDING LEVEL FOR FOREIGN OPERATIONS -- \$13.142 BILLION -- FALLS \$1.729 BILLION BELOW THE PRESIDENT'S REQUEST. THAT IS MORE THAN A 14 PERCENT CUT -- A LEVEL WHOLLY INADEQUATE TO ADVANCE AMERICA'S INTERESTS OVERSEAS.

-- SHOULD THESE SIGNIFICANT FUNDING SHORTFALLS AND THE OBJECTIONABLE FAMILY PLANNING PROVISIONS REMAIN IN THE BILL, THE PRESIDENT'S SENIOR ADVISERS WOULD RECOMMEND THAT HE VETO THE BILL.

-- THE HOUSE ZEROED OUT THE FUNDS REQUESTED FOR A NEW ANTI-TERRORISM AND SECURITY TRAINING CENTER AS WELL AS THE ADMINISTRATION'S REQUEST FOR A U.S. CONTRIBUTION TO THE INCREMENTAL COSTS OF THE TRIAL OF THE SUSPECTED LIBYAN TERRORISTS IN THE BOMBING OF PAN AM FLIGHT 103 OVER

LOCKERBIE, SCOTLAND. THESE ACTIONS ARE AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE ADMINISTRATION'S PLANS TO HELP REDUCE THE THREAT OF WORLDWIDE TERRORISM.

-- THE BILL ALSO REDUCES FUNDING FROM \$55 MILLION TO \$35 MILLION FOR KEDO, LEAVING INSUFFICIENT FUNDS TO PURCHASE NECESSARY SHIPMENTS OF FUEL OIL, WHICH WE ARE REQUIRED TO PAY UNDER THE AGREED FRAMEWORK.

A. FUNDING FOR HIPC AND FOR ADDITIONAL AIDS PREVENTION FUNDS IN THE CHILD SURVIVAL ACCOUNT IS AMONG THE ADMINISTRATION'S TOP PRIORITIES. THE FACT THAT FUNDS HAD TO COME FROM ANOTHER ADMINISTRATION PRIORITY HIGHLIGHTS THE LACK OF RESOURCES IN THE BILL.

Q. WILL THERE STILL BE MONEY IN THE FMF ACCOUNT FOR ISRAEL AND EGYPT?

A. THESE LEVELS ARE FAR BELOW THE LEVELS REQUESTED BY THE PRESIDENT. WITH THIS REDUCTION, WE WILL BE UNABLE TO FUND CRITICAL REGIONAL PRIORITIES. THIS SENDS THE WRONG SIGNAL, AT A TIME WHEN THE PARTIES ARE ACTIVELY ENGAGED IN EFFORTS TO COMPREHENSIVE PEACE HERE AT CAMP DAVID.
