INTERCONNECTION AND DIVISION OF REVENUE AMONG NETWORK
OPERATORS, IN WARSAW JANUARY 17. TERMS OF NETWORK
INTERCONNECTION AGREEMENTS NOW UNDER CONSIDERATION WILL
LARGELY DETERMINE WHETHER PLANNED MAJOR FOREIGN PRIVATE
INVESTMENT GOES FORWARD SOON IN RURAL AND REGIONAL
TELECOM NETWORKS IN POLAND. ALSO DISCUSSED WAS PLANNED
TELECOM REGULATION TRAINING IN POLAND, POSSIBLE
BRIEFINGS IN WASHINGTON THIS SPRING FOR POLISH
PARLIAMENTARIANS AND OTHERS IN CONNECTION WITH PENDING
TELECOM LEGISLATION, AND A POSSIBLE CONFIDENTIAL LEGAL

2. U.S. TEAM LED BY WARREN CLARK, SPECIAL ADVISOR,
STATE/CIP, MET JANUARY 17 WITH POLISH OFFICIALS LED BY
ANDRZEJ ZIELINSKI, MINISTER OF COMMUNICATIONS, TO

DISCUSS U.S. ASSISTANCE IN TELECOM LAWS AND REGULATIONS. TALKS FOCUSED ON REGULATION OF NETWORK INTERCONNECTION AND DIVISION OF LONG DISTANCE AND INTERNATIONAL REVENUES BETWEEN LOCAL NETWORK OPERATORS AND THE NATIONAL CARRIER (TPSA, THE POLISH NATIONAL TELEPHONE COMPANY).

3. U.S. CONSULTANT JANICE OBUCHOWSKI SAID THE NETWORK INTERCONNECTION ISSUE SHOULD BE ADDRESSED QUICKLY IN ORDER TO INCREASE INVESTMENT IN LOCAL NETWORKS. TPSA WILL BE WEALTHIER THE MORE NEW TRAFFIC IS GENERATED BY THE NEW INVESTMENT. SHE NOTED THAT A QUICK AGREEMENT COULD BE SUBJECT TO REVIEW AND MODIFICATION AFTER A FEW YEARS.

4. THE MINISTER AGREED, NOTING THAT TPSA DOES NOT LIKE COMPETITION. HE NOTED HIS POWERS AS MINISTER ARE LIMITED UNDER THE CURRENT LAW TO INDUCE TPSA TO REACH AN AGREEMENT. FOR THAT REASON HE HOPES TO HAVE THE LAW AMENDED SOON. DEPUTY MINISTER POPIOLEK NOTED THAT THERE HAVE BEEN MANY STUDIES ABOUT THE INTERCONNECTION PROBLEM. WHAT IS NEEDED NOW IS SPECIFIC HELP FROM EXPERTS ABOUT EXACTLY WHAT SHOULD BE DONE. THE MINISTER SAID IN SUMMARY HE WOULD LIKE COOPERATION WITH THE USG IN THREE AREAS: (1) INTERCONNECTION ISSUES, (2) AMENDMENTS TO THE TELECOM LAW, AND (3) SPECTRUM (FREQUENCY) MANAGEMENT.

5. AT A LATER MEETING THE POLISH SIDE WAS LED BY EUGENIUSZ DUDEK, SPECIALIST IN THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNMENT FOR RURAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS. POLISH EXPERTS WERE PARTICULARLY INTERESTED IN LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE FCC TO REGULATE AND THE DEGREE OF ITS INDEPENDENCE UNDER THE U.S. POLITICAL SYSTEM. POLES WOULD LIKE ADVICE ABOUT SETTING UP THEIR OWN COMMUNICATIONS REGULATORY BODY. JAMES SCHLICHTING, CHIEF OF THE POLICY BUREAU, COMMON CARRIER DIVISION OF THE FCC, DISCUSSED PRINCIPLES OF NON-DISCRIMINATION, TRANSPARENT REGULATORY PROCEDURES, AND REQUIREMENTS OF THE 1934 COMMUNICATIONS ACT.

6. POLISH EXPERTS NOTED THAT TPSA, AS A MONOPOLY CARRIER, EARNS ABOUT A 70 PERCENT RATE OF RETURN ON ITS INVESTMENT AFTER TAXES.

7. AT A SEPARATE MEETING, JERZY BABSKI, DIRECTOR FOR INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AT PTT MINISTRY, AND CLARK REVIEWED PLANS FOR TRAINING RELATED TO TELECOM REGULATIONS AND DISCUSSED POSSIBILITY OF VISIT BY POLISH PARLIAMENTARIANS TO THE U.S. THIS SPRING TO DISCUSS ISSUES RELEVANT TO PENDING TELECOM REGULATION.

8. POPULEK SAID LATER HE PLANS TO INSURE THAT REPRESENTATIVES OF T

PSA AND INDEPENDENT NETWORK OPERATORS ATTEND THE OECD ROUNDTABLE IN BUDAPEST JANUARY 27-28 ON NETWORK INTERCONNECTION ISSUES.

((Text)) ((WPROST)) Who do you think is a Russian democrat?

((Olechowski)) There is no reason to suppose that the Russians

are biologically immune to democracy. I think the people in power in Russia and those Russians who want nothing to do with Zhirinovskiy are democrats eager to expand the economic reforms, stabilize the situation in Russia, and build political institutions.

((WPROST)) What would have happened if Walesa had boycotted the Prague meeting?

((Olechowski)) It would have set us apart in the world, and no one else would have understood such an action. It was very important to take part in this debate and to take the rostrum, which we did in an ostentatious manner in public, as well as through diplomatic channels. Our diplomatic staff made their opinions known in a very unequivocal manner. Notice that President Clinton said that the security of Poland and this region is also important for the security of the United States. I do not know if he would have said the same thing if we had not come to Prague. I do not think a head of state can proceed any further without his parliament's approval.

((WPROST)) During the hard bargaining on the subject of expanding NATO, we spoke to the Americans, and the Americans spoke to the Russians. But there were no talks between the Poles and the Russians.

((Olechowski)) On a formal level, Polish-Russian relations are very good. We have prepared and concluded successive accords. But on a practical level, there is tension, unfortunately. We fail to understand how a neighbor of ours can tell us what to do and what not to do. Another complicating factor was that Minister Kozyrev never came to Warsaw despite two invitations from us, but this is because of the Russian elections. I saw him in Brussels and Rome in any case. I would very much like him to acquaint himself with the views of Polish public opinion and dispel the doubts in his mind.

((WPROST)) And will this visit take place?

((Olechowski)) We expect Minister Kozyrev to pay an official visit. We want to prepare it thoroughly, so that we can discuss many economic and political issues with him. Global issues have already been discussed, now is the time to discuss bilateral contacts. We must discuss a topic that is one of the most important, and also one of the most sensitive ones -- trade. There is not a lot that governments can do about trade when there is no money, but they can do something nevertheless.

((WPROST)) You said that one will only be able to assess the PFP after President Clinton's visit to Moscow.

((Olechowski)) In order to assess PFP, it is very important to know whether or not the Russians are going to belong to it. Personally, I think they are. Russia will then subject itself to a certain PFP discipline, which will considerably increase our sense of security.

((WPROST)) Polish politicians have examined the prospect of an easterly shift of the NATO border from the angle of Polish interests. Can one explain the U.S. reticence about this by the fact that the United States as a power is obliged to examine the issue from a global angle?

((Olechowski)) We also view the issue from a global angle. We have many partners and strong neighbors, and the countries that could one day threaten us are so large that we simply must view the matter from a global angle. After all, Russia, Germany, and Ukraine are world-class players. We did not want any revolutionary changes to the PFP program. All we wanted was the inclusion of a clause permitting those countries that fulfill certain conditions

concerning democracy and military alertness to apply for NATO membership. We did not even demand that Poland be given a specific mention. If we begin to cooperate within the framework of a specific system, we do so in order to be a full member of this system, and to avoid the fearful situation where there is a so-called western world and hostile territory beyond that. We are doing all we can to become a part of the community that we call the western world.

((WPROST)) Did the Visegrad group survive the week of Brussels and Prague talks? Is it true that President Clinton recommended that the Visegrad group continues to exist, promising it financial help?

((Olechowski)) There is no doubt that President Clinton called this group the "Visegrad" group every single time he spoke about it, unlike the heads of state of our neighboring countries, who merely used the vague term "central-western region." That appears like a "recommendation" or "indication." I think the Visegrad group did survive. It already has a success record that will not allow it to perish but, on the contrary, will make it all the more tangible. After all, we have a free trade zone that will encourage closer ties. There are going to be issues that merit joint solution.

((WPROST)) How is one to interpret the conduct of the Czechs, especially that of Prime Minister Vaclav Klaus?

((Olechowski)) I do not know the answer to that. I think we have three reasons to cooperate with them and coordinate our actions. First, we must undertake long-term activity to make the countries of this region become more closely linked, This is a region of Europe that is not accustomed to kind sentiments and cooperation. That is why we Poles support regional initiatives. We support the Baltic Council and the Central European Initiative, and we will seek other forms of cooperation as well. Second, all four countries have expressed similar, if not identical, hopes, saying that they consider PFP the first step to NATO membership. So if all four countries aspire to join an institution that is based on cooperation, that is all the more reason for them to show that they know how to cooperate with each other. The third important strategic and geopolitical argument is that all four countries join NATO simultaneously. It would give us no satisfaction to join NATO alone. Other countries might think it does not matter if some countries join while others do not, but we would certainly regret the absence of cooperation within the framework of an entire group. ((Text)) Budapest, 25 January (MTI) -- In the wake of Hungarian-Slovak disputes in recent weeks, Hungarian Foreign Minister Geza Jeszenszky wrote to his Slovak counterpart Jozef Moravcik today, foreign affairs spokesman Janos Herman told a press conference.

In a letter, Jeszenszky expresses surprise at the Slovak Foreign

Ministry and Moravcik personally criticizing an interview he gave Polish weekly POLYTIKA. In the interview, Jeszenszky said some of Hungary's neighbours had failed to totally observe recommendations in the Copenhagen declaration and in Council of Europe (CE) papers.

These documents guarantee national minorities' individual and collective rights to set up their own educational, cultural, and church institutions, and to play an active role in public affairs, including forming local or autonomous administrative districts.

Under Council of Europe recommendations, all members of an ethnic community have the right to use their family and given names in their mother tongue, and that right has to be recognized by the authorities. In districts with large minorities, these communities have the right to use their mother tongue in public administration and courts, and put up signs and other information in their mother tongue.

Hungary's foreign minister found it difficult to say that official Slovak practice follows European Union ((EU)) ethnic minority guidelines. South Slovak representatives in a recent Komarno conference urged new types of councils following "regional traditions," and with more local involvement.

Jeszenszky feels Slovakia would help its own interests by fulfilling legitimate wishes of Hungarians in Slovakia: Helping stability and improving Hungarian-Slovak links, enabling both countries to take a common Central European position abroad.

The foreign minister saw common interest in reuniting citizens by reopening border posts closed since the Second World War.

"Hungary, as Jozef Moravcik well knows, is ready to confirm the well-known fact that it recognizes the two countries' joint border," Jeszenszky wrote, saying numerous other unsolved problems were holding up the basic agreement, not any border question.

Herman added that Hungary has Maastricht-like borders in mind, saying there was no border dispute. The Hungarian foreign minister's visit to Slovakia is still on the agenda, he said.

There is a willingness for full cooperation with the Czech Republic along the road of participating in the Partnership for Peace initiative.

1. THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT WAS DELIVERED BY AMBASSADOR
ROBERT FROWICK, HEAD OF THE U.S. DELEGATION TO THE CSCE
SEMINAR ON EARLY WARNING AND PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY IN
WARSAW ON JANUARY 21, 1994.

2. BEGIN TEXT:

PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY AND THE NECESSITY OF WILL
THIS SEMINAR ON EARLY WARNING HAS, IN MY VIEW, REPRESENTED
A CSCE SUCCESS IN TERMS OF DEEPENING THE UNDERSTANDING OF
ALL CONCERNED REGARDING OPTIMUM USE OF EARLY WARNING
INDICATORS, MECHANISMS, STRATEGIES, AND PREVENTIVE

DIPLOMACY TECHNIQUES -- BY GOVERNMENTS, CSCE REPRESENTATIVES, AND NGOS -- IN A EUROPE EMERGING FROM DECADES OF DIVISION AND COLD WAR. AS A VETERAN OF PAST CSCE ACTIVITIES WHO HAS TEMPORARILY REENTERED YOUR DELIBERATIONS FROM THE OUTSIDE, I THINK THERE HAS BEEN A TENDENCY AROUND THE TABLE TO BE SOMEWHAT TOO SELF-CRITICAL ABOUT CSCE'S RECORD SINCE THE 1990 PARIS SUMMIT IN DEALING WITH WHAT THE DISTINGUISHED REPRESENTATIVE OF FRANCE HAS CALLED AN AVALANCHE OF CRISES. I WOULD STRONGLY AGREE WITH HIM, OUR SWEDISH COLLEAGUES WHO HAVE MOST RECENTLY SERVED AS CHAIRMAN-IN-OFFICE, AND OTHERS WHO ARGUE THAT WHAT IS MOST DECISIVELY NEEDED IS A MUSTERING OF WILL TO DEVELOP STRONG AND RESOLUTE RESPONSES TO THE WARNINGS THAT WE PERCEIVE. INDEED, I THINK THIS SEMINAR SHOULD BE SEEN AS A CALL TO ACTION TO DO ALL WE CAN OURSELVES TO GENERATE THE WILL TO CONDUCT EFFECTIVE PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY. DURING MY LAST YEARS AS A UNITED STATES FOREIGN SERVICE OFFICER, I WAS SERVING IN MY COUNTRY'S DELEGATION AT THE VIENNA CSCE REVIEW MEETING. FOLLOWING THE DECADE OF DISILLUSIONMENT AND CONFRONTATION FROM SIGNATURE OF THE 1975 HELSINKI FINAL ACT UNTIL THE MID-1980'S, NEW PROSPECTS SEEMED THEN TO ARISE FOR EUROPE, PRIMARILY FROM THE REFORMS OF GLASNOST AND PERESTROIKA ADVANCED BY THE COURAGEOUS MIKHAIL GORBACHEV. HIS REFORMS OPENED UP REAL POSSIBILITIES FOR A NEW ERA ACROSS THE EAST OF EUROPE, AND AT THE VIENNA CSCE REVIEW MEETING DETERMINED EFFORTS WERE CARRIED FORWARD BY MANY DELEGATIONS TO EXPLOIT THESE POSSIBILITIES TO THE FULLEST. WESTERN DIPLOMATS WERE CONSTANTLY CALLING FAVORABLE ATTENTION TO NEW THINKING IN THE EAST AND TRYING TO DEEPEN ITS CONTENT. THE WILL FOR CHANGE WAS THERE. BY THE END OF THE MEETING, IN JANUARY 1989, SO MANY ADVANCES HAD BEEN MADE ON THE CSCE AGENDA THAT, INDEED, A PERSUASIVE CASE CAN BE MADE THAT THE VIENNA TALKS HELPED SET THE STAGE FOR THE HISTORIC TRANSFORMATIONS OF 1989-90. BUT A WILL FOR CHANGE NECESSARILY HAD TO COME FROM WITHIN THE EAST TOO, AND THE GREATEST HEROES OF CSCE, LECH WALESIA, VACLAV HAVEL, AND ANDREI SAHKAROV -- WHOSE DETERMINATION IN THE STRUGGLE FOR FREEDOM NEVER WAVERED -- WERE IN THE VANGUARD OF THIS EFFORT.

NOW, WE ARE ENGAGED, IN A TRULY GREAT EFFORT -- CHARTED BY THE PARIS SUMMIT, WITH ADJUSTMENTS TO MEET THE CHALLENGES OF CHANGE AT THE HELSINKI SUMMIT -- TO SHAPE AN EVENTUAL NEW ORDER IN EUROPE. IN THIS ENDEAVOR, CSCE HAS BEEN THRUST TO THE FOREFRONT OF ATTEMPTS TO DAMPEN DOWN AND CONTAIN TENSIONS ACROSS THE EAST THROUGH PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY. BOULEVERSEMENT THAT THE WEST HELPED BRING ABOUT AND THAT WE HAVE BEEN ADDRESSING HERE IN WARSAW.
IN THIS TIME OF SEEMINGLY ENDLESS CRISES, I THINK ALL OF US HERE HAVE IMPORTANT ROLES TO PLAY IN ATTEMPTING TO ACHIEVE THAT PROMISE OF A BETTER EUROPE OUTLINED IN THE CHARTER OF PARIS. OUR COLLEAGUES IN THE EAST WILL HAVE TO CONTINUE SHOWING UNCOMMON SKILL AND DETERMINATION TO CREATE THE EUROPE OF DEMOCRACIES, MARKET ECONOMIES, AND RULE OF LAW TO WHICH ALL OF OUR COUNTRIES SUBSCRIBED AT PARIS. BUT THE REST OF US -- MEMBER STATES OF NATO, THE EUROPEAN UNION, AND WHAT USED TO BE CALLED THE NEUTRAL AND NONALIGNED -- HAVE A SPECIAL RESPONSIBILITY TO STIMULATE A MUSTERING OF WILL IN OUR RESPECTIVE CAPITALS AND COUNTRIES TO STAY THE COURSE AND ENSURE THE SUCCESS OF PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY. AS OUR HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR NATIONAL MINORITIES STRESSES, CAPITAL EXPENDED ON PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY IS CAPITAL WELL SPENT.

I THINK OF ALL THE MEMORABLE INTERVENTIONS THAT WERE MADE HERE THIS WEEK, ONE THAT HAS PARTICULARLY BROUGHT HOME TO ME THE URGENT NEED FOR A STRENGTHENED WILL TO SUPPORT CSCE PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY WAS THE ELOQUENT APPEAL OF THE DISTINGUISHED REPRESENTATIVE OF ALBANIA FOR INTERNATIONAL RESOLVE IN ENSURING THAT A CATASTROPHE AS HE RIGHTLY PUT IT, DOES NOT ERUPT IN KOSOVO. FO MY PART, I THINK OF ALL THE CRISES AND POTENTIAL CRISES, ACROSS EUROPE, THE KOSOVO SITUATION -- TO WHICH THE FATE OF THE FORMER YUGOSLAV REPUBLIC OF MACEDONIA IS INTIMATELY RELATED -- IS AT THE TOP OF THE LIST OF THOSE MOST LIKELY TO TRIGGER AN INTERNATIONAL CONFLICT, IF SIGNIFICANT HOSTILITIES SHOULD ERUPT THERE. YET THERE APPEARS TO BE SIGNIFICANT HESITATION BY MANY COUNTRIES TO TAKE A STRONG STAND IN ATTEMPTING TO ENSURE THAT THIS SITUATION DOES NOT EXPLODE IN OUR FACES.

SINCE CSCE DIPLOMATISTS ARE ASKED TO BE ON THE CUTTING EDGE OF PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY IN EUROPE, THEY SHOULD BE ESPECIALLY INSISTENT TOWARD THEIR GOVERNMENTS AND PEOPLES THAT THEY SIMPLY MUST HAVE STRONG, RELIABLE SUPPORT FOR THE ACCOMPLISHMENT OF THEIR MISSIONS. THIS APPLIES NOT LEAST TO MY OWN COUNTRY. THE EFFORT MAY REQUIRE CREATIVE INITIATIVES, INTER ALIA THROUGH PUBLIC DIPLOMACY, TO DEVELOP SUPPORT WITHIN OUR COUNTRIES FOR MORE RESOLUTE GOVERNMENTAL ACTION. NGOS SHOULD RALLY TO THIS EFFORT. MAXIMUM USE OF MASS MEDIA MAY BE NEEDED, TO GET THE MESSAGE ACROSS.

IT IS UNFORTUNATE THAT WIDESPREAD ECONOMIC RECESSION AND GREATLY INCREASED ATTENTION TO DOMESTIC CONCERNS COINCIDED WITH THE EMERGENCE OF THE POST-COLD WAR PERIOD. IT IS UNFORTUNATE THAT WE HAVE TO DEAL WITH THE REALITY OF SO MANY COMPLEX CRISES SIMULTANEOUSLY. AND IT IS TOO BAD THAT WE OFTEN HAVE VERY LITTLE TIME TO PREPARE FOR ACTIVE CONFLICT PREVENTION. COMMITTEE OF THE CZECH CHAMBER OF DEPUTIES

(DR. BRET) CONTACTED US AT THE BEHEST OF COMMITTEE
DEPUTY CHAIRMAN TOMAS FEJFAR REGARDING A POSSIBLE
TRIP TO WASHINGTON BY A SIZEABLE DELEGATION FROM THE
COMMITTEE (AT LEAST 10-15 PEOPLE). THE MAIN SUBJECT
THEY WANT TO DISCUSS IS PARTNERSHIP FOR PEACE, AND
THEY WOULD LIKE TO MEET WITH COUNTERPART COMMITTEES
FROM THE HOUSE AND SENATE. IN ADDITION, THEY WOULD
LIKE TO HAVE APPROPRIATE MEETINGS AT THE PENTAGON.
TIMING IS FLEXIBLE, BUT THE DELEGATION WOULD LIKE TO
TRAVEL DURING THE FIRST HALF OF THE YEAR.

3. THE MAIN THING THE CZECHS ARE LOOKING FOR AT
THIS TIME IS CONFIRMATION THAT THE U.S. SIDE WOULD
BE WILLING TO MEET WITH THE DELEGATION, AND SOME
IDEA OF WHAT A GOOD TIME MIGHT BE. WE RECOGNIZE
THAT IT WILL BE UP TO THE CZECH EMBASSY IN
WASHINGTON TO MAKE THE ACTUAL ARRANGEMENTS, BUT
WOULD LIKE TO STEER THE CZECHS IN THE RIGHT
DIRECTION. IT IS IN OUR INTEREST TO ENCOURAGE THE
PROPOSED VISIT AND TRY TO MAKE IT A SUCCESS, SINCE
THE DEFENSE AND SECURITY COMMITTEE WILL BE A KEY
PLAYER IN ENSURING THAT THE CZECH REPUBLIC CAN
PARTICIPATE IN THE PARTNERSHIP FOR PEACE.

4. WITHOUT MAKING ANY COMMITMENTS AT THIS POINT, WE
WOULD LIKE TO ADVISE THE CZECH PARLIAMENT AS TO:

A) WHAT MIGHT BE THE BEST TIMES TO TRAVEL TO
WASHINGTON OVER THE NEXT SIX MONTHS, TO MAXIMIZE THE

CHANCE OF MEETING WITH AUTHORITATIVE INTERLOCUTORS;
B) NAMES OF CONTACTS ON THE SENATE AND HOUSE ARMED
SERVICES COMMITTEE STAFFS WHO HAVE PARTICULAR
RESPONSIBILITIES WITH RESPECT TO PARTNERSHIP FOR
PEACE (WE AND THE CZECH EMBASSY IN WASHINGTON
ALREADY KNOW THE KEY PLAYERS AT THE PENTAGON);
C) IF POSSIBLE, THE LEVEL OF INTEREST IN WASHINGTON
IN MEETING WITH SUCH A DELEGATION.

1. EMBASSY DISCUSSED CSCE ECONOMIC FORUM JAN. 25 PER REFTTEL WITH MFA EUROPEAN SECURITY POLICY DEPARTMENT DIRECTOR VACEK. VACEK HAS OVERALL RESPONSIBILITY FOR CSCE MATTERS AND IS WORKING WITH THE MFA'S ECONOMIC COOPERATION DEPARTMENT ON THE ECONOMIC FORUM.

2. IN THE COURSE OF THE DISCUSSION, VACEK MADE THE FOLLOWING POINTS:

-- THE ITALIAN CHAIRMAN FOR THE FORUM IS VISITING PRAGUE THIS WEEK FOR CONSULTATIONS WITH THE CZECHS. INTER ALIA, THE CZECHS EXPECT THE VISIT WILL YIELD A CLEARER PICTURE OF THE CHAIRMAN'S SUBSTANTIVE PLANS, AS WELL AS A DECISION ON WHETHER THE SITE FOR THE FORUM WILL BE THE FORMER FEDERAL ASSEMBLY BUILDING (AS WAS THE CASE LAST YEAR) OR THE MFA BUILDING.

-- THE CZECHS CAME TO REALIZE LAST YEAR THAT THE ECONOMIC DIMENSION IS A CONTROVERSIAL ASPECT OF CSCE AND THAT REGRETTABLY IT IS LIMITED -- OWING LARGELY TO EU RESERVATIONS -- PRIMARILY TO THE QUESTION OF THE ECONOMIC TRANSFORMATION OF THE NIS.

-- AGAINST THIS BACKGROUND AND THEIR EXPERIENCE LAST YEAR, THE CZECHS WILL CONCENTRATE ON SELECTING AS FORUM PARTICIPANTS EXPERTS WHO ARE IN A POSITION TO PASS ON EXPERIENCE THE CR HAS GAINED IN ITS TRANSFORMATION PROCESS TO CENTRAL ASIAN REPRESENTATIVES.

-- THE GOCR WILL NOT TRY TO INCLUDE AS MANY HIGH-LEVEL/POLICY-LEVEL PARTICIPANTS IN ITS DELEGATION AS WAS THE CASE LAST YEAR, BUT RATHER ANTICIPATES THAT

GOVERNMENT PARTICIPATION IN THE FORUM WILL BE AT THE OFFICE DIRECTOR LEVEL. THE MFA, HOWEVER, HOPES TO HAVE A DEPUTY MINISTER FROM THE ECONOMICS MINISTRY OR MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY AND TRADE GIVE THE HOST-COUNTRY OPENING SPEECH.

3. VACEK PROMISED TO REVIEW THE PRELIMINARY AGENDA FOR THE ECONOMIC FORUM, TOGETHER WITH THE MFA'S ECONOMIC COOPERATION DEPARTMENT, AND PROVIDE ANY ADDITIONAL COMMENTS THE CZECH SIDE MIGHT HAVE. EMBASSY WILL FOLLOWING UP WITH MFA NEXT WEEK. MINIMIZE CONSIDERED.

1. THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT WAS DELIVERED BY U.S. AMBASSADOR ROBERT FROWICK TO THE OPENING PLENARY SESSION OF THE CSCE SEMINAR ON EARLY WARNING AND PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY, ON JANUARY 19, 1994.
2. BEGIN TEXT:
IT IS AN HONOR FOR THE UNITED STATES DELEGATION, AND FOR ME PERSONALLY, TO BE HERE IN WARSAW TO PARTICIPATE IN THIS TIMELY CSCE SEMINAR ON EARLY WARNING. IN OUR VIEW, IT WILL BE USEFUL AT THIS STILL EARLY STATE IN THE EVOLUTION

OF CSCE PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON, AND
STRENGTHEN, CSCE EARLY WARNING INDICATORS, MECHANISMS, AND
THE ROLE OF NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS IN THE OVERALL
CONTEXT OF CONFLICT PREVENTION.
MEETING CHALLENGES OF CHANGE

OUR DISCUSSIONS TAKE PLACE SOME FOUR YEARS SINCE COLLAPSE
OF THE OLD ORDER IN EUROPE -- THE POST WORLD WAR II ORDER
OF A CONTINENT DIVIDED BY AN IRON CURTAIN WITH WHICH OUR
HOST COUNTRY POLAND WAS ALL TOO FAMILIAR. SINCE THE
DRAMATIC EVENTS OF 1989-90, EUROPE HAS BEEN NAVIGATING
THROUGH UNCERTAIN AND DANGEROUS SHOALS OF TRANSITION FROM
THE OLD ORDER TO AN EVENTUAL NEW ONE HOPEFULLY TO BE
CONSTRUCTED ON THE BLUEPRINT OUTLINED IN THE CSCE CHARTER
OF PARIS. CSCE HAS PLAYED, AND CONTINUES TO PLAY, A MAJOR
ROLE IN THESE HISTORIC DEVELOPMENTS AND SINCE THE JULY
1992 HELSINKI SUMMIT MEETING HAS EMBARKED UPON CHALLENGING
INITIATIVES IN EARLY WARNING AND PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY. IT

MID-1992 WARNING SIGNALS FROM THE FORMER YUGOSLAV REPUBLIC
OF MACEDONIA BY PARTICIPATING IN THE CSCE SPILLOVER

MONITOR MISSION TO SKOPJE WHICH HAS BEEN MENTIONED BY OUR HIGH COMMISSIONER ON NATIONAL MINORITIES. THIS WAS A PIONEERING ENDEAVOR IN CSCE PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY. FOLLOWING DECISIONS AT THE HELSINKI SUMMIT THAT CSCE SHOULD MEET THE CHALLENGES OF CHANGE INTER ALIA THROUGH HEIGHTENED ATTENTION TO EARLY WARNING, CONFLICT PREVENTION AND CRISIS MANAGEMENT, THEN-PRESIDENT BUSH SUGGESTED ON AUGUST 6 THAT CSCE MONITORS BE DEPLOYED TO THE FORMER YUGOSLAV REPUBLIC OF MACEDONIA AS WELL AS TO KOSOVO, SANJAK, AND VOJVODINA.

EARLY WARNING

THE BUSH PROPOSAL CAME AT A TIME OF MOUNTING CONCERN THAT TENSIONS IN THESE SOUTHERN REACHES OF THE FORMER YUGOSLAV FEDERATION MIGHT EXPLODE INTO WARFARE WHICH COULD QUICKLY SPREAD INTO AN INTERNATIONAL CONFLICT. THIS PERCEPTION OF A POTENTIAL INTERNATIONAL CONFLICT HAS DIFFERENTIATED THE CHALLENGE THERE FROM THE TRAGEDIES IN BOSNIA-HERCEGOVINA AND ELSEWHERE THAT AT LEAST HAVE NOT POSED SO GREAT A DANGER OF AN INTERNATIONAL WAR.

IN ADDITION TO LITERALLY DECADES OF CONCERN -- AND EARLY WARNING -- OVER THE POSSIBILITY OF ARMED CONFLICT IN KOSOVO BETWEEN ETHNIC ALBANIANS, NUMBERING ABOUT 90 PER CENT OF THE POPULATION, AND THE RULING SERBS, A SENSE OF URGENCY HAD ARISEN IN 1992 OVER DANGERS CONFRONTING THE ETHNICALLY DIVERSE FORMER YUGOSLAV REPUBLIC OF MACEDONIA. DANGERS WERE MANIFESTED IN ITS EXTREME VULNERABILITY MILITARILY, ITS DEEPENING ECONOMIC CRISIS, AND ITS FRAGILE, DELICATELY BALANCED POLITICAL STRUCTURE.

RESPONSE

GOVERNMENTAL AUTHORITIES IN SKOPJE SIGNALLED A DESIRE THAT CSCE INDEED SHOULD CONSIDER DISPATCH OF MONITORS TO HELP PREVENT A SPILLOVER OF WARFARE INTO THE REGION. AN INITIAL FACT-FINDING VISIT TO SKOPJE BY THE LEADERSHIP OF THE MISSION IN EARLY SEPTEMBER LED TO A CAREFULLY CONSIDERED BUT RELATIVELY RAPID APPROVAL BY CSCE AUTHORITIES TO PROCEED WITH ESTABLISHMENT OF THE MONITOR MISSION. THIS TASK, INVOLVING FIRST OF ALL NEGOTIATION OF AN UNDERSTANDING ON THE FUNCTIONING OF THE MISSION WAS COMPLICATED BY THE CONTROVERSY, WITH WHICH I AM SURE ALL PRESENT HERE ARE FAMILIAR, OVER THE CHOSEN NAME OF THE COUNTRY. AT LENGTH, A DECISION WAS REACHED TO AGREE TO DISAGREE ON THE NAME TO ADOPT ARTICLES OF UNDERSTANDING ON MODALITIES PERMITTING THE MISSION TO FUNCTION EFFECTIVELY. TOWARD A STRATEGY

WHEN WE BEGAN OPERATIONS IN SKOPJE, WE NEEDED TO DEVELOP OUR OWN STRATEGY AND TACTICS TO MEET OUR ASSIGNED GOAL OF PREVENTING A SPILLOVER OF CONFLICT. WE CREATED A STRATEGY OF INITIATIVES ON BOTH EXTERNAL AND INTERNAL QUESTIONS. EXTERNAL EFFORTS WERE AIMED LARGELY AT BRINGING CSCE ACTIONS INTO THE NETWORK OF INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITIES, LED BY THE UN AND EUROPEAN COMMUNITY, TO CONTAIN HOSTILITIES

SUPPORTED PRESIDENT GLIGOROV'S APPEAL TO THE UN FOR
PEACEKEEPERS TO BE DEPLOYED AS A DETERRENT ALONG THE
SERBIAN, KOSOVO, AND ALBANIAN BORDERS. AS THE HIGH
COMMISSIONER HAS SAID, THIS HAS BEEN A CASE OF PREVENTIVE
DEPLOYMENT. POLITICALLY, WE COORDINATED WITH THE
VANCE-OWEN TEAM AS WELL AS CSCE OFFICIALS IN VIENNA AND
PRAGUE, DURING THE CHAIRMANSHIP IN OFFICE OF
CZECHOSLOVAKIA, AND WE CONSULTED WITH KEY FOREIGN AND
DEFENSE POLICY LEADERS IN ATHENS, TIRANA, SOFIA, AND
BELGRADE AS WELL AS EC AND NATO SENIOR OFFICIALS IN
BRUSSELS. IN FACE OF THE COUNTRY'S SERIOUS ECONOMIC
CRISIS, INDUCED BY HEAVY PRESSURES ON ITS NORTH-SOUTH
ECONOMIC LIFELINE, WE DREW ENHANCED INTERNATIONAL
ATTENTION TO UNFOLDING DEVELOPMENTS AND MET WITH VARIOUS
INTERNATIONAL GROUPS ACTIVE IN ATTEMPTING TO ALLEVIATE
HARDSHIPS. AND IN OUR CASE, WE SOUGHT TO ESTABLISH AS
HIGH A PROFILE AS POSSIBLE IN THE INTERNATIONAL MEDIA IN
ORDER TO UNDERScore THE SERIOUS CONCERN OF ALL CSCE
PARTICIPATING STATES IN THE SURVIVAL AND STRENGTHENING OF

((Text)) Warsaw, Jan 26 (CTK) -- The Polish-Slovak agreements concerning the environment and border cooperation have not yet been signed because they are not yet ready for discussion by the Slovak Government, Slovak President Michal Kovac told journalists today.

The Slovak Foreign Ministry originally intended that the agreements be signed during Kovac's current visit to Poland. That they will not be signed represents no change of policy, Kovac said.

Most of the series of agreements will be signed in the first quarter of 1994, Kovac said. He added that a meeting of the two countries' cabinets was being prepared.

Kovac said that a proposal to completely open the common border was spontaneously brought up during his Warsaw talks, which he considered an expression of great interest in extending Slovak-Polish relations. However, this question is linked to readmission

agreements, and control of foreign citizens and goods must be preserved. The opening of the border should only concern citizens of the two countries.

Kovac said that it was necessary to analyze the interests of the individual countries of the Visegrad Four (the Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, Slovakia) and prepare further steps to develop mutual cooperation. There are specific questions, such as the Partnership For Peace Plan, which cannot be solved bilaterally and need a joint line, he said. "When four say the same thing separately at various places, it is different from their speaking with one voice," Kovac said. However, cooperation within the Visegrad Group cannot replace bilateral relations, he noted.

Kovac also met with President of the Polish National Bank Hanna Gronkiewicz-Waltz, who said that the creation of a Slovak-Polish bank was not being considered. However, some Polish bank could take up the assignment. The bank will be chosen by the Polish minister for foreign cooperation, she said.

((Text)) Strasbourg, Jan 26 (CTK) -- At their meeting today, Catherine Lalumiere, secretary general of the Council of Europe (CE), and Czech Parliament Chairman Milan Uhde discussed the Czech law on the illegality of the communist regime and resistance against it, passed on July 9, 1993.

Speaking to journalists after the meeting, Uhde said that Lalumiere had recently met with a five-member delegation of judges from the Czech Constitutional Court, and was informed by Judge Vladimir Klokocka of the court's stance toward the mentioned law.

Uhde said he had also informed Lalumiere of his conviction that the law was necessary and that it would not result in any excesses. He said Lalumiere is today far more better informed of the issue than in the past. The fears of witch hunts simply disappeared, Uhde stated.

On the question of the restitution of property to the aristocracy, Uhde said he informed Lalumiere that no general property restitution was or would be at issue. He explained to

Lalumiere that the word "aristocracy" itself was only auxiliary, "that we have neither had nor respected any noble titles for a long time (they were abolished in 1918, in the year of Czechoslovakia's birth), that we respect the Benes decrees (under which some 2.5 million Sudeten Germans were expelled from the post-war Czechoslovakia and their property was expropriated) and everything that happened before February 25, 1948 (when communists seized power in Czechoslovakia)".

Any change of stance towards the so-called aristocratic properties taken from their owners in 1945-47 is out of the question, Uhde said.

Later in the day he ended his one-day working visit to the Strasbourg CE headquarters and returned home.
