((Text)) The Bulgarian politicians' tense faces somewhat relaxed in welcoming President Francois Mitterrand of France, but froze in amazement shortly after that. Was the purpose of his visit really a mere tribute paid to romantic reminiscences? No Bulgarian citizen would seriously believe that the French head of state, who is not very healthy, as a matter of fact, would fly over thousands of kilometers in order to mark the anniversary of his one-time meeting with 12 former, select dissidents and to revive his memories of the breakfast he had with them in January 1989, especially after he had a similar meeting with former Czech dissidents in Prague.
Feverish diplomatic comings and goings can be observed lately at the European-Balkan flank of the continent (moreover on the eve of a sinister 80th anniversary). Madeleine Albright, the U.S. President's special ambassador at large, came to our country from Washington. Her visit was followed by that of a 16-member U.S. military delegation. Former Defense Secretary Frank Carlucci arrived incognito (an event which was covered only by the daily

EKSPRES and about which no more was heard). The foreign ministers of Germany, of the UK, and of Turkey met in Ankara in order to discuss a mechanism for consultations on regional problems. Considering this background, France is presumably searching for its own place in the Balkan concert of European orchestras. It is hardly a coincidence that with its proposal on a "European Stability Pact" France was half a year ahead of the United States' "Partnership for Peace" program. A cursory examination of the two plans reveals the difference in their approach to security on our continent. In addressing the Bulgarian Parliament Mitterrand revived an apparently forgotten idea, namely that of a European confederation. He immediately explained that the concept should not be considered under its purely legal aspect. In other words, it is not a question of establishing some kind of European United States, despite the fact that this is the basic meaning of the idea. Considering the idea under the aspect of the fact that one single superpower, which bases its foreign policy on the traditional myth of "predestination" and "mission" exists in the world today, things are making some sense.

The new approach to EU membership, as part of an integrated political-economic organization, is also worth examining. The French president pointed out the association with and membership of the West European Union -- a military-political organization which does not possess its own army -- as a prerequisite for membership. There has hardly been a similar precedent in the past history of the EU. This is particularly significant considering our "patrolling cooperation" with the West European Union on the River Danube ((in connection with observing the Yugoembargo)). Bulgaria seems to have forgotten the January 1993 incident and the criticism for having failed to use force against the transiting tugs on the interational river. Actually, the "critics" disregarded the Danube Convention of 1948 which is still in force. The proposal submitted by France in February 1993 that Western military vessels would protect the Danube mouth is forgotten as well. On the other hand this promise is in contradiction with the Montreux Convention on the Straits which dates back to 1936. Was this issue discussed, perhaps? I think so, because the presence of Major General Stefan Nikolov, the chief of the president's Military Office, among the officials meeting Mitterrand at the Sofia Airport, was not entirely in accordance with protocol. Is our possible association with the West European Union not likely to involve some kind of cooperation with the Euro-Corps which will presumably be subordinate to the West European Union and NATO forces?

As a matter of fact, what was the real purpose of Mitterrand's visit to our country, and whom did he come to see?

//((Interview with Polish President Lech Walesa by Jozef Huebel in Warsaw on 24 January: "There Are No Contradictions, We Just Do Not Know" -- first paragraph is editorial introduction))

((Text)) On the occasion of the visit by Slovak President Michal Kovac to Poland on 25-27 January, Polish President Lech Walesa answered four questions from SME via our collaborator in Warsaw, STV correspondent Jozef Huebel.

((Huebel)) Mr. President, there are many unsolved problems between Poland and Slovakia: We have only nine border crossings, while there were 40 of them prior to the war. Slovak korunas cannot be legally exchanged in Polish banks, and vice versa, your zlotys cannot be exchanged in Slovak banks. Neither the "Carpathian Euroregion" nor the "Tatras Euroregion" projects have made any progress. A joint Polish-Slovak bank still does not exist, and signatures are also missing on the treaty on prevention of double taxation and protection of investments. We have not correlated our customs policy. When are these problems going to be solved?

((Walesa)) I said once that by the year 2000 Poland will remove

all borders that separate our country from its neighbors. The border should be marked only by good directional signs and computers, so that every traveler can choose the best alternative route for the remainder of his trip. I am doing everything in my power so that no border stands between us by the year 2000. Only, we must even our standards by then. People are like communicating vessels: If there is a difference in levels, a Niagara Falls forms. He who has seen them knows how the water thunders, falls heavily, and finally shatters. If the levels match, however, there is no movement, and it is completely safe. That is one of the reasons why we should well consider our differences, so that we can reach this safety. If we even up wages, prices, standards, roads, and computers, our unification will be so fast, we will not even notice it. Therefore, let us collaborate to even up the standards of our communities, and the border will not be needed.

((Huebel)) I will ask a somewhat unpleasant question now: Why do the representatives of our countries -- Poland and Slovakia -- meet so seldom? After all, the Slovak Republic has been here for more than a year, you have not come for an official visit, the Polish prime minister has not been there either, and this visit by President Kovac is the first significant visit in our mutual relations. Will that be amended?

((Walesa)) Yes, of course. I have said many times that both you and we have numerous domestic problems now, and are engrossed in them. It has to be kept in mind, however, that we are building an economic and legal structure, and the presidents and the other officials have so many worries that they do not have time for anything else. We will try to rectify this, but we can manage only if we succeed in solving our problems. We will then have time also for "external" issues.

((Huebel)) Mr. President, would it not be possible to use precisely the Polish-Slovak cooperation as an example to the West that something exists here, and that the Visegrad Group has good prospects because of this cooperation?

((Walesa)) Of course, I take it! The situation calls for this, it calls for us initiating something, it calls for our relations to be the best -- better than between other nations. Again, however, it must be done. There is no doubt that the politicians and the leaders understand each other. We really get along well, and speak as in a single voice. On the other hand, we have no idea of technical, ministerial, and directorial solutions, i.e., of a technical concept how to do all of this. Unfortunately, so far, we have not found a method to accelerate it all. There are no contradictions, we just do not know.

((Huebel)) The stability of our region, and the success of the cooperation of the Visegrad Four depends to a great degree on Hungarian-Slovak relations. How do you feel about the problem of the Hungarian minority in Slovakia and the "Gabcikovo" issue?

((Walesa)) This problem is here to stay. If the process of European integration were faster, this problem would not exist. That is because the European principles and various treaties state that everyone has the right to freedom and his characteristic features -- but -- within the borders of integral Europe. Under such circumstances, no one would attempt a division, even if certain groups wanted to preserve their specific features, but as I say -- in a single house! Since these attempts at agglomeration are not very successful, new attempts at division ensue. Therefore, I believe that we will be able to enter Europe together, rather than

go on subdividing. These partitions are not necessary.

2. IN OTHER DECISIONS, CCET DIRECTOR ZECCHINI'S CONTRACT WAS RENEWED FOR ANOTHER TWO YEARS (PARAGRAPH 8). ROMANIA'S OBSERVER STATUS IN THE STEEL COMMITTEE WAS RENEWED FOR A YEAR (PARAGRAPH 9); AND POLAND'S, HUNGARY'S, CZECH REPUBLIC'S AND SLOVAKIA'S PARTICIPATION IN AN ARRAY OF OECD COMMITTEES WAS APPROVED (PARAGRAPH 10). THE SYG RECOUNTED HIGHLIGHTS OF HIS BRIEF MEETING WITH GEORGIA'S PM SHEVARDNADZE (PARAGRAPH 11) AND ANNOUNCED THAT HE HAD RECEIVED A FORMAL REQUEST FROM THE CZECH FM FOR MEMBERSHIP (PARAGRAPH 15). 3. FRANCE CONFIRMED ITS AD REFERENDUM ACCEPTANCE OF THE JANUARY 13 COUNCIL CONSENSUS THAT ARGENTINA AND BRAZIL SHOULD PARTICIPATE IN THE WORK OF THE DEVELOPMENT CENTER. CONSENSUS INCLUDES MODIFYING ARTICLE 11 OF THE DECISION ESTABLISHING THE DEVELOPMENT CENTER TO PERMIT THE ORGANIZATION MORE EASILY TO INVITE NON-MEMBERS TO PARTICIPATE. 4. RENEWAL OF SIGMA, LARGELY FUNDED BY THE EUROPEAN UNION VIA PHARE BUT ADMINISTERED BY THE OECD, WON FULL SUPPORT FROM PERMREPS. JAPAN ASKED THAT THE SIGMA PROGRAM BE REVIEWED PERIODICALLY, A PROPOSAL ACCEPTED BY MEMBERS. COUNCIL DECISION WAS ACCORDINGLY MODIFIED TO CALL FOR AN ASSESSMENT BEFORE THE END OF 1995.

5. IN OTHER INTERVENTIONS, THE NETHERLANDS ANNOUNCED ITS INTENTION OF CONTRIBUTING ABOUT 1.5 MILLION FF (USD 254,000 AT A FF5.9USD1 EXCHANGE RATE) TO THE PROGRAM. DENMARK OBSERVED THAT IT HAD CONTRIBUTED TO THE FIRST PHASE OF SIGMA AND WOULD LOOK FAVORABLY ON DOING SO FOR THIS PHASE AS WELL.

6. SWEDEN, TURKEY, GREECE AND OTHERS WELCOMED THE EXTENSION OF SIGMA ACTIVITIES TO ALBANIA, ESTONIA, LATVIA, LITHUANIA AND SLOVENIA. SWEDEN WORRIED THAT THE PROGRAM RELIED TOO HEAVILY ON VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS, AND ASKED THAT A LARGER SHARE COME FROM THE OECD'S

BUDGET, AN IDEA TO WHICH THE UK QUICKLY OBJECTED. THE UK ASKED WHY SIGMA FUNDING HAD INCREASED SO SHARPLY (230 PERCENT BY HIS RECKONING). DRAWING ON REFS A AND C, AMBASSADOR AARON SUPPORTED THE PROGRAM AND ITS EXTENSION TO SIX NEW COUNTRIES, WELCOMED THE CALL FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF THE PROGRAM, AND STRESSED THE NEED FOR CLOSE COORDINATION OF SIGMA ACTIVITIES WITH THE EXTENSIVE USG AND OTHER BILATERAL PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION EFFORTS IN SIGMA TARGET COUNTRIES.

7. REPLYING FOR THE SECRETARIAT, PUBLIC MANAGEMENT SERVICE HEAD DERRY ORMOND WELCOMED AN ASSESSMENT OF SIGMA IN TWO YEARS. HE PROMISED CONTINUED CLOSE COORDINATION WITH BILATERAL OPERATIONS IN THESE COUNTRIES, NOTING THAT SUCH COORDINATION HAS BEEN ONE OF THE PROGRAM'S "STRONG POINTS." ORMOND IDENTIFIED THREE FACTORS BEHIND THE SHARP RISE IN BUDGETARY RESOURCES MADE AVAILABLE TO SIGMA: AN INCREASE FROM SIX TO ELEVEN COUNTRIES; INTENSIFIED ACTIVITIES IN SOME AREAS; AND GROUNDBREAKING WORK IN OTHERS. MUCH OF THE NEW WORK, HE CONCLUDED, IS IN THE CONTROL FUNCTION AREA, AS SIGMA TRIES TO HELP OVERCOME THE WIDESPREAD VIEW IN THESE COUNTRIES THAT GOVERNMENT IS AN OPPRESSOR.

11. THE SYG RELATED HIGHLIGHTS OF HIS BRIEF (20 MINUTES) TALK JANUARY 20 WITH GEORGIA PM EDUARD SHEVARDNADZE. THE PM ASKED WHAT THE OECD COULD DO TO HELP GEORGIA. THE SYG REPLIED THAT THE ORGANIZATION HAS 3-4 PROJECTS SLOTTED FOR GEORGIA, CURRENTLY ON HOLD BECAUSE OF THE UNSETTLED SECURITY SITUATION. LACK OF SPACE PREVENTED THE OECD FROM TAKING GEORGIAN TRAINEES INTO THE OECD, BUT THE SYG TOLD SHEVARDNADZE THAT OECD-SPONSORED TAX TRAINING CENTERS (ANKARA, BUDAPEST, COPENHAGEN AND VIENNA) AS WELL AS THE JOINT VIENNA INSTITUTE WERE POSSIBILITIES. THE SYG ACCEPTED AN INVITATION TO VISIT GEORGIA BUT NO DATE WAS SET.

DEVELOPMENTS ON MEXICO'S ENTRY

12. OECD LEGAL ADVISOR SCHRICKE, REPORTING ON HIS TRIP TO MEXICO LAST WEEK TO HELP THE MEXICANS WITH THEIR PREPARATIONS FOR ENTRY INTO THE OECD, SAID HE HAD RETURNED WITH THE DRAFT MEXICAN LETTER AND DECLARATION TO THE OECD. BOTH WILL BE DISTRIBUTED SHORTLY, AND FOLLOWED SOON THEREAFTER BY A SECRETARIAT ANALYSIS OF THEIR CONTENTS. MISSION WILL FAX COPIES OF BOTH TO EUR/RPE FOR DISTRIBUTION WITHIN WASHINGTON AND TO EMBASSY MEXICO CITY AS SOON AS RECEIVED.

13. SCHRICKE NOTED THAT THE DOCUMENTS WOULD FACILITATE COUNCIL DISCUSSION OF THE ISSUE AT ITS NEXT SESSION ON FEBRUARY 10. SECRETARIAT WOULD WELCOME MEMBERS' COMMENTS ON THE DOCUMENTS BEFORE THEN, IF POSSIBLE.

14. SCHRICKE ALSO OBSERVED THAT CIME AND CMIT WOULD HOLD THEIR JOINT REVIEW SESSION ON MEXICO ON FEBRUARY 24. ((Text)) ((Pankovcinova)) What information do you have about the purpose of Ivan Lexa's visit to the former Yugoslavia in the fall of 1992?
((Knazko)) I found out after the fact that Mr. Lexa had gone to Yugoslavia with the blessing of the prime minister. I never found out anything about the purpose of this visit and no report was ever written about it. Thus, the government resolution according to which every government member -- anyone who was in any way involved in Slovak foreign policy -- is obliged within 14 days of returning from a visit to submit a report on it was infringed.

((Pankovcinova)) However, Mr. Lexa was not a government member, neither a minister nor a state secretary, at that time. Did this resolution apply to him?

((Knazko)) He was head of the Slovak Government Office at that time and this resolution applied to him if he went there with the blessing of the prime minister -- without his blessing, of course, he could not have gone there.

((Pankovcinova)) Why did you not say anything about this before?

((Knazko)) I did. I wrote a letter to the prime minister, but I did not receive a reply. This was not the only instance. Later, I also informed the press about visits that were not discussed in advance with the Foreign Ministry -- for example, when the prime minister was in Germany or Austria without the knowledge of the deputy prime minister and foreign minister. We never received a report at the Foreign Ministry on these visits by the prime minister.

((Bratislava SLOVENSKY DENNIK in Slovak on 27 January on page 2, under the headline "A Question for Ivan Lexa," carries the following 100-word "(SD)"-signed question and Lexa's response:

"In a speech delivered to the National Council of the Slovak Republic, M. Knazko indirectly described you as the person the prime minister sent to the former Yugoslavia in the fall of 1992 without the knowledge of the Foreign Ministry. Do you have anything to say to this?

"Lexa: No comment.")
