 BASIS.

3. JAPAN - SPECIAL COMMITTEE APPROVAL OF GUIDELINES
 LEGISLATION

CONTEXT: ON APRIL 26, THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON THE DEFENSE
 GUIDELINES OF THE LOWER HOUSE OF THE JAPANESE DIET PASSED A
 PACKAGE OF DOMESTIC LEGISLATION RELATED TO THE GUIDELINES FOR
 U.S.-JAPAN DEFENSE COOPERATION. A LOWER HOUSE PLENARY VOTE ON
 THIS LEGISLATION IS SCHEDULED FOR APRIL 27. WE ANTICIPATE THAT
 THE LOWER HOUSE WILL APPROVE THE LEGISLATIVE PACKAGE. THE
 UPPER HOUSE OF THE DIET WILL NOT CONSIDER THIS LEGISLATION
 UNTIL MAY, AFTER THE U.S.-JAPAN SUMMIT ON MAY 3.

THE LEGISLATION APPROVED BY THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE CONTAINS
 AMENDMENTS, THE MOST SIGNIFICANT OF WHICH IS THE DELETION OF A
 PROVISION CONCERNING MARITIME INTERDICTION OPERATIONS (MIO).
 MIO WILL BE CONSIDERED IN A SEPARATE BILL DURING THE CURRENT
 SESSION OF THE DIET, WHICH ENDS IN MID-JUNE.

Q: WHAT IS YOUR REACTION TO THE APPROVAL OF THE DEFENSE
 GUIDELINES LEGISLATION BY THE LOWER HOUSE SPECIAL COMMITTEE?
 WHAT DO YOU THINK ABOUT THE AMENDMENTS TO THE LEGISLATION,
 ESPECIALLY THE DECISION TO DELETE THE SECTION ON MARITIME
 INTERDICTION OPERATIONS?

A: WE WELCOME THE PROGRESS IN THE DIET'S DELIBERATIONS. SINCE THESE DELIBERATIONS ARE STILL ONGOING, IT WOULD BE INAPPROPRIATE FOR ME TO COMMENT FURTHER, OTHER THAN TO SAY THAT WE LOOK FORWARD TO PASSAGE OF THIS IMPORTANT UNCLAS SECTION 02 OF 08 STATE 076764

LEGISLATION.

(IF PRESSED): WE ARE CONFIDENT THAT THIS LEGISLATION, WHEN FINALLY ENACTED, WILL ENABLE THE U.S. AND JAPAN TO RESPOND QUICKLY AND FLEXIBLY TO ANY CONTINGENCIES THAT MAY ARISE.

4. THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT WAS ISSUED BY THE OFFICE OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN ON 4/24/99.

5. KEY VOTES AT THE UNITED NATIONS COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS

AS THE LEADERS OF THE NORTH ATLANTIC TREATY ORGANIZATION GATHERED IN WASHINGTON, THE NATIONS OF THE WORLD ALSO CAME TOGETHER AT THE UNITED NATIONS COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS IN GENEVA TO REAFFIRM THE UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS. ON FRIDAY, THE COMMISSION ADOPTED A SERIES OF IMPORTANT RESOLUTIONS THAT WILL HELP ADDRESS A WIDE RANGE OF HUMAN RIGHTS CONCERNS AROUND THE WORLD.

WE WOULD LIKE TO THANK THE OVERWHELMING MAJORITY OF COMMISSION MEMBERS WHO JOINED US IN ADOPTING A RESOLUTION ON HUMAN RIGHTS CONDITIONS IN BOSNIA-HERZEGOVINA, CROATIA, AND THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF YUGOSLAVIA, INCLUDING KOSOVO. THE RESOLUTION, SPONSORED BY THE UNITED STATES, HIGHLIGHTS THE BROAD ARRAY OF HUMAN RIGHTS PROBLEMS THROUGHOUT THE FORMER YUGOSLAVIA. IN PARTICULAR, IT CALLS ON THE AUTHORITIES IN BELGRADE TO END IMMEDIATELY THEIR CAMPAIGN OF VIOLENCE AND REPRESSION AGAINST THE CIVILIAN POPULATION IN KOSOVO AND ACCEPT CONDITIONS FOR A LASTING PEACE. BY CONDEMNING THE MILOSEVIC REGIME'S GRAVE AND SYSTEMATIC HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES, CRIMES AGAINST HUMANITY, WAR CRIMES, AND LARGE-SCALE DESTRUCTION OF CIVILIAN PROPERTY IN KOSOVO, THE COMMISSION DEMONSTRATED THAT NATO'S NINETEEN DEMOCRACIES DO NOT STAND ALONE IN DEMANDING PEACE, JUSTICE AND FREEDOM FOR THE PEOPLE OF KOSOVO.

I ALSO WOULD LIKE TO CONGRATULATE OUR NATO ALLIES, THE CZECH REPUBLIC AND POLAND, WHO CHAMPIONED THE COMMISSION'S PASSAGE A RESOLUTION ON HUMAN RIGHTS IN CUBA. THEIR DETERMINED EFFORTS DEMONSTRATE BOTH THEIR COMMITMENT TO DEMOCRACY AND THEIR CONVICTION THAT HUMAN RIGHTS ARE INALIENABLE AND UNIVERSAL. HOPE THAT THE CUBAN GOVERNMENT WILL, IN RESPONSE, TAKE IMMEDIATE STEPS TO RESPECT HUMAN RIGHTS. HONORING THE RESOLUTION'S CALL FOR THE RELEASE OF THE INTERNAL DISSIDENT WORKING GROUP -- BEATRIZ ROQUE, FELIX BONNE, RENE GOMEZ

MANZANO, AND VLADIMIR ROCA -- WOULD BE AN IMPORTANT FIRST

STEP. LIKE VACLAV HAVEL AND ADAM MICHNIK BEFORE THEM, THEIR ONLY CRIME WAS TO SPEAK TRUTH TO POWER SO THAT THE POWERLESS MAY BE HEARD. WE LOOK FORWARD TO THE DAY WHEN THEY, LIKE THEIR CZECH AND POLISH COUNTERPARTS, WILL WITNESS THEIR NATION'S ACCESSION INTO THE COMMUNITY OF DEMOCRACIES.

UNFORTUNATELY, THE COMMISSION ALSO CHOSE NOT TO SUPPORT THE U.S.-SPONSORED RESOLUTION ON HUMAN RIGHTS IN CHINA. WE WOULD LIKE TO THANK THOSE COUNTRIES THAT JOINED US IN OPPOSING PASSAGE OF CHINA'S NO-ACTION MOTION ON THE GROUNDS THAT IT WOULD PREVENT THE COMMISSION FROM ADDRESSING AN IMPORTANT HUMAN RIGHTS CONCERN THAT IS WELL WITHIN ITS JURISDICTION. WE SPONSORED THIS RESOLUTION AS PART OF OUR PRINCIPLED, PURPOSEFUL POLICY OF ENGAGEMENT WITH CHINA. OUR GOAL WAS TO FOCUS INTERNATIONAL ATTENTION ON THE SHARP DETERIORATION IN THE HUMAN UNCLAS SECTION 03 OF 08 STATE 076764

RIGHTS SITUATION IN CHINA. WE BELIEVED -- AND CONTINUE TO BELIEVE -- THAT THERE IS NO BETTER PLACE TO DO THAT THAN IN THE COMMISSION, THE PREEMINENT INTERNATIONAL FORUM ON HUMAN RIGHTS. WE HAVE ACCOMPLISHED THAT GOAL, EVEN THOUGH THE COMMISSION CHOSE NOT TO TAKE ACTION ON OUR RESOLUTION.

THE COMMISSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS ALSO PASSED A NUMBER OF OTHER IMPORTANT RESOLUTIONS, INCLUDING MEASURES ON IRAN, SUDAN, AFGHANISTAN, BURUNDI, IRAQ, NIGERIA, BURMA, AND EQUATORIAL GUINEA. I WOULD LIKE TO THANK ALL THOSE MEMBER STATES WHO JOINED OUR DELEGATION IN GENEVA IN WORKING TO SECURE PASSAGE OF THESE RESOLUTIONS. I WOULD ALSO LIKE TO EXPRESS MY SPECIAL APPRECIATION TO THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY AS EU COUNCIL PRESIDENT FOR SPONSORING RESOLUTIONS ON IRAN AND SUDAN. WE LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH MEMBER STATES AS THE COMMISSION TURNS TO OTHER, EQUALLY VITAL ISSUES IN ITS FINAL WEEK, INCLUDING ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL RIGHTS, WOMEN'S RIGHTS, AND RACISM.

6. THE FOLLOWING PRESS STATEMENT WAS ISSUED JOINTLY BY THE U.S., ROK AND THE GOVERNMENT OF JAPAN FOLLOWING TALKS CARRIEE OUT APRIL 23-25 IN HONOLULU.

7. U.S.-ROK-GOJ JOINT PRESS STATEMENT

THE UNITED STATES, REPUBLIC OF KOREA AND JAPAN, LED RESPECTIVELY BY DR. WILLIAM J. PERRY, SENIOR SECRETARY LIM DONG-WON AND DIRECTOR GENERAL KATO RYOZO, MET IN HONOLULU, APRIL 23 THROUGH 25, TO CONTINUE CONSULTATIONS BEGUN IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE NORTH KOREA POLICY REVIEW. THE DELEGATION DISCUSSED A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH THAT WOULD REDUCE THREATS POSED BY NORTH KOREA AND WOULD LEAD TO THE END OF THE COLD WAR STRUCTURE ON THE KOREAN PENINSULA. IT WAS RECOGNIZED THAT THE DPRK'S NUCLEAR, MISSILE AND OTHER THREATENING WEAPONS PROGRAMS, ENDANGER THE SECURITY OF THE U.S., ROK AND JAPAN. THE THREE

COUNTRIES STRESSED THE IMPORTANCE OF A CONCERTED AND INTEGRATED APPROACH BUILDING ON THE AGREED FRAMEWORK AND EACH COUNTRY'S BILATERAL EFFORTS. THE DELEGATION ALSO NOTED THE PLIGHT OF THE PEOPLE OF NORTH KOREA AMIDST THAT COUNTRY'S ECONOMIC PROBLEMS AND FOOD SHORTAGES.

THE THREE SIDES AGREED THAT AN EFFECTIVE POLICY TOWARDS NORTH KOREA MUST BE A CLOSELY COORDINATED EFFORT OF THE U.S., ROK, AND JAPAN. THEY, THEREFORE, AGREED TO ESTABLISH A TRILATERAL COORDINATION AND OVERSIGHT GROUP (TCOG) TO INSTITUTIONALIZE THE PROCESS OF CONSULTATION AND POLICY COORDINATION. THE TCOG WILL MEET A LEAST QUARTERLY AT SENIOR LEVELS.

8. THE FOLLOWING PRESS GUIDANCES WERE PREPARED ON 04/26/99 AND NOT USED BY THE SPOKESMAN DURING THE DAILY BRIEFING. POSTS MAY DRAW ON THESE GUIDANCES FOR USE ON AN IF ASKED BASIS.

9. PERRY REVIEW: U.S.-ROK-GOJ TRILATERAL COORDINATION

CONTEXT: AT APRIL 23-25 MEETINGS IN HONOLULU BETWEEN DR. WILLIAM J. PERRY, ROK SENIOR SECRETARY LIM DONG-WON AND JAPANESE DIRECTOR GENERAL KATO RYOZO, THEY NOT ONLY DISCUSSED THE SUBSTANCE OF A POSSIBLE COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH TO THE DPRK, BUT ALSO AGREED TO ESTABLISH A FORMAL MECHANISM FOR IMPLEMENTING IT. A JOINT PRESS STATEMENT WAS RELEASED APRIL 25, 1999 AT NOON (SEE ABOVE).

Q: WHAT MORE CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT THE JOINT PRESS STATEMENT ON DR. PERRY'S MEETINGS IN HONOLULU WITH THE ROK AND JAPAN?

A: THE JOINT PRESS RELEASE SPEAKS FOR ITSELF. DR. WILLIAM J. PERRY MET WITH SENIOR JAPANESE AND KOREAN OFFICIALS IN

HONOLULU

FROM APRIL 23 TO 25 TO CONTINUE CONSULTATIONS IN CONJUNCTION WITH HIS NORTH KOREA POLICY REVIEW. DR. PERRY EARLIER TRAVELED TO SEOUL AND TOKYO AS PART OF THIS PROCESS. THIS WAS THE FIRST TIME THAT HIGH-LEVEL REPRESENTATIVES FROM ALL THREE COUNTRIES HAVE SAT DOWN TOGETHER.

--WE ARE NOT IN A POSITION TO OFFER ADDITIONAL DETAILS ON THE TALKS AT THIS TIME; WE WOULD NOTE THAT MOST OF THE DELEGATION HAS YET TO RETURN FROM HAWAII.

--AS THE PRESS RELEASE NOTES, DISCUSSIONS FOCUSED ON A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH TO REDUCE THE SECURITY THREATS POSED BY NORTH KOREA TO THE U.S., THE ROK, AND TO JAPAN, AND TO BRING PEACE AND STABILITY TO THE KOREAN PENINSULA.

--AS THE PRESS RELEASE ALSO NOTES, THE THREE COUNTRIES AGREED

NOT ONLY ON THE NATURE OF THE THREATS POSED BY THE DPRK, BUT ALSO ON THE NEED FOR A CONCERTED AND INTEGRATED APPROACH TO DEALING WITH THEM.

--THE TRILATERAL COORDINATION MECHANISM SHOULD BE VIEWED IN THAT LIGHT.

Q: WHAT MORE CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT THE TRILATERAL COORDINATION MECHANISM?

A: THE THREE SIDES AGREED THAT AN EFFECTIVE POLICY TOWARD NORTH KOREA SHOULD BE CLOSELY COORDINATED BETWEEN THE U.S., ROK, AND JAPAN.

--FOR THAT PURPOSE THEY AGREED TO ESTABLISH A TRILATERAL COORDINATION AND OVERSIGHT GROUP (TCOG) TO INSTITUTIONALIZE THIS COORDINATION.

--AS FAR AS WE KNOW, PRECISE DETAILS ABOUT THE PERSONALITIES AND LEVEL OF REPRESENTATION FOR THE COORDINATION GROUP HAVE YET TO BE DETERMINED.

10. DPRK: FOUR PARTY TALKS UPDATE

CONTEXT: AT THE OPENING OF THE FIFTH PLENARY ON APRIL 24, AMBASSADOR CHRISTIAN DUNANT, REPRESENTING THE GOVERNMENT OF

SWITZERLAND AS HOST, PROPOSED A FUTURE SEMINAR FOR FOUR PARTY DELEGATIONS ON THE SWISS EXPERIENCE IN OSCE VERIFICATION MEASURES (VM), INCLUDING A VISIT TO A SWISS VM MILITARY INSTALLATION. THE PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSAL IS FOR DELEGATIONS TO OBSERVE AN EXAMPLE OF A SUCCESSFUL PRECEDENT FOR CONFIDENCE BUILDING MEASURES, DUNANT EXPLAINED. IN REMARKS OPENING THE FIFTH PLENARY, AMBASSADOR CHARLES KARTMAN, SERVING AS CHAIR, NOTED THIS IDEA, ALONG WITH A PREVIOUS SWISS PROPOSAL TO ESTABLISH A HUMANITARIAN CORRIDOR THROUGH PANMUNJON AS A FOUR UNCLAS SECTION 05 OF 08 STATE 076764

PARTY CONFIDENCE BUILDING MEASURE.

THE PLENARY MEETING WAS FOLLOWED BY THE TWO SUBCOMMITTEES' MEETINGS APRIL 25 AND 26. ONE SUBCOMMITTEE CONVENED EACH MORNING TO TAKE UP TENSION REDUCTION ON THE KOREAN PENINSULA, AND THE OTHER MET EACH AFTERNOON TO DISCUSS REPLACING THE KOREAN WAR ARMISTICE WITH A PEACE REGIME THERE. THE U.S., AS CHAIR OF THE PLENARY, ALSO CHAIRED BOTH SUBCOMMITTEES: MAJ. GEN. MICHAEL MOSELEY OF THE JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF CHAIRED THE SUBCOMMITTEE ON TENSION REDUCTION AND MR. TODD HARVEY OF THE OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE CHAIRED THE SUBCOMMITTEE FOR THE PEACE REGIME. WORK IN BOTH SUBCOMMITTEES WAS HINDERED BY DPRK INTRANSIGENCE, BUT DISCUSSIONS WERE NEVERTHELESS SERIOUS SUBSTANTIVE, AND OF VALUE.

U.S.-DPRK BILATERAL MEETINGS ALSO TOOK PLACE APRIL 25 AND 26 WHICH PLANS FOR THE MAY VISIT TO THE UNDERGROUND FACILITY AT KUMCHANG-NI WERE REVIEWED AMONG OTHER BILATERAL ISSUES.

PLANS FOR THE CLOSING PLENARY MEETING AND FOR A SIXTH PLENARY ARE IN THE MAKING. THE FIFTH PLENARY IS SCHEDULED TO CONCLUDE TOMORROW, APRIL 27.

Q: WHAT IS YOUR REACTION TO THE SWISS GOVERNMENT'S PROPOSAL MADE DURING ITS WELCOME REMARKS AT THE FIFTH PLENARY OPENING WHAT ABOUT THE PREVIOUS SUGGESTION TO CONSIDER A HUMANITARIAN CORRIDOR?

A: THE SWISS GOVERNMENT IS GRACIOUSLY AND GENEROUSLY SUPPORTING THE FOUR PARTY TALKS. ITS CONSTRUCTIVE PROPOSALS, SUCH AS THE IDEA FOR A SEMINAR AND VISIT TO A SWISS OSCE VERIFICATION MEASURES MILITARY FACILITY, ARE BEING EXAMINED BY THE PARTIES. WE WELCOME THESE CONTRIBUTIONS.

Q: ANY PROGRESS?

A: THE TALKS AT THE SUBCOMMITTEES WERE SUBSTANTIVE AND SERIOUS. THE FULL DELEGATIONS ARE SCHEDULED TO MEET IN PLENARY SESSION TOMORROW, INCLUDING TO DISCUSS THE RESULTS OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE SESSIONS, SO I WILL REFRAIN FROM FURTHER CHARACTERIZING THE TALKS OR DISCUSSING DETAILS AT THIS POINT.

Q: DID YOU CONTINUE TO NEGOTIATE WITH THE DPRK ON THE SUSPECT UNDERGROUND SITE VISIT?

A: THE NEGOTIATIONS ON THE SITE AT KUMCHANG-NI WERE SUCCESSFULLY CONCLUDED MARCH 16. IN A SUBSEQUENT EXPERTS' MEETING HELD IN PYONGYANG, THE U.S. AND DPRK WORKED OUT MOST DETAILS FOR THE MAY VISIT. DURING BILATERAL CONTACTS IN GENEVA, THE U.S. AND DPRK WRAPPED UP REMAINING DETAILS, AND DISCUSSED A RANGE OF OTHER BILATERAL MATTERS ALONG WITH, OF COURSE, ISSUES DIRECTLY PERTAINING TO THE FOUR PARTY TALKS. IN KEEPING WITH OUR USUAL PRACTICE, I WON'T DISCUSS DETAILS OF THESE CONTACTS.

Q: WHAT IS THE DATE FOR THE VISIT TO THE SUSPECT SITE? CAN YOU CONFIRM REPORTS IN THE SOUTH KOREAN PRESS THAT IT IS MAY 17?

A: THOSE REPORTS ARE INCORRECT. THE VISIT WILL TAKE PLACE AS UNCLAS SECTION 06 OF 08 STATE 076764

11. CHINA: 10,000 DEMONSTRATE IN BEIJING

CONTEXT: MORE THAN 10,000 PRACTITIONERS OF FALUN GONG (TRANSLATED IN THE WESTERN PRESS AS BUDDHIST LAW OR PRACTICE THE LAW OF THE REVOLVING WHEEL) A QUASI- RELIGIOUS FORM OF THE CHINESE MARTIAL ART, QIGONG, SURROUNDED CHINA'S LEADERSHIP COMPOUND IN BEIJING AND DEMANDED RECOGNITION FROM THE GOVERNMENT. THE DEMONSTRATION, WHICH WAS THE LARGEST SINCE THE 1989 TIANANMEN DEMONSTRATIONS, APPARENTLY CAUGHT AUTHORITIES SURPRISE. HOWEVER, THE DEMONSTRATORS WERE PEACEFUL AND ORDERLY AND AUTHORITIES EXERCISED RESTRAINT IN DEALING WITH THEM. THE DEMONSTRATORS DISPERSED AT 10:00 P.M., AFTER BEING PROMISED A

MEETING WITH MEMBERS OF CHINA'S STATE COUNCIL. FALUN GONG, THE LARGEST OF MANY QIGONG GROUPS THAT ARE FLOURISHING IN CHINA, ASSERTS THAT IT HAS MORE THAN 100 MILLION MEMBERS. QIGONG, A TRADITIONAL CHINESE TEACHING, INCORPORATES A BROAD RANGE OF HEALING TECHNIQUES, MARTIAL ARTS AND MEDITATION. MANY OF THE PROTESTERS CARRIED A COPY OF A BOOK WRITTEN BY THE SECT'S LEADER LI HONGZHI, WHO MOVED TO NEW YORK LAST YEAR UNDER PRESSURE FROM CHINESE AUTHORITIES TO RESTRICT HIS ACTIVITY. MR. LI ASSERTS THAT HE HAS A HIGHER SPIRITUAL AUTHORITY THAN JESUS, MOHAMMED OR BUDDHA AND TEACHES THAT HE WAS SENT TO EARTH BY A "SUPREME BEING" TO SAVE MANKIND FROM MORAL CORRUPTION CAUSED BY CONSUMERISM, MODERN SCIENCE, AND TECHNOLOGY. MOST PROTESTERS WERE FROM OUTSIDE OF BEIJING AND SEEMED TO ELICIT LITTLE SYMPATHY FROM BEIJING RESIDENTS. THIS PROTEST CAME IN THE MIDDLE OF AN EXTREMELY SENSITIVE TIME, THE 10TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE STUDENT MOVEMENT THAT BEGAN IN APRIL 1989.

Q: COMMENT ON THE LARGE DEMONSTRATION BY ADHERENTS OF FALUN GONG THAT TOOK PLACE IN FRONT OF CHINA'S LEADERSHIP COMPOUND IN BEIJING.

A: WE ARE AWARE OF THE DEMONSTRATION THAT TOOK PLACE IN FRONT OF THE LEADERSHIP COMPOUND IN BEIJING. WE UNDERSTAND THAT THE DEMONSTRATORS WERE PRACTITIONERS OF THE FALUN GONG (FALL-UNN-GUNG) SECT, WHICH PREACHES AMONG OTHER THINGS A BROAD RANGE OF HEALING TECHNIQUES AND MARTIAL ARTS. THE SECT ALSO USES THE BUDDHIST NOTION OF KARMA THAT HOLDS THAT PEOPLE'S DEEDS DETERMINE THEIR FATE IN THE NEXT LIFE.

--THE PROTESTERS DEMANDED THE RELEASE OF FELLOW ADHERENTS WHO HAD BEEN ARRESTED IN A RECENT INCIDENT, AS WELL AS SOME FORM OF RECOGNITION OF FALUN GONG.

--BY ALL REPORTS THE DEMONSTRATION, WHICH LASTED THIRTEEN HOURS, WAS PEACEFUL AND ORDERLY AND CHINESE AUTHORITIES EXERCISED RESTRAINT IN DEALING WITH DEMONSTRATORS. POLICE MADE NO EFFORT TO BREAK UP THE CROWD AND THERE WERE NO REPORTS OF POLICE ABUSE.

--THE DEMONSTRATORS DISPERSED PEACEFULLY ABOUT 10:00 P.M., AFTER THE DEMONSTRATION'S LEADERS WERE PROMISED A MEETING WITH MEMBERS OF CHINA'S STATE COUNCIL.

--WE WELCOME REPORTS THAT CHINESE CITIZENS WERE ABLE TO PEACEFULLY EXERCISE THEIR INTERNATIONALLY-RECOGNIZED

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RIGHTS OF FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION AND ASSEMBLY TO
DEMONSTRATE AND MAKE THEIR VIEWS KNOWN TO CHINA'S
LEADERSHIP.

--CHINESE AUTHORITIES? RESTRAINT IN DEALING WITH THIS LARGE
GATHERING IN FRONT OF ZHONGNANHAI, CHINA'S LEADERSHIP COMPOUND
IN BEIJING, AND THE DECISION OF STATE COUNCIL MEMBERS TO MEET
WITH THE ORGANIZERS OF THE DEMONSTRATION TO HEAR THEIR VIEWS
CLEARLY CONTRIBUTED TO THE PEACEFUL AND SPEEDY CONCLUSION OF
THIS DEMONSTRATION.

--ON APRIL 26, THE STATE COUNCIL GAVE A STATEMENT TO THE
WESTERN PRESS THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD NEVER BANNED QIGONG
(CHEE-GUNG)--THE TRADITIONAL CHINESE MARTIAL ART ON WHICH FALUN
GONG (FALL-UNN GUNG) IS BASED-- AND THAT "DIFFERENT VIEWS AND
OPINIONS" SHOULD BE RESOLVED THROUGH "PROPER CHANNELS."

--WE NOTE THAT NO MAJOR CHINESE DAILIES REPORTED THE INCIDENT.

12. CHINA-WTO

CONTEXT: MEDIA REPORTS IN THE PAST FEW DAYS SUGGESTED THAT THE
U.S. AND CHINA ARE TRYING TO RECOVER MOMENTUM IN THE BILATERAL
TALKS ON CHINA'S ACCESSION TO THE WTO. THIS MORNING'S WALL
STREET JOURNAL CONTINUED IN THIS VEIN, BUT ALSO REPORTED THAT
THE CHINESE OFFICIAL PRESS IS BEGINNING TO WARN CHINESE
BUSINESSES TO BECOME MORE EFFICIENT SO AS TO COMPETE WITH
FOREIGN BUSINESSES. THIS IS A GOOD SIGN, AS FAR AS IT GOES.

AUSTR BOB CASSIDY IS REMAINING IN BEIJING WITH A SMALL
NEGOTIATING TEAM, HAVING EXTENDED FOR A FEW EXTRA DAYS. TALK
ARE CONTINUING, BUT THERE HAVE BEEN NO SENSATIONAL
ANNOUNCEMENTS.

Q: WHAT IS THE STATUS OF TALKS ON CHINESE ACCESSION TO THE
WTO?

A: MEETINGS AT THE EXPERT LEVEL ARE CONTINUING IN BEIJING.
CONTINUE TO FOCUS ON OUR OBJECTIVE OF RESOLVING DIFFERENCES
IN THE REMAINING AREAS OF SERVICES, MARKET ACCESS,
AND THE APPLICATION OF INTERNATIONAL TRADING
RULES TO CHINA.

Q: PRESS REPORTS INDICATE THAT "NO PROGRESS" IS BEING MADE

A: THESE ARE COMPLEX AREAS INVOLVING IMPORTANT ISSUES.
ALTHOUGH WE DO NOT PRESUME THE OUTCOME, WE ARE WORKING AS
HARD AS WE CAN.

13. INDONESIA - EAST TIMOR AUTONOMY TALKS

CONTEXT: THERE WAS CREDIBLE EVIDENCE OF CONTINUED VIOLENCE IN EAST TIMOR OVER THE WEEKEND, AFTER THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF AD REFERENDUM AGREEMENT IN UN-SPONSORED TALKS BETWEEN INDONESIA AND PORTUGAL IN NEW YORK ON THE FUTURE STATUS OF EAST TIMOR. TO END THIS VIOLENCE, IT IS CRITICAL THAT INDONESIAN SECURITY FORCES TAKE ACTIVE MEASURES TO MAINTAIN ORDER AND SHUT DOWN THE RECENTLY-CONSTITUTED PRO-INTEGRATION MILITIA THAT HAS ATTACKED CIVILIANS. IT IS ALSO IMPORTANT THAT INDEPENDENT INTERNATIONAL OBSERVERS, INCLUDING THE UN OFFICIALS WHO WILL HELP SET UP THE VOTE ON AN AGREED AUTONOMY PROPOSAL, ARE ABLE TO EFFECTIVELY UNCLAS SECTION 08 OF 08 STATE 076764

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MONITOR AND VERIFY THE SITUATION ON THE GROUND. AMBASSADOR ROY AND OTHER U.S. OFFICIALS ARE NOW IN EAST TIMOR. THEY REPORT THAT THE SECURITY SITUATION IS FRAGILE AND TENSE.

Q: ISN'T THE RECENTLY NEGOTIATED PEACE AGREEMENT FOR EAST TIMOR MERELY A BLUE PRINT FOR CIVIL WAR?

A: WE WELCOME PROGRESS MADE IN THE NEW YORK NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN INDONESIA, PORTUGAL, AND THE UN ON AN AUTONOMY PACKAGE AND ON STEPS TO CONDUCT A PEACEFUL AND CREDIBLE BALLOT TO POLL THE VIEWS OF THE PEOPLE OF EAST TIMOR ON THE FUTURE STATUS OF THE TERRITORY. THE ANNEXES ON DETAILS OF SECURITY ARRANGEMENT AND MODALITIES OF THE VOTE ARE NOT YET FINALIZED. WE CONSIDERED IT IMPORTANT THAT ALL AGREEMENTS AND ANNEXES BE SIGNED BY MAY 5 AND THAT THEY BE SWIFTLY IMPLEMENTED. WE URGE IMMEDIATE ACTIVATION OF THE EAST TIMOR PEACE AND STABILITY COMMISSION AND EFFECTIVE MOVES AMONG EAST TIMORESE GROUPS TO PROMOTE RECONCILIATION AND END THE VIOLENCE.

--SUCCESS IN THESE RELATED EFFORTS WILL REQUIRE THAT INDONESIAN SECURITY FORCES FULFILL THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES TO PROTECT ALL EAST TIMORESE AND TAKE STEPS IMMEDIATELY TO BRING MILITIAS INVOLVED IN THE RECENT VIOLENCE UNDER CONTROL AND TO DISARM

THEM. WE ARE DEEPLY DISTURBED AT REPORTS OF CONTINUING VIOLENCE AND KILLINGS BY THE ARMED PRO-INTEGRATION MILITIAS DESPITE THE MILITARY'S PLEDGE TO ENFORCE THE TRUCE AGREEMENT REACHED APRIL 21 AND RESTORE ORDER.

--IT IS CRITICAL THAT INDONESIA PERMIT AND FACILITATE IMMEDIATELY AN INTERNATIONAL PRESENCE IN EAST TIMOR WHICH WILL WORK TO RESTORE CALM. WE ANTICIPATE THAT UN OFFICIALS CHARGED WITH HELPING PREPARE FOR THE BALLOT WILL SOON BE IN PLACE. GROUPS RESPONDING TO HUMANITARIAN NEEDS SHOULD ALSO BE ALLOWED IMMEDIATELY TO INITIATE OR INCREASE THEIR ACTIVITIES.

14. IMF CONTINGENT CREDIT LINES

CONTEXT: IN LEAD-UP MEETINGS TO THIS WEEK'S IMF SPRING MEETING, THE IMF EXECUTIVE BOARD APPROVED A NEW CONTINGENT CREDIT LINE MECHANISM. THIS MECHANISM, FIRST PROPOSED BY PRESIDENT CLINTON LAST FALL, WOULD PROVIDE FINANCING TO COUNTRIES FOLLOWING SOUND ECONOMIC POLICIES BUT WHICH ARE THREATENED BY CONTAGION FROM FINANCIAL CRISES IN OTHER COUNTRIES. IN ORDER TO QUALIFY FOR FUNDING UNDER THIS MECHANISM, COUNTRIES MUST BE PURSUING SOUND POLICIES THAT WOULD NOT NORMALLY REQUIRE ASSISTANCE FROM THE IMF, FOLLOW INTERNATIONAL CODES OF CONDUCT FOR ECONOMIC POLICIES, AND HAVE GOOD RELATIONS WITH PRIVATE CREDITORS. COUNTRIES WHICH QUALIFY AND WHICH SEEK ASSISTANCE WOULD RECEIVE ACCESS TO A CREDIT LINE WHICH THEY COULD DRAW UPON SHOULD THE BE THREATENED BY CONTAGION.

Q: CAN YOU COMMENT ON THE IMF'S ANNOUNCEMENT THAT IT HAD GIVEN FINAL APPROVAL TO THE CREATION OF A NEW CONTINGENT CREDIT LINE?

A: AGREEMENT ON THE CONTINGENT CREDIT LINE CARRIES THROUGH ON PRESIDENT CLINTON'S CALL FOR AN EXPANDED CAPACITY TO HELP MAINTAIN CONFIDENCE WHEN COUNTRIES FACE THE THREAT OF FINANCIAL CONTAGION.

-- WE WELCOME THIS IMPROVEMENT TO THE INTERNATIONAL FINANCIAL SYSTEM TO PREVENT AND CONTAIN CRISES.
