Draft POTUS Newsweek Op-Ed

This week, Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Barak and Palestinian Chairman Yasser Arafat will come to Camp David at my invitation in an effort to reach agreement on the core issues that have fueled a half-century of conflict between Israelis and Palestinians.

Why this summit and why now? Simple. While Israeli and Palestinian negotiators have made real progress since that first historic handshake seven years ago, they can take the talks no further at their level. Significant differences remain. The negotiations have reached an impasse. Success now depends on historic

decisions that only the two leaders can make.

For Prime Minister Barak and Chairman Arafat, the challenge this week will be to start drawing the contours of the long-awaited peace - a peace that can fulfill the Israeli people's quest for security, recognition, and genuine reconciliation with Palestinians and genuine acceptance in the region - acceptance in deeds as well as words. A peace that can fulfill the Palestinian people's legitimate aspirations to determine their destiny on their own land, and to build a better future.

Underlying this challenge lie the most profound questions, about beliefs, political identity, and collective fate. Etched into each side's mind are intense fears and emotions and a deep-seated commitment to defend their people's interests.

There are no easy answers, and no painless solutions. Neither side can achieve 100 percent of its goals. For the optimal solution of each party is, by definition, one the other party cannot and will not accept. Negotiations must create an outcome that is realistic, balanced, and fair; that meets the fundamental objectives of both sides; that strengthens the two parties rather than weakens one of them; that accommodates both sides vital needs and reconciles their competing grievances.

To delay this gathering is simply no longer an option. For the Israeli-Palestina n conflict knows no status quo. It can move forward toward real peace, or it can slide back into turmoil. It will not stand still. If the parties do not seize this moment to make more progress, there will be more hostility and more bitterness, perhaps even more violence.

And to what end? Eventually, after more bloodshed and tears, they will have to come back to the negotiating table. They will have to return to face the same history, the same geography, the same demographic trends, the same

passions, and
the same hatreds - and the same exact choices that confront them
today.

The decisions will not come easier with time. The leaders have to
make the
decisions that are stiller there to be made, and the longer we wait, the
more
difficult the decisions are likely to become. The Israeli and Palestinian
people
have leaders now who are visionary enough, courageous enough, and
capable of
building a fair, just, and lasting peace.

In coming here and accepting this challenge, Prime Minister Barak
and Chairman
Arafat have shown they are ready to take risks to pursue peace. The
rest of the
world - and especially the rest of the region - cannot afford to be
bystanders.
For all those who are truly committed to the cause of peace and to the
well-being
of the Israeli and Palestinian people, now is the time to lend their
support to
the peacemakers.
