^Albright to meet PLO men near Camp David - source
THURMONT, Md., July 13 (Reuters) - U.S. Secretary of State
Madeleine Albright on Friday will leave the Camp David site of
Middle

East summit talks to meet Palestinian leaders who travelled from the
region to meet President Yasser Arafat, a source close to the talks
told Reuters.

``Albright will meet the PLO (Palestine Liberation Organisation)
representatives at Emmitsburg at 1 p.m. (EDT/ 1700 GMT)," the
source

said. A U.S. official would neither confirm nor deny the report.

The source said the men -- Tayseer Khaled of the radical
Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine, Suleiman al-Najab
of the Palestinian People's Party and Sameer Ghosheh of the Popular
Struggle Front -- still wanted to get into Camp David to consult with
Arafat on the talks, which are tackling the most sensitive issues of
the 52-year-old conflict.

Emmitsburg is a town near Camp David where a federal emergencies training site is being used as an extra site for any lower-level, technical talks which may be required as the four-day-old summit proceeds. The Americans have been reluctant to give access to the secluded talks to the newly-arrived Palestinian officials, who are now throwing their weight behind Arafat having previously opposed his 1993 Oslo peace deal with Israel, which forms the basis of these talks.

[FBIS Translated Text] If the Camp David summit proves

a success (which remains unclear at this stage), it will only be the beginning. Bill Clinton has big plans in such an event. The plans in Washington are for August to be "Syria month." If Clinton pulls off an agreement at Camp David (regardless of whether its a comprehensive deal or just a framework accord), he will immediately turn to Damascus.

The contacts are already underway. Syria has relayed clear signals, some of them publicly. The Americans are planning another summit for

August with the participation of Clinton, al-Asad, and Baraq, in order to quickly wrap up an elegant Syrian-Israeli peace agreement.

Baraq will then hold a national referendum, or call elections, on the entire package: A comprehensive and final end to the Middle East conflict at bargain price (depending, of course, on one's viewpoint).

Syria will get back all the Golan Heights (with a creative compromise being found with regard to the north-eastern bank of Lake Tiberias). Arafat will get almost all of the West Bank (in stages). Jerusalem will be expanded (but also a little divided). Most of the settlements will stay under Israel's sovereignty, and that's that: peace and happiness

to all. Clinton, for his part, will take the whole package when he puts in his bid for the Nobel Peace Prize.

So far the plan. Reality, however, is a bit more difficult and cruel. To make all this happen, Baraq and Arafat have to reach an arrangement. Both of them are expected to make unbearably tough decisions and agree to huge concessions. They are expected to cut into their own flesh. To gamble on their future. To go all the way without fear or hesitation. To rise above the moment, the difficulties, and the opposition. It is not certain that this will happen. It is far more likely that it won't.

Nevertheless, the summit's first days were good. The atmosphere was good. There were smiles a sense of openness and opportunity. A feeling that it can be done. Because if they fail to achieve an agreement now at Camp David, it is unclear when -- if at all -- it can ever be reached in the future. [Description of Source: Tel Aviv Ma'ariv

^UPDATE 3-Arafat talked out of leaving summit -source
(Updates with U.S. briefing)

THURMONT, Md., July 14 (Reuters) - Palestinian President

Yasser Arafat threatened to walk out of a Middle East summit in
angerover U.S. bridging proposals but President Bill Clinton calmed him
down,

a source close to the talks said on Friday.

As an official news blackout continued for a fourth day,

Israeli and Palestinian sources both said the United States had put forward its own ideas for the first time Thursday night aimed at narrowing differences on the core issues.

But those ideas, which the Israeli source said were only presented verbally, sparked the summit's first reported crisis. One source told Reuters that Arafat was so angry at the proposals made by U.S. Middle East envoy Dennis Ross that he ordered his delegation to pack their bags.

"There was a crisis during the talks yesterday and Arafat ordered his delegation to pack their bags to leave Camp David in anger

at American proposals which were identical to the Israeli position," the source said.

"President Clinton calmed Arafat down and the Palestinian leader agreed to stay only after the Americans withdrew their proposals.

They are expected to submit new proposals," the source added. White House spokesman Joe Lockhart refused to confirm or deny the report, but conceded that tensions had flared at times.

"I didn't see any luggage today," Lockhart said when asked about the reported Thursday night incident.

"These are very, very difficult issues. I've heard about a lot of tensions between the parties. There are tensions every day when you're working through these issues," he said.

ARAFAT SAID TO BRISTLE OVER JERUSALEM

A Palestinian source said the U.S. ideas covered Palestinian refugees, the fate of Jerusalem and borders of a future Palestinian state.

He also said Arafat had rejected a redrawn map of the disputed city of Jerusalem proposed by Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Barak's delegation,

saying it was close to an Israeli proposal to grant Palestinians in East Jerusalem municipal powers under Israeli sovereignty.

Palestinians want Arab East Jerusalem as capital of an independent state, while Israel says the holy city must remain undivided under its sovereignty.

Two senior cabinet ministers told reporters in Israel this week that a swap of West Bank land for sovereign Israeli territory would

also be on the table.

Lockhart said Clinton was expected to remain at Camp David until he leaves for a major summit in Japan next Wednesday.

"I think you can assume he will be here indefinitely. I think everyone knows the outer parameters of his schedule," he told

a news briefing.

Clinton is due to leave next Wednesday for a Group of Eight summit in Japan. Some Israeli officials have said the negotiations

could
continue in his absence.

Asked if the atmosphere was positive, Lockhart said he would prefer to stick to the word "informal." The talks had split into working

groups on each of the core issues, he said.

A senior Israeli source said: "The negotiations are difficult.

These are subjects that are hard to solve. If there will be an agreement,

Israel will have to pay a heavy price."

Israeli and Palestinian officials said delegation members would open talks on economic issues on Saturday night, either at Camp

David or at a separate federal facility in the nearby town of Emmitsburg

where technical experts have been based.

ALBRIGHT MEETS PALESTINIAN VISITORS

Albright left Camp David Friday morning and met a group of Palestinian leftist opposition leaders in Emmitsburg after the U.S. hosts refused to allow them to confer with Arafat at the summit venue. Struggling to keep the talks confidential, Lockhart said:

"Given the spirit of the ground rules that we've put down, we indicated

that we prefer that meeting not happen." But he did not entirely rule it out, saying delegates were free to leave Camp David if they wished to.

Lockhart said the Albright meeting was intended to take the place of a session with Arafat in Camp David requested by Palestinian

officials at the invitation of the PLO leader.

One of three Palestinians who flew in to see Arafat, Tayseer

Khaled of the radical Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine,

refused to meet Albright, charging that the Americans were interfering

in Palestinian affairs.

With Barak preparing to negotiate on Jerusalem, one of his domestic opponents, Limor Livnat of the Likud Party, visited the summit

media centre to warn against erecting a "Berlin Wall" in the city.

U.S. officials promptly asked her to leave, as they did a Palestinian official two days previously. "Symmetry has been restored,"

a U.S. official said.

Israeli and Palestinian officials warn that if the summit fails, the region might be consumed by violence much worse than the seven-year Palestinian Intifada or uprising which began in 1987 against

Israel's military occupation of the Gaza Strip and West Bank, lands captured 20 years previously.

[FBIS Translated Text] [Taha] Mr. Nabil, what happened
at Camp David yesterday that disturbed the Palestinian president and

made him threaten to withdraw from the summit?

[Amr] These reports are baseless. I listened to the news dispatches, a large part of which are mere deductions and there is no information about this topic.

[Taha] You listened to a report on what Israel wants with respect to Jerusalem, the refugees, and the settlements. How do the Palestinians view these proposals?

[Amr] These reports about the Israeli proposals are a collection of Israeli ideas leaked by Israel on many issues under discussion. For us, there is a clear stand on all these issues that is based on international legitimacy, on the need for great respect for the international laws and resolutions on final-status issues. All these issues are being negotiated at Camp David. The Palestinian side insists on the importance, or the need for the solution to be based on international legitimacy. The Israelis, of course, have reservations on this issue. The issues have not been settled, as yet.

[Taha] What did the US paper that was presented say on these three issues?

[Amr] The US side has not submitted a US paper so far. There is a US attempt to sound out the points on which ideas could be presented. Therefore, what was said about the paper is not accurate.

[Taha] You are in Washington and were among those who met with Albright. What is your comment on the US refusal to have the Palestinian delegation and figures that were described as being from the opposition from meeting with the Palestinian president while Dan Meridor was allowed to join the Israeli delegation at Camp David?

[Amr] First of all, there was no special arrangement for the Palestinians. All the arrangements that are taking place now have been

agreed upon in advance and all the parties know this. We have the negotiating delegation that comprises 12 members and who are at Camp

David. This is the number of people each party is allowed to have. The Israeli delegation did not have 12 members but less than this number.

Therefore, when any delegation has less than 12 members, the delegation

can bring in more members. As for us, we submitted 12 names from the

very first day. That's why Dan Meridor's arrival is within the Israeli

quota, if one can use this expression. As for us, there was no possibility to add any other person.
