Camp David Peace Talks
July 19, 2000

For the past nine days, we have been engaged in the most comprehensive and thorough negotiations ever between Israelis and Palestinians. As I explained on the eve of the Summit, I was convinced that we had a genuine opportunity to put an end to their conflict, reach a just and lasting peace, and create a better future for the Middle East.

I believe the two parties made an intensive effort to try to resolve their differences over the most difficult issues in their conflict.

With our help, they explored ideas and possibilities, all on the explicit basis that nothing was agreed until everything was agreed, and that the ideas discussed did not necessarily reflect the view of any of the parties.

I want to express my appreciation to Prime Minister Barak, Chairman Arafat, and

their delegations for the efforts they undertook to reach an agreement.
Prime

Minister Barak showed courage and an understanding of the historical importance

of this moment, and Chairman Arafat has made it clear that he remains committed to the path of peace.

Unfortunately, while we left no stone large or small unturned in our efforts to

bridge the differences, and while real progress was made, it became clear this

morning that some gaps could not be closed now. I therefore have decided to end the summit.

As I do so, I am fully aware that disappointment will be felt on both sides.

But, it is essential at this time that Israelis and Palestinians do not lose the

hope for peace and avoid any actions that would inflame the situation.

Already

they have come a long way together.

The Oslo process is forging a new relationship between these two peoples, who

have no alternative but to live side-by-side and build a common future for their

children. For the sake of these children, their leaders now must make a supreme

effort to continue along the path of peace. And all those who have an interest

in peace must give them the support they need. The United States should always

be prepared to walk the extra mile for peace, no matter the risks, no matter the

odds. That is why I convened this summit and that is why I will remain ready to

do whatever I can to help the parties make peace.

From the beginning, no one underestimated the difficulties involved.

The issues

faced by the parties involve questions of history, identity, and national fate.

But because this is hard does not mean we can give up. There is only one path to

peace: negotiations, honorable compromise and a commitment to reach a fair deal.

That effort must continue because the alternative is unacceptable.

Background: In a surprise development early this morning, after the White House had announced the Summit could be concluding without an agreement, Israeli and Palestinian delegations agreed to continue their negotiations at Camp David after President Clinton's departure for the G-8 Summit in Okinawa. Secretary Albright will be leading the US team until the President's return in four days. A news blackout is still in effect.

CORE POINTS:

* I'm obviously pleased that both sides have decided to continue these very important discussions to try and find a way forward to a just and lasting peace.

* This Administration is absolutely committed to helping the parties achieve that goal and we will spare no effort in that regard.

If asked about substantive disagreements between the parties

As you know, there is a news blackout that I intend to respect.

The President has said that these are as difficult negotiations as he's seen.

These are complex issues that go to the very core issues at hand.

If asked about your participation

* I'm being kept fully apprised of developments and fully support our efforts here.
