^Hizbollah warns against U.S. proposals at Camp David
BEIRUT, March 22 (Reuters) - Hizbollah said on Saturday Palestinian
acceptance of U.S. proposals at the Camp David Middle East summit
that

fall short of solving the refugees and other problems would lead to
further tension in the region.

``The refugees, Jerusalem and the size of the Palestinian
state are complex issues on which the U.S. backs Israel fully," said
Naim Kassem, deputy head of the organisation whose guerrillas
fought

Israel's occupation of south Lebanon for nearly 20 years.

``Even if they reached an agreement which does not take into
consideration reality and full Palestinian rights then tension will
follow suit and flare up will remain the rule in the region," Kassem
told Reuters in an interview.

Hizbollah (Party of God) drove Israel out of south Lebanon
in May after a long war of attrition. It has opposed peace deals struck
by Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat with Israel and called on
Palestinians

under occupation to take up arms.

Hizbollah and other Lebanese groups say the 360,000 Palestinians
registered as refugees in Lebanon should have the right to return
home.

They also oppose Israeli control of Jerusalem.

Israel is unlikely to accept the return in any significant
numbers of the 3.4 million refugees scattered across the Levant as part

of a final peace deal that the Camp David summit is intended to
achieve.

A U.S. proposal circulated by Israeli officials calls for
Israeli sovereignty over the whole of Jerusalem with Palestinian
administratio

n of some Arab Moslem quarters. The Palestinians are demanding
sovereignty

over Arab East Jerusalem.

^Barak tries to heal rift in his Camp David team

WASHINGTON, July 22 (Reuters) - Prime Minister Ehud Barak tried to project an image of harmony among Israel's peace negotiators on Saturday after two officials denied reports they were pressuring him to compromise on Jerusalem.

``Prime Minister Barak says that he carries final responsibility for any result of the Camp David summit whether a deal will be reached

or whether there will be a deadlock, including decisions on Jerusalem,"

a statement released by Barak's office said.

``The delegation is working in full harmony with a sense of heavy responsibility for the results of the summit," it said.

Amnon Lipkin-Shahak and Shlomo Ben-Ami, who are both ministers in Barak's government and senior members of his team at the Camp David

peace talks outside Washington, had issued an unprecedented public statement

denying reports that they were pressuring Barak to make concessions on Jerusalem.

``Those close to the prime minister who are spreading these reports are acting with unparalleled nerve. They are saying things which

are according to their opinion and not those of the prime minister," Lipkin-Shahak and Ben-Ami wrote in a joint statement.

Israeli political sources said the unnamed Barak aides were not acting on their own accord.

The fate of Jerusalem seemed the most likely deal-breaker at Israel's peace talks with the Palestinians, which are expected to regain momentum when U.S. President Bill Clinton returns from the Group

of Eight summit in Japan on Sunday.

Palestinians want East Jerusalem, which Israel captured in the 1967 Middle East war, as the capital of a state they plan to establish

this year.

Barak has broken a 33-year taboo by agreeing to even discuss the status of Jerusalem, which Israel insists will remain its ``united and eternal capital."

ISRAEL: Israeli Left Wing Threatens To Topple Baraq If Fails To
Achieve

Accord

[FBIS Translated Text] The prime minister is between a rock and a hard place: while the right-wing camp is threatening to topple

the government if an agreement that entails concessions on Jerusalem is achieved, the left-wing camp is making the opposite threat, if an agreement is not reached, it will withdraw its support from Baraq.

Arab MK's announced that if an agreement is not achieved at the summit, they will present a no-confidence motion in the government.

"If the talks fail we will take action to topple the Baraq government," MK Muhammad Barakah, HADASH Knesset faction chairman, and Talib Sani, chairman of the United Arab List faction said.

Senior officials in Peace Now and the other peace movements said at the end of the week that if Baraq returns from the summit without an agreement, he does not deserve their support.

Peace Now Secretary General Gabi Lasky said "we support the idea and not the man. Our working assumption is that Baraq is coming

back with an agreement. If he returns without one, we will have to reassess the situation and find out whether he did everything possible to reach a peace agreement."

Meretz made similar remarks. Senior Meretz officials said yesterday that "only after Baraq returns from Camp David, and what happened there becomes known, a decision will be made whether to support him."

In addition, senior Labor officials assessed yesterday that returning from Camp David without an agreement will undermine Baraq's status as party chairman and open up a struggle for party head. "If Baraq returns without an agreement, his status will be weakened, and if that happens senior party officials will not hesitate to compete against him for leadership of the party," the officials said. In their view, those who might compete against Baraq are Minister Shlomo Ben-Ami and Knesset Speaker Avraham Burg.

What could strengthen those assessments were weekend reports on sharp differences of opinion between Baraq and Ben-Ami at Camp David.

^Israeli minister says Jerusalem can be resolved

JERUSALEM, July 23 (Reuters) - Justice Minister Yossi Beilin said on Sunday that he believed Israeli and Palestinian negotiators at Camp David would be able to resolve their disagreements over Jerusalem and sew up a deal.

"It is possible to solve the problems of Jerusalem," Beilin told reporters during a bus tour of Arab neighbourhoods in East Jerusalem.

"It is much more of a symbolic problem than anything else." The fate of Jerusalem, which is holy to Jews, Christians and Moslems, is thought to be the most formidable obstacle to an agreement

at the Camp David peace summit near Washington.

Beilin, an architect of Israel's seven-year-old peace negotiations with the Palestinians, told reporters that Israeli Prime Minister Ehud

Barak and Palestinian President Yasser Arafat were "on the verge"

of an agreement.

Barak has vowed to maintain Israel's undivided sovereignty over the holy city, although aides have hinted he could accept sharing

sovereignty in some parts of Arab East Jerusalem.

Palestinian officials have said they reject any proposal which falls short of full Palestinian rule over East Jerusalem.

Israel captured East Jerusalem from Jordan in the 1967 Middle East war and annexed it in a move not recognised internationally.

Palestinians

want Arab East Jerusalem as the capital of a future state they plan to establish this year.

Beilin said the status of Jerusalem as Israel's "united and eternal capital" would not be compromised if Barak gave Palestinians

control of Arab neighbourhoods added to the holy city after the 1967

conflict.

He said there were 28 such Arab neighbourhoods which were never "really fully integrated" into Israel.

The Israeli newspaper Ha'aretz reported from the summit that opinion polls taken privately for Barak showed 62-65 percent of Israelis

would accept deep concessions in Jerusalem as part of a broader peace

package. Public surveys have reached the opposite conclusion.

The Camp David summit is expected to regain momentum when U.S. President Bill Clinton returns to Washington from the Group of

Eight summit in Japan at 3:50 p.m. (1950 GMT).

Diplomats say that significant progress had been made on most issues -- the borders and powers of a Palestinian state, security

arrangements, the fate of Palestinian refugees and the future of Jewish

settlements in the West Bank.

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
