^Arafat seeks Egypt's support in Israel talks-report

CAIRO, July 24 (Reuters) - Palestinian President Yasser Arafat has asked Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak for support and accused Israel

of intransigence at the Camp David peace talks, a newspaper reported on Monday.

``The summit and our previous efforts have clashed with extremist

and tough positions from the government of Israel and the policy of Israeli stubbornness," Arafat said in a telegram congratulating Mubarak

on the 48th anniversary of Egypt's 1952 Revolution, published in the daily al-Gomhuria.

"Therefore, we look to you and sister Egypt to support our negotiating positions."

"We came to Camp David with our sights set on realising comprehensive and fair peace...that guarantees for our nation and our Palestinian people their rights on their land and holy places," the paper quoted Arafat as saying.

He praised Mubarak, a major Arab ally, for defending Palestinians' right of return, of self-determination, and right to establish a state with Jerusalem as its capital."

Talks at Camp David, entering their 14th day, were expected to intensify after a three-day absence by U.S. President Bill Clinton. Palestinian officials said on Sunday Arafat's unwavering determination to end 33 years of Israeli occupation of Arab East Jerusalem

was strengthened by a flurry of political activity in the Middle East by some Arab leaders.

Mubarak made a surprise trip to Saudi Arabia on Sunday for talks on the Camp David summit with King Fahd and Crown Prince Abdullah.

Egyptian Foreign Minister Amr Moussa and his Jordanian counterpart

Abdulilah al-Khatib said after talks in Egypt on Saturday that East Jerusalem was occupied Palestinian land that should be returned in accordance

with United Nations resolutions.

The status of Jerusalem is the most intractable issue facing the negotiators. Israel occupied East Jerusalem in the 1967 Middle East

war and annexed it, a move not recognised internationally.

^UPDATE 1-Palestinians say summit at difficult stage

GAZA, July 24 (Reuters) - Palestinian President Yasser Arafat has described his peace negotiations with Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Barak as at a ``very difficult" stage with no sign of progress, a senior aide said on Monday.

Tayeb Abdel-Rahim, the adviser, said he had spoken on Sunday night to Arafat. He denied Israeli news reports that near-agreement

had been reached in the Camp David talks on all the main issues except Jerusalem.

``There has been no agreement reached on any of the negotiable issues on the table including Jerusalem, borders, economy, refugees, security, (Jewish) settlements and water. None of the files have been closed," he said.

``President Arafat sees that the negotiations are passing through a very difficult stage because there was no progress made on any of the negotiable issues," he said.

Israeli officials said prospects for a peace deal could become clearer on Monday after U.S. President Bill Clinton rejoined the 14-day-old talks after a three-day absence.

``We have always appreciated efforts by President Clinton to support the peace process," Abdel-Rahim said. ``We hope the American

administration would compel the Israeli side to comply with the peace

process terms of reference."

Abdel-Rahim said resolving the issue of Jerusalem was fundamental to reaching a comprehensive peace treaty and the Palestinians demanded

full sovereignty in Arab East Jerusalem.

``The only possibility is that Jerusalem must return to full Palestinian sovereignty, otherwise Israel would continue to slip away from peace obligations," he added.

Both Barak and Arafat have promised their people they would present any accord in a referendum.

``If Arafat comes back with a comprehensive agreement he'll win the support of his people, and if he comes back refusing to surrender

he'll be embraced by his people as a leader and as a symbol," Abdel-Rahim said.

``We hope we could come to an agreement, but if not we will pursue our plans to declare a (Palestinian) state," he added.
