ISRAEL: TAKE 1 OF 2--Israel -- Opposition Urges Early Elections
as Talk
of Unity Government Continues

[FBIS Report] The Israeli media on 24 July reports on a
statement issued by the right-wing opposition parties calling for early

elections and their decision to withdraw their no-confidence motions, as well as on stories about secret One Israel-Likud contacts aimed at setting up a national unity government in the event that the Camp David summit ends in failure.

The state-funded but independent Voice of Israel in Hebrew at 0900 GMT reports: "At the end of a meeting held today at the initiative of Likud leader Ari'el Sharon, leaders of the right-wing opposition parties -- except United Torah Jewry -- issued a statement in favor of disbanding the Knesset and calling early elections. Our correspondent Gil Litman reports that the right-wing leader further pledged in their statement to thwart what they believe is the prime minister's willingness to undermine the unity of Jerusalem and to make concessions to the Palestinian s in all areas.

"Meanwhile, the Likud and the National Unity-Yisra'el Beytenu factions have withdrawn their motions of no confidence in the prime minister which had been slated to be discussed today due to the prime minister's absence from the country. Consequently, the Knesset will this afternoon only discuss and vote on the motion submitted by the Herut faction."

The press carries several reports on the developments in the domestic arena, including the possibility of setting up a national unity government. Writing on page 2 of the independent, liberal, intellectual

Tel Aviv Ha'aretz in English, Yosi Verter says: "Sources in the Likud said yesterday that most of the party's senior figures will agree to join an 'emergency government' if the summit meeting fails and violence erupts in the territories.

"Last week cabinet Minister Hayim Ramon asked the chairman of the Likud faction, MK Re'uven Rivlin, what his party's position would be if the prime minister were to invite it to join the government. Rivlin

replied that in his opinion such a move would be 'political suicide' for the Likud. Sharon, to whom Rivlin reported the meeting with Ramon, yesterday invited the heads of all the opposition parties -- SHAS, National

Union-Yisra'el Beytenu, Yisra'el Ba'aliya and the NRP -- to an urgent meeting set for today at which the latest political developments will be discussed.

"The view in both the Likud and One Israel is that if an agreement is reached at Camp David but Baraq is unable to obtain a parliamentary majority for it and for a referendum, elections will be held early next year. Both parties rule out the possibility that Baraq will fall in a no-confidence vote, as that would mandate elections within 60 days, for which neither party is ready."

Writing on page 5 of the independent, second-largest circulation Tel Aviv Ma'ariv in Hebrew, Ron Levin, Menahem Rahat, and Arye Bender report: "Ma'ariv has learned that, with the prime minister's approval, meetings were held in recent days by senior One Israel and Likud members to discuss the establishment of a national unity government. It was noted that 'most senior Likud figures evinced vast interest.' Officially, however, the Likud continues to affirm that it is not interested in joining a government led by Baraq.

"A senior source told Ma'ariv yesterday: 'The Likud knows that Baraq can survive as prime minister without them as well, and that any additional minute they spend in the opposition will weaken them versus SHAS, their true rival in the elections. And, one must not forget that Ari'el Sharon would rather entrench his position as leader of the Likud inside the government than let Binyamin Netanyahu entrench his position as opposition leader outside the Knesset.'"

The Voice of Israel reported in its 0600 GMT Hebrew newscast: "Minister Dalya Itzik says that after his return from Camp David, the prime minister will set up a different coalition. According to her, the idea of a national unity government has been discussed in informal chats and has not been rejected out of hand by Likud members. In response, Likud chairman Ari'el Sharon says there have been no contacts whatsoever to set up a unity government, either overt or covert, and that there were no such contacts in the past year. According to him, elections should be held as soon as possible, to be ensued by a Likud-led government."

A report by David Franklin on page 1 of the independent Jerusalem The Jerusalem Post adds: "The Likud must decide on when to hold an internal election for its new leader and next candidate for prime minister

as soon as the results of the Camp David summit are known, Likud chairman MK Ari'el Sharon said yesterday. Sharon told The Jerusalem Post he has conducted polls that have shown he can defeat any of the candidates expected to challenge him, except for former chairman and prime minister Binyamin Netanyahu. 'Netanyahu will definitely be a problem,' said Sharon, adding that anyone is entitled to run."

"He maintained that Jewish leaders, like members of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, who 'are concerned' about the potential Israeli moves on Jerusalem at the summit are not speaking out due to Baraq's warnings that violence will break out if a peace deal is not concluded. 'He is threatening his people with war, and is recruiting anyone he can, including other leaders, to threaten,' said the Likud leader, adding that Clinton's remarks on the possibility of violence if no accord is reached were inspired by the premier." "He also maintained that Baraq plans to pursue the Syrian track after dealing with the Palestinian talks. In fact, Sharon said, he has information that Baraq has already made a proposal to the United States that 'Israel will agree to a withdrawal to Lake Kinneret on condition that the Syrians commit not to take water from the Kinneret, and allow Israelis to travel freely, to have their barbecues, around the Kinneret.' The significance of such a move would be that the prime minister would be consenting to a pullback to the pre-June 4, 1967 line, instead of the international border."

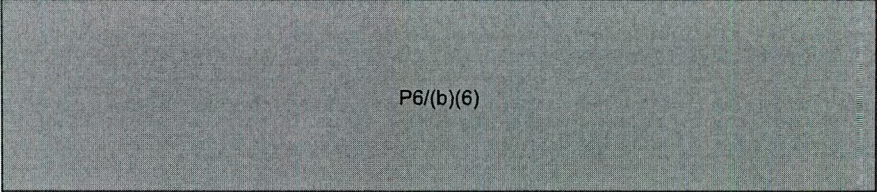

The fact that the parties themselves were willing to seriously discuss a resolution to this issue is testimony to how far the peace process has come and I am urging both sides to continue that process.

If pressed on USG reaction should Arafat declare a Palestinian State this year

I don't want to speculate on hypotheticals.

In the meantime, I would strongly counsel both sides against taking any unilateral action that would damage the peace process.

The window for achieving a just and lasting peace is not closed.

1. That the two Presidents meet at the Millennium Summit (September 5-8). This is an official request.
2. That the President stop in Tunis on his way to Nigeria (this was a personal request from the Ambassador)
