Following upon our recommendation IV.B. (Dec. 1996); the Council needs to
see
the report disseminated by HRSA in June 1995 entitled, "Progress and
Challenges in Linking Incarcerated Individuals with HIV/AIDS to Community
Services."

The Council needs the that HRSA specific guidance stating that CARE Act
funds
should only be used to supplement and enhance existing state programs,
particularly state funded drug assistance programs and programs for inmates
under the custody of States.

The Council also requests further elaboration concerning the draft policy
regarding services for incarcerated individuals. Specifically, (a) how
does
the policy that "such individuals are the responsibility of the institution
and jurisdiction in which they are confined" affect individuals in federal
jails, (b) How is the use of CARE Act funds monitored when other funding
for
the pre-release case management and linkage services are unavailable, and
(c)
How are case management services "typically including assessment of needs,
development of a care plan, referral and follow-up to ensure access to
needed
services, and an ongoing reassessment of needs," monitored and evaluated.

AIDS Education & Training Centers

The Council requests the list of Federal, State and local correctional
facilities which received AETC training.

We further request copies of curriculum used in such programs and
scheduling

Sandy and I just received a copy of the full text of the language being proposed for the ADAP program and have concern about it. She asked that I relay that concern to you.

There were two concerns expressed by ONAP that you have addressed: (1) need for funding for viral load testing and other medical expenses related to the new treatments; and (2) need to allow states some flexibility to use their ADAP funds so that they could purchase insurance coverage that would provide benefits equivalent to their ADAP formulary but at a reduced cost.

The increase in Title II (non-ADAP) adequately addresses the first concern. Broadening the use of ADAP funds to include "medical services directly related to AIDS drugs" is overly broad and inadvisable.

To correct this problem, and to address the second issue we raised, we suggest that the words "medical services directly related to" be stricken.

AIDS Deaths Drop 60% In California
Wide distribution of new drugs credited

AIDS deaths in California dropped an astonishing 60 percent in the first six months of 1997 -- the strongest evidence to date that available new drugs may be saving thousands of lives.

The nearly two-thirds decline in AIDS deaths surprised and delighted researchers, who said yesterday that California's aggressive attempts to distribute anti-viral drugs to infected patients appears to be paying off.

"These numbers are huge. I've not seen anything like this," said Thomas

Coates, executive director of the University of California at San Francisco's AIDS Research Institute.

Developed by the California Department of Health Services, at the request of The Chronicle, the figures show that the dramatic improvements in survival

first noticed by Bay Area AIDS patients are substantial and statewide.

During the first six months of 1997, according to state records, 1,112 California residents died of AIDS. That is 60 percent below the 2,788 who perished in the same period one year earlier.

That compares with a 23 percent drop in death rates noted by the federal Centers for Disease Control, which measured AIDS deaths nationwide between 1995 and 1996. The difference between the new state figures and the older federal data strongly suggests that the trend toward fewer deaths is accelerating.

Dr. Richard Selick, a CDC epidemiologist, said the California statistics

are impressive. ``It's a sudden, dramatic drop that does suggest it would be the influence of a recent change in treatment," he said.

DRUGS TAKEN IN COMBINATION

The drop-off in death rates coincides with the widespread use of the newest anti-viral drugs, called protease inhibitors, which are taken in combination with older AIDS drugs.

Epidemiologists expected a decline in AIDS deaths in the latter part of the 1990s because infection rates fell dramatically in the mid- 1980s after it became clear that AIDS was caused by a sexually transmitted virus, and gay men in great numbers switched to safer sex practices.

But Selick said the steep pitch of the decline noted in California points to the effect of drugs, rather than a decade-old behavior change, which would have produced a steady but slower decline.

``This is a great payoff for all the research that has been going on for a decade and one half," said George Lemp, who coordinates AIDS research programs for the UC system.

``The drop in deaths would appear to exceed what you would expect from prevention," Lemp said. ``It's probably attributable to new therapy."

MAKING TREATMENT AVAILABLE

Jim Creeger, research manager for the state Office of AIDS, described the drop-off in AIDS deaths as ``an awesome decrease," and he attributed it to California's effort ``to get these (protease inhibitor) drugs out on the street."

He noted that the figures are preliminary because it takes time for county death records to be completed and sent to the state. However, he said such death records are ``more than 90 percent complete" after six months, and the latest figures are based on numbers reported more than six months ago.

Creeger said he believes the figures will not change significantly as the remaining death records trickle in.

Dr. Steve Morin, director of public policy research at UCSF's AIDS Research Institute, said the availability of the new AIDS drugs varies dramatically from state to state.

``California and New York probably have the best programs in the country," said Morin. ``The worst states are those with the poorest Medicaid programs," like North Carolina, Mississippi and Florida.

Ever since it became apparent that the protease drugs were helping AIDS patients, federal funds have been pouring into the AIDS Drug Assistance Program -- but at rates far below what clinicians say is needed. The federal

outlay for assistance program rose from \$50 million in 1995 to \$285 million in the current fiscal year. California has augmented the federal assistance program money with state funds -- more than \$24 million is allocated for 1998. Governor Pete Wilson has proposed increasing that figure by \$36 million in his new budget.

'TREATMENT ON DEMAND'

In San Francisco, coverage for protease drugs is so encompassing that Moran calls it virtually "treatment on demand." The bill for AIDS drugs has risen to \$13.5 million from \$3.5 million in 1996.

Amid all the optimism, however, researchers caution that the lifesaving effects of the protease drugs may not last. There is also a fear that the good news will diminish the discipline required to maintain the safe sex practices that helped curtail the spread of the epidemic 15 years ago.

UCSF researcher Coates noted that the drop in death rates coincides with a time dubbed "the honeymoon period" for protease drugs -- a time before scientists began to note that the virus seemed to be returning in some patients taking the drugs.

In fact, a San Francisco General Hospital study found that 53 percent of those taking the combination were showing signs that the AIDS virus was reviving in their bloodstreams. However, that study is recognized as not representing a typical sample of San Francisco AIDS patients.

"We can't emphasize how much we are not clear that this is going to last," said Ben Collins, spokesman for San Francisco based Project Inform.

"These drugs are difficult to take, and the regime is difficult to adhere to for a long period of time."

More than 37,500 Californians now have AIDS, and 150,000 more have been found to be HIV-positive, the Department of Health Services reports.

The state's AIDS Drug Assistance Program, established in 1987, pays for drug treatments that can cost as much as \$12,000 a year for low- or moderate-income HIV-positive people.

In the budget that Wilson plans to reveal today, he will ask the Legislature to add \$36 million to the program. That would push total spending

-- state and federal -- to \$130 million. The AIDS Drug Assistance Program provides the drugs free, or at limited cost, to those with adjusted gross incomes of less than \$50,000 a year. This year, nearly 20,000 people were enrolled.

Assemblywoman Carole Migden, D-San Francisco, said, "It's a spectacular comfort to people in dire need of lifesaving medication." She called Wilson's proposal "extraordinary."

In the FY99 budget, the Administration includes language concerning a number of sensitive issues. OMB staff have solicited comments from the various EOP agencies and HHS and would like to propose the following compromise positions. If you disagree and we need to meet, please contact me at 395-9188 no later than 2:00 pm Tuesday.

We propose language that repeats the FY 1997 (NOT FY98) enacted language:

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, no funds appropriated under this Act shall be used to carry out any program of distributing sterile needles and syringes for the hypodermic injection of any illegal drug unless the Secretary of Health and Human Services determines that such programs are effective in preventing the spread of HIV and do not encourage the use of illegal drugs.

ONDCP recommended raising the test for certification to require that these programs reduce illegal drug use, rather than merely not encouraging it. This would seem to be a change in Administration position.

HHS/ONAP recommend repeating the FY 1998 enacted language -- which would require that HHS also establish criteria for such programs. ONDCP opposes this requirement, arguing that it makes the programs seem more established than they are. ONAP supports the idea of removing the criteria, but was concerned that doing so could send a signal that the Administration was pulling away from the compromise worked out for FY 1998. However, it was not the Administration's compromise, and we think the simpler formulation

can more easily and correctly be presented as the Administration's longstanding position.

It's very difficult and complicated for the United States to involve itself in the internal affairs of another country. We'll try to see what we can do, however.

AIDS Deaths Drop 60% In California
Wide distribution of new drugs credited

AIDS deaths in California dropped an astonishing 60 percent in the first six months of 1997 -- the strongest evidence to date that available new drugs may be saving thousands of lives.

The nearly two-thirds decline in AIDS deaths surprised and delighted researchers, who said yesterday that California's aggressive attempts to distribute anti-viral drugs to infected patients appears to be paying off.

"These numbers are huge. I've not seen anything like this," said Thomas

Coates, executive director of the University of California at San Francisco's AIDS Research Institute.

Developed by the California Department of Health Services, at the request of The Chronicle, the figures show that the dramatic improvements in survival first noticed by Bay Area AIDS patients are substantial and statewide.

During the first six months of 1997, according to state records, 1,112 California residents died of AIDS. That is 60 percent below the 2,788 who perished in the same period one year earlier.

That compares with a 23 percent drop in death rates noted by the federal Centers for Disease Control, which measured AIDS deaths nationwide between 1995 and 1996. The difference between the new state figures and the older federal data strongly suggests that the trend toward fewer deaths is accelerating.

Dr. Richard Selick, a CDC epidemiologist, said the California statistics are impressive. "It's a sudden, dramatic drop that does suggest it would be the influence of a recent change in treatment," he said.

DRUGS TAKEN IN COMBINATION

The drop-off in death rates coincides with the widespread use of the newest anti-viral drugs, called protease inhibitors, which are taken in combination with older AIDS drugs.

Epidemiologists expected a decline in AIDS deaths in the latter part of the 1990s because infection rates fell dramatically in the mid- 1980s after it became clear that AIDS was caused by a sexually transmitted virus, and gay men in great numbers switched to safer sex practices.

But Selick said the steep pitch of the decline noted in California points to the effect of drugs, rather than a decade-old behavior change, which would have produced a steady but slower decline.

“This is a great payoff for all the research that has been going on for a decade and one half,” said George Lemp, who coordinates AIDS research programs for the UC system.

“The drop in deaths would appear to exceed what you would expect from prevention,” Lemp said. “It’s probably attributable to new therapy.”

MAKING TREATMENT AVAILABLE

Jim Creeger, research manager for the state Office of AIDS, described the drop-off in AIDS deaths as “an awesome decrease,” and he attributed it to California’s effort “to get these (protease inhibitor) drugs out on the street.”

He noted that the figures are preliminary because it takes time for county death records to be completed and sent to the state. However, he said such death records are “more than 90 percent complete” after six months, and the latest figures are based on numbers reported more than six months ago.

Creeger said he believes the figures will not change significantly as the remaining death records trickle in.

Dr. Steve Morin, director of public policy research at UCSF’s AIDS Research Institute, said the availability of the new AIDS drugs varies dramatically from state to state.

“California and New York probably have the best programs in the country,” said Morin. “The worst states are those with the poorest Medicaid programs,” like North Carolina, Mississippi and Florida.

Ever since it became apparent that the protease drugs were helping AIDS patients, federal funds have been pouring into the AIDS Drug Assistance Program -- but at rates far below what clinicians say is needed. The federal outlay for assistance program rose from \$50 million in 1995 to \$285 million in the current fiscal year. California has augmented the federal assistance

program money with state funds -- more than \$24 million is allocated for 1998.

Governor Pete Wilson has proposed increasing that figure by \$36 million in his new budget.

'TREATMENT ON DEMAND'

In San Francisco, coverage for protease drugs is so encompassing that Moran calls it virtually "treatment on demand." The bill for AIDS drugs has risen to \$13.5 million from \$3.5 million in 1996.

Amid all the optimism, however, researchers caution that the lifesaving effects of the protease drugs may not last. There is also a fear that the good news will diminish the discipline required to maintain the safe sex practices that helped curtail the spread of the epidemic 15 years ago.

UCSF researcher Coates noted that the drop in death rates coincides with a time dubbed "the honeymoon period" for protease drugs -- a time before scientists began to note that the virus seemed to be returning in some patients taking the drugs.

In fact, a San Francisco General Hospital study found that 53 percent of those taking the combination were showing signs that the AIDS virus was reviving in their bloodstreams. However, that study is recognized as not representing a typical sample of San Francisco AIDS patients.

"We can't emphasize how much we are not clear that this is going to last," said Ben Collins, spokesman for San Francisco based Project Inform.

"These drugs are difficult to take, and the regime is difficult to adhere to for a long period of time."

More than 37,500 Californians now have AIDS, and 150,000 more have been found to be HIV-positive, the Department of Health Services reports.

The state's AIDS Drug Assistance Program, established in 1987, pays for drug treatments that can cost as much as \$12,000 a year for low- or moderate-income HIV-positive people.

In the budget that Wilson plans to reveal today, he will ask the Legislature to add \$36 million to the program. That would push total spending -- state and federal -- to \$130 million. The AIDS Drug Assistance Program provides the drugs free, or at limited cost, to those with adjusted gross incomes of less than \$50,000 a year. This year, nearly 20,000 people were enrolled.

Assemblywoman Carole Migden, D-San Francisco, said, "It's a spectacular comfort to people in dire need of lifesaving medication." She called Wilson's proposal "extraordinary."

"CRUISE SHIP DENIED PORT OF CALL"

Organizers of a gay cruise vacation announced this week that the government of the Cayman Islands, a British dependency, has denied their vessel landing rights. The Caribbean island's Minister of Tourism cited the group's inability to follow "standards of appropriate behavior" as cause for turning the group away.

The Motor Ship Leeward, chartered by Norwegian Cruise Line, was scheduled to dock at Grand Cayman on February 1. The stop was part of a seven-day cruise booked by Atlantis Events Inc., a West Hollywood travel group which specializes in organizing vacations for gay people. A total of 910 people, primarily gay men, made reservations for the cruise, which is still set to depart from Miami on January 30.

In a letter dated December 8, 1997, and addressed to Norwegian Cruise Line's port captain in Miami, the Cayman Minister of Tourism Thomas C. Jefferson stated, "Careful research and prior experience has led us to conclude that we cannot count on this group to uphold the standards of appropriate behavior expected of visitors to the Cayman Islands, so we regrettably cannot offer our hospitality."

The Ministry of Tourism did not return several phone messages from a Blade reporter. Kathy Owen of the New York-based firm Patrice & Tanaka Co., which handles some public relations for the ministry, told the Blade that the office does not plan to discuss the matter further.

Robert Chatterton Dickson, spokesperson for the British Embassy in Washington, told the Blade Thursday that the island's Executive Council -- which is the executive body of the island, similar to a state governor -- is expected to release a statement of "regret" for any offense caused but defending the decision to deny the group landing rights. Dickson said the British government was "surprised" by the Minister of Tourism's actions but noted that the affair is an internal matter for the Cayman government.

[This is not the first time the Cayman Islands have been hostile toward gay vacationers.] In 1987, RSVP Travel Productions sent what is believed to be the first large group of gays to the islands. RSVP President Charlie Rounds said he thinks the circumstances of that trip led to last month's rejection of the Norwegian Cruise Line vessel. The controversy in that incident began when RSVP booked a trip to Grand Cayman on a cruise liner which maintained a regular weekly stop at the island. Through casual discussions with the crew of that ship, Rounds said, port authorities learned that the ship was planning to bring RSVP's group of gay men. They began attempting to convince the crew not to bring the gay group and when they failed, revoked the ship's right to dock. According to Rounds, the vessel defied the authorities' rejection and docked anyway. After several hours discussion in the port, the authorities finally relented and allowed the vacationers to come ashore, Rounds said.

Rounds said there were no major problems with the authorities but that the vacationers received a "hostile" reception and were "closely watched." He added that a religious organization protested their six-hour stay.

Since that flap 10 years ago, the gay travel industry has considered the Caymans to be hostile territory. No sizable group of gays or lesbians has attempted to visit for several years.

Needle-exchange programmes in the USA: time to act
now

One in three of the more than 570 000 AIDS cases reported in the USA since the beginning of the epidemic has been caused, directly or indirectly, by injection drug misuse. Although HIV-infection rates among homosexual men have fallen, rates due to intravenous drug misuse have soared and about half of new HIV infections now can be traced to that source. Those affected are not only the drug misusers infected by

contaminated needles but their sexual partners
(most of whom have been poor, black, and Hispanic women)
and the children of women infected by drug misuse
or sexual contact with infected drug misusers. Injection
drug misuse is now the leading primary cause of
paediatric AIDS.

Yet, despite this epidemic, the USA remains one of
the few industrialised countries that refuses to provide
easy access to sterile syringes. Of the 100 or so
US needle-exchange programmes most are small and
underfunded, and some are illegal. Most US states
still have laws on drug paraphernalia or syringe
prescription that make it a crime to give a drug
misuser a clean needle.

The Clinton Administration now has an opportunity
to address this problem. In 1997 the US Congress
banned the use of Federal funds for
needle-exchange programmes until March 31, 1998, but after that date
the legislation allows funding if the Secretary of
Health and Human Services determines that exchange
programmes are effective in preventing the spread
of HIV and do not encourage the use of illegal drugs. But
with the deadline fast approaching, the Secretary
of Health and Human Services, Donna Shalala, has yet to
make an official determination, causing AIDS
activists to wonder whether the Administration will refuse to
endorse needle-exchange programmes out of fear
that the step will open the President to the charge that he
is "soft on drugs".

If this is true, it would be a remarkably callous
decision for the Administration to make. Yet, given the
weight of the scientific evidence supporting the
efficacy of needle-exchange schemes, it is hard to attribute
the reluctance to back such programmes to anything
other than political considerations. Study after study
has found that needle-exchange programmes reduce
the risk of HIV infection. In 1993, a study on
needle-exchange programmes by the Centers for
Disease Control and Prevention and the University of
California, San Francisco, concluded that "the
time has arrived for federal, state, and local governments to
remove the legal and administrative barriers to
increased needle availability and to facilitate the expansion of
needle exchange programmes in the US". In 1995,
the National Academy of Science's Institute of Medicine,
an independent organisation set up by Congress for
advice on scientific and technical matters, concluded
that needle-exchange programmes were effective and
did not encourage illegal drug use. In 1997 an
independent consensus panel convened by the
National Institutes of Health found that "an impressive

body of evidence suggests powerful effects from
needle-exchange programmes . . . there is no longer doubt
that these programs work".

Just last month, the President's Advisory Council
on HIV/AIDS issued a report urging the Administration
to move immediately to end the ban on Federal
funding for needle exchanges. "The debate at this time
should no longer be if, but how, needle exchange
programs should be established", wrote the council's
chairman, R Scott Hitt. And the debate is not
academic. A study published in The Lancet last year by Peter
Lurie and Ernest Drucker, who used conservative
estimates of interventions that give injection drug
misusers access to sterile injection equipment,
concluded that if the USA had adopted such programmes in
1987, it could have prevented between 4394 and
9666 HIV infections. Moreover, they found that if current
policies are not changed, an additional 5150-11
329 preventable HIV infections could occur by the year 2000
in the USA. Who will stop these preventable
infections? The Clinton Administration should act now. Delay
is costing lives.

I have been trying (unsuccessfully) to reach you by phone, but given the time-sensitive nature of this issue, I am going to convey this information in an e-mail and fax so you can discuss it with Janet Crist.

Given the attached e-mail from ONDCP and the conversation that took place between Josh and Janet this morning, it is clear that OMB and ONDCP staff have different views on what is "current law" on needle exchange. In an attempt to clarify this, I am going to send you via fax what we view as current law, which are Sections 505 and 506 of the General Provisions in the Labor/Health/Education Appropriations Act for FY 1998. In this fax, I have marked the criteria that states that Federal funds can be used for NEPs if (among other criteria) the Secretary of Health and Human Services can certify that they "do not encourage" the use of illegal drugs.

In the e-mail we received this morning, it seems that ONDCP staff view current law to be that NEPs must "reduce" the use of illegal drugs. We believe that the only place in current law that a needle-exchange provision reads "reduce" is in Section 202 of the Alcohol, Drug Abuse, and Mental Health Administration (ADAMHA) Reorganization Act of 1992, which is not controlling of all of the funds in the Labor/HHS/Education Act, as the General Provisions are.

Currently, we are attempting to come to resolution on the General Provisions in Title V of the Budget, and are using the recently-enacted L/HHS/Ed Appropriations Act as the basis for our proposed compromise. If you are using another provision of law as the basis for your language, please let us know as soon as possible. As it stands, we view our compromise proposal as a "retention" of current law, and the ONDCP

proposal as a "change" from current law.

Please discuss this with Janet Crist and if needed, re-initiate a dialogue between Janet and Josh on this issue.

Several major concerns arise when discussing HIV/AIDS in racial and ethnic minority populations: 1) the disproportionate impact of AIDS on Blacks, Hispanics, Native Americans and Asian and Pacific Islanders; 2) the lack of access to quality health care services for people with HIV infection; 3) the inability of mainstream HIV prevention efforts to be effective in hard-to-reach, at risk individuals including those with limited English-speaking ability. These three programs will address these issues:

1) Enhanced Prevention Activities Targeting Populations at Greatest Risk

Enhanced prevention efforts targeting those populations at greatest risk for HIV infection are necessary. Of particular concern are racial and ethnic minority individuals including young males who have sex with other males, substance abusers, and individuals in rural areas. Culturally relevant and linguistically appropriate programs are key to reducing the rate of new HIV infections in communities already hardest hit by the epidemic.

Program: Enhancement of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's current program which funds minority community-based organizations (Program Announcement #704), to focus specifically on the most at-risk populations, especially minority youth who have sex with youth. Under this expansion, CDC could fund those applications which have already been approved but were not funded due to budgetary constraints.

Funding Level: \$20 million

2) Consumer Treatment Education

Numerous studies have shown that racial and ethnic minority population have historically had less access to quality health care; this is also true for minorities with HIV. With the advent of protease inhibitors, the need for a patient to be educated about treatment options available to them cannot be understated, especially given the number of options available and the complexity of the science.

Program: A HRSA funded patient education program focusing on HIV treatment options, including participation in clinical trials. This program would focus on educating patients about new drugs and drug combinations, new treatment options, and the role of clinical trials in treatment plans.

Funding Level: \$10 million

3) Targeted HIV and STD Health Care Services

For some populations, especially in the South and Southwest United States, both the HIV and STD rates are increasing. Research has shown that a history of STD infection places one at greater risk for HIV infection. Thus, the need to ensure that comprehensive HIV-related HIV and STD services are provided is essential.

Program: Enhancement of HRSA's Special Programs of National Significance program to target HIV and STD health care related services to heterosexual populations, especially in the South and Southwest United States where few resources have been targeted in the past. This program, utilizing an already existing mechanism, could be quickly implemented and thus provide essential services in an expedited manner to a population which currently receives limited services.

I am afraid that there continues to be confusion with respect to the agreement on the ADAP match issue. Sandy has asked that I clarify our position, which is as follows:

There be no reference to a matching requirement in the appropriations language itself.

There should be a statement within the budget narrative that puts forth the interest of the Administration in working with the Congress, the States, and the community to develop strategies for encouraging fair state participation in ADAP.

She apologizes if things were not made clear this morning in your conversation. She supports the concept of a match, and believes that we should work one out that achieves the desired goal of encouraging states to contribute to ADAP without creating unintended negative consequences. However, it was her understanding that no such match proposal had been worked out to the satisfaction of HHS and OMB and therefore that no specific match requirement would be put forth at this time. Thanks for your suggested text. Josh has cleared the following, which he says meets his agreement with Sandy that we make clear we're planning to work with Congress to develop a fair and effective way to encourage both States and the Federal government to do their part.

Budget Chapter: We would replace the current text in the budget chapter on health as follows.

"Ensuring Access to Powerful AIDS Therapies through Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Grants in Partnership with the States: The budget proposes a \$100 million increase in Ryan White treatment grants for powerful "combination therapy" AIDS drugs, and proposes that states increase their own spending on AIDS drugs as Ryan White assistance increases. While combination therapy offers tremendous hope to people with HIV, it also presents a tremendous challenge to existing AIDS services programs to make this hope available to all Americans. With joint effort, those programs can rise to the challenge. The matching rate proposed represents a way of encouraging state programs to join Ryan White in meeting this challenge; the Administration looks forward to working with Congress to find the most effective and fair relationship between the Ryan White AIDS treatment grants and State funding for AIDS services.

The Budget also includes a \$65 million increase for grants to cities, States and clinics for medical care, social support services, and new ways to speed the identification and referral into health care of people who are HIV positive. In total, the budget proposes \$1.3 billion in Federal

spending for activities authorized by the Ryan White CARE Act, a 14% increase over 1998 levels and a 241% increase over comparable 1993 levels."

Appendix Text: We would add the following to the text in the Budget Appendix on HRSA (page 495 of the FY98 Budget):

"The budget proposes a \$100 million increase in Ryan White treatment grants for AIDS drugs, and proposes that each State increase its own spending on AIDS drugs as Ryan White assistance increases. DNC Includes Gays & Lesbians in Delegate Selection Rules for 2000
Convention

Washington, DC: The Democratic National Committee's bodies governing the delegate selection rules for the 2000 National Democratic Convention -- the DNC Rules & Bylaws Committee & DNC Executive Committee -- voted unanimously in a meeting this weekend to include the first-ever language requiring state parties to specifically include Gay & Lesbian representation as part of the delegate selection process for the 2000 Convention.

"Gay and Lesbian Democrats and our community have taken a significant step forward," said Jean O'Leary of California, Chair of the DNC Gay & Lesbian American Caucus and member of the DNC Executive Committee, the governing body of the DNC. "These new rules will likely increase the number of openly Gay and Lesbian delegates to the 2000 Convention and mark the first time that a major National Party organization has included Gays and Lesbians as a priority for selecting delegates to a National Party Convention."

"These new rules reflect what we have done for the Democratic Party and this Administration over the years as well as how critical our community's support will be for a Democratic Presidential victory in 2000," said Jeff Soref, Vice Chair of the DNC Gay & Lesbian American Caucus and At-Large DNC Member from New York.

The DNC Rules & Bylaws Committee voted unanimously in favor of an amendment to the sections of the 1996 delegate selection rules governing outreach and inclusion of groups traditionally active but underrepresented in the Democratic Party. The amendment, submitted by California DNC member Garry Shay, requires state parties to develop and submit to the DNC outreach plans for delegate selection that include those "historically underrepresented" in the Democratic Party because of "race/ethnicity, age, sexual orientation or disability." The new rules also require state parties to give "priority of consideration" to these underrepresented groups in a state's delegate selection process "in order to assist in the achievement of full participation by these groups."

"This is another example of the Democratic Party's commitment to equal opportunity and the full inclusion of Lesbians and Gay men in the affairs of the Party at the local, state and national level," said Los Angeles County Democratic Party Chair Garry Shay, who submitted the amendment to the Rules & Bylaws Committee of the DNC. "While the Republican National Committee spent the weekend debating whom to exclude from the Republican Party, the Democratic Party is building on its record of inclusion and participation," Shay continued.

Shay credited passage of the new language contained in his amendment to the work done by DNC Members Jeff Soref, Jean O'Leary and California State Assemblywoman Carole Migden and Gay & Lesbian Victory Fund Executive Director Brian Bond. Shay also noted DNC Chairman Steve Grossman's support for the amendment and the strong support of former White House Deputy Chief of Staff and current At-Large DNC Member Harold Ickes, who spoke on behalf of the amendment at the Rules & Bylaws Committee meeting. The amendment was approved along with other changes to the delegate selection rules later in the weekend by the DNC's Executive Committee, the governing body of the DNC. The DNC will vote once more on the entire package of 2000 Convention delegate selection rules at a meeting of the full DNC in May.

Of the 4,925 delegates and alternates to the 1996 National Democratic Convention in Chicago, at least 146 were openly Gay or Lesbian. The site for the 2000 Convention has not yet been selected, but a Site Advisory Committee was recently appointed by DNC Co-Chairs Steve Grossman and Governor Roy Romer (D-Colorado) to review bids from over 20 cities for the 2000 Convention. The Site Advisory Committee includes three openly gay men: Terry Bean of Oregon, Andrew Reyes of North Carolina and Andy Tobias of New York.

I am afraid that there continues to be confusion with respect to the agreement on the ADAP match issue. Sandy has asked that I clarify our position, which is as follows:

There be no reference to a matching requirement in the appropriations language itself.

There should be a statement within the budget narrative that puts forth

the interest of the Administration in working with the Congress, the States, and the community to develop strategies for encouraging fair state participation in ADAP.

She apologizes if things were not made clear this morning in your conversation. She supports the concept of a match, and believes that we should work one out that achieves the desired goal of encouraging states to contribute to ADAP without creating unintended negative consequences. However, it was her understanding that no such match proposal had been worked out to the satisfaction of HHS and OMB and therefore that no specific match requirement would be put forth at this time. I just spoke with Kevin Thurm and confirmed that it is also his understanding that the above reflects the agreement reached.

We just received language from Gordon Agress which implies that a specific match proposal remains in the proposed appropriations language, which is inconsistent with the above recommendation. Can you tell me where you suggest we go to bring this to closure?
