A proposal to federally fund needle-exchange programs has angry senior health officials ready to draw blood. White House AIDS policy director Sandra Thurman is siding with the Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS, which wants to give drug addicts free and clean needles. They argue that their plan might curb HIV transmission. But drug czar Gen. Barry McCaffrey isn't convinced. In a strong letter to Thurman last week--copied to key Hill legislators--McCaffrey said the plan misses the point. "We must offer them a way out not a means to continue addictive behavior," he said. The council disagrees, and the president has yet to choose sides. If the administration doesn't act within the next month, the AIDS Council's 31 volunteer members are threatening to quit or call for Health Secretary Donna Shalala's resignation.

Subject: ACLU opposes mandatory HIV partner notification

Citing Public Health Concerns,
ACLU Rejects Forced HIV Partner Notification

ALBANY, NY -- Citing the failure of mandatory partner notification to contain recent outbreaks of sexually transmitted diseases, the American Civil Liberties Union today released a report rejecting this strategy for people with HIV.

The 25-page report, "HIV Partner Notification: Why Coercion Won't Work," is being issued as New York, a bellwether on HIV/AIDS policy, is considering a mandatory partner notification law.

Joined by the New York Civil Liberties Union, the ACLU released the report today at a news conference in Albany, where lawmakers may soon vote on a partner notification bill being proposed by State Assemblywoman Nettie Mayersohn, as well as a host of bills aimed at mandating HIV testing and criminalizing HIV transmission.

"Taking an HIV test is already scary enough," said Jennifer Middleton, a

Staff Attorney with the ACLU's AIDS Project who spoke at today's news conference. "Add on fears about the government reviewing the test results and demanding the names of your sex partners, and many people simply won't take the test."

Saying that mandatory partner notification will hurt more people than it will help, the ACLU instead is calling for increased resources for voluntary plans that provide support for HIV-infected individuals and encourage them to notify their partners.

Partner notification schemes have traditionally been promoted as a way to control the spread of disease. Looking at coercive partner notification schemes for both "traditional" STDs and for HIV, the ACLU report concludes that mandatory notification schemes simply do not work.

More troubling, the ACLU report says, mandatory partner notification systems invariably discourage people at risk from being tested. If a person does not get tested in the first place, the report points out, there will be no notification of any kind.

A policy that deters HIV testing is in the long run more costly, Middleton said. "If people don't get tested, or if they don't get counseling and treatment when they are positive, then we are not effectively containing the spread of HIV. Where is the public policy sense in that?"

Out of Fear, a Call for Mandatory Partner Notification

In recent years, a few isolated incidents of multiple HIV infections by reckless individuals have prompted some legislators to introduce aggressive partner notification bills, even though there is no evidence to suggest that they will help in these extraordinary cases.

In New York State, lawmakers have introduced a bill that makes failure to disclose HIV infection to a sex partner a felony, and a proposal to require mandatory HIV testing of certain people. Another proposal to send HIV-positive results to local health offices for partner notification places no limits on government officials' power to investigate in order to identify and notify partners.

"These bills show the effect that fear of HIV and AIDS can have on public policy making," said Deborah Small, Legislative Director of the NYCLU. "Any legislation that would discourage people from getting tested is bad public policy and we oppose it."

Partner Notification Has Failed

Much of the support for state-mandated partner notification is based on its supposed effectiveness in preventing the spread of STDs. But the ACLU evaluation of this strategy shows that partner notification for STDs has not been effective, even when a cure is available.

A study by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) has found that "traditional approaches to the control of syphilis that emphasize

partner notification have not been effective in halting this epidemic." One reason for this failure, the CDC found, was the fact that syphilis outbreaks affect a large number of people who use illegal drugs and who either can't or won't provide sufficient information for public health officials to trace and notify their partners.

Indeed, the various risk factors that have been attributed to the failure of partner notification efforts in controlling syphilis -- drug dependency, anonymous sex, needle-sharing, and the exchange of sex for drugs or money -- are all present among the fastest growing populations at risk for HIV, the ACLU reports.

Voluntary Notification: A Focus on Programs That Work

Anyone with HIV should notify his or her partners, the ACLU said. But the evidence shows that partner notification does little to change the high-risk behavior of those most likely to contract HIV. At the same time, coercive partner notification diverts resources from programs that do work.

In addition, many of those who are afraid of partner notification -- including gay men, injection drug users and people of color -- struggle with substantial fears of discrimination, debilitating social and economic instability, and violence, according to the report.

"Every person with HIV should be told to notify their partners, and should be given help to get through the difficult process this often involves," said Matt Coles, Director of the ACLU's HIV/AIDS Project. "In the end, even so-called mandatory programs rely on a patient's cooperation, and the evidence is clear that voluntary programs are better than coercive programs at getting it."

The principal authors of this report are Michael Adams of the ACLU's HIV/AIDS Project, and Barbara Saavedra, cooperating attorney with the ACLU of Northern California.

The report is the latest in a series of ACLU white papers on HIV-related public policy issues. Q: What is your response to today's *New York Times* story which reports that House Republicans would like to spend any tobacco revenues for tax credits to encourage small businesses to provide health insurance?

A: *We welcome support for the President's goal of national, bipartisan tobacco legislation and the proposals being considered by House Republicans suggest that they too support this goal. There is no doubt that the Congress, the states and many others will have a spirited debate over how exactly to use any revenue associated with tobacco legislation. Many ideas as to how best spend this revenue will no doubt emerge and we look forward to that discussion.*

The President's budget proposal would also use tobacco revenues to improve health care -- including a historic 50 percent increase in biomedical research, outreach proposals to help more uninsured children sign up for health care coverage, and proposals to allow Medicare beneficiaries enroll in certain high quality cancer clinical trials.

The President has long advocated increasing the tax deductibility and improving the affordability of health care coverage for the self-employed. From the moment he came into office, President Clinton has supported raising the tax deductibility for the self-employed to 100 percent. He signed into law proposals in the 1996 Kennedy-Kassebaum legislation and the 1997 balanced budget agreement that phased in tax deductions for the self-employed from 25 percent to 100 percent.

While we commend anyone who is interested in working on achieving greater tax equity with regard to health care coverage, we will evaluate proposals in the context of other high priority initiatives and on the basis of soundness in policy, cost, and workability.

But first things first. We need to enact tobacco legislation this year that will help stop our nation's children from taking up smoking in the first place. Then we can have a thorough debate about the best way to invest tobacco revenues.

“The Future of Tobacco in U.S. Policy”
March 30, 1998

I am here today, not only as the Chief of Staff of this Administration, but as a businessman, as a North Carolinian, and as a parent, to talk to you about the President’s plan to protect our children from tobacco.

Consider these facts:

- Smoking kills 430,000 people every year -- it kills more people than AIDS, alcohol, car accidents, murders, suicides, drugs and fires combined. Smoking is still by far the largest preventable cause of premature death in the United States.
- Nearly 90% of smokers started smoking before they turned 18.
- Nearly half of these teen smokers think they will not be smoking five years after starting -- yet only one in five actually manages to quit.
- Every day, 3,000 young people will become regular smokers, and 1,000 will die sooner as a result.

At the same time, multi-million dollar marketing campaigns have been designed to get our children to light their first cigarettes.

- In the past months, new documents have come to light that conclusively prove that tobacco companies aimed to sell their deadly products to children as young as 12.
- These documents are a shocking reminder that our children are under siege by a deadly and powerful enemy -- and it is up to us to protect our children.

As Chief of Staff, I can tell you that protecting our children from the threat of tobacco is right at the top of the President’s agenda -- and this administration is fully committed to working with the bipartisan leadership in Congress to achieve this goal.

- This is not a matter of politics --- it is a matter of priorities. Many Members of Congress from both parties have shown enormous leadership on this most important issue.
- Congressman Waxman first and foremost has been in the forefront of this issue for years -- providing the powerful leadership it took to bring us to the critical point we have reached today. It is a certainty that we would not be here if it were not for his determination.
- Congressman Bliley has recently done the American people a great service by getting thousands of pages of documents from the tobacco companies posted on the Internet so all the world can see how the tobacco companies have gone after our children.
- Congressman Fazio and Senators Conrad, Harkin, and Chafee, have worked long and hard to introduce tobacco legislation that this Administration can support.

- Senator McCain has provided great leadership in the Commerce Committee to draft a bipartisan bill that will move us significantly closer to enacting comprehensive tobacco legislation. Everyone knows the difficulty of putting together legislation that is so large and complex, but Senator McCain has done so in a way that has been as open and inclusive as it has been efficient and productive.
- Senator McCain will most likely release his bill later today, and we will need to review it in detail before making final judgement.
- Based on what we have seen and heard, I will say this today: We expect to see a bill from Senator McCain that will lay a strong foundation for further action, but also has room for improvement.

The areas that need further work are critically important:

- For example, we do not believe the McCain bill will impose strong enough lookback penalties on companies that continue selling tobacco to our children. Reducing youth smoking is our bottom line and we must make it the industries' bottom line.
- We also anticipate seeing some gaps in the bill: the McCain bill does not try to comprehensively address the question of how best to use tobacco revenues to protect the public health and to help our children.
- As for liability, it is not yet clear what Senator McCain will produce. But, our position is clear: unless we are imposing tough penalties on the tobacco companies and doing everything in our power to reduce youth smoking, this Administration will not consider proposals to give the tobacco companies protection from liability. As we have said many times, reasonable limits on liability will not be a deal breaker in a bill that meets all of the president's principles, but first, we have to get that kind of bill.

Senator McCain's bill does, however contain some notable steps forward:

- We believe the McCain bill will make significant inroads on youth smoking by substantially increasing the price of a pack of cigarettes.
- We believe the McCain bill will also give the FDA the full authority it needs to regulate tobacco products, including the authority to restrict both the advertising aimed at young people and their access to tobacco.
- And the McCain Bill is also expected to contain a strong plan to protect tobacco farmers and their communities.
- We look forward to working with Senator McCain and others in the Commerce Committee and the full Senate to significantly strengthen this bill and make it an even more effective instrument to reduce youth smoking.

As you know, President Clinton has proposed a comprehensive plan that he believes -- and experience shows -- is the best way to stop young Americans from smoking before they start. We are pleased that the McCain Bill will likely include many of the elements of the President's plan, and we will work hard to see that the McCain Bill is improved to meet all of the President's goals:

The President's plan would:

- Raise the price of cigarettes by up to \$1.10 a pack over 5 years and \$1.50 a pack over the next ten years, and impose tough penalties on companies that continue to sell to kids;
- Affirm the FDA's full authority to regulate tobacco products;
- Get companies out of the business of marketing and selling tobacco to minors.
- Promote public health research and public health goals; and
- Protect our tobacco farmers and their communities.

The Treasury Department has found that the President's proposal to stop teenage smoking will save 1 million lives over the next five years.

- Last week, Vice President Gore announced that new estimates show that our proposal would have major effects on youth smoking in every state, with reductions ranging from 33% in Washington State to 51% in Kentucky.
- For every dime added to the price of cigarettes over a 5 year period, up to 270,000 fewer teenagers will begin smoking and more than 90,000 premature deaths will be avoided.
- Price increases alone are projected to reduce teenage smoking over the next 5 years by 29%. Youth access and marketing restrictions in the President's plan are projected to reduce teenage smoking by an additional 11%.
- The combination of the price increase called for in the President's plan plus the tighter restrictions on youth access and marketing, will reduce the number of youths smoking by 3 million between now and 2003 -- and most importantly help us avoid approximately 1 million premature deaths.

The Tobacco companies themselves must also be part of the solution.

- As the President has said, advertising aimed at adults is legal, but tobacco companies must draw the line at our children.
- Our proposal requires tobacco companies to help establish smoking cessation programs for adult smokers, and to launch public education campaigns aimed at children to keep them from smoking in the first place.

The heavy human cost of smoking to our families and communities is tragic -- and as a businessman, I can tell you that the economic cost to our society is extraordinarily high.

- Smoking related illness costs approximately \$60 billion every year -- that's more than the federal government spends on education, child care, and medical research combined.
- Smoking during pregnancy results in 2,500 fetal deaths every year, and *costs \$4 billion per year -- this amount is close to double what we spend on cancer research each year.*
- Smokers die earlier and have to retire sooner -- and this is estimated to cost our economy as much as \$80 billion every year in lost output, lost productivity, and lost wages.

These costs rob our economy and cheat the American people out of their hard-earned tax dollars.

But if we pass the President's plan, we will take the first important steps to reducing these costs, increasing productivity, and most importantly, saving lives.

We know that this plan will be good for America -- and as a North Carolinian -- born and raised in tobacco country -- I can tell you that we must also make sure that we treat our tobacco farmers fairly.

- *The President has made protecting tobacco farmers and their communities one of the five key elements for his plan for comprehensive tobacco legislation.*
- *We can achieve the twin goals of both protecting the health of the public and protecting the well-being of farming communities. Recently, a remarkable coalition of farming groups, including burley and flue-cured growers, and public health groups, including the American Heart Association and the American Cancer Society, came together around a shared set of principles. That is a consensus we can build on.*
- *We propose to use some of the revenue from raising the price of cigarettes to make sure that we save our kids without devastating our farm communities. That is a commitment this Administration has made, and we are optimistic that a consensus is forming in Congress to use some of this money to help tobacco farmers.*

President Clinton has submitted to Congress the first balanced budget in 30 years. This budget protects our children from the harms of tobacco -- and our nation from the burdensome costs associated with teen smoking. This budget also uses the very money raised by raising the price of cigarettes to invest in the future of our nation. Our budget uses the tobacco money for:

- **Critical investments in health research, including biomedical research, cancer clinical trials, and children's health outreach -- increasing by nearly 50% the funding for the National Institutes of Health.**
- **We also make historic investments in child care and after-school care -- doubling the number of working families who receive child care, and significantly increasing the number of students receiving after school care; and lastly,**
- **We make unprecedented investments in education -- reducing class size, hiring 100,000 additional teachers, and building or rehabilitating 5,000 schools;**

Finally, and most importantly, as a parent of three kids, I can tell you that when I hear the statistics I mentioned earlier, my blood runs cold.

- **When I saw the documents that showed that tobacco companies had deliberately tried to get our children to smoke -- despite the fact that a full third of the 3,000 kids who start smoking every day will die prematurely -- I knew then and there that we must not rest until we have done everything we can to protect our children from tobacco.**

**We have it within our power right now to save the lives of 1 million kids over the next five years.
We must not miss this historic opportunity.**

- As President Clinton recently said: "We stand on the verge of one of the greatest public health achievements in history -- an historic triumph in our fight to protect America's children from the deadly threat of tobacco."
- As Chief of Staff of this Administration, as a businessman, as a North Carolinian, as a parent, and as an American -- I ask you to support our efforts, and to work with us in a bipartisan manner to meet this vitally important challenge.

DROP IN AIDS DEATHS SHOULD NOT TRANSLATE TO DECREASED EFFORT
HIV/AIDS RESEARCH VALUABLE IN OTHER INFECTIOUS DISEASE RESEARCH

The numbers of both AIDS-related deaths and new AIDS diagnoses in the United States may have dropped, but those decreases should not slow the pace of AIDS research--particularly as scientists are pushing to develop a vaccine--the head of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) told a House appropriations subcommittee recently.

In the first half of 1997, the number of AIDS deaths dropped 44 percent and the number of new AIDS cases decreased by 12 percent compared to same time period in 1996, NIAID Director Anthony Fauci reported to the House Appropriations, Labor, Health and Human Services, Education and Related Agencies (L/HHS) subcommittee.

Fauci appeared before the subcommittee to answer questions about NIAID's budget request for FY 99. President Clinton has proposed that NIAID, a part of the National Institutes of Health (NIH), receive \$702 million for

non-AIDS research activities and \$768 million for AIDS-related research. The total appropriation would represent an 8.6 percent increase over FY 98 funding.

But Fauci warned that AIDS is still an evolving epidemic. "Although the numbers in our country are going down, we cannot slack off on drug development and clinical trials," he said. "And we have a very, very important goal that we need to fulfill with regard to a vaccine."

Research into the AIDS epidemic needs to be considered as vital to the overall research effort into emerging and re-emerging microbes, said Fauci. Close to 60 percent of the basic research related to AIDS has had some striking extrapolation into other disciplines, Fauci said. He pointed to the AIDS-related research into diagnostics with molecular probes that has played a major role in developing diagnostics for the sexually-transmitted disease chlamydia. Also, one of the drugs developed to treat AIDS can now be used effectively against the hepatitis B virus.

"The spin-offs from HIV research are almost going to be non-separable from our approach to other diseases," Fauci said.

Still, with the reported success in treating AIDS victims comes increased pressure on Congress and the subcommittee to deal with other diseases, Rep. John Porter, R-IL, the subcommittee's chairman, told Fauci. "We are vitally interested that we not only continue progress on AIDS, but look at other diseases plaguing humankind and attempt to reach the same level of success in dealing with them," Porter said.

Later in the hearing, Porter asked NIH Director Harold Varmus to justify the proposed increase in funding for AIDS research. Porter recalled that after reviewing the entire NIH AIDS research portfolio last year, the NIH Office of AIDS Research (OAR) did not ask for additional money. Instead OAR's recommendations focused more on shifting existing funds.

Among OAR's recommendations were to fund more investigator-initiated AIDS research grants and to expand research efforts on immunology and vaccine development. Varmus reported that NIH has almost doubled funding for investigator-initiated grants. It has also launched a Vaccine Research Center.

As to the need for more overall funding for AIDS research, Varmus reasoned: "The budget request is substantial, of course, but it is below the NIH average and only slightly above the level we were asking for any of the institutes."

Varmus also cautioned against putting too much stock in the drop in AIDS mortality and morbidity. "Over the next few years we don't know what's going to happen. That graph may plateau, because we know there is a high frequency of drug resistance and failure to tolerate the protease inhibitors," he said. Nor do those statistics reflect what's happening in those parts of the world where the costs of the drugs, as well as the care system needed to effectively administer those drugs, are prohibitive, Varmus said.

Even in the United States those statistics are not consistent. Fauci reported that there is much less of a decrease in new AIDS diagnoses among minorities and an actual increase among women and inner-city African American and Latino heterosexuals.

"Although the total numbers are getting better, at best they are holding steady and in some cases, not doing well at all," Fauci said.

DROP IN AIDS DEATHS SHOULD NOT TRANSLATE TO DECREASED EFFORT
HIV/AIDS RESEARCH VALUABLE IN OTHER INFECTIOUS DISEASE RESEARCH

The numbers of both AIDS-related deaths and new AIDS diagnoses in the United States may have dropped, but those decreases should not slow the pace of AIDS research--particularly as scientists are pushing to develop a vaccine--the head of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) told a House appropriations subcommittee recently.

In the first half of 1997, the number of AIDS deaths dropped 44 percent and the number of new AIDS cases decreased by 12 percent compared to same time period in 1996, NIAID Director Anthony Fauci reported to the House Appropriations, Labor, Health and Human Services, Education and Related Agencies (L/HHS) subcommittee.

Fauci appeared before the subcommittee to answer questions about NIAID's budget request for FY 99. President Clinton has proposed that NIAID, a part of the National Institutes of Health (NIH), receive \$702 million for non-AIDS research activities and \$768 million for AIDS-related research. The total appropriation would represent an 8.6 percent increase over FY 98 funding.

But Fauci warned that AIDS is still an evolving epidemic. "Although the numbers in our country are going down, we cannot slack off on drug development and clinical trials," he said. "And we have a very, very important goal that we need to fulfill with regard to a vaccine."

Research into the AIDS epidemic needs to be considered as vital to the overall research effort into emerging and re-emerging microbes, said Fauci. Close to 60 percent of the basic research related to AIDS has had some striking extrapolation into other disciplines, Fauci said. He pointed to the AIDS-related research into diagnostics with molecular probes that has

played a major role in developing diagnostics for the sexually-transmitted disease chlamydia. Also, one of the drugs developed to treat AIDS can now be used effectively against the hepatitis B virus.

"The spin-offs from HIV research are almost going to be non-separable from our approach to other diseases," Fauci said.

Still, with the reported success in treating AIDS victims comes increased pressure on Congress and the subcommittee to deal with other diseases, Rep. John Porter, R-IL, the subcommittee's chairman, told Fauci. "We are vitally interested that we not only continue progress on AIDS, but look at other diseases plaguing humankind and attempt to reach the same level of success in dealing with them," Porter said.

Later in the hearing, Porter asked NIH Director Harold Varmus to justify the proposed increase in funding for AIDS research. Porter recalled that after reviewing the entire NIH AIDS research portfolio last year, the NIH Office of AIDS Research (OAR) did not ask for additional money. Instead OAR's recommendations focused more on shifting existing funds.

Among OAR's recommendations were to fund more investigator-initiated AIDS research grants and to expand research efforts on immunology and vaccine development. Varmus reported that NIH has almost doubled funding for investigator-initiated grants. It has also launched a Vaccine Research Center.

As to the need for more overall funding for AIDS research, Varmus reasoned: "The budget request is substantial, of course, but it is below the NIH average and only slightly above the level we were asking for any of the institutes."

Varmus also cautioned against putting too much stock in the drop in AIDS mortality and morbidity. "Over the next few years we don't know what's going to happen. That graph may plateau, because we know there is a high frequency of drug resistance and failure to tolerate the protease inhibitors," he said. Nor do those statistics reflect what's happening in those parts of the world where the costs of the drugs, as well as the care system needed to effectively administer those drugs, are prohibitive, Varmus said.

Even in the United States those statistics are not consistent. Fauci reported that there is much less of a decrease in new AIDS diagnoses among minorities and an actual increase among women and inner-city African American and Latino heterosexuals.

"Although the total numbers are getting better, at best they are holding steady and in some cases, not doing well at all," Fauci said.

I assume you are referring to HIV surveillance and names reporting.
Here's the current situation:

CDC has prepared a draft notice to be published that establishes mandatory HIV surveillance (as opposed to AIDS surveillance, which is currently mandatory). There's little disagreement with the need for data on HIV. However, CDC has been strongly pushing a system that would require names to be used to distinguish records. Several large states have indicated a reluctance to use names and instead are going to try for some kind of unique identifier system. CDC doesn't think that will work.

There are several objections to names reporting, including:
confidentiality breaches (which are greater with HIV than with AIDS cases because the data are held much longer with HIV)
state legislatures will want to access the data for non-public health purposes on a large-scale basis (e.g., cross-referencing the HIV database with accused sex offenders)
deterrence to testing - fear of disclosure (real or perceived) will keep people from being tested (particularly people of color, undocumented persons, and young gay men, all of whom are traditionally testing averse)

HHS still has to pass on the draft notice, and to our knowledge has not done so. Sandy and I have spoken with both Kevin and Eric and expressed strong concerns about requiring names reporting. While we remain open to the possibility that names reporting can be required in a way that mitigates the above concerns, CDC has been speeding way ahead of the

community (and HHS) on this issue.

Our recommendation is that Chris communicate to Kevin concern that this policy be fully vetted with you and us before CDC publishes this announcement have the meeting with Daniel and Elizabeth, with us, to hear their concerns and to let them know that we will work with them to resolve the issue and to allay their concerns that CDC is going full speed ahead with or without them

In follow up to the Process Call, today, and followig some conversations I had, both with (1) HRSA and (2) AAC I have gained some of the following information which I thought useful to pass on:

1. HRSA.

There is a general sense among some Ryan White staffers that the fight is at the top and is largely a political hot potato(e). The following reflects how much dis-information seems still to be floating around Shalala's shop and while there is some truth buried in this, it truly begs the overall question we and others have been pursuing for a very long time! It was suggested that it was the model paraphernalia laws which needed changing at state levels so that clean needles could be purchased rather than by "edict" from the feds. There is also a sense that the science as of a year ago was muddy and still may be.

2. AIDS Action

I got a variety of opinions here. Generally, AIDS Action supports us

making
a bold step and feels it has made a bold step, too. Wait... There's
more..... Their general impression is that Shalala and Clinton met,
yesterday, and that Shalala did recommend the changes we are seeking and
that
the ball is in his court (less assured on how strong she may have been,
if at
all). What is anticipated as likely is that Clinton will accept (maybe

Last year, for the first time in the history of this disease, we saw a decline in the number of lives lost to AIDS. Yet we also know that people of color, women, and young gay men did not show equal improvement and continue to be disproportionately impacted by HIV and AIDS.

That is why we must not rest in our fight to stop the spread of HIV and to care for those who are already infected. With over 5.8 million new infections occurring each year across the globe, there is still so much more to do.

I want you to know that this Administration is working to end this epidemic. President Clinton and Vice President Gore have increased funding for the AIDS Drug Assistance Program by 450% since taking office. Funding for the Ryan White CARE Act overall has more than tripled, along communities across this country to care for those living with HIV and AIDS. Research and prevention funding have also increased significantly. And in perhaps our most important step in addressing the global epidemic, the President announced one year ago that the United States would join the world in an effort to develop a vaccine against HIV within 10 years.

Your commitment, your energy, and your passion are inspirational. It is the love of mothers for their children that fuels your work and mine. Together, we can help lift the message across the country that we will not stop until we have a cure for those who are living with AIDS, and a vaccine to protect those who are at risk. Again, thank you for your gift to our nation.

The Politics of Needles and AIDS

Debate has started up again in Washington about whether the Government should renew its ban on subsidies for needle-exchange programs, which advocates say can help stop the spread of AIDS.

In a letter to Congress, Barry McCaffrey, who is in charge of national drug policy, cited two Canadian studies to show that needle-exchange plans have failed to reduce the spread of H.I.V., the virus that causes AIDS, and may even have worsened the problem. Congressional leaders have cited these studies to make the same argument.

As the authors of the Canadian studies, we must point out that these officials have misinterpreted our research. True, we found that those who participated in programs in Vancouver and Montreal allowing addicts to exchange used needles for new ones had higher H.I.V. infection rates than addicts who did not. That's not surprising. Because the programs are in inner-city neighborhoods, they serve those who are at highest risk. Also, needle-exchange programs must be tailored to local conditions. For example, in Montreal and Vancouver, cocaine injection is a major source of H.I.V. transmission.

Some users inject the drug up to 40 times a day. At that rate, we have calculated that the two cities we studied would each need 10 million clean needles a year to prevent the re-use of syringes. Currently, the Vancouver program exchanges two million syringes annually, and Montreal, half a million.

A study conducted last year and published in The Lancet, the British

medical journal, found that in 29 cities worldwide where programs are in place, H.I.V. infection dropped by an average of 5.8 percent a year among drug users. In 51 cities that had no needle-exchange plans, drug-related infection rose by 5.9 percent a year. Clearly these efforts can work. But clean needles are only part of the solution. A comprehensive approach that includes needle exchange, health care, treatment for drug addiction, social support and counseling is also needed. In Canada, the Government responded to our research by expanding needle exchange programs and adding related services. We hope the Clinton Administration and Congress will provide the same kind of leadership in the United States. Julie Bruneau is an assistant professor of psychiatry at the University of Montreal. Martin T. Schechter is a professor of epidemiology at the University of British Columbia.

We got a call from AIDS Foundation of Chicago expressing lots of concern about an upcoming visit by John Ward at a public hearing on names reporting. They were very concerned -- probably with lots of justification -- that John was going to push names and tilt the debate. The Foundation has been working very hard to have UIs fairly considered.

I would like to not have John go, since he doesn't seem to be able to discuss this issue with any balance. Rob would be better. It would be inappropriate of them to be pushing names when the R + R hasn't been vetted yet. CDC should be able to talk about the need for HIV surveillance and a reasonable level of data quality, but it's my understanding that the "names is the way to go" policy has not been cleared.

By this summer, Illinois is expected to become the 32nd state to legally mandate HIV names reporting. A method of record keeping which not only eases the challenges associated with tracking contacts and partners at risk, names reporting also answers key public health questions regarding the number of infected individuals, emerging trends in infection and behavioral risk factors. Before the end of the year, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention is also expected to release guidelines for states concerning effective methods of HIV surveillance, including HIV names reporting. AIDS advocacy groups largely oppose mandatory names reporting but support unique identifier systems in which patients are named through a code composed of their birth date, social security number and other characteristics. However, CDC evaluations have suggested

that such systems are not only more costly to healthcare providers, and therefore have lower rates of compliance, but records are often inaccurate or incomplete. One alternative approach currently offered in conjunction with mandatory reporting is anonymous testing. Meanwhile, in New York State, where all infants are tested for HIV, debate over names reporting has been active. While many officials contend that treatment efforts and transmission prevention would be facilitated through names reporting, others believe it would scare patients from receiving treatment at all. A recommendation regarding names reporting is expected soon from a working group of the state's AIDS Advisory Council.

Here are the talking points, without any editorial revisions. What would you like me to do with these?

Political message: Clinton Administration halts (or fails to halt) pediatric AIDS epidemic.
AIDS is spreading among injection drug users, their partners and children - over half of the 40,000 to 80,000 new HIV infections are related to injection drug use. CDC tells us that injection drug use is indirectly responsible for 63% of AIDS cases among women and over half of the cases of pediatric AIDS. We will continue to see increases cases among women and children if we do not allow for the most effective HIV prevention measures possible. There have been no pediatric AIDS cases in San Francisco in two years. This is not a coincidence - San Francisco has the largest comprehensive needle exchange program operating in the country. Our goal should be to duplicate that success at a national level.

Political message: Science must lead in AIDS policy. It has spoken; we must heed.
If we don't do it: Administration panders to politics - no scientific credibility left.
Scientific study after scientific study shows that needle exchange reduces the number of new HIV infections. Six federally funded reports, conducted independently by the National Commission on AIDS in 1991, the General Accounting Office in 1993, the University of California in 1993, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in 1993, the National Academy of Sciences in 1995, and the Office of Technology Assessment in 1995 are among those scientific studies. There is also a National Institutes of Health report that supports needle exchange. Dr. Satcher is on record supporting needle exchange. Science shows that needle exchange programs can reduce HIV infections by at least one-third and reduce risk behavior by as much as 80%. This evidence was funded by the federal government. We funded it, we need to use it.

Political message: There is ample political cover from all sides of this debate. We are not out there alone.
The advocacy community has delivered credible support from a broad-based coalition of respected organizations including: the American Medical Association; the United States Conference of Mayors (passed a bipartisan resolution this summer); the American Bar Association; the American Academy of Pediatrics; the American Public Health Association; the NAACP; the American Nurses Association; Mother's Voices, and the list goes on.

Major newspapers have written editorials in support of needle exchange urging us to act, including the New York Times, the Washington Post, the Chicago Tribune, the Seattle Times, the Los Angeles Times, the Detroit Free Press and the Plain Dealer.

Political message: There is solid majority support for needle exchange programs. It is overwhelming support if the administration puts the issue out affirmatively. When the issue is framed by opponents the results could be different.

Polling data indicates that Americans support needle exchange programs by significant margins. The Kaiser Family Foundation's poll stated that 71% of Americans favored these programs. A bipartisan poll by a Republican pollster, The Tarance Group, also found a 55% majority of Americans favor needle exchange programs. The Harris poll on this topic further confirms that there is majority support in America for this effective HIV prevention program. Only the Family Research Council has produced a poll showing opposition (60%) and only after a series of influencing statements (a "push poll" 8).

Political message: The decision not to fund needle exchange programs is based on a racist and reckless disregard for those communities most affected. With race issues out front for the President this is a troubling message that will be stated publicly by African-American and Latino leaders.

AIDS is no longer just a disease of gay men - it is increasingly a disease of minority communities across America. There is a tremendous cost to our public health care system when new HIV cases are reported to a system already overwhelmed. AIDS is now the single largest cause of death among black and Latino men and women between the ages of 25-44. Over half are directly related to IV drug use. AIDS prevention programs, such as needle exchange, have demonstrated remarkable results in reducing transmission (33%). The evidence to prove this is indisputable.

In the Seattle Times Online, Metropolitan King County executive Ron Sims contends that needle-exchange programs in the region are helping prevent HIV infection and treat substance abuse. He notes that HIV is non-discriminatory, but does have a higher prevalence in areas affected by discrimination, poverty, and lack of access to adequate medical care. He states that the level of HIV infection among injection drug users in King County is under 3 percent, which is largely due to the early implementation of needle-exchange programs. According to Sims, the success of the program has spurred other Northwest regions to initiate such measures. He asserts that this response is the correct one, especially in light of high IDU infection rates in areas that waited to set up the needle-exchanges, particularly on the East Coast and in the South. Sims asserts that the programs are cost-effective compared to HIV treatment costs, and he points out that the programs offer a gateway for addicts to seek drug treatment. More than 330 people have entered drug-treatment programs in Seattle-King County over the past four years because of the programs. According to Sims, political debates concerning needle exchanges have harmed HIV prevention efforts, and he calls on Washington state lawmakers to focus instead on the science involved in the interest of saving lives, conserving resources, and preventing HIV infections.
