Q Mr. President, General Barry McCaffrey is in the midst of controversy over the needle exchange program, as well as a personality conflict. Mr. President, what are your words to General McCaffrey's detractors, especially those in your Cabinet, your administration, and those Democrats in the CBC that are joining Newt Gingrich to get McCaffrey out of the Drug Czar's Office?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, first of all, I think we ought to look at his record. I think he's got quite a commendable record. We have more than double -- we've had a strategy that was as follows with the drug issue: One, to try to help parents teach their children that drugs are wrong and illegal and can kill you. Two, to try to support local law enforcement efforts and local community efforts at not only punishment, but prevention. Three, to try to increase our capacity to stop drugs from coming in at the border.

We more than doubled border guards, for example, from 3,000 to 6,000. We've got another 1,000 coming in this budget. We've got a fund set aside in the highway bill to increase the technological capacity of the government to stop drugs coming in at the border.

And General McCaffrey has been behind a lot of that. He's also done enormous work with the supply countries and Latin America, trying to get them to work with us. And he's made some real headway. He's one of the reasons we've got this alliance against drugs at the last Summit of the Americas. He supported huge increases in funding for treatment and for testing and treatment for inmates not only in federal, but in state and local penitentiaries. So I think he's got a good record.

Now, he believes that the benefits of needle exchange are uncertain and that the message you send out is not good, that somehow the government is empowering drug use. There are people all over the country who agree with that. Now, the weight of medical research and the American Medical Association has a different view. Their view is that it may help to lower the transmission of HIV, and there is no evidence that it increases drug use.

I think -- if I might, I mean, that's the next logical question, why did we make the decision we did -- because the weight of scientific evidence was what I just said. But if you look at it, it's clear -- if you go all across the American cities or go to Vancouver, Canada, anyplace where they've had a needle exchange program where there has been serious testing, the only place it really works to reduce HIV transmission and to reduce drug use is when the people who come in to exchange needles get pulled into treatment programs.

So the real issue is, will there be more funds for treatment. And that's, obviously -- I'm getting as much money out there as I can, but that's why I think it should remain a local decision and why I made the decision I did, and why I'd like to see this controversy put behind us, because I think in a way, in terms of impact on people, it has been -- there has been more heat than light on it.

HASTERT CARRIES GOP FLAG IN WAR ON DRUGS

WASHINGTON - The handiwork of suburban GOP Rep. Dennis Hastert will be on display this week as the Republican Party begins unveiling a series of anti-drug measures.

The headlines probably will be grabbed by show "drug-free" initiatives, like

"drug-free Congress" legislation, requiring random drug tests of elected representatives and their staffs.

But the broader plan will reflect the priorities of Hastert, a

less-than-flamboyant lawmaker who has focused on drug issues for years and was chosen by Republican leaders to coordinate the campaign.

Look for Hastert's influence particularly in a stepped-up emphasis on drug interdiction and border controls.

The GOP plan will call for the hiring of thousands of additional border guards and a major commitment to deploy technologically advanced equipment that can "sweep" luggage for traces of illegal drugs, a congressional staff member said.

Hastert also has been musing about triple-fencing parts of the Mexican border, sure to be diplomatically troublesome but politically popular.

The Republican plan would view drug education and prevention programs more skeptically, putting them under close scrutiny to show a tight focus on anti-drug messages or measurable results in lowering narcotics use.

Drug abuse awareness programs, including the politically popular DARE (Drug Abuse Resistance Education), have come in for criticism for ranging too far from their purpose in places.

How the program will fare is open to question, with Republican leaders recently signaling they will use a hard stand on drugs to fend off criticism they are too soft on cigarette-makers.

Intertwining the plan with the politically charged tobacco settlement can cause only trouble during an election year. But Hastert, a committed partisan, argues, "There is a real nexus with tobacco. I think we'll get it all passed."

Clinton defends drug needle policy

WASHINGTON, April 30 (UPI) - - President Clinton defended his refusal to

lift a 10-year ban on the use of federal funds for needle exchange programs, despite acknowledging that medical research proves such programs help prevent the spread of the AIDS-causing virus HIV.

At a White House news conference, Clinton said needle-exchange programs work best when accompanied by mandatory drug treatment programs, and insisted that more attention therefore should be spent on funding local treatment efforts.

Clinton said, "That's why I think it (needle-exchange programs) should remain a local decision and why I made the decision I did, and why I'd like to see this controversy put behind us."

He complained there has been "more heat than light on" the matter.

But Clinton confirmed that he understood "the weight of medical research" shows needle-exchange programs "may help to lower the transmission of HIV, and there's no evidence that it increases drug use."

He said such facts raise the "logical question" of why he accepted the recommendation of his top drug policy adviser, Barry McCaffrey, who opposes needle-exchange programs, over the recommendation of his top AIDS policy adviser, Sandra Thurman, who supports them.

Defending McCaffrey's drug-fighting record, Clinton said: "He believes that the benefits of needle exchange are uncertain and that the message you send out...is...that somehow the government is empowering drug use. There are people all over the country who agree with that."

Exchanging blows over needles

Needle exchange will not go away, despite the fondest wishes of the Clinton administration to click its heels together and make it so. Protests are dogging those heels at locations throughout the country, legislation is percolating through Congress, and its own troops are restless.

Secretary of Health and Human Services Donna Shalala traveled to the University of California, Berkeley on April 24 to participate in the inauguration of their new Chancellor.

Three days and a continent away, about 200 protesters jeered Shalala at an April 27 public appearance at Bryn Mawr, outside of Philadelphia. The disruption lasted for about 15 minutes before the group left to continue demonstrating outside the building.

Manhattan was the next site. President Clinton, headlining another omnivorous political fund raising event, drew about 50 people on short notice to protest outside the hotel on April 28.

Protests are planned in Washington and other cities as leading administration officials make public appearances. Lanier is encouraged by this "growing drumbeat," a "new level of activism" which is bringing in increasing numbers of people of color.

Support for needle exchange has also come in other ways. Financier/philanthropist George Soros announced that he will make another \$1 million available to the Lindesmith Center to fund needle exchange. Those grants require a match by other contributors.

Congressional machinations

New York Republican Gerald Solomon introduced a bill (HR 3717) last Thursday, April 23 that would prohibit use of any federal funds "directly or indirectly" for needle exchange programs. It carried the co-sponsorship of four other members of the House.

The following day the Congressional Black Caucus called on the president to reverse his decision and to fund needle exchange programs. It also urged him to fire Drug Czar McCaffrey, a major source of opposition within the White House.

The Solomon bill raced to a Wednesday, April 29 vote on the floor of the House. After several hours of heated debate the measure passed 287-140. The "No" vote dropped by 18 when compared to a similar measure last fall. A handful of Republicans switched their votes, as did more than a dozen Democrats. The number is significant because 146 votes are needed to sustain a presidential veto.

Daniel Zingale, executive director of the AIDS Action Council, attributed the shift to "the indecisiveness and weakness from the White House, which Congress took as an engraved invitation to further politicize the issue."

"It's all about the Senate now," he said, "It makes it harder." He hopes that Senator Ted Kennedy's (D-Massachusetts) willingness to filibuster over the issue might preclude it even being scheduled for a vote. Senator Arlen Specter (R-Pennsylvania) "has been great," Zingale said. "[Tennessee Republican Bill] Frist could be key. I think he understands where the science is on this issue." As the only physician in the Senate, his voice carries great weight on medical issues.

Mike Shriver, policy director of the National Association of People With AIDS (NAPWA), marveled at "an administration that is so schizophrenic," split between the science and General McCaffrey. He found it "bizarre" that the House prohibitionists both attacked Clinton and praised his subordinate McCaffrey. And he called it frightening that Clinton "condones the insubordination by an individual (McCaffrey) who has done nothing to further the cause of drug abuse prevention or treatment in this country."

"It is amazing that to have come so far, to be exactly where we have always been. This is one of the darkest days we have ever experienced. I can't see any change in this policy without a change in drug control policy."

Washington, D.C. to demand increased funding for the full scope of federal
HIV/AIDS programs as
part of AIDSWatch '98 from May 3-5.

``The paradox of today's HIV epidemic -- promising new treatments and
increasingly complex
service needs -- has led some to question the need for a sustained

commitment to HIV and AIDS," said Regina Aragon, San Francisco AIDS Foundation Public Policy Director and member of the Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS. "We reject this notion and instead call for a national recommitment to the fight to end AIDS."

In addition to fighting for critical funding to continue San Francisco's battle to end the HIV epidemic and human suffering caused by AIDS, advocates will also urge the Senate to oppose the House of Representatives (HR 3717) bill which would permanently ban the use of federal funding for needle exchange programs. Priorities for advocates during the three-day AIDSWatch '98 include:

- Fully funding the Ryan White CARE Act -- which includes the AIDS Drug Assistance Program -- at levels recommended by advocates, including a \$105.2 million increase in funding for services in those urban areas hardest hit by the HIV epidemic (Title I funds) and a \$173 million increase for the AIDS Drug Assistance Program to provide free or low cost HIV treatments to the uninsured or underinsured;
- Allocation of \$250 million (a \$46 million increase) to the Housing Opportunities for People With AIDS (HOPWA) program in Fiscal Year 1999 to ensure adequate funding for an estimated eight to ten newly eligible areas, as well as ongoing and unmet service needs in the 88 jurisdictions currently funded;
- An increase of \$185 million in funding for HIV prevention programs;
- Support for an additional \$241 million in National Institutes of Health HIV/AIDS research, including the search for an effective vaccine; and
- Additional funding of \$200 million for an expanded and sustained federal investment in substance abuse treatment and mental health services for people living with HIV/AIDS and those at highest risk for infection.

It is expected that the House of Representatives Appropriations Committee will take action on these issues in late May or early June.

"San Francisco has developed a world-renowned safety net of integrated services that target the most vulnerable among us," said Aragon. "In a period when the public is focused on the amazing results of some very promising new treatments for HIV, many are still in need of critical medical care and supportive services. Until we have a cure for HIV, we must not forget the needs of every person

living with HIV and AIDS."

The San Francisco AIDS Foundation's HIV Advocacy Network has coordinated the outreach in the Northern California area and is leading a 30-person delegation to the nation's capitol. The delegation, which includes men and women living with HIV and AIDS, staff of the AIDS Foundation policy department and members of the AIDS Foundation's community-based board of directors, will meet with Members of Congress during the three-day AIDSWatch '98.

The San Francisco AIDS Foundation is a non-profit AIDS service organization serving the community since 1982 and provides HIV/AIDS advocacy at federal, state and local levels of government. The San Francisco AIDS Foundation HIV Prevention Project operates the nation's largest needle exchange program, swapping 2.1 million sterile syringes each year.

ABBREVIATED TALKING POINTS ON NEEDLE EXCHANGE

The Clinton Administration

A Record of Fighting the AIDS Epidemic

It has been more than 15 years since the epidemic of HIV/AIDS struck our nation. In that time, more than 600,000 Americans have been diagnosed with AIDS and more than 300,000 men, women, and children have died of AIDS. President Clinton has worked hard to reinvigorate the response to HIV and AIDS, providing new national leadership, substantially greater resources, and a closer working relationship with affected communities.

Overall Increases. Since President Clinton took office in 1993, overall funding for AIDS related programs has increased by more than 86%.

Supported the Ryan White CARE Act. President Clinton in five years has tripled funding for the Ryan White CARE Act, the largest distributor of funds for medical and support services to people living with HIV and AIDS. In 1996, the Administration earmarked Ryan White funds for the AIDS Drug Assistance Program to help those without insurance obtain much needed prescription drugs; since then, ADAP funds have increased by 450%.

Supported the National Institutes of Health. The Administration has increased NIH AIDS research funds by 50% in five years. In 1993, President Clinton signed the NIH Revitalization Act creating a permanent Office of AIDS Research at NIH and investing it with new authority to plan and carry out the AIDS research agenda.

Accelerated AIDS Drug Approval to Record Times. Since 1993, the Food and Drug Administration has approved 10 new AIDS drugs, 20 new drugs for AIDS-related conditions, and three new diagnostic tests. Included in the approvals are a class of drugs known as protease inhibitors, which, in combination with previous drugs, have shown tremendous promise in the treatment of HIV progression.

Pushed for an AIDS Vaccine. On May 18, 1997, the President challenged the nation to develop an AIDS vaccine within the next ten years. He has supported that goal by dedicating an AIDS vaccine research center at the National Institutes of Health and encouraging domestic and international collaboration among governments, medical communities and service organizations.

Increased Access to HIV Prevention Services for Youth. In a directive

issued on World AIDS Day 1997, President Clinton instructed each Federal agency to identify all programs under its control that offer opportunities to youth for preventing HIV infection and develop within 180 days a plan through which those programs can increase preventative education as well as support services for those already infected.

Protected Medicaid. The President fought to preserve Medicaid coverage for people living with AIDS. Nearly 50% of people with AIDS and 92% of children with AIDS rely on Medicaid for health coverage. He also revised eligibility rules for Social Security Disability Insurance to increase the number of HIV+ persons who qualify for benefits.

On Monday, May 11, 1998, the Congressional Black Caucus will hold a meeting to request that President Clinton declare a "State of Emergency" in HIV and AIDS among African Americans. We ask that you join us for this historic meeting. Let the Caucus know that you support this emergency request. The meeting will be from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM in The Capitol, Room 6 or 9. The Capitol is in Washington, DC, you should go to the House Wing which is on the Independence Avenue side of the Capitol.

The African American community is facing a "State of Emergency" in the face of HIV/AIDS. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), every hour, seven (7) Americans are infected with HIV, three (3) of them are African Americans. A total of 240,000-325,000 African Americans are infected with HIV and 92,200 African Americans are living with AIDS. An alarming 1 in 50 African American men and 1 in 60 African American women are infected with HIV.

This "State of Emergency" demands sound national policy and proactive national and community based leadership. In a country which is the leader in HIV/AIDS research and care, it is unconscionable and intolerable that African Americans are: less likely to know their HIV status, more likely to be diagnosed late in disease progression, less likely to have access to doctors with HIV/AIDS experience and the state of the art HIV/AIDS care, and less likely to be prescribed, and to take the new and promising combination drug therapies.

We come together on May 11th, to work with the Congressional Black Caucus as they request that President Clinton declare a "State of Emergency" in HIV and AIDS among African Americans. All agencies of the federal government must garner their collective expertise and resources to address this crisis now and be held made accountable for closing the health outcomes disparities. We recommend that the Secretary of Health and Human Services provide a report on how the agencies (including but not limited to NIH, HRSA, HCFA, CDC, SAMHSA) whose departments are responsible for HIV/AIDS related prevention, health care and research, plan to close the gap by the year 2000. The plan should delineate the specific goals and objectives, time frames for implementation and completion, and the funding allocated to meet the objectives.

Furthermore, federal funds must be directed to follow the epidemiological trends in the epidemic, and new resources must be allocated to address emerging needs and to close the gaps in services. We are especially concerned about women, adolescents, gay men and injection drug users. The response to the HIV/AIDS epidemic must be integrated with many challenges facing our community, such as poverty, teen pregnancy, STDs, unemployment, addiction, homelessness, access to health care, disproportionately high rates of incarceration, and the list goes on. The following strategies must be must be planned and implemented immediately:

- 1) A large scale, culturally appropriate, public information and education

campaign targeted to African Americans, to educate people about the benefits of knowing their HIV status; to promote HIV counseling, and voluntary HIV testing; and to promote voluntary partner counseling, notification and referral services. The overall goals of this campaign are to reduce further transmission of HIV/AIDS and to promote early intervention and treatment for those who have already contracted the virus.

2) A large scale public information and educational campaign to dispel the shame and stigma associated with HIV/AIDS and promote the understanding of HIV/AIDS treatments. To further promote the understanding that disease management and treatment can increase the length and quality of life for people living with HIV/AIDS.

3) A comprehensive plan to address the HIV prevention, care, treatment and support service needs of African American gay men. African American gay men have been disproportionately affected by HIV/AIDS, yet in many regions of the country there is a lack of services to address their specific needs.

3) A comprehensive plan and the allocation of the necessary funds to ensure that every person in this country with HIV/AIDS has access to the state of the art HIV care, treatment with effective combination drug therapies, and treatment for opportunistic infections. We can no longer stand watching only a select few benefit from the enormous national investment in HIV/AIDS research, prevention, treatment and care.

4) A comprehensive and coordinated plan to address HIV/AIDS and substance abuse by increasing resources for the expansion of culturally appropriate and gender specific drug prevention and treatment programs; and the integration of HIV prevention and primary HIV health care into drug prevention and treatment services.

5) Overturn the ban and allow Federal funding of needle exchange programs. By leaving states and localities to fund these programs on their own, the federal government is effectively denying this lifesaving intervention to thousands of Americans at risk for HIV/AIDS.

6) A comprehensive plan, and the allocation of sufficient funding, to conduct clinical research on the effect of HIV treatment in minority populations. This needs to include a greater focus on the effect of HIV therapy on concomitant medical conditions that are of high incidence within the African American community. Further, this plan should also address the current rates of inclusion of people of color into clinical trials, and the need to establish more African American investigators in HIV related research.

Join us, the AIDS epidemic is not over, especially not in African American communities. We need your voices, we need your support, and we need your outrage. We must act swiftly if we are to save the lives of our friends, family members and partners.

There is a world rich with variety and opportunity. For the Class of '93, it's all yours for the taking. You're now ready to launch toward newer, broader horizons (to cast your nets across a deep sea of choice and chance.

As you do set out, I have one over-riding piece of advice. If you remember nothing else I say this morning, I hope you'll remember this:

Try to give back as much as you get.

Give back to your community and your college (to your family and your friends.

I know that's a message that's been instilled in you here at Agnes Scott. I know many of you have already taken it to heart.

And you should be proud of your accomplishments in the community.

Proud of the Habitat for Humanity chapter you formed in the fall.

Proud of the new house you built for Mary Brown and her family.

Proud of the voter registration drive you helped organize.

But as you move on (as you turn your attention to raising families..and establishing careers (and meeting all the many little challenges of everyday life (it becomes harder to get involved. You have to make more of an effort to find the time and the energy.

But, please, do it.

I promise you: Your efforts really will matter *in your own lives and in the lives of others.

You all have so much to give (gifts that are yours alone. But taken together, what a rich mosaic they create!

Appreciate the great diversity of talents and backgrounds and interests you represent.

There's a story about a little girl and some balloons. The girl has a beautiful purple balloon. She is walking down the street, so proud of that balloon, when a gust of wind loosens it from her hand and sends it flying to the clouds.

The little girl is heartbroken. But her grandfather tells her not to worry, they'll get another balloon just like the one she lost.

They go to the man who sells balloons and discover he has no more purple ones. But he has many other colors *red, yellow, green, blue.

The little girl picks up a red one and asks, &will this one float as high, will it fly as strong? *

&Yes, *the man replies. Then the girl turns to a green balloon and asks the same question, then a brown balloon, then a yellow one, and so on. Finally, the man tells her, &These balloons are no different from each other. It doesn't matter what color they are *they can all float high and fly strongly. *

Like all those brightly colored balloons, you can all fly high (and that is what we need you to do.

The future you're entering is both wondrous and fragile. There are glorious opportunities ahead of you. And there are serious problems demanding your attention. Problems you didn't create but are now inheriting. Problems earlier generations couldn't *or wouldn't *solve. Peace is now yours to achieve. Hunger is now yours to stop. Bigotry is now yours to end.

In short, action is now yours to make.

Find the issue you care about. And whatever it is (protecting the environment, fighting the war on drugs, being an advocate for children

the people who expect the worst prepare for the worst (and usually get the worst.

In contrast, concerned individuals face problems head on. They size them up, then go to work tearing them down. Of course, they get discouraged.

Sure there are times when they want to give up. But they never do.

Somewhere, somehow, they always manage to reach deep down and find one more burst of energy and optimism.

These days, I see pessimism among so many of our young people, and it saddens me. Please ... don't join their ranks. Don't let the troubles of our times freeze you, making you scared for tomorrow and unable to act today.

Remember: Every generation since time immemorial - has faced a future filled with both blessings and burdens. Yours is no different. You must build on what's good and change what's bad.

You, the Class of '93, among the special few -- best prepared to achieve something special.

Each of you is a capable, independent woman with a good head on your shoulders and a fine education behind you.

You've had the benefit of some wonderful opportunities. But that also means you now have a special obligation to reach back to those who are coming along behind you -- to be the next link in a long chain of arms reaching back..and back (and back.

Time, talent, treasure. Try to take at least one of those and give it back to all of the people and institutions that have helped you get to this point.

And high on that list is this school. Agnes Scott needs your support in order to continue giving women educational and social experiences as rich as you've had. You are the ones to preserve and strengthen the traditions of this college.

[PAUSE]

Yet while I strongly urge you to invest yourself in the common good, I must also offer a warning: Don't try to do everything. Make your commitments selectively and whole-heartedly. Be discriminating when deciding which organizations you'll work for -- either as an employee or a volunteer. Your associations reflect your character.

Remember: Ethics and character are the only things we can ever truly own. Use yours carefully, for they are much easier to keep than to recover.

Keep your priorities straight: A career (community contribution (leadership (are all wonderful and important things. But only when they don't come at a cost of what really matters: family. Whatever else you do, do right by your family.

I can tell you from personal experience: The temptation to be Super Woman is a strong one. But let me also tell you that it doesn't work. There is no such thing as having it all. Every life is a series of trade-offs and decisions, a constant juggling act to make the right choices.

[PERSONAL]

Some of you will be career women. Others will be full-time wives and mothers. Many will juggle the two. I think if there is one thing my generation can be proud of, it is that we did help pave the way for women to strike that balance of career and family.

Whatever your choices, what matters is that they are the choice you can best live with...the roles you can best fulfill, while remaining true to

yourself and the people you love.

At the end of our careers -- and our lives -- few of us look back and think:

I should have spent more time at the office.

As I ,ve faced my own conflicts, I ,ve often thought of something Lee Attwater said shortly before his death. Many of you will recall that Mr. Attwater was a presidential campaign strategist known for his ruthless,

&take-no-prisoners approach to winning elections.

Reflecting upon his life he said:

"What power I wouldn't trade for more time with my family. What price I wouldn't pay for an evening with friends. 8 [PAUSE]

This Class of ,93 (this generation of women (this wonderfully diverse group (is moving out into the world with more options than any other generation of American women has ever had.

You know, I have a special affinity for your class. This year marks the 25th anniversary of my own graduation. I too went to a women ,s college.

To this day, I am grateful for the uniquely stimulating and supportive environment I experienced as an undergraduate at Spelman College.

I wouldn ,t trade those years for anything. An occasion such as this gives me good reason to look back (to remember what it felt like to be part of the Class of ,68.

What a year. Martin Luther King, Jr. lay in state at Spelman. Robert Kennedy also assassinated. The lingering idealism of Camelot (the Civil Rights Movement (the symbolism of a new era (al blending together in a crazy, exciting, and scary patchwork.

Yet despise the battles and the conflicts (despite the tragedies and the upheaval (what I remember most clearly is the great hope we felt. Hope for a future that seemed to be without limit. Hope and an ability to dream dreams, to only look forward.

We believed we could make a difference.

I want you to feel that same sense of hope, to feel limitless in what you can accomplish. 25 years ago, much of our revolution was about symbolism. Today, the conflicts may be a little kinder (but the real issue is where the power lies.

It lies in you (in the future.

In 1968, despite the frightening problems, the possibilities were endless.

In 1993, despite the frightening problems, the possibilities are endless.

There are so many opportunities ahead of you.

I believe you will succeed in fulfilling many of the roles now open to you.

I would like to close with the words Maya Angelou used to close the Inaugural Poem:

Here on the pulse of this new day

You may have the grace to look up and out

And into your sister ,s eyes,

And into your brother ,s face,

Your country,

And say simply

Very simply

With hope *

Below is a draft letter to Dr. Hitt, Chair of the President's Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS, in response to a letter expressing concern about needle exchange and the Administration's commitment to HIV prevention.

Since this articulates our response to a very sensitive issue, I would appreciate it if you would review the letter and reply to me with any comments by the end of today (Friday).

Dear Dr. Hitt:

Thank you for your letter regarding needle exchange programs and prevention in the fight to end the AIDS epidemic.

I am taking the concerns you have raised very seriously. We all know that the rising incidence of HIV infection among those who use injected drugs, and among their partners and children, is a major factor in the continued growth of this epidemic. Therefore, I will continue to support retention of the HHS Secretary's authority to decide whether to allow local communities to use federal funds for needle exchange programs.

Recently, the Secretary released a report indicating that needle exchange programs can help reduce HIV transmissions without encouraging

the use of illegal drugs. This scientific analysis should be of great use to those local and state officials that are considering the implementation of needle exchange as part of their comprehensive HIV prevention strategies.

However, we are not at this time allowing for Federal funds to be used for such programs. That decision was made because we believe that Congress would not support such a move. More must be done to help the general public and those in Congress understand the role of needle exchange programs in our efforts to fight both HIV and illegal drug use.

In the interim, the Office of National AIDS Policy, the Office of Drug Control Policy, and the Department of Health and Human Services will work together to improve our efforts to stop the spread of HIV among injection drug users, their partners, and their children.

I appreciate the passion that you and other members of the Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS bring to the debate. Be assured that my commitment to ending this epidemic -- and to responding to the needs of those already living with HIV and AIDS -- remains firm. We must all work together to stop this deadly disease, and I will take all measures within my authority to achieve that end.

Thank you again for sharing your concerns, and for your commitment to bringing an end to this terrible epidemic.

On Monday, May 11, 1998, the Congressional Black Caucus will hold a meeting to request that President Clinton declare a "State of Emergency" in HIV and AIDS among African Americans. We ask that you join us for this historic meeting. Let the Caucus know that you support this emergency request. The meeting will be from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM in The Capitol, Room 6 or 9. The Capitol is in Washington, DC, you should go to the House Wing which is on the Independence Avenue side of the Capitol.

The African American community is facing a "State of Emergency" in the face of HIV/AIDS. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), every hour, seven (7) Americans are infected with HIV, three (3) of them are African Americans. A total of 240,000-325,000 African Americans are infected with HIV and 92,200 African Americans are living with AIDS. An alarming 1 in 50 African American men and 1 in 60 African American women are

infected with HIV.

This "State of Emergency" demands sound national policy and proactive national and community based leadership. In a country which is the leader in HIV/AIDS research and care, it is unconscionable and intolerable that African Americans are: less likely to know their HIV status, more likely to be diagnosed late in disease progression, less likely to have access to doctors with HIV/AIDS experience and the state of the art HIV/AIDS care, and less likely to be prescribed, and to take the new and promising combination drug therapies.

We come together on May 11th, to work with the Congressional Black Caucus as they request that President Clinton declare a "State of Emergency" in HIV and AIDS among African Americans. All agencies of the federal government must garner their collective expertise and resources to address this crisis now and be held made accountable for closing the health outcomes disparities. We recommend that the Secretary of Health and Human Services provide a report on how the agencies (including but not limited to NIH, HRSA, HCFA, CDC, SAMHSA) whose departments are responsible for HIV/AIDS related prevention, health care and research, plan to close the gap by the year 2000. The plan should delineate the specific goals and objectives, time frames for implementation and completion, and the funding allocated to meet the objectives.

Furthermore, federal funds must be directed to follow the epidemiological trends in the epidemic, and new resources must be allocated to address emerging needs and to close the gaps in services. We are especially concerned about women, adolescents, gay men and injection drug users. The response to the HIV/AIDS epidemic must be integrated with many challenges facing our community, such as poverty, teen pregnancy, STDs, unemployment, addiction, homelessness, access to health care, disproportionately high rates of incarceration, and the list goes on. The following strategies must be must be planned and implemented immediately:

- 1) A large scale, culturally appropriate, public information and education campaign targeted to African Americans, to educate people about the benefits of knowing their HIV status; to promote HIV counseling, and voluntary HIV testing; and to promote voluntary partner counseling, notification and referral services. The overall goals of this campaign are to reduce further transmission of HIV/AIDS and to promote early intervention and treatment for those who have already contracted the virus.
- 2) A large scale public information and educational campaign to dispel the shame and stigma associated with HIV/AIDS and promote the understanding of HIV/AIDS treatments. To further promote the understanding that disease management and treatment can increase the length and quality of life for people living with HIV/AIDS.

3) A comprehensive plan to address the HIV prevention, care, treatment and support service needs of African American gay men. African American gay men

have been disproportionately affected by HIV/AIDS, yet in many regions of the country there is a lack of services to address their specific needs.

3) A comprehensive plan and the allocation of the necessary funds to ensure that every person in this country with HIV/AIDS has access to the state of the art HIV care, treatment with effective combination drug therapies, and treatment for opportunistic infections. We can no longer stand watching only a select few benefit from the enormous national investment in HIV/AIDS research, prevention, treatment and care.

4) A comprehensive and coordinated plan to address HIV/AIDS and substance abuse by increasing resources for the expansion of culturally appropriate and gender specific drug prevention and treatment programs; and the integration of HIV prevention and primary HIV health care into drug prevention and treatment services.

5) Overturn the ban and allow Federal funding of needle exchange programs. By leaving states and localities to fund these programs on their own, the federal government is effectively denying this lifesaving intervention to thousands of Americans at risk for HIV/AIDS.

6) A comprehensive plan, and the allocation of sufficient funding, to conduct clinical research on the effect of HIV treatment in minority populations. This needs to include a greater focus on the effect of HIV therapy on concomitant medical conditions that are of high incidence within the African American community. Further, this plan should also address the current rates of inclusion of people of color into clinical trials, and the need to establish more African American investigators in HIV related research.

Join us, the AIDS epidemic is not over, especially not in African American communities. We need your voices, we need your support, and we need your outrage. We must act swiftly if we are to save the lives of our friends, family members and partners.

AIDS Groups CEO Salaries Criticized

WASHINGTON (AP) - Some officials at charitable AIDS organizations are doing well by doing good. At least nine groups pay their top officers more than \$100,000.

And that has upset both AIDS activists and at least one member of the House, who spoke out Wednesday.

"I was shocked to discover how many AIDS organizations pay their executives excessive salaries at the expense of those living with HIV," said Rep. Tom Coburn, R-Okla., a physician who has treated patients with the virus that causes AIDS. "At a time when direct services and medically necessary care is being severely curtailed, many AIDS charity executives have put lining their own pockets above saving many lives."

The president of the board of directors of Washington's Whitman-Walker Clinic insisted the salaries are not out of line. Whitman-Walker's executive director, Jim Graham, was paid \$143,690 in 1996.

"This is a salary that's nowhere out of sync with everything else," board president Dace Stone said.

In New York, the National Charities Information Bureau, which tracks charitable organizations, noted a lack of guidelines about how much a charity should pay its leaders. "It is up to the board of directors to figure out how much compensation it takes to improve or maintain the organization's

revenues,
and more importantly, their programs," bureau spokesman Dan Langan said.

Directors of the nine AIDS organizations, which receive \$53 million a year from federal, state and local governments, are in charge of operations, budgets and staff.

At the top of the list: Jerome Radwin, chief executive officer of the New York-based American Foundation for AIDS Research, a national group known as AmFAR. He was paid \$191,729 in 1996, the group said in its financial disclosure form filed with the Internal Revenue Service.

Radwin said AmFar brought in an outside firm to recommend salaries under a philosophy of hiring good people and paying them ``not at the top but in a competitive framework to attract the talent we need."

The Gay Men's Health Crisis, also based in New York City, had two employees who earned more than the \$130,000 salary of New York Gov. George Pataki in 1995: Executive Director Mark Robinson, paid \$144,782; and the deputy executive director for development, Addie Guttag, \$139,337. The group did not return a phone call for comment.

On the West Coast, Los Angeles-based AIDS Healthcare Foundation had at least six employees with salaries exceeding \$100,000 in 1996 - five physicians paid \$127,375 to \$172,366, and the foundation president, Michael Weinstein, paid \$126,548.

``We're a medical provider and our top salary earners are doctors," said Cesar Portillo, the organization's director of government affairs. ``We provide the highest-quality medical care to people with AIDS. The only way we can do that is to make sure we're competitive in the market in terms of physicians."

Graham, of the Whitman-Walker clinic, said his salary increased as the clinic grew, from a budget of \$280,000 and six employees when he arrived 14 years ago to a budget of \$21 million and 280 employees today.

Records show the clinic still spends just 2 percent of its budget on administrative costs.

``It is not a situation where money is being diverted to fat salaries over the back of people who need help," Graham said.

Dear Dr. Hitt:

Thank you for your letter regarding needle exchange programs and prevention in the fight to end the AIDS epidemic.

I am taking the concerns you have raised very seriously. We all know that the rising incidence of HIV infection among those who use injected drugs, and among their partners and children, is a major factor in the continued growth of this epidemic. Therefore, I will continue to support retention of the HHS Secretary's authority to decide whether to allow local communities to use federal funds for needle exchange programs.

Recently, the Secretary released a report indicating that needle exchange programs can help reduce HIV transmissions without encouraging the use of illegal drugs. This scientific analysis should be of great use to those local and state officials that are considering the implementation of needle exchange as part of their comprehensive HIV prevention strategies.

At the same time, the Administration tried to prevent the politicization of the needle exchange by keeping decision making at the local level. Therefore, we are not at this time allowing for Federal funds to be used for such programs. More must be done to help the general public and those in Congress understand the role of needle exchange programs in our efforts to fight both HIV and illegal drug use.

In the interim, the Office of National AIDS Policy, the Office of Drug Control Policy, and the Department of Health and Human Services will work together to improve our efforts to stop the spread of HIV among injection drug users, their partners, and their children.

I appreciate the passion that you and other members of the Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS bring to the debate. Be assured that my commitment to ending this epidemic -- and to responding to the needs of those already living with HIV and AIDS -- remains firm. We must all work together to stop this deadly disease, and I will take all measures within my authority to achieve that end.

Thank you again for sharing your concerns, and for your commitment to bringing an end to this terrible epidemic.

"In response to our earlier discussion regarding the funding of the Office of National AIDS Policy (ONAP), I am providing you with some followup information on reducing HUD's contribution to the ONAP budget for FY99. I am pleased that we will be able to reduce the contribution significantly.

Last week, ONAP, the White House Office of Administration (OA), and I met to discuss how to reduce ONAP's FY 99 budget. After much debate, we are prepared to reduce ONAP's FY99 operations budget (and HUD's contribution) from \$278,429 to \$215,105, a reduction of \$63,324 (or 22%). This reduction is quite significant, and represents cuts in almost all categories of ONAP's operations budget.

A cut of this amount also insures that HUD is not the largest contributor to ONAP. HHS would now provide the lion's share of ONAP's budget, at over \$600,000 for staffing. The Domestic Policy Council (DPC), which has been helping to fund ONAP since '94, would be contributing approximately xxx,xxx (\$194,000 + OEOP rent<Ashley?.). This amount is around 5% of DPC's total budget (Ashley ?). HUD's contribution would be at its lowest level since ONAP was created.

Concerning the issue of discontinuing HUD funding of ONAP after FY1999, I am unable to commit to this request because of several outstanding issues, the most important of which is the following; while HHS can and does supply ONAP with the majority of its staff, it is prohibited by Congress from providing ONAP's operational expenditures. Unfortunately, that leaves HUD as the only other Federal agency with considerable program involvement in AIDS policy. "

A few thoughts -

I was hoping we could keep the number of participants to about 40 - it's just really hard to have any kind of conversation with 75 people. You should add something about post-release treatment/service connection since a big problem is getting people into services immediately after their release.

The protective barriers issue is a non-starter for the Feds. I think if you put it out front you're going to do more harm than good. I would change the last one, though you're on the right track. We have to find ways for the Feds to be able to influence the state and local prisons but I think it's going to have to be carrot rather than stick.

Overall, I get the sense that you're envisioning something more grand than we were. Not that the issue isn't important, but the higher the profile and number of attendees the more entrenched everyone's going to be from the start. I think these folks respond much better to smaller, less formal settings. What do you think?
