I talked with Sean Maloney about the idea of having the President order the White House flag to be lowered to half staff on World AIDS Day (December 1) to commemorate the Americans lost to AIDS. He likes the idea, and suggested that it would be helpful to have your support for the formal request. My understanding is that these decisions are ultimately made by the President, so the recommendation would probably come through the Staff Secretary.

In addition, the White House has dimmed its lights in the past at some point in the evening. I believe that this falls under your authority. We will make a more formal request but I did want you to know it would be coming as you consider the flag raising idea.

#3 AIDS THERAPY: EARLY TREATMENT QUESTIONED; MERCK CANCELS TWICE-DAILY CRIXIVAN TRIALS

Although "[t]he current consensus among AIDS experts is for early and aggressive antiretroviral treatment for HIV-infected patients," Dr. Jay Levy of the University of California-San Francisco questions this approach in an editorial in the Sept. 19 issue of The Lancet. Emphasizing that he is not referring to HIV patients in the "primary stage of HIV infection, who can greatly benefit from dramatic suppression of viral load," he writes, "In my view early treatment with antiviral drugs starts the clock ticking too soon, limiting future options and making therapy a necessity for the lifetime of the person." Reuters/JAMA reports that Levy advocates reserving potent antiretroviral therapies for the later stages of infection, in part to avoid "the development of drug-resistant virus." He explains that viral "mutations that emerge during antiretroviral drug treatment select for viruses resistant to these drugs." In addition, he argues that while early aggressive antiretroviral treatment "can preserve the immune system ... this overlooks the fact that '... these drugs can be toxic and can be directly detrimental to a natural immune response to HIV, which is present' in most individuals during the asymptomatic phase of infection." Instead, Levy recommends reserving antiretroviral regimens "for those patients who have symptoms or whose CD4 cell counts have dropped substantially" (Reuters/JAMA, 9/18).

BY VICE PRESIDENT AL GORE
HUMAN RIGHTS CAMPAIGN
Saturday, September 19, 1998

I am always delighted to share this stage with my most trusted adviser of all -- my wife Tipper. I join you in celebrating the courageous and compassionate work she does to heal those suffering from AIDS and HIV; to raise awareness of AIDS; to fight for basic fairness and opportunity in the government, and in all of our lives. Tipper -- thank you for letting me bask in your reflected glory.

Let me say to all of you: I am proud to be here tonight.

I want to begin by congratulating HRC for your leadership -- your tireless commitment to equality and fairness -- and your stunning success.

In 1996, HRC was active in nearly two hundred races across the country -- and 84 percent of your candidates won. Elizabeth -- you and I may have something to talk about a bit later on.

I am especially pleased to have with us tonight some of the men and women that I am proud to work with in the administration, who serve as examples of the kind of excellence in public service that America denied itself in the past -- but who are now able to serve their country with great distinction because of our policies.

First of all, a person upon whom Tipper and I depend each and every day for his advice, his hard work, and his friendship -- Tipper's Deputy Chief of Staff and our Social Secretary, Philip Dufour. Elizabeth mentioned Philip's early work with HRC; all I can say is, your loss is our gain.

The terrific new Deputy Administrator of our Small Business Administration -- and your former Board Chair -- Fred Hochberg; I had the honor of personally swearing in Fred at the White House;

Richard Socarides, the President's Senior Advisor and liaison to the gay and lesbian community, and the first-ever senior Presidential advisor on those issues;

Ginny Apuzzo, Assistant to the President for Management and Administration -- the highest-ranking gay or lesbian person ever to serve in the federal government; Ginny -- we're so proud of you -- not just for the work you do now, but also for your lifelong commitment to fairness and opportunity;

From my own office -- Julian Potter, the director of our Community Empowerment Board; Moe Vela, my chief financial officer; Clark Ray, Tipper's director of scheduling and advance; Anthony Bernal of my scheduling and advance office; and Miguel Bustos of my domestic policy staff.

And I'd like to ask all of the members of our administration who are here tonight to stand and be recognized.

You are key members of an outstanding team, and Tipper and I are very proud to serve with all of you.

I come before you with a simple message: that the cause we celebrate tonight is not some narrow, special interest. It is really the cause that has defined this nation since its founding: to deepen the meaning of fundamental fairness, to make real the promise of our self-government, to build a good and just society on this bedrock principle: equal opportunity for all, special privileges for none.

If you believe in the basic dignity of every American -- if you live by our laws and live up to your responsibilities -- then you can share in the full promise of the greatest nation on this earth. And that means all of you.

That is a purpose we did not fully understand when we counted each slave as three-fifths of a person. Or when innocent and loyal Japanese-Americans were imprisoned at the outset of World War II. Or when gays and lesbians were effectively barred from holding jobs in their own federal government. We've come a long way, America.

And when some, in recent months, have launched unprecedented attacks on the very idea of fair treatment -- trying to punish and scapegoat people just because of their sexual orientation -- I have been amazed, and outraged. For this I believe with all my heart: if we cannot conquer the forces of hatred and division that still exist in our society,

we can never redeem the American dream.

That is why President Clinton and I are so determined to appoint the best-qualified people to senior positions in our government -- whether or not they are gay or lesbian.

That is why we ended, by Executive Order, policies that discriminated against gays and lesbians in our civilian federal workforce. And never forget this: we are one of the most successful administrations in history not in spite of that diversity -- but because of it!

And we want our country to push back the forces of hatred and discrimination, as we have always done when we are at our best. The story of America is the story of an ever-widening circle of human dignity and expanding opportunity.

It is the story of a free people determined to unleash the full potential of the human spirit. We have always been a bright and shining light to the world. Against all the opposition of the forces of hate -- against those who are limited by their surrender to discrimination -- we are determined to stand for justice.

Now the United States Senate should join us in that crusade, and confirm Jim Hormel as the next Ambassador to Luxembourg. We know he's qualified. We know he's a good and decent man. So let's give him the up-or-down vote that he deserves.

And it is an outrage that today, in 1998, in 40 states of our union, it is 100 percent legal to fire a hard-working employee just because they are gay or lesbian. That is profoundly wrong. Everyone deserves the basic freedom from discrimination.

So I say to Congress: let's give everyone who is willing to work for it a fair and equal chance to succeed. Pass the Employment Non-Discrimination Act into law.

You all remember how hard it was to get 49 votes in the Senate two years ago. So I'll make you a deal: help me get that one last vote, and then I'll go down to the Capitol and personally exercise that little-known, but extremely significant provision of our Constitution that says: every time I vote, we win.

I am proud of your commitment to fight the terrible scourge of HIV and AIDS -- a commitment your government shares today. Too often, in the beginning, you stood nearly alone against the most crushing epidemic of this century. But you have led and inspired us all to action.

I am proud that we have increased AIDS research at the NIH by 50 percent; tripled Ryan White funds; and increased drug assistance for people with AIDS by 450 percent. We are united in the fight for research, care, and prevention. And we will not stop until all who need it have access to the treatment they need. We will not rest until we have a vaccine -- and a cure.

I am also proud that we appointed Sandy Thurman, the outstanding director of our Office of National AIDS Policy. Sandy makes a difference because she speaks the truth -- unvarnished. And that's exactly what we need.

We haven't always agreed on everything, and I can't promise we always will. But I can promise an open door and an open mind -- the kind of frank, honest dialogue that can help us learn from one another, and move forward together.

And let me say this: we know our progress so far would have been impossible without our President, Bill Clinton. He believes, deep in his heart, the words he spoke to you one year ago, when he became the first President in history to address a gay and lesbian audience: "If we're ever going to build One America, then all Americans...have got to be a part of it." 8

We still have a long way to go on our journey, to be sure. We still see too much evidence of intolerance -- in ugly words and awful violence; in the public outrage of bombed buildings, and the private pain of a teenager's suicide. Despite all the progress we have made in civil rights and in human rights, too often, the shadows of division still darken the American spirit.

Last year, here in Washington, D.C., three men accosted a gay man in a park, forced him at gunpoint to go under a bridge, and beat him viciously while using anti-gay epithets.

Just five days ago in Brooklyn, a lesbian leaving a restaurant was chased by three men, who yelled obscenities at her, then slashed her with a knife.

These shameful acts of violence wound not just the individuals involved -- they wound the American spirit. If we allow even a small number of Americans to harbor and act upon malice and intolerance, we all feel the bitter sting of injustice.

Let us send a clear message to those would commit crimes of hate: it is wrong, it is illegal, and we will punish you with the full force of our laws.

I believe we also need stronger laws. Crimes of hate against all people -- including gays and lesbians -- should carry a punishment that is swift and severe. So I say to Congress: take a stand against crimes of hate. Pass the Hate Crimes Prevention Act into law.

People across the world see in America the reflection of their own great potential -- and they always will, as long as we give all our citizens, whatever their background or sexual orientation, the freedom to achieve their own greatness.

We learned in school about the "lowest common denominator;" 8 America is about the highest common denominator.

That's why your work is so critical. We need more education and

awareness. We need more intelligent advocacy. We need more energy and action in all our communities. We need to fight discrimination person by person, block by block, neighborhood by neighborhood. We've got to keep working, until every person in this room -- and every person in this nation -- has a full and equal chance to reach for their dreams.

That is a lofty goal -- but if we are to live together in peace and dignity, how can we hope for anything less?

Mark my words -- we'll get there. But we've got a lot of hard work to do. And I pledge to you: I intend to be a part of it.

Let's seize the promise of the future. We don't have a moment to waste -- because we don't have a person to waste. Thank you -- and keep up the good work.

The U.S. General Accounting Office (GAO) conducted a study of the Joint U.N. Program on HIV/AIDS at the request of the U.S. House Committee on International Relations (IR). The report stated that UNAIDS has made limited progress towards generating worldwide support for AIDS projects and that the organization failed to meet certain goals. In its defense, UNAIDS asserted that the evaluation began only 18 months into the group's first biennium and claimed that certain facts were presented from a negative standpoint. In the same report, the GAO praised the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). Benjamin Gilman, chairman of the IR committee, said "If our government, through USAID and the Centers for Disease Control can do a better job than the U.N. to combat [HIV/AIDS], then we should shift funding to the more successful programs." The United States supplied 28 percent of the biennial UNAIDS Secretariat budget for 1996-1997.

BACKGROUND - The Congressional Black Caucus recently requested that the Administration declare a public health emergency on AIDS in the African-American community. During its recent Washington conference, the AIDS crisis was declared one of CBS's highest priorities. The situation is indeed severe. In 1997, 45% of new adult and adolescent (and 62% of pediatric) AIDS cases reported were African-Americans. Similarly 56% of new adult and adolescent (and 69% of pediatric) HIV infections reported were African-Americans. AIDS is the leading cause of death for African-Americans between the ages of 25 and 44.

TALKING POINTS

The Administration agrees that AIDS is of crisis proportions in the African-American community and is committed to a long-term, sustained partnership with the CBC and others to address that crisis. A short-term, "band-aid" approach is inconsistent with the severity of the problem. HHS has taken this on as one of its highest priorities.

Secretary Shalala and Surgeon General Satcher have given CBC's request high priority, and have responded with a comprehensive package of HIV prevention, education and care with funding specifically targeting African-Americans. Through discretionary reallocation, HHS is currently proposing approximately \$36 million in services for FY98, and has committed to sustaining or improving upon that amount for FY99.

The Administration is seeking \$400 million in funding over five years for its Initiative to Eliminate Racial and Ethnic Disparities and Health; HIV/AIDS is one of six diseases receiving specific focus in this Initiative. The goal of the Initiative is to close the gaps between

African-Americans and other racial and ethnic minorities and white Americans by the year 2010.

#2 MANAGED CARE: LESSONS LEARNED FROM STATE MEDICAID PROGRAMS

States are increasingly relying on Medicaid managed care programs to control the costs and standardize the quality of care for people with HIV/AIDS. To date, 35 states and the District of Columbia enroll people with HIV/AIDS in their Medicaid managed care programs. In a new report from the National Academy for State Health Policy, authors Joanne Rawlings-Sekunda and Neva Kaye study six Medicaid managed care programs (Massachusetts, New Jersey, Tennessee, Texas, San Francisco, and Orange County, CA) to identify the major challenges confronting these programs and lessons learned. The chosen sites reflect "a mix of AIDS incidence rates" among rural and urban areas, Rawlings-Sekunda noted. "We picked New Jersey in particular because they have such a high [HIV/AIDS] incidence with women and children, as opposed to the more traditional male population" reflected in the San Francisco site, she said.

ISSUES LIST

The major issues identified by the plans include the cost of HIV/AIDS drugs, updating drug formularies and other treatment protocols, ensuring that both health plans and physicians are equipped to treat persons with HIV/AIDS, treatment adherence and dealing with the rapid development of new HIV/AIDS treatments. Another issue identified by the states which may compromise care for people with HIV/AIDS is the difficulty of rate forecasting for this population. Although HIV/AIDS patients represent a small portion of any state's Medicaid managed care enrollee population, "any plan that becomes the 'preferred' plan of [people with HIV] runs the risk of losing money." For this reason, states use a risk adjustment system to adjust their capitation rates to compensate for more expensive patients. The adjustment factors, however, are based on demographic factors that "predict little of the costs of populations with more complex needs." And although plans could theoretically receive reimbursement rates based on the number of HIV/AIDS enrollees, states often cannot identify these members to ensure the proper rate adjustment. In addition, the authors cite the "difficulty of calculating the impact of new drug protocols on cost" and,

while "[i]n theory, the [drug] protocols decrease the use of inpatient hospitalization and other costs, such as home health," state's have had a hard time quantifying those savings. The authors report that of those plans interviewed, only the New Jersey plan adjusts the capitation rates to reflect both the costly drug therapies and the expected decrease in cost associated with hospital stays. In response to rate-setting issues, the report identifies risk-sharing strategies as a means to "protect plans" from fluctuating costs and "address the issue of selection bias."

PROVIDER EXPERIENCE

Another challenge facing states is ensuring "access to primary care physicians with HIV experience," especially "as treatment standards become more complex." The authors note that members of the Clinical Affairs Committee of the Infectious Disease Society of America have "assert[ed] that primary care physicians '... la[g] 3 years behind AIDS specialists.'" One study found that patients receiving treatment from the most experienced physicians had a 31% lower death rate than patients cared for "by physicians with the least AIDS experience." The study reports a division between those advocating that only physicians with HIV/AIDS experience should treat infected patients, and those contending that all health professionals should educate themselves in HIV/AIDS treatment. The latter group proposes that specialists should be consulted "for complex" treatment "decisions." Rawlings-Sekunda said, "Having the primary care physician have AIDS experience means ... better continuity of care" and prevents any issues from "slip[ping] through the cracks."

COORDINATION IS KEY

The authors note that "[o]ne of the promises of managed care is increased coordination" to ensure continuity of care and cost containment. The study investigated managed care plans' case management systems to assess patients' adherence to drug regimens, access to non-medical services and issues surrounding confidentiality. Noting that a significant number of HIV-infected Medicaid patients reported skipping antiretroviral medications, the study proposed that the "most important factor" in maintaining treatment adherence is providing adequate, understandable information about the disease and the consequences of neglecting drug regimens. In addition, it recommended that people with HIV/AIDS, advocates and physicians be included in the process of maintaining up-to-date clinical standards for managed care programs (Morgan, Daily Report, 9/24). Health officials in Augusta, Ga., met Wednesday to discuss the use of HIV reporting in the state. The state will hold a series of meetings on the issue that are expected to conclude on Oct. 8 in Athens, Ga., and a decision on the matter is expected to be ready by summer 1999. Georgia is one of 11 states that does not currently report HIV cases. The state does report AIDS cases, but David Johnson, of the STD/HIV section of the Division of Public Health, said, "AIDS cases tell us what may have occurred 8-10 years ago, not what's occurring recently." Johnson also noted that the lack of HIV reporting could give people the false sense that the HIV epidemic is declining, since AIDS cases and AIDS deaths are falling. Some people voiced concerns that name- or code-based HIV reporting would keep people from getting tested for HIV. There are an estimated 25,000 to 30,000 HIV-infected individuals in Georgia, according to state officials.

#3 NIH: KEUSCH APPOINTED ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR FOR INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH

The National Institutes of Health Monday announced the appointment of Dr. Gerald Keusch to serve jointly as associate director of NIH for International Research and director of the Fogarty International Center (FIC), the NIH component devoted to advancing health through international scientific cooperation. Keusch is an internationally renowned expert on infectious diseases and vaccine research. He has conducted studies in Central America, Asia and Africa, where he directed an NIH-supported International Collaboration on AIDS research project on the epidemiology and natural history of chronic diarrhea and wasting syndrome. "I am delighted that Dr. Keusch will be joining us," NIH Director Dr. Varmus said. "We will gain the benefit of his many years of basic and clinical investigation into the health problems such as HIV, malnutrition and diarrheal diseases that exact such a huge human toll, especially abroad," he added. As associate director for international research, Keusch will be a principal adviser to Varmus and senior NIH staff on international research policies and programs. As director of the FIC, he will oversee the institute's international research and training grants and fellowships with more than 80 nations. Keusch is currently at the Tufts University School of Medicine and New England Medical Center where he established a major research and training program on infectious diseases and international health. He also serves as scientific director of the Health Group at the Harvard Institute for International Development. "I hope to pursue several goals, such as bringing more young scientists into the field of international health and promoting interdisciplinary approaches," Keusch said. "My own studies ... have shown me the importance of closely linking basic and clinical research pursuits in international health." Keusch also said he intends to "create new partnerships among institutions involved in international health to help ensure that

our research efforts translate into public health tools and interventions" (NIH release, 9/22).

THE CLINTON ADMINISTRATION A RECORD OF RESPECT FOR GAY AND LESBIAN AMERICANS

President Clinton will become the first sitting president to speak before a gay and lesbian organization on November 8, 1997. The President will deliver the keynote address to the Human Rights Campaign National Dinner, where he will highlight the diversity that is America's strength and discuss how we must all work together to solve our nation's problems.

Fighting Discrimination

Prohibiting Discrimination against Gays and Lesbians in the Federal Workforce. Under President Clinton, federal agencies implemented non-discrimination policies that include gays and lesbians and he issued an executive order mandating that security clearances no longer be denied based on sexual orientation.

Fighting Discrimination in the Workplace. President Clinton endorsed and is fighting for passage of the Employment Non-Discrimination Act, a bill to outlaw discrimination in hiring, firing and promotions based on sexual orientation, making him the first U.S. President ever to back civil rights legislation for gays and lesbians. The legislation would ban discrimination based on sexual orientation in many workplaces. The President endorsed this legislation in October of 1995.

Fighting Discrimination Against People With AIDS. President Clinton directed the Justice Department and the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission to vigorously prosecute those who discriminate against people with AIDS, leading to actions against health care providers and facilities that violate the Americans with Disabilities Act. More than 800 charges of AIDS-related discrimination have been settled in four years.

Fighting Gay and Lesbian Hate Crimes. President Clinton signed the Hate Crimes Sentencing Enhancement Act, as part of the 1994 Crime Act. The bill covers those victims of hate crimes who have been targeted because of their sexual orientation. The President will also convene the White House Conference on Hate Crimes on November 10, 1997.

Opposed Anti-Gay Ballot Initiatives. President Clinton strongly opposed anti-gay ballot initiatives in Colorado and Oregon. His two nominees to the Supreme Court voted to overturn Colorado's Amendment 2, declaring such initiatives unconstitutional violations of the Equal Protection clause of the Constitution.

Fighting Discrimination Against People with AIDS in the Military. President Clinton successfully fought for the repeal of the Dornan amendment, which would have required the expulsion of all HIV-positive military service members regardless of their ability to do their jobs.

Helping Those Fleeing Persecution Because of Their Sexual Orientation. President Clinton's Administration is the first ever to permit asylum for gays and lesbians facing persecution in other countries.

Banning Insurance Discrimination for Pre-Existing Conditions such as AIDS. Fought for and signed the Kennedy-Kassebaum Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, which bans insurance discrimination against people with pre-existing medical conditions including HIV/AIDS.

Fighting Harassment Based on Sexual Orientation. The Department of Education has issued policy guidance on sexual harassment of students, which includes certain forms of harassment based on sexual orientation.

Welcoming the Contributions to Public Service of All Americans

President Clinton has Appointed the Most Inclusive Administration in History. The President has appointed over 130 openly gay and lesbian appointees, including Virginia Apuzzo as an Assistant to the President for Administration, the first openly gay Assistant to the President, and Director of the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office Bruce Lehman, the first openly gay man to be confirmed by the U.S. Senate. The President has also nominated Jim Hormel to be U.S. Ambassador to Luxembourg -- if confirmed he would be the first-ever gay United States ambassador.

Outreaching to All Communities. President Clinton named the first Presidential Liaison to the gay and lesbian community.

Working to Save Lives and Improve Health Care

In 1996, for the first time in the history of the AIDS epidemic, the number of Americans diagnosed with AIDS declined, falling by 6 percent for Americans over 12 between 1995 and 1996. In addition, HIV/AIDS mortality declined 26 percent between 1995 and 1996, falling from the leading cause of death among 25-44 year olds to the second leading cause of death in that age group. There has been a slowing in the epidemic overall and a sharp decline in the number of AIDS cases in infants and children.[Centers for Disease Control, 7/97]

Helping Those in Need:

Pushing for an AIDS Vaccine. On May 18, 1997, President Clinton challenged the nation to commit itself to the goal of developing an AIDS vaccine within the next ten years. The President also announced a number of initiatives to help fulfill this commitment, including high-level international collaboration, a dedicated research center for AIDS vaccine research at NIH, and outreach to scientists, pharmaceutical companies, and patient advocates to maximize the involvement of both the private and public sector in the development of an AIDS vaccine.

Dramatically Increasing Overall AIDS Funding. The Clinton Administration has responded aggressively to the significant threat posed by HIV/AIDS with increased attention to research, prevention, and treatment. President Clinton increased public health spending for HIV/AIDS programs by over 56 percent, including a 186 percent increase for Ryan White CARE programs and a 40 percent rise for AIDS-related research. The 1998 budget also includes \$634 million for CDC's HIV prevention activities and \$1.5 billion to continue research efforts in HIV infection and AIDS supported by NIH.

Increasing AIDS Drug Assistance. Funding for AIDS drug assistance has increased by 221 percent during the Clinton Administration. This program provides new life-prolonging drugs to people with

HIV and AIDS.

Accelerating AIDS Drug Approvals in Record Time. President Clinton convened the National Task Force on AIDS Drug Development, and removed dozens of bureaucratic obstacles to the effective and decent treatment of people with AIDS. In four years, FDA has approved 16 new AIDS drugs and 3 new diagnostic tests. Included in those approvals are a new class of drugs known as protease inhibitors, which show tremendous promise in the treatment of HIV disease.

Protecting Medicaid: The President fought for and won protection of the fight to preserve the Medicaid guarantee of coverage for the more than 50% of people living with AIDS who rely on Medicaid for health coverage.

Increasing Research. In one of his first acts in office, President Clinton signed the National Institutes of Health Revitalization Act of 1993, placing full responsibility for planning, budgeting, and evaluation of the AIDS research program at NIH in the Office of AIDS Research.

Focusing on Prevention:

Targeting Young People With Warnings of the Dangers of AIDS. Launching the Prevention Marketing Initiative, focusing on the risk to young adults (18-25) with frank public service announcements recommending sexual abstinence and, for those who are sexually active, the correct and consistent use of latex condoms.

Educating the Federal Workforce. Issuing a directive on September 30, 1993, that requires every federal employee to receive comprehensive education on HIV/AIDS.

Focusing National Attention to a National Problem:

An AIDS Office in the White House. Creating a White House Office of National AIDS Policy to bring greater direction and visibility to the war on AIDS. At the same time, the Administration has sharpened the focus of its AIDS programs, establishing a new Office of National AIDS Policy at the White House.

A Presidential Advisory Council. The President created the Presidential Advisory Council on HIV and AIDS to provide him and his Administration with expert outside advice on the ways in which the Federal government should respond to the HIV/AIDS epidemic.

The Administration also Convened the First Ever White House Conference on HIV and AIDS. On December 6, 1995, the President convened the first White House Conference on HIV and AIDS in the history of the epidemic, bringing together more than 300 experts, activists, and citizens from 37 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico for a full day of discussions of key issues.

Released the first National AIDS Strategy. On December 17, 1996, the Clinton Administration released the first National AIDS Strategy, establishing goals for the nation and opportunities for immediate progress.

President Clinton Expected To Sign Bill, Asserts HRC

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Senate voted 96-0 to pass the Higher Education Reauthorization Act. A part of this bill, which was taken from the Campus Right to Know Act, will require campus police to report incidents of hate crimes on the basis of sexual orientation, disability, religion, gender and ethnicity. The bill is an important step in providing students access to information allowing them to choose a school in which they will be safe, according to the Human Rights Campaign.

"This legislation sends the clear message that hate crimes are serious offenses and should not be swept under the carpet. This open policy allows gay and lesbian students to know if they may be at higher risk by attending certain schools. This legislation also allows schools with a high incidence of hate crimes to identify their problems and fix them," said HRC political director Winnie Stachelberg.

The House passed the bill the day before by a voice vote and now it will go to President Clinton who is expected to sign it into law. Before this legislation, existing federal reporting requirements only mandated colleges and universities to report hate crimes that result in murder, rape, or aggravated assault. This was inadequate because the majority of hate crimes on campuses are not this extreme. Most incidents come in the form of assaults, or lesser crimes. Unfortunately, vandalism and intimidation as incidents that campus police must report to the Department of Education were not included in this bill.

In 1990, Congress enacted the Hate Crimes Statistics Act (HCSA) in an effort to measure the extent of the hate crime problem in America. In 1992, Congress enacted the Campus Security Act to require colleges and universities to annually report crime statistics in an effort to measure campus crime and increase security awareness. With the passage of this section of the Higher Education Reauthorization Act, campus police will now also report incidents of hate crimes on the basis of sexual orientation, disability, religion, gender and ethnicity.

"The first step to solving a problem is acknowledging it exists. This bill will provide the necessary tools for college administrators to recognize that their institutions may be incubators for hateful activity," said HRC senior policy advocate Kris Pratt.

The Human Rights Campaign is the largest national lesbian and gay political organization, with members throughout the country. It effectively lobbies Congress, provides campaign support, and educates the public to ensure that lesbian and gay Americans can be open, honest, and safe at home, at work, and in the community.

- Daniel heard no feedback on the June 1998 minutes, so he proceeded to approve them.
- Meeting with the President: December 1st (World AIDS Day) is not a good option due to prior commitments of the Council members.
- The Appropriations letter and the Needle Exchange letter have been sent and the council should be receiving a packet with those enclosures and others soon.

Scott's meeting with Sandy and Todd:

- Todd agreed to produce a memo once every two weeks for the council members keeping them updated on the activities of ONAP. Scott also talked with Todd about individually contacting subcommittee chairs to keep them updated. Subcommittee members expressed that in lieu of a memo, his and Sandy's participation on these Executive Subcommittee conference calls would be a much better use of their time and the Council's time.
- Overall, Scott still did not get a good perception of what initiatives ONAP was actually moving or being pushed through
- There was a general consensus of the subcommittee on the importance of either Sandy or Todd to participate in the Executive Subcommittee conference calls. The council members feel uninformed and would like consistent updates to be able to take back information to the other subcommittees as well as their communities.

"State of Emergency:"

- All subcommittee members feel as though work is being done but they are not being included or informed. Once again, they expressed a need for information on important topics such as the "State of Emergency" for their respective subcommittee's and communities.
- Briefing of the Council on the State of Emergency:
Given recent events, Alexander and Debra will draft "talking/issue points" on the issue to better inform the Council and others about the Council's position and focus.

Congressional Black Caucus:

- Debra discussed Shalala's statement about the epidemic in the African-American and Latino populations and said that she stopped short of declaring a "State of Emergency."
- Subsequent discussion revolved around Sandy's position on the "State of Emergency" and ONAP's position about supporting or not supporting a call for a "State of Emergency."

Research Subcommittee:

- The members of the Research Subcommittee informed the Executive members of the recent series of conference calls regarding microbicide research.

Prisons Subcommittee:

- Jeremy expressed great interest and hope that Sandy/Todd could shed some light on the status of the national meeting on prisons, etc., but was disappointed that he would have to still wait.

November 16-19 Meeting:

- Daniel suggested the Executive Subcommittee hold a private meeting during lunch to discuss important issues away from the public forum. Daniel will extend the lunch period for this to happen.

November 11th Executive Subcommittee Conference Call:

- Call will be longer than one hour in order to discuss a rundown of issues for the November meeting. The Administration shares the Congress's commitment to reducing the incidence and prevalence of substance abuse, especially among our Nation's youth, and supports Senate passage of H.R. 4550, with the following amendments:

Expand the list of authorized activities in the National Youth Anti-Drug Media Campaign H.R. 4550, as passed by the House, contains a limited number of authorized activities that may be undertaken with funds authorized for the National Youth Anti-Drug Media Campaign, a key element of the Administration's efforts to reverse recent increases in drug use by youth. The limited activities authorized by the bill will restrict the ability of the media campaign to reach new and emerging media outlets, constrain important private sector partnerships and sponsorships, and prevent other initiatives that are integral to the media campaign. The Administration urges the Senate to adopt the language proposed in Director McCaffrey's September 30, 1998, letter to Senator Hatch and other Members of Congress.

H.R. 4550 mandates an equal match to the media campaign by non-Federal funds or in-kind contributions. The Administration believes, as Director McCaffrey stated in his letter to Senator Hatch, that ONDCP should have greater discretion to determine whether non-Federal contributions constitute an appropriate match to appropriated funds.

Eliminate the provision consolidating existing Drug Information Clearinghouses within ONDCP. The bill directs the establishment within ONDCP of a drug information clearinghouse that would consolidate and assume the drug information clearinghouse roles currently performed by Federal agencies. These clearinghouse efforts are successful, and no restructuring of these roles should be undertaken without a comprehensive review of their operations.

Modify the Drug-Free Schools Quality Assurance Program. H.R. 4550 would require States to establish standards for drug prevention programs in public schools but would neither authorize new funds nor condition the receipt of current program funds on the creation of these standards. To avoid possible Constitutional objections, this provision should be revised to authorize and encourage, rather than require, State officials to establish such standards. Congress generally may not direct States to implement Federal programs. The proposed program also ignores the comprehensive statement issued by the Department of Education providing guidance to States and local communities in using Federal funds to ensure

that schools are safe and drug-free.

Delete the provisions expediting the approval process for anti-addiction medications. These provisions are unnecessary and counter to procedures that the Drug Enforcement Administration; Food and Drug Administration, and the National Institute on Drug Abuse have implemented to facilitate the development of anti-addiction medication in the safest manner possible.

Good Morning! Thank you for that warm introduction. My thanks to _____ for inviting me to join you today. I can't say that I get out here too often, but I appreciate the opportunity to share with you a little of what's going on from Washington (since the national media is a little pre-occupied at the moment).

I was particularly interested in talking with you about how this epidemic is impacting on more rural areas of the country, and to hear your suggestions on how we can do a better job at the national level of helping you do your jobs here in North Dakota. So I will keep my comments brief, and use time at the end for questions and answers. That will give us a chance to talk with each other a little bit.

Let me start by bringing you greetings from The President and Vice President, and to join them in thanking you for all of your hard work. Both of them, and their wives, have demonstrated an extraordinary personal commitment to ending this epidemic. Just this past weekend, for example, I did the Washington AIDS Walk with Mrs. Gore. She did the Walk because she understands how important it is to support those who, like you, are doing the trench work in this epidemic.

Much of the work that you do day in and day out puts you at the forefront of this epidemic. You know better than most how AIDS has become a disease of poverty; how the twin epidemics of drug use and AIDS can fuel each other; how racism, sexism and homophobia continue to fuel this epidemic. And you certainly

understand how much work remains to be done in our efforts to fully meet the needs of those that are living with HIV or AIDS.

It was in Atlanta 14 years ago that I first became involved in AIDS work. I ran an AIDS service organization there for six years, and spent much of that time working on the epidemic in rural Georgia (which is basically everything that's not Atlanta!). So I share with you an understanding of how particularly difficult it is to address HIV and AIDS in areas:

- where people prefer to ignore it as an issue because the numbers of cases are not as high;
- where the stigma for those who are infected is intense;
- where access to competent medical advice is difficult, both because knowledgeable doctors are harder to come by and because they're harder to get to!

I know these issues, and believe that they are probably familiar to

many of you. I also know that the solutions are not easy to come by. But we are making strides.

When the President and Vice President announced my appointment last April, I made several promises to you about my work in Washington. Among those was a commitment to work as hard as I possibly can to improve the level of services provided to those most in need in our society.

I have worked hard to fulfill that promise, with the full and complete support of the President and Vice President. This Administration has made great strides in increasing the level of resources made available to prevent the spread of HIV, care for those living with the disease, and search for new and better

treatments:

- Funding for care and treatment for people living with HIV/AIDS has more than tripled and funding for research has increased by 50%.
- Funding for drug assistance programs has increased by more than 450%
- A new vaccine research center is being built at the National Institutes of Health to focus on the President's goal of finding a vaccine to prevent HIV infection
- The President has vigorously defended the Medicaid program, and is fighting hard to pass legislation on a patient bill of rights
- and funding for the Housing Opportunities for People With AIDS (or HOPWA) Program has gone from \$100 million in 1993 to \$225 million in the President's latest budget.

We are proud of these accomplishments, but we know as well as you that even more must be done.

One area where I think we can do better is prevention. While there was a \$5 million increase requested in the FY 1999

budget, and while prevention funds are up more than 28 percent since President Clinton took office to \$637 Million, this is not enough. We must do more in this area and are looking closely at how we should approach this difficult and too often politicized task.

We also have a great deal of work to do to help the public and our elected officials understand the reality of this epidemic.

No doubt you have had the same reaction as I have to the constant news stories about the declining rate of AIDS cases and deaths. It's that strange mix of hope and fear. Hope that these decreases will continue, that maybe we can manage the symptoms until there is a cure. And fear that the larger story

behind the statistics will never be told.

That is the story of the thousands of women, men and children across this country that have yet to reap the promise of these new treatments. Of the huge disparities in this epidemic along line of race, class, and gender; of the interconnection between the twin epidemics of addiction and AIDS. You know this story. But much of America does not.

They hear about the new treatments and think “cure.” We hear about the new treatments and think about affordability and access.

They hear about dramatic improvements in health. We see the reality of complicated treatment regimens, crippling side effects,

tremendous cost, and wide variations in efficacy.

They see images of people going back to work. We see those that have yet to even try the new treatments, of those who remain sick, of growing waiting lists for essential services like food and housing.

Our job is to ground the optimism in a better sense of the reality of this epidemic. To share the truth about how AIDS continues to wreak havoc in so many without dampening the enthusiasm that energizes our work. We need to help the general public—and particularly our elected officials at all levels of government—to see the epidemic as we see it and to boost our efforts instead of allowing them to dwindle.

We cannot allow all of our progress to breed complacency. Present and future generations are in jeopardy and there is more—much more—that needs to be done. Too many Americans and too many policy makers yearn to believe that the worst is behind us. Yet the sobering truth is that we are actually far closer to the end of the beginning than we are to the beginning of the end.

In big cities, small towns, and rural communities across this country -- the epidemic rages on. Increasingly, it is women, young people, families, and disenfranchised communities of color that are caught in the crossfire. Those coming in for services are now far more likely to be individuals or entire families caught in terrible cycles of despair, poverty, violence, drug use, and homelessness.

Helping these families requires outreach, trust building, cultural sensitivity, and comprehensive support services—which must include housing and transportation to critical services.

Let me give you one example of how this complacency effects your work. As you may know, President Clinton and Secretary Cuomo included a \$21 million increase in funding for the HOPWA program. This had been approved by the appropriations committee and was just about to be ratified by the full House when the money was snatched away for another use. Part of the justification that was used for this was that the decline in AIDS cases and deaths meant that the need for HOPWA had lessened. Let me share with you some of the kinds of policy questions so that you'll have a better sense of what those of us in Washington

are currently considering:

- With the authorization of the Ryan White CARE Act expiring in the next few years, we are talking about how this \$1.4 billion program must adjust to an ever changing health care environment. This is a huge program, and the only one of its kind. We are begin the dialogue about how this program is currently meeting needs, and how it might be improved to reflect the dramatic changes in the epidemic that have occurred since it was originally conceived nearly a decade ago. For example, how can we use Title II funding to better serve more rural states? Can we reduce the bureaucratic burden on states like North Dakota that get smaller amounts of funding?

- HIV surveillance is another hot issue. Right now, we must rely heavily on AIDS statistics to help us understand the growth and depth of the epidemic. Yet with the average length of time between initial infection and the onset of AIDS increasing, we are less and less able to accurately monitor our progress. The Centers for Disease Control is about to propose that all States begin reporting of HIV infections. We believe that this will give us valuable information that can inform our prevention and care planning. However, we are mindful of concerns about confidentiality and stigmatization so the CDC is seeking to balance its need for data with recommendations that promote confidentiality and privacy.

- We are also struggling, as you may have heard, with ways to encourage HIV prevention and care among drug users while at the same time discouraging the use of illegal and harmful drugs. The debate over needle exchange is just a part of the larger issue of how best to respond to the most vulnerable and disenfranchised populations in this country, including the homeless, the immigrants, the mentally ill, and active and recovering drug users.

These are clearly not just academic discussions. How our nations responds, how each state, city, and community across America responds, how you and I respond -- will mean life or death for hundreds of thousands of Americans.

I expect that you've recognized some of these as your own issues, ones with which you and your clients have struggled. Over the next few days, you'll have a chance to talk about them, and hopefully to develop some creative solutions. I urge you to communicate your ideas to our office, the government agencies that are responding to the AIDS epidemic, and to the national associations and groups that represent a louder collective voice for those living with HIV and AIDS.

Now I know that many of us have been in the battle against AIDS for many years. Others have joined along the way, and have helped bring new ideas and new energy to the struggle. We know what it's like in the trenches. We have lost the friends and family members we have loved most in this world to this

disease. And it is because of them, and in their memory and honor, that we continue to do this work.

Yet now is not the time to rest. Together, in the words of Mother Jones, “We must pray for the dead and fight like hell for the living!” So onward with our work.

Working in Washington, I am often reminded of the power of facts in raising public awareness and increasing public accountability. Numbers help to us to quantify the magnitude of what we are dealing with. And in the battle against AIDS -- the numbers are staggering. But if there is one thing I hope we will always remember -- it is that behind these numbers are real lives and shattered dreams.

It will take all of our collective wisdom and expertise to move us productively through this most challenging phase of the epidemic. But no where on earth is there a group of individuals and organizations that has demonstrated a greater ability to rise to the occasion than the AIDS community. Together, we have built more with less than any group I have known by consistently transforming crisis into opportunity.

Unfortunately, while we have made tremendous strides in the struggle to end this epidemic, there is as much work now as there ever was. None of us can rest until there is a cure for those already infected and vaccines for those at risk. And that means everybody!

- Not just for those that have their own health insurance.
- Not just for those that have access to quality medical treatment.
- Not just for those who speak English.
- Not just for citizens of this country.
- Not just for those that live on the coasts.
- And Not just for citizens of wealthier countries around the world.

There can be no rest for any of us until there is a cure that works for everyone and a vaccine that is available to everyone.

Now that's a tall order. Many of us are tired from years of hard

work and struggle against this epidemic. But now is not the time to slow down. You and I are fortunate to be here to fight. We remember the promises we made our friends and family who have been lost to AIDS, and to ourselves, to keep fighting until the end.

I urge each of you, as you go to the workshops and listen to the speakers, to continually ask yourself, “how can I use this information to help me do an even better job than I currently do, and to also ask yourself, who else needs to hear what I am hearing?” I say that because no matter how many of you are in this room today, and there are a lot of you, there are so many others who could not make it here today who could benefit from your collective experience and wisdom. I am also thinking about

what I need to do when I get back to Washington and who needs to hear the case for additional AIDS prevention, services, and research funds.

An Indian philosopher wrote: "Faith is the bird that feels the light of day and sings while the dawn is still dark." Today, paradoxically at the dawn of new AIDS treatments, our faith is challenged as never before -- but together we will meet this challenge and move toward the light of a new day. A day without AIDS.

H.R. 4550 - Drug Demand Reduction Act
(Portman (R) Ohio and 16 cosponsors)

The Administration shares the Congress', commitment to reducing the incidence and prevalence of substance abuse, especially among our Nation's youth, and supports Senate passage of H.R. 4550, with the following amendments:

Expand the list of authorized activities in the National Youth Anti-Drug Media Campaign H.R. 4550, as passed by the House, contains a limited number of authorized activities that may be undertaken with funds authorized for the National Youth Anti-Drug Media Campaign, a key element of the Administration's efforts to reverse recent increases in drug use by youth. The limited activities authorized by the bill will restrict the ability of the media campaign to reach new and emerging media outlets, constrain important private sector partnerships and sponsorships, and prevent other initiatives that are integral to the media campaign. The Administration urges the Senate to adopt the language proposed in Director McCaffrey's September 30, 1998, letter to Senator Hatch and other Members

of Congress.

H.R. 4550 mandates an equal match to the media campaign by non-Federal funds or in-kind contributions. The Administration believes, as Director McCaffrey stated in his letter to Senator Hatch, that ONDCP should have greater discretion to determine whether non-Federal contributions constitute an appropriate match to appropriated funds.

Eliminate the provision consolidating existing Drug Information Clearinghouses within ONDCP. The bill directs the establishment within ONDCP of a drug information clearinghouse that would &consolidate and assume 8 the drug information clearinghouse roles currently performed by Federal agencies. These clearinghouse efforts are successful, and no restructuring of these roles should be undertaken without a comprehensive review of their operations.

Modify the Drug-Free Schools Quality Assurance Program. H.R. 4550 would require States to establish standards for drug prevention programs in public schools but would neither authorize new funds nor condition the receipt of current program funds on the creation of these standards. To avoid possible Constitutional objections, this provision should be revised to authorize and encourage, rather than require, State officials to establish such standards. Congress generally may not direct States to implement Federal programs. The proposed program also ignores the comprehensive statement issued by the Department of Education providing guidance to States and local communities in using Federal funds to ensure that schools are safe and drug-free.

Delete the provisions expediting the approval process for anti-addiction medications. These provisions are unnecessary and counter to procedures that the Drug Enforcement Administration; Food and Drug Administration, and the National Institute on Drug Abuse have implemented to facilitate the development of anti-addiction medication in the safest manner possible.

NAMES-BASED REPORTING: CONGRESSIONAL HEARING HELD ON PROPOSED LEGISLATION

The House Commerce subcommittee on health and environment yesterday held a hearing on the HIV Partner Protection Act, H.R. 4431, sponsored by Reps. Tom Coburn (R-OK) and Gary Ackerman (D-NY), and patterned after New York's recently enacted names-based reporting law. Some of the outstanding issues considered during the hearing were:

- o the necessity of mandating names reporting;
- o how names reporting will improve public health;
- o the advantages and effectiveness of names reporting over a

coded-identifier system;

- o exemptions from civil and criminal penalties for "good faith" errors;
- o how the bill will impact anonymous testing;
- o should insurers be prohibited from taking "adverse actions" against HIV-positive policyholders? and
- o how the change in medical technology and federal law has altered the perspectives of those working in the area of HIV partner notification and counseling.

The legislation expands the Ryan White funding requirement to include "past and present partner" notification. It requires physicians to "confidentially" report "positive test results ... and any other information necessary for carrying out a system of partner notification, as is presently done for diseases such as syphilis," to their state's public health department. Public health workers are required to contact any partners to "offer referral for testing and counseling," and to obtain names of other partners potentially infected with HIV. The bill does not impose criminal or civil penalties for non-compliance, and authorizes \$10 million for state implementation (Subcommittee memorandum, 9/25).

SPONSORS SPEAK

Testifying before the subcommittee, Coburn said he believed that "this legislation is long overdue" and "may be the only bill passed by Congress this year that actually saves lives." He pointed out that new drug developments allow HIV-positive individuals to "lead longer and healthier lives," which has caused "many who initially opposed" partner notification to "reconsider[r]." Coburn noted that partner notification is "standard public health procedure for curtailing the spread of virtually all other sexually transmitted diseases," and stressed that it "is extremely important to disease control because it is the only timely way to alert those in danger of infection," especially women (Coburn statement, 9/29). Ackerman said that the bill's purpose "is not to penalize but to protect the infected and their partners." He added that he "believe[d] that we can take the same sober, pragmatic approach to treating HIV as we do with other diseases without harming anybody's privacy or inviting discrimination" (Ackerman statement, 9/29).

GUIDELINES VS. LEGISLATION

Dr. Helene Gayle, director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Center for HIV, STD and TB Prevention, testified that the CDC has recently released "updated guidance" on HIV partner counseling and referral services (PCRS). The proposed legislation and the updated guidance "share important goals of notifying partners," Gayle noted. However, she asserted that the legislation would deter and "drastically reduce" anonymous testing. "Our goal is to prevent HIV infection by reducing behaviors likely to transmit the virus and assisting individuals at risk or already infected in gaining access to prevention services, medical care and other needed services" as part of a "comprehensive strategy," Gayle said. Anonymous testing "is integral" to that strategy, she said, because people are more likely to be tested earlier, while they are still

asymptomatic. She also noted that trust in the public health system is a key issue for maintaining the viability of a comprehensive anti-HIV effort and expressed concern that such trust might be undermined if potentially infected persons knew that partner notification would be mandatory. She pointed out that because HIV is a "life-long issue" for infected individuals, "PCRS for HIV differs from partner services for other STDs" (Gayle testimony, 9/29). Gayle said that while she did not oppose the bill, she felt that CDC guidelines should be implemented prior to enacting any laws (Daily Report sources, 9/29).

NOT SO FAST

The bill was strongly denounced, however, by AIDS Action as "a bureaucratic scheme that could act as a disincentive to HIV testing at a time when there are as many as 300,000 HIV positive people in America who are unaware of their status." AIDS Action Executive Director Daniel Zingale said, "We don't need lists and HIV police force. We need an effective plan to encourage people at risk for HIV to get tested" (AIDS Action release, 9/29). [Click here](#) for previous coverage of names-based reporting.

I talked with Mary Beth Donahue at some length today about SAMHSA. She's been working to try to improve their responsiveness around HIV issues.

I shared with her our sense that we've got no ax to grind with SAMHSA or with Nelba. We just want to get more drug treatment money, and to make sure we know where the existing money is going. I also told her about the snafu with the agency rep they sent over after Brad.

We agreed that I would reach out to Valerie Mills more, and the Mary Beth would communicate to Nelba that Valerie needs to have the authority and access to make that effective. She also said that they would always be available if we needed more or if problems develop. I told her that I'd be willing to try, but was not sure that Valerie had a lot of capacity.

I told her about your upcoming lunch meeting with Nelba and that there's a fair amount of paranoia at SAMHSA about it. Hopefully, that will be an opportunity for you to engage Nelba as someone who can help her and not as someone she should see as a threat.

I also told Mary Beth that I thought the McAffrey didn't really care for Nelba a lot, but used her as he needed (men, isn't it always the case.).

Thanks very much for your interest in La Clinica del Pueblo and for your help in getting information about the blessing of the its new building to Mrs. Gore. Given the very short notice, I realize that it is unlikely that Mrs. Gore will be able to attend this event. Nevertheless, her presence would give great visibility and recognition to a free health clinic which struggles daily to meet the primary care needs of the terribly under served Latino community.

La Clinica now operates out of cramped quarters in an old school building with little heat in the winter and no air conditioning in the summer. Three

long
flights of stairs provide the only access, making it very difficult for the
sick and disabled to reach the care they need.

Recently, La Clinica purchased an old, abandoned building which they will
shortly begin renovating. On Tuesday, October 13th, from 3:00 - 5:00 in
the
afternoon, a blessing ceremony will take place at the new building.
Various
political and community leaders, such as Congresswoman Eleanor Holmes
Norton,
in addition to many of La Clinica's patients, will attend.

While La Clinica is a primary care clinic providing a full range of
services
to the low income Latino community, one of its biggest programs is focused
on
the prevention of HIV/AIDS and care for those who are infected. In
addition
to providing quality care, it actively works with AIDS patients to ensure
that
their housing and other needs are met. A little known fact is that many
of
Whitman Walker's Latino AIDS cases are routinely referred to La Clinica for
care.
