Dear Mr. President:

The purpose of this letter is to offer the American people's continued support for your crusade against HIV and AIDS. The international dimensions of this disease are devastating, particularly for our youth. Around the world, more than 1 million children are living with HIV and AIDS. Twelve hundred children die of AIDS each day, even as 1,600 more become infected with HIV. Your call to action is important not only for the future of South Africa, but also for inspiring action by the rest of the world.

Over the last fifteen years, our nation has been at the forefront of the effort to stop the spread of this devastating disease, to design strategies that help to stop the spread of this deadly virus, and to remind all citizens that together we must fight AIDS. Thanks to increased

attention and resources we have made great strides, but there is still much more to do.

We have mounted an aggressive initiative to develop a vaccine for HIV in cooperation with other nations. This work is critically important to our goal of bringing an end to the AIDS epidemic once and for all both here and across the globe.

During the July, 1997 meeting of the U.S.-South Africa BiNational Commission, we announced the creation of a \$10 million USAID-funded project to assist the South African government in combating AIDS/HIV. I recently asked my National AIDS Policy Coordinator Sandra Thurman to travel to South Africa at your convenience to discuss ways in which the United States can further support your country's anti-AIDS efforts. No nation can afford the toll HIV and AIDS continue to take on our societies. We must mount a global education campaign to first slow and then halt the spread of this terrible epidemic.

As you address the South African nation today, I am confident that you will generate the broad societal support that has been so essential to our own successes. Educators and activists, members of religious and civic groups, business and labor organizations, and tens of thousands of other men and women of goodwill have all been a part of the national response to this disease and have extended a helping hand to those living with HIV and AIDS.

You have our continued commitment to work in solidarity with you and the people of South Africa to care for those that are living with HIV and AIDS, to promote prevention and education programs that can stop the spread of this disease, and to work together toward finding both a cure and a vaccine. We join you in mourning the lives of so many who have already been lost, and in doing all that we can to protect those who remain at risk.

As many of you know, the President's budget proposal to cut Medicaid administrative funds by \$1.9 billion was resurrected by House Republicans in the context of the emergency supplemental appropriations bill. Now we understand from Bridgett Taylor that these cuts (\$1.7 billion) are being considered in the context of the omnibus appropriations package currently being negotiated. This will be a tough one to fight since the President already put it on the table but we encourage you to call the White House and tell them that there is no need for Medicaid cuts in a time of budget surplus.

Huge Gains, and Huge Worries, on AIDS

The medical accomplishment has been astonishing. Not many years ago infection with the virus that causes AIDS was considered a death sentence.

Virtually everyone infected, except for rare individuals with a peculiar natural resistance, would inexorably develop symptoms, become progressively sicker, and die. It might take 10 years or more for the virus to destroy the body's immune system, leaving it vulnerable to attack by a host of opportunistic infections, but the end was invariably the same -- premature death for individuals who were mostly in the prime of life.

Then came the advent of drugs to attack the virus itself and to treat the pneumonias and other infections that typically administer the coup de grace. Most important was the development in recent years of powerful new cocktails of drugs that provided the most effective treatment yet for neutralizing the virus. Suddenly people who thought they were doomed had a new hold on life. The number of deaths from AIDS in the United States fell by 29 percent in 1996 and by a spectacular 47 percent last year, the largest single-year decline ever recorded for any major disease.

That is cause for jubilation, but not for a declaration of victory. As many as 900,000 Americans remain infected with the AIDS virus, and the rate of new infections is holding steady in the United States at some 40,000 a year. Now that infected individuals are living longer and healthier lives, there is an increasing danger that they will pass the virus on to others.

Worse, the virus is spreading at a frightening rate in Africa and other parts of the developing world, where large parts of the population are infected and there is neither money nor medical capacity to provide lifesaving drugs. The world will not be rid of this scourge until breakthroughs in vaccines or prevention strategies can stop the spread of infection before any curative treatment is needed.

Let me also take a moment here to offer my prayers and my condolences to the family of Matthew Shepard, as well as to the community of Laramie, Wyoming and the university. While it wouldn't be proper for me to comment on the specifics of this case I do want to say again, crimes of hate and crimes of violence cannot be tolerated in our country. In our shock and grief one thing must remain clear, hate and prejudice are not American values. The public outrage in Laramie and all across America

today echoes what we heard at the White House Conference on Hate Crimes last year -- there is something we can do about this, Congress needs to pass our tough Hate Crimes Legislation. It can do so even before it adjourns and it should do so.

I hope that in the grief of this moment for Matthew Shepard's family, and in the shared outrage across America, American's will once again search their hearts and do what they can to reduce their own fear and anxiety and anger at people who are different. And I hope that Congress will pass the Hate Crimes Legislation.

Tipper and I were saddened to hear of the tragic death of Matthew Shepard.

These senseless acts of hate and violence have no place in our communities or our nation, and we join the American people today in expressing our sense of outrage.

As we work to make sure justice is done, our thoughts and prayers go out to the family and friends of Matthew Shepard at this difficult time.

THE CLINTON-GORE ADMINISTRATION

A RECORD OF RESPECT FOR GAY AND LESBIAN AMERICANS

Fighting Discrimination

Prohibiting Discrimination Against Gays and Lesbians in the Federal Workforce. On May 28, 1998, President Clinton issued an Executive Order prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation in the Federal civilian workforce. This makes the Federal Government the largest employer in the world (1.8 million civilian employees) with a non-discrimination policy covering sexual orientation. And the President, working with a coalition in the House of Representatives, successfully defeated an attempt to overturn this policy. In addition to this executive action, the President also issued an Executive Order mandating that security clearances no longer be denied based on sexual orientation.

Fighting Discrimination in the Workplace. President Clinton endorsed and is fighting for passage of the Employment Non-Discrimination Act, a bill outlawing discrimination in hiring, firing and promotions based on sexual orientation, making him the first U.S. President ever to back civil rights legislation for gays and lesbians. The legislation would ban discrimination based on sexual orientation in the workplace, extending basic employment discrimination protections to gay and lesbian Americans. The President endorsed this legislation in October of 1995.

Fighting Discrimination Against People With AIDS. President Clinton directed the Justice Department and the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission to vigorously prosecute those who discriminate against people with AIDS, leading to actions against health care providers and facilities that violate the Americans with Disabilities Act. [CHECKING More than 800 charges of AIDS-related discrimination have been settled in four years.]

Fighting Gay and Lesbian Hate Crimes. As part of the 1994 Crime Act, President Clinton signed the Hate Crimes Sentencing Enhancement Act, providing for longer sentences where the offense is determined to be a hate crime. Last year, the President hosted the historic White House Conference on Hate Crimes and announced his sponsorship of the Hate Crimes Prevention Act. This crucial legislation would strengthen and expand the ability of the Justice Department to prosecute hate crimes by removing needless jurisdictional requirements for existing crimes and by giving Federal prosecutors the power to prosecute hate crimes committed because of the victim's sexual orientation, gender or disability. The President and Vice President continue to push Congress to pass this important legislation.

Opposed Anti-Gay Ballot Initiatives. President Clinton strongly opposed anti-gay ballot initiatives in Colorado and Oregon. His two nominees to the Supreme Court voted to overturn Colorado's Amendment 2, declaring such initiatives unconstitutional violations of the Equal Protection clause of the Constitution.

Fighting Discrimination Against People with AIDS in the Military. President Clinton successfully fought for the repeal of the Dornan amendment, which would have required the expulsion of all HIV-positive military service members regardless of their ability to do their jobs.

Helping Those Fleeing Persecution Because of Their Sexual Orientation. President Clinton's Administration is the first ever to permit asylum for gays and lesbians facing persecution in other countries.

Banning Insurance Discrimination. Fought for and signed the Kennedy-Kassebaum Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, which bans insurance discrimination against people with pre-existing medical conditions including HIV/AIDS. In addition, President Clinton issued a directive that ensures that all providers of Federal health insurance abide by non-discrimination rules including sexual orientation.

Fighting Harassment Based on Sexual Orientation. The Department of Education has issued policy guidance on sexual harassment of students, which includes certain forms of harassment based on sexual orientation.

Welcoming the Contributions to Service of All Americans

President Clinton has Appointed the Most Inclusive Administration in History. President Clinton is the first President to appoint an openly gay person to an Administration post. The President has appointed over 130 openly gay and lesbian appointees, including Virginia Apuzzo as an Assistant to the President for Administration, the first openly gay Assistant to the President; Director of the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office Bruce Lehman, the first openly gay man to be confirmed by the U.S. Senate; and Fred Hochberg, Deputy Administrator of the Small Business Administration. The President has also nominated, and continues to fight for, Jim Hormel to be U.S. Ambassador to Luxembourg -- if confirmed he would be the first-ever gay United States ambassador.

Reaching Out to All Communities. This Administration is committed to a policy of inclusion. President Clinton named the first Presidential Liaison to the gay and lesbian community and become the first sitting president to speak before a gay and lesbian organization on November 8, 1997, when he deliver the keynote address to the Human Rights Campaign National Dinner. In September 1997, the Vice President addressed a reception of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force, the first Vice President to speak at a gay rights event.

Working to Save Lives and Improve Health Care

In 1996, for the first time in the history of the AIDS epidemic, the number of Americans diagnosed with AIDS declined, falling by 6 percent for Americans over 12 between 1995 and 1996. In addition, HIV/AIDS mortality declined 23 percent between 1995 and 1996, falling from the leading cause of death among 25-44 year olds to the second leading cause of death in that age

group. There has been a decline in the number of AIDS cases overall and a sharp decline in new AIDS cases in infants and children.

Helping Those in Need:

Pushing for an AIDS Vaccine. On May 18, 1997, President Clinton challenged the nation to commit itself to the goal of developing an AIDS vaccine within the next ten years. The President also announced a number of initiatives to help fulfill this commitment, including high-level international collaboration, a dedicated research center for vaccine research at NIH, and outreach to scientists, pharmaceutical companies and patient advocates to maximize the involvement of both the private and public sector in the development of an AIDS vaccine.

Dramatically Increasing Overall AIDS Funding. The Clinton Administration has responded aggressively to the significant threat posed by HIV/AIDS with increased attention to research, prevention, and treatment. President Clinton increased public health spending for HIV/AIDS programs by over 56 percent, funds for the Ryan White CARE programs have tripled and support for AIDS-related research has increased by 50 percent [YES?].

Increasing AIDS Drug Assistance. Funding for AIDS drug assistance has increased by 450 percent during the Clinton Administration. This program provides new life-prolonging drugs to people with HIV and AIDS.

Accelerating AIDS Drug Approvals in Record Time. President Clinton convened the National Task Force on AIDS Drug Development, and removed dozens of bureaucratic obstacles to the effective and decent treatment of people with AIDS. In four years, FDA has approved 16 new AIDS drugs including protease inhibitors and 3 new diagnostic tests.

Protecting Medicaid. The President fought for and won the preservation of the Medicaid guarantee of coverage for the more than 50 percent of people living with AIDS who rely on Medicaid for health coverage.

Increasing Research. In one of his first acts in office, President Clinton signed the National Institutes of Health Revitalization Act of 1993, placing full responsibility for planning, budgeting and evaluation of the AIDS research program at NIH in the Office of AIDS Research.

Focusing on Prevention:

Targeting Young People With Warnings of the Dangers of AIDS. The Clinton Administration launched the Prevention Marketing Initiative, focusing on the risk to young adults (18-25) with frank public service announcements recommending sexual abstinence and, for those who are sexually active, the correct and consistent use of latex condoms.

Educating the Federal Workforce. The Administration issued a directive on September 30,

1993, that requires every Federal employee to receive comprehensive education on HIV/AIDS.

Focusing National Attention to a National Problem:

An AIDS Office in the White House. President Clinton created a White House Office of National AIDS Policy to bring greater direction and visibility to the war on AIDS. At the same time, the Administration has sharpened the focus of its AIDS programs.

A Presidential Advisory Council. The President created the Presidential Advisory Council on HIV and AIDS to provide him and his Administration with expert outside advice on the ways in which the Federal government should respond to the HIV/AIDS epidemic.

The Administration also Convened the First Ever White House Conference on HIV and AIDS. On December 6, 1995, the President convened the first White House Conference on HIV and AIDS in the history of the epidemic, bringing together more than 300 experts, activists and citizens from 37 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico for a full day of discussions of key issues.

Released the first National AIDS Strategy. On December 17, 1996, the Clinton Administration released the first National AIDS Strategy, establishing goals for the nation and opportunities for immediate progress.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

I was deeply grieved by the act of violence perpetrated against Matthew Shepard of Wyoming.

The Justice Department has assured me that local law enforcement officials are proceeding diligently to bring those responsible to justice. And I am determined that we will do everything we can and offer whatever assistance is appropriate.

Hillary and I ask that your thoughts and your prayers be with Mr. Shepard and his family, and with the people of Laramie, Wyoming. In the face of this terrible act of violence, they are joining together to demonstrate that an act of evil like this is not what our country is all about. In fact it strikes at the very heart of what it means to be an American and at the values that define us as a Nation. We must all reaffirm that we will not tolerate this.

Just this year there have been a number of recent tragedies across our country that involve hate crimes. The vicious murder of James Byrd last June in Jasper, Texas and the assault this week on Mr. Shepard are only among the most horrifying examples.

Almost one year ago I proposed that Congress enact the Hate Crimes Prevention Act. Our Federal laws already punish some crimes committed against people on the basis of race or religion or national origin, but we should do more. This crucial legislation would strengthen and expand the ability of the Justice Department to prosecute hate crimes by removing needless jurisdictional requirements for existing crimes and by giving Federal prosecutors the power to prosecute hate crimes committed because of the victim's sexual orientation, gender, or disability. All Americans deserve protection from hate.

There is nothing more important to the future of this country than our standing together against intolerance, prejudice, and violent bigotry. It is not too late for Congress to take action before they adjourn and pass The Hate Crimes Prevention Act. By doing so they will help make all Americans more safe and secure.

As for the requested meeting with the Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS, our first requested date coincided with the previously scheduled meeting of the Council. Since there was some doubt as to whether the President would utilize the foreign travel for which his time was reserved, we wanted to be there in waiting. If the President is unable to do the November dates, then we will have to bring the Council back to town for the meeting. One suggestion, included in the scheduling request, was to have the meeting on or near World AIDS Day (December 1, 1998) or in mid-December (options 2 and 3).

Christa tells me that if we don't articulate a reason for having the meeting sooner rather than later, it will continue to get bumped. The President should meet with the Advisory Council this year because: (1) a commitment was made by the COS to have that meeting occur; (2) the POTUS has not met with the Council for any extended period of time since 1995; and (3) the Administration needs to bolster the community's appreciation of its prioritization of HIV/AIDS--badly damaged with the needle exchange decision. Also, as you have mentioned, a pending announcement by the President of a new HIV/AIDS initiative (responding to the CBC) will generate a lot of press--setting the date for the meeting with the Council will increase the likelihood that it's response to the CBC announcement will be positive.

#1 MEDICARE HMOS: AREA WITHDRAWALS JEOPARDIZE AIDS PATIENTS' DRUGS

AIDS patients in the nation's capital may lose insurance coverage for "potentially life-sustaining medications" as a result of several HMOs "that recently announced plans to stop serving area Medicare beneficiaries on Jan. 1," Saturday's Washington Post reported. The Post described the plight of several DC-area AIDS patients, noting that some "are so desperate that they are considering moving to other areas where coverage still is available" or "contemplating committing insurance fraud." Although all of the Medicare HMO patients will be eligible for traditional fee-for-service plans, these plans typically do not provide as much coverage for prescription drugs. The health plans remaining in the Washington area's Medicare HMO market, including Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Maryland, Kaiser Permanente and United HealthCare, said "they will only cover the medications up to a \$1,000 annual cap on all prescription drugs combined." A Health Care Financing Administration spokesperson said, "If there's no plan that offers the prescription drugs, then those people are left out in the cold." One patient, facing a "searing dilemma," concluded, "If you make too much money to qualify for assistance programs but not enough to afford the drugs, you have two choices: fraud or death" (Hilzenrath, Washington Post, 10/10).

I just spoke with DoJ's leg person handling this bill, and told her that
we were leaning to recommending that the Administration's position move
from "strongly oppose" to silent. Here is why we support that position:

The Policy

Requiring Testing

We do not want to support mandatory testing. We have always maintained
that voluntary counseling and testing is adequate. That remains our
position on a number of bills, including Rep. Coburn's. If we were to
adopt a different stance for prisoners, it opens us up to charges of
hypocrisy and deflates our argument on non-prisoners. Moreover, it could
potentially be infused with racial connotations since prisoners are
predominantly black men. Given the heat that the CDC, NAACP and others
are putting on us for the racial disparities in the epidemic, it might be
prudent to avoid a conflict here.

I understand that Rep. Waters has participated in amending this bill, so it is clearly on her radar screen. Her staff says that she's in a position of not actively opposing the bill. Rep. Pelosi's staff says the same.

That being said, we now test everyone on the way out of jail so the bill just moves up the inevitable. From a scientific perspective, that is better for prisoners since early detection and treatment of HIV is recommended. From a BoP policy perspective, the testing done on the way out is "voluntary" except that it's required as part of the package of things that must be done to be released. So BoP argues that they don't do mandatory or "forced" testing, but that's semantics.

The bill requires counseling, support, and care for all those who test HIV-positive. We think that's a good mandate, even if it may be redundant (BoP's principal objection to the bill, as I understand it). I think this works more to the advantage of correction officers, staff, and visitors than prisoners because the policy now is that prisoners get care if they're HIV-positive. (The President's Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS has been adamant that they believe that there is a difference between policy and practice at some Federal institutions, but we cannot confirm that and BoP says it's not true.)

The bill also provides that the Attorney General develop standards of care and prevention for States, which we think is good. State, county and local jails ought to be the object of far greater attention since the prevalence of HIV there is so much higher than Federal institutions. I think BoP and DoJ like this part of the bill.

Testing After Potential Exposure

HR2070 also requires testing, or re-testing, after an exposure by a prisoner to an officer, staff person, or visitor. This is hard to argue, particularly because there are now protocols for post-exposure prophylaxis that may be efficacious (not a lot of data yet). We like that the determination of whether the exposure risk was significant lies with DoJ/BoP and should therefore be based on scientific standards and not subjective fears ("he spit on me, I want him tested"). Universal precautions should minimize instances of exposure, and BoP encourages their implementation, but exposures are certainly possible.

The Unions

I've spoken with the leg. director for AFSCME, which represents some (100,000) of the correctional officers and have a call into SEIU, which represents others. AFSCME says this is a very big deal for the correctional officers, and they feel that the bill that passed is a significant improvement over the original draft that we strongly opposed. They are less concerned about our active support than they are about our active opposition--they'd be content if we moved from "strongly oppose" to silent.

This also makes BoP's objection that officer's are going to be put at risk during mandatory testing because they might have to hold prisoners down to take their blood. First of all, I am not convinced this is a significant issue for Federal prisoners. Second, if the officers' unions are

supporting the bill, why are we objecting on their behalf?

Recommendation

We recommend that the Administration:

remove its strong opposition to the bill

not actively oppose or support the bill

indicate to Senator Hatch and others that we'll acquiesce to a Senate

version that parallels that which passed the House, and that the

Administration would strongly oppose a version that reverts to the

original version of HR2070.

#3 SOUTH AFRICA: LEADER PLEDGES 'PARTNERSHIP AGAINST AIDS'

Speaking for South African President Nelson Mandela Friday, Deputy President Thabo Mbeki delivered a speech urging citizens to join him in a "Partnership Against AIDS" and spread the message that people "can save themselves and save the nation, by changing the way we live and how we love." He said, "For too long, we have closed our eyes as a nation, hoping the truth was not so real. ... Every single day a further 1,500 people in South Africa get infected. To date, more than 3 million people have been infected." He said, "You have the right to live your life the way you want to. But I appeal to the young people, who represent our country's future, to abstain from sex for as long as possible. If you decide to engage in sex, use a condom. In the same way, I appeal to both men and women to be faithful to each other, but otherwise to use condoms." In addition to urging everyone to change their behavior and "use every opportunity openly to discuss the issue of AIDS," Mbeki urged citizens to care for those with HIV/AIDS and refrain from subjecting them to "discrimination of any kind." He also implored the crowd to "pool our resources and to commit our brain power! There is still no cure for HIV and AIDS. Nothing can prevent infection except our own behavior," he said (ANC Daily News Briefing, 10/10). The AP/Arkansas Democrat-Gazette reports that the speech "was part of a major information campaign that began Friday. Flags flew at half-staff to remember the estimated 360,000 people who have died of the disease" in South Africa (10/10). In a statement released Friday, National Party health spokesperson Dr.

Kobus Gous said, "We have on our hands an epidemic disease which has the potential to disrupt and ruin this country socially, economically and health-wise. Aids needs to be viewed not only as a health issue, but also as an issue that would have an effect on every sphere of South African society" ANC Daily News Briefing, 10/9).

VERTICAL TRANSMISSION

Also on Friday, Health Minister Nkosazana Zuma announced that funding for programs that treat HIV-positive pregnant women with AZT will be cut and said that "the \$14 million appropriated for the government's new campaign to raise AIDS awareness would be better spent on public education." The move will close five pilot programs that were to begin dispensing AZT to pregnant women. The AP/Arizona Daily Star reports that doctors "blasted" the decision and "complained" it will close five pilot projects (10/12). The Sunday Times reports that AZT "can cut the transmission rate of HIV to babies by half." Approximately "200 babies a day" are born with HIV in the country. In her announcement, made at Mbeki's launch of the AIDS awareness campaign, Zuma said AZT "is not cost-effective because we don't have the money. What we are focusing on is trying to get the prevention message across, because ... what will work is when people take precautions and babies are saved because men and women are using condoms." She said that too many women needed to be treated with AZT "to save a relatively small number of babies." Glenda Gray, director of the Perinatal HIV Research Unit at Chris Hani Baragwanath Hospital, said, "Here's a real way we can prevent transmission and the government is not intervening. They prefer incoherent campaigns instead of things that will really turn the tide against AIDS." She added, "Whatever money you put in, you get out, in terms of the costs of treating HIV-positive babies" (Paton, Sunday Times, 10/11).

(SC) Blunt AIDS Ads Tackle Unsafe Sex; S.F. ad campaign promotes post-exposure treatment

With a pair of ads guaranteed not to play in Peoria, San Francisco has launched a publicity campaign to encourage gay men to take emergency anti-viral pills if they experience an incident of unsafe sex.

In bars, dance clubs and sex clubs that cater to gay men, a poster depicts a broken condom and the words "Oh S--!" in big, boldface type.

The smaller print in the ads directs readers to San Francisco's Post-Exposure Prevention program -- a one-year-old experiment that provides a month's worth of drugs that may stave off infection by HIV, the virus that causes AIDS.

Tom Coates, director of the University of California at San Francisco AIDS Research Institute, said the ads were designed with heavy input from market researchers and focus groups. "It's what people experience. They can relate to it," he said.

Coates said the "Oh S--!" ads will not be seen by people unless they frequent gay bars and clubs. "It will only be used in some very specific locations, where, yes, it is

designed to attract attention."

Because of the controversial nature of the advertising, the city-sponsored ads, costing \$40,000 over the three months of the campaign, are being paid for by private funds.

Tamer spots with a similar message are destined for Municipal Railway buses, bus shelters, billboards and newspapers. They feature a pair of gay men in bed with the headline: "We know what to do." Like its saucier counterpart, the ad copy stresses that the therapy is only effective if started within 72 hours of an incident of unsafe sex.

AIDS prevention advocates said the ad campaign is a good idea.

"We have a long history in this city of using explicit approaches to get men's attention," said Rene Durazzo, program director for the San Francisco AIDS Foundation. "If this gets men into the post-exposure program, then the ads are worth it."

All of the ads were designed with gay men of color in mind -- a group deemed highly vulnerable to the AIDS virus yet not reached by programs targeting San Francisco's largely white gay population. The bus advertisements feature a Latino and an African American.

"The post-exposure program is underutilized in communities of color and in the low-income, indigent population," Durazzo said.

Of the 202 participants in the program thus far, 73 percent are white. Only 22 are Latino; only 11 are black.

Dr. James Kahn, a UC San Francisco professor and medical director of the post-exposure program, said it is important to tailor a message to the intended audience. "The worst thing that can happen is to mount an educational campaign and have no one pay attention to it."

So far, none of those enrolled in the program who have taken the anti-viral drugs has turned up infected with the virus, although Kahn stresses that it is too early to tell if

the program works.

But there is evidence that a significant portion of the sex partners of those in the program were, in fact, infected with the virus. Among 40 such partners interviewed, 32 were HIV-positive, and all of them were already aware that they were infected.

However, the purpose of the experiment is not only to find out whether the drug regime works, but also whether the availability of emergency anti-viral pills will encourage riskier sex. It is too early to determine the answer to the second part of the experiment as well, researchers said.

"The goal here is to look at the feasibility of post-exposure prevention," Coates said. "We're satisfied to date. The people coming in are experiencing a significant exposure to HIV, and they are not coming into it as a way of maintaining a high-risk lifestyle."

The idea for post-exposure prevention derives from a program developed at San Francisco General Hospital to treat medical personnel after accidental needle sticks during treatment of infected patients. The idea is to give a similar course of AIDS drugs to those who engage in unsafe sex through a momentary lapse in judgment or because of an accident such as a condom tear.

In fact, condom breakage is an alarmingly frequent occurrence in gay sex -- estimates range from 5 to 15 percent.

Response to Omnibus Provisions
October 15, 1998

Q: How do you respond to the decision to restrict needle exchange programs in DC?

A: We are working very hard to slow down and ultimately stop this terrible epidemic, and it pains me to think that countless lives will be lost because of childish gamesmanship. The Republican leadership has once again chosen shameless political grandstanding at the expense of sound public health policy. Now we're going to continue to push for it, but so far they've simply refused to budge on the issue.

Q: Why did the Administration give in on this issue? Didn't you say that you'd veto the bill if this restriction remained?

A: We fought the additional restrictions on needle exchange right up until the end, and the Republican leadership would simply not budge on it. We had said that we would strongly consider a veto if the restrictions remained in the DC appropriations bill; however, since it is now part of a much larger omnibus bill, there are other priorities that must be considered.

Q: What about additional AIDS funding?

A: I believe that we did quite well in getting increased funding for AIDS services and prevention. We also worked closely with the Congressional Black Caucus to obtain separate increases to address the extremely serious growth of the epidemic in the African-American and other minority communities. We have to do a little more work to identify exactly what the increases were and what kind of report language was included, so I can't give you specifics yet on the numbers.

We had also been working vigorously on the Jeffords-Kennedy "Work Incentive" Disability Bill. This would have been extremely helpful to people with disabilities, including people living with AIDS, many of whom are trying to get back into the workforce without jeopardizing their basic benefits. It looks like the Republican leadership, which has been talking a good game about supporting the disabled, is refusing to allow the bill to go through.

We're not giving up, though, and will continue to fight for it to be included as part of the omnibus bill, or to add it to something else to get it passed this year.

B. We think his 2,4,5,10, and 13 are 'done'.

C. Some of his other options have merit and we think could lead to additional activities, but we need to dig more (or perhaps, in the case of FERC-related ones, Shelley has the answers.) These are 7,9,27,28,30,32,36,44,45,46. If you want to set priorities among these that would be great; perhaps we should wait for word from the Task Force before you invest time though.

As is so often the case, identifiable savings exist everywhere Amory says, but the difficulty is figuring out how to get at them in a sensible public policy way.....! Rosina

Fifth, there would need to be an extensive training outreach program coupled to this to ensure that these software design tools were widely adopted and properly used. This would be a useful set of activities to include in the DOE motor Challenge budget for RD&D.

Building Design Competitions.

The energy and environmental performance of residential and commercial buildings is notoriously difficult to improve due to the numerous disconnects between architects, contractors, owners, and renters.

Competitive grants for building energy designs could help bridge these disconnects and tap the 50 percent and greater energy savings possible in new residential and commercial buildings, reducing emissions from new construction at costs as low as \$0.30/ton of carbon. Given that the buildings sector accounts for one-third of U.S. carbon emissions, this is a substantial opportunity.

Barriers to improving energy efficiency in buildings include the following. Incentives for improving efficiency are limited. Architects are typically paid a negotiated amount based largely on the cost/size of the building, not on its performance; contractors are paid for construction; and owners are paid per square foot. The renter who pays the energy bills does not want to replace inefficient equipment for the owner. Homeowners rarely know the energy performance or have the opportunity to influence it during the design process.

Policy mechanisms do not effectively overcome these disconnects. Higher energy costs have relatively little impact due to the disconnects noted above. Codes and standards are useful for establishing minimum performance levels, but they work better for manufactured equipment than building shells and also tend to freeze into place, providing little continuing push to improve performance. Tax incentives can make higher efficiency equipment more attractive to the capital cost sensitive builder/owner but leverage is limited.

Opportunities are large. With proper design, energy consumption in buildings can be cost-effectively reduced by 50 percent and more. These savings are largely locked in by the design of the building and continue for its 50-80 year lifetime.

Competitive grants for building energy designs would provide a high leverage means of improving performance. Architects would compete to design the most efficient buildings. Note that the National Association of Home Builders and DOE now give out design prizes, but they have no monetary value and are limited to perhaps 10 or so per year. With perhaps the best third of building designs receiving small grants sufficient to cover the additional cost of design and more. This would bypass the many disconnects between the renter, owner, contractor, and architect and give the architect a direct incentive to design in better building energy performance. Unlike codes/standards, competitive pressures would provide a continuing push to improve performance. High leverage would be generated as the energy component of design is typically less than 1 percent of the total cost of the building, only one-third of submitted designs would win, and for houses, winning designs might typically be replicated a hundred or more times in different developments. This would also give visibility to winning architects and winning designs, and would provide opportunities to publicly illustrate the value and performance of these buildings *there would be lots of photo-ops. Complementary activities would include further development of computer design tools, information exchange programs over the internet, and education/training programs for architects. Design parameters could be extended to use of environmentally-friendly materials or minimizing material waste.

How much carbon would this save and at what cost? Assuming a \$10 million program (not including overheads, training, computer design tools, etc.) of \$10K prizes for house designs replicated 100 times, High replication

should be factored into the size of the reward, for example, by giving \$2000 for the first house and \$80 for each of the next 100 houses with the same design. If only 1 house were built, the cost would increase to \$30/ton. the program would influence directly the construction of 100,000 homes, and indirectly (losing contestants) 200,000 more. For the average house generating about 3 tons of carbon per year, or 240 tons of carbon over its 80 year lifetime, this program would save at least 120 tons of carbon at a cost of \$33 (\$10K/300 houses) or \$0.30/ton of carbon. Annual savings would increase at roughly 450,000 tons of carbon per year for each year of the \$10M contest, or 5 million tons/year by 2010. Obviously there are many ballpark assumptions here, particularly the number of houses that would be replicated, the savings per household, the size of the prize, the cost of administering and validating the program (not included), etc., but there is the potential for significant leverage. A similar \$10M program for commercial buildings would also provide large benefits. Smaller programs would have proportional benefits. A \$2 million residential/commercial pilot program, for example, would be a useful way to test this approach.

Thanks for sending along the marked-up draft. I assume that the strikethroughs and italics are changes made by Hatch to the version passed by the House. I have a few comments:

BoP has clearly been working with Hatch's office on revising the bill, which pisses me off. Seems like a little breach of protocol.

In Section 4014 (a), I need to know more about the recommendation to change "shall" to "may" - I need to know what the "guidelines issued by the Bureau of Prisons relating to infectious disease management" say about "risk for infection." I'm not sure that it makes sense to make the "shall" to "may" change if the testing is to be done only on those that are "at risk for infection." I don't believe BoP uses any such criteria now when testing prisoners upon exit - why now insist on standards for entrance testing? I actually think that using objective "at risk" determinations is reasonable, but it could get ugly if those determinations start to look discriminatory or based on stereotypes--as you and I have agreed, we have to be very careful about racial overtones to this.

Is the 3 to 4 months adequate time period to avoid massive testing of short-term (e.g., immigration) detainees?

I'll take a second look at it this afternoon, but wanted to pass these thoughts along.
