national campaign to encourage HIV testing, specifically oriented to those
who are at risk and don't know it (women who are partners of injection
drug users or bisexual men, and adolescents) - \$7 million

a special pilot program(s) that seeks to demonstrate the benefits of
improved integration between prevention for HIV and STDs with maternal and

child health - \$2 million

HIV prevention community planning (established program of block grants with local decision-making on use of funds - similar to Ryan White Title I) - set-aside/earmark specifically for prevention programs targeting young persons (including young gay men) and women at high risk - remaining balance

We are assuming at least \$15 million dollars. If you are expecting to do a lot more, item (1) can go to \$10 million but no more, item (2) should stay at \$2 million, and the rest should go into item (3). We would also want to push for report language that admonishes the CDC to insure that young people are adequately represented in the community planning groups for item (3) since they are often excluded from participating in prevention planning and programming.

Synopsis of Bangkok Short-course Perinatal ZDV Trial

Background: The Bangkok Perinatal AZT Study, a collaboration between the

Thai Ministry of Public Health and the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, is a randomized placebo controlled trial to evaluate the safety and efficacy of a short course of oral zidovudine (ZDV) administered during late pregnancy and labor to reduce the risk for perinatal HIV transmission. It was conducted to evaluate an intervention that could be implemented in Thailand.

Methods: HIV infected pregnant women were enrolled with their written informed consent and randomized at each of two study hospitals in Bangkok to receive ZDV or placebo. The ZDV regimen consisted of 300 mg orally twice daily from 36 weeks gestation until the onset of labor and 300 mg every three hours from the onset of labor until delivery. All women were recommended not to breastfeed and were provided with infant formula, consistent with Thai national guidelines for HIV-infected women. The planned sample size was 392 women, chosen to provide 80% power to detect a 50% lower transmission rate in the ZDV arm compared with a transmission rate of 24% in the placebo arm, with an overall Type I error of 0.05. The study endpoint was the HIV infection status of the infant at age 6 months as determined by results of polymerase chain reaction (PCR) testing for HIV DNA performed on blood specimens taken at birth, 2 months, and 6 months of age. The proportions of children found to be infected by 6 months of age in each treatment arm were estimated by the Kaplan-Meier method. The null hypothesis of no treatment effect was tested using a normally-distributed Z statistic computed from these estimates. As a result of two interim evaluations of treatment efficacy done for data and safety monitoring board reviews in July 1997 and January 1998, the critical value of the Z statistic for rejecting the null hypothesis of no treatment effect at the end of the study was 2.05.

Results: Between May 23, 1996 and December 31, 1997, 397 women were enrolled (198 in ZDV arm, 199 in placebo arm); 4 women were lost to follow up before delivery and 393 women delivered. At enrollment, the median age was 24 years and the median CD4+ count was 424 cells/?L. Baseline characteristics were balanced between the two arms. The median duration of antenatal treatment was 24 days and the median number of labor doses was 3. Ninety-six percent of study visits were kept, 99% of women took at least 90% of pills in the antepartum period, and 99% took at least one pill during labor. No mothers breastfed their infants. Adverse events were balanced between the treatment arms. No women needed to stop the study drug. As of February 10, 1998, PCR data were available for 391 children. Fifty-two children have tested PCR-positive, 17 in the ZDV arm and 35 in the placebo arm--42% of infected children tested positive at birth and all first tested positive by their 2 month visit. Of the remaining 339 children, 310 tested PCR-negative at 2 months of age or older. There are 29 living children whose infection status is pending (PCR-negative at birth but no further testing yet). The Kaplan-Meier estimates for transmission risk in the ZDV and placebo arms are 9.2% (95% confidence interval, 5.0%-13.5%) and 18.6% (95% confidence interval, 13.0%-24.0%), respectively, representing a 51% reduction in transmission risk (95% confidence interval, 15% -

71%). Based on these data, the Z statistic for testing for a difference between the arms is 2.67 ($p=0.008$). Under assumptions that all infected children will be detected by their 2 month visit and that the transmission risk among the children whose infection status is pending is as high as 24%, the probability is >98% that the null hypothesis will be rejected when all data are available.

Conclusion: A short course of twice-daily oral ZDV used from 36 weeks gestation until delivery was safe and reduced the risk for mother-infant HIV transmission by approximately one half. This regimen may be useful for preventing HIV infection in children in developing countries.

Anticipated Media Questions and Answers on CDC-sponsored trials of

short-course AZT to prevent perinatal HIV transmission in Thailand and Ivory Coast

1) What were the perinatal HIV prevention studies in Thailand and Côte d'Ivoire designed to do?

CDC collaborated with the Ministries of Health of Thailand and Côte d'Ivoire (Ivory Coast) to examine whether a "short course" of oral AZT (also called zidovudine or ZDV) given to women late in pregnancy and during labor is safe and effective for preventing perinatal (mother-to-child) transmission of HIV in the developing world .

The ability of this short AZT regimen to prevent perinatal HIV transmission was evaluated by comparing the rates of HIV infection in the children born to women in two study groups (short- course AZT and placebo).

2) Why were these studies needed?

Practical therapies for reducing mother-to-infant HIV transmission are urgently needed in the developing world, where more than 1,000 babies are born with HIV infection every day. The only AZT regimen previously proven to reduce the risk of mother-to-infant HIV transmission (the "076" regimen used in the U.S.) is not feasible and is too expensive to be used in most developing countries. In order for policy makers in the developing world to provide HIV-infected women a preventive therapy,

they urgently needed conclusive scientific evidence that a practical AZT regimen is safe and more effective than what they are currently able to provide--which, tragically for most-- is no preventive therapy at all.

3) Why was this regimen evaluated?

CDC and public health authorities in Thailand and Cote d'Ivoire designed and evaluated regimens that could be feasible to implement in these nations. While the ACTG 076 study did not indicate which part of the regimen was most important for prevention, researchers believe that the risk for transmission may be highest during the last weeks of pregnancy and during labor and delivery. Therefore, the studies were designed to determine if administering AZT orally for a short period during the last weeks of pregnancy and during labor could effectively reduce perinatal HIV transmission. By using a much shorter oral course during pregnancy, an oral dose during delivery (rather than an intravenous dose) and no infant dose, the regimen could be realistically implemented in these and other developing countries, where most women do not even see a doctor or nurse early enough in pregnancy to start a 6 month regimen.

4) What were the findings of these studies?

Preliminary data from the Thailand study demonstrate that the short-course regimen of AZT used late in pregnancy and during delivery is safe for use and reduced perinatal HIV transmission by an estimated 51 %, from 18.6% to 9.2% . Efficacy data from the Cote d'Ivoire study, which had only completed 40% of its enrollment, are still preliminary

and will require further analysis.

5) Were there any adverse effects of the regimen?

In the Thailand trial, 397 women were enrolled. No unexpected serious adverse events occurred, and there was no significant differences in adverse events between women who received the AZT regimen and those who did not.

There were a number of stillborns and infant deaths among study participants in both the treated and untreated groups in Cote d'Ivoire and some infant deaths in Thailand. None were thought to be a consequence of the short-course AZT regimen.

6) Why has CDC decided to drop the placebo arm of the study in Cote d'Ivoire ?

Although the data from Cote d'Ivoire are too preliminary to assess efficacy there, preliminary data from Thailand clearly indicate that the same short-course regimen can significantly reduce the rate of transmission to infants before and during birth. Moreover, the regimen appears safe. CDC and its collaborators have therefore begun offering all remaining pregnant women enrolled in the Cote d'Ivoire study short-course AZT.

These exciting results indicate that this shorter, simpler regimen of AZT can significantly reduce the number of infants born with HIV

infection in these and other nations that are currently unable to provide HIV-infected pregnant women the "076" intervention.

As planned in the original study protocol, follow-up will be conducted with the women and children from both sites for 18-24 months to monitor for adverse effects in the women and children, to document final infection status of the children, and to determine the impact of mother-infant transmission due to breast-feeding on infection rates in Cote d'Ivoire. The long term implications of the initial protection at the time of birth in countries with no safe alternatives to breast-feeding are not yet known.

7) Do you still believe these studies were ethical, were the placebos necessary?

CDC is extremely pleased that the study was able to provide positive answers to questions essential to policy makers in the developing world in a timely manner-- something that would not have been possible without placebos. These studies were not only ethical but essential to conduct. The placebo controlled design, where one group of women receives inactive pills, provided the best means of answering two questions critical for policy makers in the developing world: 1) is the short-course regimen more effective than no intervention? and 2) is it safe for use in the local setting?

The results of the Thailand study further demonstrate why comparing the

short course to placebo was so important. The transmission rate in the untreated group in Bangkok (19%) was lower than that found in the same hospitals just a few years earlier (24%). Without the untreated placebo group to document the current background transmission rate, the wrong conclusions about efficacy could have easily been drawn. For example, if it had turned out that the regimen actually provided no benefit over no treatment (i.e., the treatment group had a 19% transmission rate), because this transmission rate was lower than the only available historical data (24%), the erroneous conclusion that it was effective might have been drawn.

Moreover, there were some infant deaths and other adverse events among children of women in both the treated and untreated groups. Without the placebo control to clarify background rates of adverse events, it could not be demonstrated to policy makers that these adverse events were not due to the AZT, and that the therapy is safe.

8) Is the short-course regimen as effective as the 076 regimen used in the U.S.?

This study was not designed to compare the short-course regimen to the U.S. regimen. In the ACTG 076 study, the rate of transmission was reduced by nearly 70%, while the rates of transmission in Thailand were reduced by about 50%. The smaller reduction in transmission in this trial could be related to the shorter duration of treatment, the lack of treatment for the infant following delivery, the oral dosing in labor, or some combination of factors. However, the 076 regimen was not

evaluated in these populations, and if it were, the rate of transmission for that regimen might be different among women with different general health and health care access.

9) What are the implications of these findings for the developing world?

Will women in these countries now have access to this intervention?

With this new information, there is now a realistic option to help reduce the overwhelming number of infants born with HIV infection in the developing world each year. CDC has already begun to share these findings with our partners worldwide and will aggressively support UNAIDS and policy makers in Thailand, Cote d'Ivoire, and throughout the world to translate these findings into effective public policy and health care practice.

Certainly, there are numerous challenges and hard work ahead, and the health ministries of each country will have to determine what these findings mean for them, given their own resources and health delivery systems. Additionally, in countries with no safe alternative to breast-feeding, the impact of transmission through breast-feeding after birth will still have to be considered.

10) What are the implications for perinatal HIV prevention in the U.S.?

These studies were designed to provide data relevant to the needs of Thailand and Cote d'Ivoire rather than the U.S. Because HIV-infected

pregnant women in the U.S. and other industrialized nations already have access to the effective "076" treatment regimen, and because the shorter AZT regimen appears to be somewhat less effective, no change in recommendations for perinatal prevention in the U.S. will be made based on these findings. However, the results do support the current PHS recommendation of offering AZT even to women in the U.S. who present late for prenatal care or who are first diagnosed with HIV infection late in pregnancy.

11) If a woman in the U.S. can't afford the "076" regimen, should she be offered short-course AZT?

The "076" regimen is the standard of care for preventing perinatal transmission in the U.S. and should be made available to all HIV-infected pregnant women. Because the longer "076" regimen may be more effective than the short course AZT regimen, women who initiate care in time to use it should be offered the "076" regimen. The regimen is covered under Medicaid and other reimbursement sources.

12) Why were the findings reviewed now?

Since the last interim review of data from the Thailand study in January 1998, which did not demonstrate conclusive findings, CDC has been closely monitoring preliminary data as they emerge. Because of the tremendous implications of this study for perinatal HIV prevention in the developing world, CDC wanted to ensure that results were provided as quickly as possible, once conclusive data were available. As soon as

CDC received enough data to determine efficacy, the agency requested an immediate review of the data by the independent Data and Safety and Monitoring Board (DSMB) overseeing the research to review the results. The DSMB reviewed the data on February 17, 1998 and concurred with CDC's conclusions. CDC has begun notifying collaborators worldwide and will aggressively support UNAIDS and policy makers in Thailand and throughout the world in translating these findings into effective public policy and health care practice.

The DSMB monitoring the two CDC trials is sponsored by the National Institutes of Health. Data from the two CDC trials were first reviewed by this DSMB in December 1996 and July 1997. In those reviews, the DSMB concluded that study progress was satisfactory and the regimen appeared safe. In the July 1997 meeting, the DSMB also reviewed the transmission rates from the Thailand study and determined that data were insufficient to draw conclusions. The second review of efficacy data from Thailand was conducted January 22, 1998. At that time the DSMB concluded that data were still not sufficient to provide conclusive results.

13) When were these studies begun and what was the status at the time of this review?

Both trials began enrollment in 1996. The Thailand trial began enrollment in May 1996 and completed enrollment in December 1997 after reaching the targeted enrollment. The infection status has now been determined for more than 90% of infants in the Thailand study. The infection status of the remaining children will be available in several

months. Final data will be analyzed at that time, but are extremely unlikely to change the overall conclusion of efficacy. The Abidjan trial began enrollment in April 1996 and has completed approximately 40% of its enrollment.

14) How will the management of the mothers already enrolled in this study change?

All of the women enrolled in the Thailand study have now delivered their babies. All remaining women in the study in Cote d'Ivoire who have not yet delivered are now being contacted and offered short-course AZT therapy. CDC will be conducting follow-up of participants for 18-24 months to monitor for adverse events and to determine the infection outcomes of the children.

15)) Are there other perinatal prevention studies that use AZT currently underway? What are the implications of these results for these studies?

UNAIDS is sponsoring perinatal prevention studies in 4 African countries; ANRS (France) is conducting a study in Cote d'Ivoire and Burkina Faso; and NIH is sponsoring studies in Uganda and Thailand. These studies differ somewhat in the formulation and combination of drugs evaluated. Some are evaluating AZT in combination with other drugs.

CDC has already notified these agencies of the results, so that they can consider the implications of these findings for their studies.

Investigators in each study will have to look at the study results and local circumstances to make decisions about next steps. UNAIDS will soon convene an international meeting to discuss the scientific and policy implications of these findings. While this AZT regimen will provide a solution for many developing nations, there is still a need for even simpler solutions in areas where even this short-course regimen remains out of reach.

16) Were these findings a surprise or did these studies just confirm what you already knew?

Researchers generally start research with a premise they believe plausible. CDC staff, along with the rest of the international health and research community, were certainly hopeful that this regimen would prove effective and ultimately help reduce the heavy burden of HIV among children in the developing world. However, these and various other studies have been conducted precisely because no one knew if this regimen, which is much shorter during pregnancy, uses oral therapy during labor, and does not treat the infant, would prove more effective than no intervention.

17) If this regimen may not be as effective as the ACTG 076 regimen, is it ethical to offer women in the developing world a less effective treatment?

In countries in which the "076" AZT regimen is feasible, it is already being used. Until now most poor HIV-infected women in developing

nations had no AZT intervention available. These findings indicate that there is a much more feasible option that can significantly reduce a woman's chances of transmitting HIV to her baby compared to no intervention.

As with any other health threat, we must provide solutions that are relevant to the countries that need them. For example, in many developing nations, oral rehydration therapy is used for treatment of diarrhea rather than the intravenous therapy we are able to provide in the U.S.

18) What is the role of the DSMB and who is on the board?

Agencies conducting large clinical trials use an independent Data and Safety Monitoring Board (DSMB) to periodically review interim findings. These reviews take place at predetermined intervals. The role of the DSMB is to ensure that there are no serious side effects detected as the study progresses, that the study is proceeding effectively and will provide the data needed, and that investigators are notified if conclusive results are available prior to the anticipated completion date.

For example, if at the time of a DSMB review, preliminary findings are already sufficient to determine that the intervention being studied is effective or if it is clear that the intervention is not working or may be harmful, the DSMB will immediately notify the sponsoring agency so that appropriate action can be taken. These studies were monitored by a DSMB convened by the U.S. National Institutes of Health. The panel is

made up of physicians, statisticians, and ethicists familiar with clinical trials, but independent of the trials being monitored. Additionally, representatives from both host countries, Thailand and Cote d'Ivoire, serve as ad hoc board members for review of these trials.

19) Given that efficacy is not yet known in Cote d'Ivoire, will that study continue?

Although the data from Cote d'Ivoire are too preliminary to assess efficacy there, the data from Thailand clearly indicate that the short-course regimen can significantly reduce the rate of transmission to infants before and during birth. All pregnant women remaining enrolled in the Cote d'Ivoire study will therefore be offered short-course AZT. As planned in the original study protocol, follow-up will be conducted with all women and children for 18-24 months to monitor for adverse effects, to document final infection status of the children, and to determine the impact of breast-feeding on infection rates.

The health ministry of Cote d'Ivoire will carefully review these findings with investigators there to determine if any further research is needed to determine the impact of breast-feeding and other local circumstances on the effectiveness of this regimen.

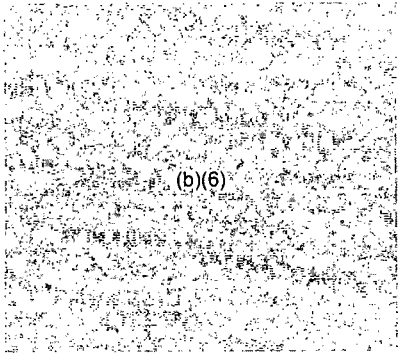

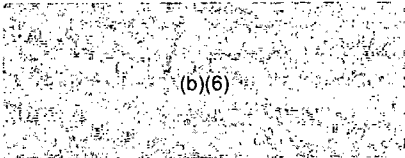

Short-Course Regimen of AZT Proven Effective in Reducing Perinatal HIV Transmission: Offers Hope for Reducing Mother-to-Child HIV Transmission in Developing World

In an announcement that has important implications for many developing nations, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) stated today that a short course of AZT given late in pregnancy and during delivery reduced the rate of HIV transmission to infants of infected mothers by half and is safe for use in the developing world. The Ministry of Public Health of Thailand (MOPH), who conducted the study in collaboration with CDC, announced the results earlier today in Thailand.

The findings, from a preliminary analysis of data from the CDC/MOPH collaborative study, offer real hope to many developing nations that previously had no realistic therapy options to prevent HIV-infected pregnant women from transmitting infection to their babies.

"We are very fortunate in the U.S. and Europe to have been in a position to offer preventive therapy to HIV-infected pregnant women for several years, and thousands of infections in infants have been prevented as a direct result," said Health and Human Services Secretary Donna E. Shalala, "Now we are a step closer to seeing the kind of progress that we've made at home extended to the developing world."

Prior to these findings, the only AZT regimen proven effective for perinatal HIV prevention was essentially out of reach for the countries in which over 90% of HIV infections occur.

The AZT regimen used in the U.S. is costly and requires several months of treatment for the mother and the infant and an intravenous dose that is not feasible in many developing countries. In order for policy makers in developing nations to provide HIV-infected women a preventive therapy, they urgently needed conclusive scientific evidence that there is a practical treatment regimen that is safe and more effective than what they have been able to provide -which, tragically for most -- has been no preventive therapy at all.

"By using a much shorter course during pregnancy, an oral dose rather than an intravenous dose during delivery, and no infant dose, we evaluated a regimen that could be realistically implemented in developing nations," said Dr. Helene Gayle, Director of CDC's National Center for HIV, STD, and TB Prevention. "Now that the regimen has been proven safe and effective in Thailand, these findings offer hope of extending perinatal prevention to HIV-infected women throughout the developing world."

The Thailand study was one of two CDC collaborative perinatal HIV prevention studies. The CDC studies, conducted with the Ministries of Health in Bangkok, Thailand and Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire, were part of an international collaborative research effort coordinated by the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) to help identify practical solutions for the developing world.

The Thailand study, which began enrollment in 1996, provides the first conclusive scientific data on the preventive effectiveness of a short-course regimen of AZT.

Although final data are not yet in, CDC has now received conclusive interim data from Thailand. Enrollment into the study has

been completed and over 90% of the data have now been reviewed by CDC and the independent Data Safety and Monitoring Board (DSMB) overseeing the research. Because this regimen has proven both safe and effective, the placebo-control component of CDC's Abidjan study is no longer necessary. Therefore, CDC and its collaborators have begun offering all pregnant women enrolled in the Abidjan study the short-course AZT regimen. Research collaborators worldwide are currently being notified of the findings. In a joint statement released today by UNAIDS, the National Institutes of Health (NIH) , and the French National Agency for AIDS Research (ANRS), it was announced that an international meeting will be soon be held to discuss the far-reaching scientific and policy implications of these findings.

"As the international health community now faces the challenges of making this prevention opportunity a reality for HIV-infected women worldwide, the really hard work begins," said Dr. Kevin DeCock, Director of the Division of HIV Prevention, NCHSTP. "The remarkable news is that we begin with the first conclusive evidence that simpler, practical therapies can make a difference."

CDC stressed that these studies were not designed to address perinatal prevention needs in the U.S. and other industrialized nations. Because HIV-infected pregnant women in the U.S. already have access to the more effective longer treatment regimen, recommendations for perinatal HIV prevention in the U.S. will not change.

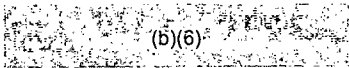

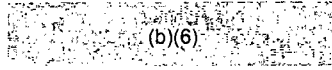

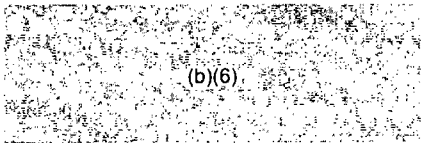

Following upon our recommendation IV.B. (Dec. 1996); The Department of
Defense

in their memo of March 26, 1997 to Acting Director Goosby indicates that
they

have been working on the report with an anticipated completion date of
April,

1997 pending input from each of the Military Departments.

Health & Human Services

Following upon our recommendation IV.B. (Dec. 1996); the Council needs to

see

the report disseminated by HRSA in June 1995 entitled, "Progress and Challenges in Linking Incarcerated Individuals with HIV/AIDS to Community Services."

The Council needs the that HRSA specific guidance stating that CARE Act funds

should only be used to supplement and enhance existing state programs, particularly state funded drug assistance programs and programs for inmates under the custody of States.

The Council also requests further elaboration concerning the draft policy regarding services for incarcerated individuals. Specifically, (a) how does

the policy that "such individuals are the responsibility of the institution and jurisdiction in which they are confined" affect individuals in federal jails, (b) How is the use of CARE Act funds monitored when other funding for

the pre-release case management and linkage services are unavailable, and

(c) How are case management services "typically including assessment of needs, development of a care plan, referral and follow-up to ensure access to needed services, and an ongoing reassessment of needs," monitored and evaluated.

AIDS Education & Training Centers

The Council requests the list of Federal, State and local correctional

facilities which received AETC training.

We further request copies of curriculum used in such programs and
scheduling
information regarding frequency of use.

Department of Justice

We request the Office of National AIDS Policy to again forward them a copy
of
that report in conjunction with a re-forward of this set of recommendation
and
assessments.

The response regarding our request for information concerning Discharge

Prevention.

This is underscored by several successful state models where Protective Barriers are available in prisons.

Follow-up Required: We request copies of PS 5270.07 & PS 6100.01 and comment on how these statutes might be revised.

A request for investigation into the viability and effectiveness of improved Substance Abuse Intervention Programs, including Needle Exchange, is needed as well as improved surveillance.

Regarding counseling and psychosocial need of inmates with HIV/AIDS, additional attention to the Special Needs of Women with AIDS, and Hospice Care, must also become a part of the commitment of the Federal Bureau of Prisons.

Housing & Urban Development.

Temporary and other housing options for ex-offenders, such as HOPWA, SPNS, USCM, etc.

Review of Issues

? Pending Surveillance Recommendation

The Administration should direct the CDC to conduct an HIV surveillance of all prisoners within the Federal Correction System. Specific funding should be earmarked for this project. The data should be used to plan for improving health and psychosocial needs of inmates, to develop appropriate prevention strategies, and to make informed decisions with regard to funding allocations and inmate needs.

This was reviewed by both the NORA Working Group on Incarcerated Individuals and the PACHA Prevention Committee as well as being submitted to John Miles.

General comments included; a wariness of surveillance despite the need for information, and an overall sense of vagueness in it. Comments included:

How does this relate to what is already being done? What type of surveillance

(i.e., blind, UI, names, etc.)? Accomplished (and funded) by whom? Will it

use CDC "best practices"? Will it emerge in the same context as the Prevention Rec. on Surveillance? What will be the availability of treatment?

How do other countries accomplish this? Understanding the need for

information -- does this reach that goal?

Jeremy will remind John Miles to send us reports.

Steve will prepare a background piece for our March meeting.

? Meeting with CDC & DoJ

John Miles will join us on Monday, March 16th, with a focus on Surveillance.

We will continue to work with ONAP to arrange for Kathleen Hawke or an individual from DoJ to participate.

Health & Human Services

Following upon our recommendation IV.B. (Dec. 1996); the Council needs to see

the report disseminated by HRSA in June 1995 entitled, "Progress and Challenges in Linking Incarcerated Individuals with HIV/AIDS to Community Services."

The Council needs the that HRSA specific guidance stating that CARE Act funds

should only be used to supplement and enhance existing state programs, particularly state funded drug assistance programs and programs for inmates under the custody of States.

The Council also requests further elaboration concerning the draft policy regarding services for incarcerated individuals. Specifically, (a) how does

the policy that "such individuals are the responsibility of the institution and jurisdiction in which they are confined" affect individuals in federal jails, (b) How is the use of CARE Act funds monitored when other funding for

the pre-release case management and linkage services are unavailable, and (c)

How are case management services "typically including assessment of needs, development of a care plan, referral and follow-up to ensure access to needed

services, and an ongoing reassessment of needs," monitored and evaluated.

AIDS Education & Training Centers

The Council requests the list of Federal, State and local correctional facilities which received AETC training.

We further request copies of curriculum used in such programs and scheduling information regarding frequency of use.

Department of Justice

We request the Office of National AIDS Policy to again forward them a copy of that report in conjunction with a re-forward of this set of recommendation and assessments.

The response regarding our request for information concerning Discharge Planning (Dec. '96), is hardly adequate, although the Federal Bureau of Prisons does comment upon this in its current report.

We are in receipt of the Federal Bureau of Prisons Treatment Protocols manual.

We would like to see (a) documentation that it is in use, and (b) documentation from HHS that it is compatible with their Treatment Guidelines.

The statement that protective barriers; "are not medically necessary and, therefore not authorized" is unacceptable in the context of AIDS Prevention.

This is underscored by several successful state models where Protective Barriers are available in prisons.

Follow-up Required: We request copies of PS 5270.07 & PS 6100.01 and comment on how these statutes might be revised.

A request for investigation into the viability and effectiveness of improved

Substance Abuse Intervention Programs, including Needle Exchange, is needed as

well as improved surveillance.

Regarding counseling and psychosocial need of inmates with HIV/AIDS, additional attention to the Special Needs of Women with AIDS, and Hospice Care, must also become a part of the commitment of the Federal Bureau of Prisons.

Housing & Urban Development.

Temporary and other housing options for ex-offenders, such as HOPWA, SPNS, USCM, etc.

? Pending Surveillance Recommendation

The Administration should direct the CDC to conduct an HIV surveillance of all prisoners within the Federal Correction System. Specific funding should be earmarked for this project. The data should be used to plan for improving health and psychosocial needs of inmates, to develop appropriate prevention strategies, and to make informed decisions with regard to funding allocations and inmate needs.

This was reviewed by both the NORA Working Group on Incarcerated Individuals and the PACHA Prevention Committee as well as being submitted to John Miles.

Alexandra -

Daniel gave me a copy of the latest version of the Research Committee's recommendations on the vaccine issue. I have strong concern about the section on Leadership and Coordination, which does not seem to reflect the discussion we had on the last conference call. Specifically, I think it is unwise to talk about a specific position ("Vaccine Coordinator") at ONAP. Rather, it would be more appropriate for the PACHA to recommend that the

responsibilities be vested with ONAP, with appropriate support to make it feasible for us to handle them.

In addition, the new paragraph on the development of a plan was not discussed on the call, to my recollection, and puts us in an awkward position. It is not our position or expertise to draft a plan--it is our job to make sure that a plan has been developed and to follow that plan's progress to insure that we are on schedule in meeting the President's goal.

To facilitate the process, I offer the following to replace the entire section on Leadership and Coordination. Please let me know what you think - if possible, I would like this distributed to other members of the Research Committee so that it would be available for the upcoming conference call. I'd also appreciate it if my fingerprints weren't on it (orally on the phone is ok) since it's not appropriate for me to be suggesting that you advocate to supplement ONAP.

Leadership and Coordination

It is only within the Office of the President that sufficient authority exists to assure the coordination and collaboration of all requisite

constituencies, including Federal agencies, the private sector, and the international community. Responsibility should rest with the Office of National AIDS Policy, which was created for exactly this kind of leadership role. We therefore recommend that the President formally charge the Director of the Office of National AIDS Policy with developing and maintaining administrative mechanisms for accomplishing this multi-sector collaboration and coordination. This would include responsibility for assuring the involvement of senior leadership in all constituencies in support of achieving the President's ten-year goal.

However, we are very concerned that the lack of adequate support for ONAP and its Director (previously articulated in several reports and letters from the PACHA) will render it unable to fulfill these new responsibilities. Therefore, we recommend that the President fulfill his public commitment to provide critical support to his Office of National AIDS Policy so that it can adequately respond to the responsibilities articulated above as well as to other recommendations of the PACHA.

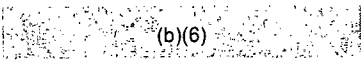
