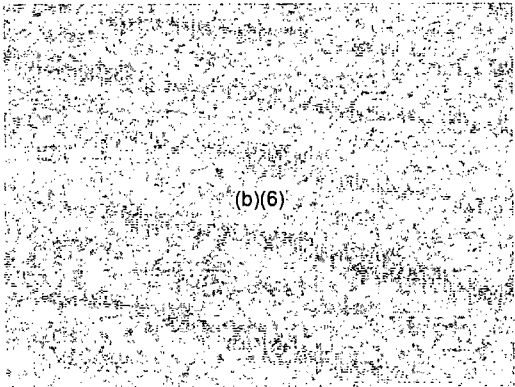

HIV Infection Rate Remains Steady

ATLANTA (AP) - Despite a historic drop in AIDS cases and deaths in the United

States in the last few years, the rate at which people are becoming infected

with HIV has held relatively steady, the government said Thursday.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said that many people are

not

heeding warnings about unsafe sex and drug use.

“It shows the need for sustained prevention. What we have seen is that

with

every generation, you have to start at the beginning,” said Terry

Hammond, a

CDC spokeswoman.

Using statistics from the 25 states that report infection rates, the CDC

estimated a 2 percent decline from 1995 to 1996 in the number of new HIV

cases

diagnosed among people 13 or older.

AIDS deaths, meanwhile, dropped 21 percent in 1996 and were down an

additional

44 percent in the first half of 1997, according to figures previously

released

by the CDC.

“This is a case of the glass is half full,” said Cornelius Baker of the

National Association of People with AIDS. “People are living longer.

That's

great. But with a steady infection rate, it means the epidemic isn't going

away.”

People diagnosed with HIV are not considered AIDS cases until they actually

develop symptoms of the disease. So delaying the onset of AIDS and prolonging the lives of AIDS patients can reduce the number of AIDS deaths even while there's little change in the rate of new HIV cases.

“We're not seeing good news in the fact that we are not seeing a substantial decline,” in the HIV infection rate, said Dr. Patricia Fleming, a CDC researcher.

The CDC estimated that HIV cases between 1994 and mid-1997 dropped slightly among men but increased among women.

The study also showed HIV infections among young people overall had leveled off, but minorities now make up a greater portion of that group. Of the 7,200 cases of HIV reported among 13- to 24-year-olds, 63 percent were black and 5 percent Hispanic.

Ms. Fleming warned that not all states were required to report infection rates. The new figures don't include California and New York, so the true national infection rate could be higher or lower, she said. The CDC wants all states to create a name-based HIV reporting system.

“You need to know about the front end of the epidemic if you're trying to

find out what's going on with the disease," said Eve Mokotoff, chief of the HIV/AIDS epidemiology unit at the Michigan Department of Community Health in Detroit.

Michigan is among the states that require their clinics and hospitals to report the names of people infected with HIV.

which attempt to smear Drs. Mann and Clements-Mann with some implied conflict of interest.

Dr. Mann spoke to us on March 15 with strong views in a direct style with which many might disagree while simultaneously agreeing with his assessment of the problems. But he did so publically and on the record, and did not hide behind anonymous, unattributed criticisms.

I believe an open and public debate on the AIDS vaccine issues between those who may agree with Dr. Mann and those who do not would be most educational and useful. But snide, secretive attempts to attack character are neither helpful nor appropriate.

Thanks for keeping us informed on published news and articles relevant to the issues.

If the person who wrote or said this would be willing to identify himself or herself publically, letting the e-mail recipients assess his or her own expertise, motives, potential conflicts of interest, and other hidden agenda, that would be welcome. Otherwise, I do not think it appropriate for the White House to use e-mail to circulate onwards such unattributed comments

which attempt to smear Drs. Mann and Clements-Mann with some implied conflict of interest.

Dr. Mann spoke to us on March 15 with strong views in a direct style with which many might disagree while simultaneously agreeing with his assessment of the problems. But he did so publically and on the record, and did not hide behind anonymous, unattributed criticisms.

I believe an open and public debate on the AIDS vaccine issues between those who may agree with Dr. Mann and those who do not would be most educational and useful. But snide, secretive attempts to attack character are neither helpful nor appropriate.

WASHINGTON (AP) - The nation's new surgeon general said Friday he is disappointed by the Clinton administration's decision to bar federal funding for AIDS-fighting programs that give clean needles to drug users.

The administration said this week that science shows that such programs prevent the spread of HIV without increasing drug use. However, the White

House decided against using federal money to support them, agreeing with those who say that buying needles for addicts sends the wrong message.

Asked about the decision, Dr. David Satcher said that as a scientist he is "disappointed" any time resources are not available to fund effective programs.

"We said very clearly that they do not increase drug use," he said in an interview Friday. "It would be great if we could do it without the political overtones."

Also Friday, members of the Congressional Black Caucus called for the resignation of President Clinton's drug policy chief, Barry McCaffrey, who had urged Clinton to withhold federal money for the programs.

"This is a life-and-death issue," said Rep. Maxine Waters, D-Calif. "You can save lives with needle exchange distribution as we try to work at getting rid of drugs in our society."

In response, McCaffrey said black leaders should think twice before endorsing needle exchange programs in neighborhoods where drugs are rampant. Such program provide clean needles to drug users in exchange for used, possibly

contaminated, ones.

“If you're a parent already fighting to bring your children up right and protect them from drugs, you have to ask: ‘Do I want one of these programs on my corner or near my child's school?’” he said in a statement.

White House spokesman Mike McCurry added that the president supports McCaffrey and is confident in the needle exchange decision. “The president is very supportive of the work that he's done,” McCurry said.

At an announcement of the administration's policy on Monday, Satcher had said that more money for needle exchange programs would save lives. But with the administration trying to show a united front, Satcher had sidestepped a question about whether he was personally disappointed.

Satcher, who took office two months ago, has supported needle exchange programs since he was director of the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and it was one of several positions criticized by Senate conservatives opposed to his nomination.

Clinton's science advisers wanted to lift the ban on federal money for needle exchange programs. But at the last minute, the White House sided with

opponents, including conservatives in Congress and McCaffrey.

Studies suggest that needle exchange programs can be effective in getting drug users into treatment, but McCaffrey and others say it is wrong to use tax money to buy needles that will be used to inject illegal drugs.

Satcher acknowledged those arguments.

“It's not easy to answer that with science when someone asks you what kind of message you're sending,” he said.

Still, Satcher said it is “critical” for local communities to come together and create their own needle exchange programs if they feel comfortable with them.

“They should find the funds,” he said.

Studies suggest that half of all people who contract HIV are infected by needles or by sex with injecting drug users, or are children of infected addicts.

The government reported this week that HIV infections have remained relatively steady over time, despite a historic drop in AIDS cases and deaths because

of
new drugs.

The CDC report also found minorities making up a larger of the infected population, something the Congressional Black Caucus seized on Friday as it denounced the administration's decision.

Satcher argued that the administration decision to endorse the programs - even without federal money - is significant, despite protests about the continued funding ban.

``I understand how disappointed people are," he said. ``But I would not discount the significance of the decision made."

BALTIMORE (AP) - David Purchase was angered by the Clinton administration's refusal to allow federal money to buy clean needles for drug addicts, even though officials admitted that such exchange programs fight AIDS without encouraging drug use.

``No guts, no glory," said Purchase, chairman of a needle exchange advocacy

group, which is holding its national convention through today.

Despite the president's hesitation, Purchase has seen the number of programs

balloon since the start of the Tacoma, Wash.-based North American Syringe Exchange Network. About half of the programs are illegal, he said.

In response to Clinton's statement, international financier George Soros on Thursday offered \$1 million in matching funds to support needle exchange programs around the country.

The Soros pledge ``was in the works, and we decided to announce it when the federal government decided not to fund programs," said Ty Trippet of the Lindesmith Center, a drug policy research organization that is part of the Soros-sponsored Open Society Institute.

In 1991, there were fewer than 10 needle exchange programs in the country, said Purchase. Now there are 134 programs in 34 states and U.S. territories.

They handed out 17.5 million syringes to 121,000 ``injectors" last year, he said.

NASEN serves as a clearinghouse for information and buys needles in bulk to sell to needle exchange programs.

Baltimore's health department has run a needle exchange program for three

years and received permission this year from the state to continue indefinitely.

“I'm convinced if we can get the president over here, we can change his opinion,” Mayor Kurt Schmoke said.

Baltimore's program, providing needles to about 7,000 addicts at a cost of about \$300,000 per year, is the largest city-run needle exchange in the country, Schmoke said. It pays for itself if just three people avoid the costs of AIDS-related hospitalization, he said.

“You've got to demonstrate widespread grass-roots support,” said city health commissioner Peter Beilenson. “You've got to get beyond the advocacy groups or it won't get widely used.”

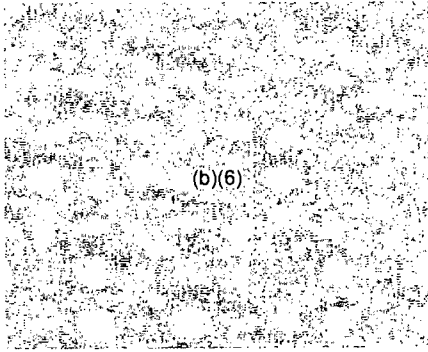

WASHINGTON (AP) - Some officials at charitable AIDS organizations are doing well by doing good. At least nine groups pay their top officers more than \$100,000.

And that has upset both AIDS activists and at least one member of the House, who spoke out Wednesday.

“I was shocked to discover how many AIDS organizations pay their executives excessive salaries at the expense of those living with HIV,” said Rep. Tom Coburn, R-Okla., a physician who has treated patients with the virus that causes AIDS. “At a time when direct services and medically necessary care is being severely curtailed, many AIDS charity executives have put lining their own pockets above saving many lives.”

The president of the board of directors of Washington's Whitman-Walker Clinic insisted the salaries are not out of line. Whitman-Walker's executive director, Jim Graham, was paid \$143,690 in 1996.

“This is a salary that's nowhere out of sync with everything else,” board president Dace Stone said.

In New York, the National Charities Information Bureau, which tracks charitable organizations, noted a lack of guidelines about how much a charity should pay its leaders. “It is up to the board of directors to figure out how much compensation it takes to improve or maintain the organization's revenues, and more importantly, their programs,” bureau spokesman Dan Langan said.

Directors of the nine AIDS organizations, which receive \$53 million a year from federal, state and local governments, are in charge of operations, budgets and staff.

At the top of the list: Jerome Radwin, chief executive officer of the New York-based American Foundation for AIDS Research, a national group known as AmFAR. He was paid \$191,729 in 1996, the group said in its financial disclosure form filed with the Internal Revenue Service.

Radwin said AmFar brought in an outside firm to recommend salaries under a philosophy of hiring good people and paying them ``not at the top but in a competitive framework to attract the talent we need."

The Gay Men's Health Crisis, also based in New York City, had two employees who earned more than the \$130,000 salary of New York Gov. George Pataki in 1995: Executive Director Mark Robinson, paid \$144,782; and the deputy executive director for development, Addie Gutttag, \$139,337. The group did not return a phone call for comment.

On the West Coast, Los Angeles-based AIDS Healthcare Foundation had at least six employees with salaries exceeding \$100,000 in 1996 - five physicians paid \$127,375 to \$172,366, and the foundation president, Michael Weinstein, paid \$126,548.

``We're a medical provider and our top salary earners are doctors," said Cesar Portillo, the organization's director of government affairs. ``We provide the highest-quality medical care to people with AIDS. The only way we can do that is to make sure we're competitive in the market in terms of physicians."

Graham, of the Whitman-Walker clinic, said his salary increased as the clinic grew, from a budget of \$280,000 and six employees when he arrived 14 years ago to a budget of \$21 million and 280 employees today.

Records show the clinic still spends just 2 percent of its budget on administrative costs.

``It is not a situation where money is being diverted to fat salaries over the back of people who need help," Graham said.

Black Caucus Wants AIDS Declaration

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Congressional Black Caucus said Monday it will ask Health and Human Services Secretary Donna Shalala to declare a ``state of emergency" in the black community over HIV and AIDS, which is the leading killer of blacks 25-44 years old.

``This is a national crisis ... and we cannot rest until it is considered
as

one," said Rep. Maxine Waters, D-Calif., who chairs the 39-member group.

An HHS spokeswoman said the department was reviewing its options.

Waters announced the decision after a meeting at the Capitol involving caucus

members, AIDS activists and medical professionals.

She said the decision to declare a medical state of emergency is done by the

health secretary in consultation with related agencies, such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Among other things, such a step could lead

to increased funding for the disease, she said.

The government allocated about \$3 billion for AIDS this year; President Clinton has proposed increasing that to \$3.8 billion in the fiscal year that begins Oct. 1.

Benny Primm, executive director of the Addiction Research and Treatment Corp.

in New York, said blacks - who are 13 percent of the population - account for 36 percent of all AIDS cases.

“One only has to look at the statistics ... to know this money ought to be

following the epidemic," Primm told a news conference. "It has not."

In 1996, HIV and AIDS dropped to the second-leading cause of death among Americans 25-44 years old, but remains the leading cause of death among blacks in the same age group.

Annual AIDS deaths among all groups have declined, but not significantly among blacks, officials said.

The Clinton administration, as part of the president's race initiative, has announced plans to reduce health disparities among minorities in six areas by 2010, including HIV and AIDS.

"We certainly agree with the Congressional Black Caucus that minority communities have been especially hard hit by the AIDS epidemic," said HHS spokeswoman Melissa Skolfield. "It's something that we consider to be urgent."

I want to thank you for your continued efforts on behalf of inmates with HIV/AIDS as well as for your cooperation with the Subcommittee on Prison Issues of the Presidential Advisory Council on AIDS.

This letter is to invite you to meet with our Committee at the next Council Meeting, June 15 -- 19, 1998. Ideally, we are looking at Sunday afternoon or Tuesday morning. We would value your input to our work regarding prisons issues as they relate to the Council.

Among the issues we would like to discuss with you are (1) Standards of Care for inmates with HIV/AIDS, Case Management - Release & Compassionate Release, (2) HIV Prevention Education, (3) Substance Abuse Treatment Programs, and (4) The viability of a federal pilot program in the availability of Protective

Barriers for inmates based upon existing models, and of course, (5) any other issues you would care to suggest we discuss during our time, together.

There have been differences of opinion on health care policy, between the Council and the Federal Bureau of Prisons. Obviously we are advocates of reform, and it is from this viewpoint which we feel we bring a new perspective to the dialogue which might not be available from within the Federal Bureau of Prisons. We therefore assume we are all on the same team -- wishing for the best possible prison environment for inmates and staff, alike.

We look forward to hearing from you, and to meeting with you in June. You should have already received copies of all our previous reports, however, we attach these for your convenience. If I may be of any further assistance, please do not hesitate to contact me, Todd Summers, Deputy Director, Office of National AIDS Policy, or Daniel Montoya, Deputy Director, Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS.

International conference set for November 15-18, 1998 in Mexico

CHICAGO ? With the advent of more effective antiviral drugs, and the promise these drugs pose to those few people with HIV/AIDS who can obtain them, there is a pressing need to re-examine healthcare delivery systems worldwide so that HIV disease and death do not continue to be as synonymous as they now are for so many people. The International Association of Physicians in AIDS Care (IAPAC) today announced plans for its Second International Conference on Healthcare Resource Allocation for HIV/AIDS and Other Life-Threatening Illnesses, which aims to examine the economic, ethical, and human rights issues that underlie healthcare resource allocation. The conference, chaired by The Most Rev. Desmond Tutu and prominent Mexican pediatrician Patricia Uribe Zuniga, is scheduled for November 15-18, 1998, in Cancun, Mexico.

Generalist versus Specialist: Who should care for people living with HIV and/or TB?

What are the ethical and human rights perspectives on needle exchange?

How do/should governments prioritize healthcare resources to the competing needs for healthcare, education, infrastructure, and economic development?

How should the US address the growing US AIDS Drug Assistance Program crisis?

What is the cost-benefit ratio of testing "less than perfect" vaccines versus waiting for "more perfect" vaccines?

What is the healthcare impact of the US embargo on Cuba?

Cost-benefit analysis: How do various AIDS drug therapies compare?

Among the featured presenters/panelists are Awa Coll-Seck, Director of Policy, Strategy & Research at the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS; South Africa's Hoosen Coovadia, Chairperson of the 12th International Conference on AIDS 2000; Uribe Zuniga, Coordinator of Mexico's Consejo Nacional para la Prevencion y Control del SIDA; Debrework Zewdie, Lead Specialist Population at the World Bank; Stephen Corber, Director of Disease Prevention and Control at the Pan American Health Organization; Richard Marlink, Executive Director of the Harvard AIDS Institute; and Lawrence Gostin, Co-Director of the Georgetown-Johns Hopkins Program on Law & Public Health.
