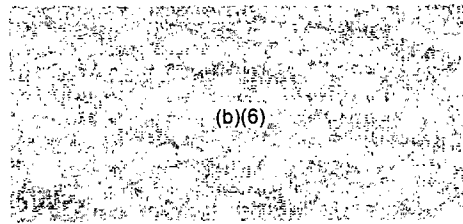

HIV/AIDS:

Action items for efforts focusing on orphans and other vulnerable children

*There is concern that recognizing the magnitude of the problem will be so overwhelming that those of us who can help will turn away in despair and hopelessness...
However, there is much that can be done NOW....*

- Identify and support the innovative and effective community-based approaches already implemented by families and communities affected by HIV/AIDS. Solutions have been developed, but these need to be strengthened and expanded to more adequately address the current and future needs of children, their families, and their communities.
- In areas where activities have not yet been developed, foster the initiation of community-based approaches to identify and care for its most vulnerable members, including children affected by HIV/AIDS and their families. Encourage the development of the capacity of communities to sustain these efforts as the impact of AIDS continues to take its toll.
- Some regions of the world are just beginning to experience the impact of a growing HIV/AIDS prevalence. In those areas, initiate community-based systems that will begin to recognize and address the growing needs of children and others as the impact of the disease increases.
- Build upon the capacity of children to support themselves. Enable children to stay in school and to learn vocational skills, improving their ability to provide for their own needs - now and in the future.
- Ensure the protection of the most vulnerable children who are neither cared for by family nor community. Essential services include those that include adoption and foster care mechanisms, protection of abused or neglected children, and address the needs of street children and other abandoned children.
- Promote increased understanding and commitment to meet the needs of vulnerable children. Activities should be directed to all children in need, reducing the potential for stigma and discrimination resulting from efforts that focus only on children whose parents died of AIDS or are living with HIV/AIDS.
- In all of these activities, foster an environment of respect and understanding for people infected and affected by the disease, while incorporating efforts to prevent continued transmission for the protection of those who are not yet infected and for the children of tomorrow.
- Support policy interventions that address the rights of women and children, ensure

their access to education and the ability to support themselves, and protect their earnings and investments through equitable property ownership and inheritance laws.

- The enormity of the problem and the scarcity of resources make it imperative to identify effective models of intervention by thorough evaluations and to disseminate the results so that those activities which are most effective can be reproduced in other areas.
- Given the magnitude of the problems created by HIV/AIDS, even relatively low-cost interventions will require significant resources to be implemented at scale. It is essential to increase collaboration among governments, donors, business, non-governmental and community organizations to address the enormous need.

Seriousness of the problem:

The impact of HIV/AIDS on children is both large scale and

long term. The number of orphans in the countries already

most affected by AIDS are not expected to peak until after the year 2030.

Related to impact on development

The impact of HIV/AIDS constitutes a disaster, but the advantage we have in responding is that this is a slow onset disaster. It is imperative that we use the time effectively and mitigate problems before they reach a critical mass and undermine development generally.

Besides the immediate affect of parental loss on children, HIV/AIDS impacts children, families and communities on many levels - including the social, economic, and demographic.

Ignoring the widespread impact of the epidemic would undermine the effectiveness of development activities throughout much of sub-Saharan Africa.

Similar to concept already presented in initial set of bullets:

Scaling-up -

To date, projects responding to the needs of orphans and other children made vulnerable by HIV/AIDS have been very

limited. Cost-effective, sustainable interventions must be scaled up to match the scale of the impacts that are occurring.

The families and communities most seriously affected by HIV/AIDS are the front line of response to the impacts of the pandemic. Action by governments, service providers, and others who respond to the impacts of HIV/AIDS will be effective to the extent that they strengthen the capacities of people on the front line to cope.

>#2 AIDS ACTION: PANEL OF EXPERTS GRADE GOVERNMENT EFFORTS

> AIDS Action today released "The 1998 Until It's Over Report

>Card," assigning grades to the federal government's response to

>the AIDS epidemic in various categories. The government was

>graded in four areas -- research, care and treatment, prevention

>and education, and international -- by a panel of AIDS

>researchers, advocates and other experts including former U.S.

>Surgeon General Joycelyn Elders; AIDS advocate Mary Fisher, who

>is HIV-positive; former Wisconsin Congressman Steve Gunderson

>(R); Black Entertainment Television host Tavis Smiley; Ryan White
>Foundation Founder and President Jeanne White; former Miss
>America and AIDS activist Kate Schindle; AIDS Action Executive
>Director Daniel Zingale and University of California-Los Angeles
>Chancellor Emeritus Charles Young. Research efforts received an
>"A-," while care and treatment received a "B," prevention and
>education a "D," and international efforts an "F." Summing up
>the panel's findings, Zingale said, "Twenty years into the
>epidemic, America's record on AIDS remains uneven. As America
>reaps the rewards of our investments in research and care, we're
>witnessing skyrocketing infection rates and an AIDS holocaust in
>Africa because of our failure to address prevention and
>international efforts" (release, 12/1).

> NOT A PASS-FAIL OPTION

> In an interview with the Daily Report, Zingale elaborated on
>the grades.

> o Research: "To acknowledge the incredible breakthroughs in
> treatment which could not have happened without the federal
> government's investment in AIDS research and basic medical
> research. Congress just approved and the president just
> signed significant new increases in medical research in the
> appropriations bill that was just completed this fall." But
> the minus is there for a reason: "The minus was important
> as a signal of how far we still have to go, lest anyone
> think that the remarkable breakthroughs have taken us the
> distance, which they have not. The minus is really there as
> a guard against complacency and to acknowledge that most

- > members of the panel and one in particular that things could
- > be done better."
- > o Care & Treatment: "There were significant increases for the
- > Ryan White AIDS Care Act, which is the federal government's
- > most important program designed for people with HIV/AIDS.
- > So we're acknowledging the success of that program and the
- > continued investment in that program. What kept the
- > government from getting an A on access to care is the fact
- > that Medicaid still requires people with HIV to develop AIDS
- > before they get access to AIDS preventing drugs."
- > o Prevention & Education: "The flip side of the investment in
- > research is that there have been no new initiatives and no
- > significant new investments in HIV prevention and as a
- > consequence there's no equivalent of the encouraging results
- > we see on the research side. On the contrary you have two
- > young Americans contracting HIV every hour. We hope that
- > this will be a signal that all elements of the federal
- > government need to do a better job of making prevention a
- > priority. Look to the budget numbers and you'll see major
- > increases for research and care, even housing, and more
- > meager ones for prevention. And even those small increases
- > for prevention were very hard fought. There just isn't the
- > same kind of enthusiasm among federal decision makers right

- > o International: "You cannot conquer AIDS without addressing
- > it globally. It's like trying to address a global
- > environmental pollution issue by fighting only within the

> borders of the U.S. It just doesn't work and the U.S. has

> been virtually absent from any real effort to combat AIDS in

> the developing world. So we hope that this F will be a

> signal to the U.S. government to step up to the plate and

> address AIDS globally."

> DISSENTING VOICE

> While the panel collectively decided on the grades, Mary

>Fisher strongly disagreed with the grade awarded for research

>because of the dearth of research on women with HIV/AIDS. "We

>have to encourage more research because there is no research for

>women," she said in an interview with the Daily Report. "We must

>get to the doctors in this country to be more aware of what this

>disease means for women, what the symptoms are for women --

>because they're different than for men." Fisher emphasized that

>raising awareness among the medical community is key because

>"it's the doctors women see first and the doctors need to be

>aware of what it means for a woman facing this disease." She

>explained, "Right now women feel the same way men did in the

>early 80s. They feel the stigma, they feel the discrimination.

>Women are afraid of losing their jobs and some are afraid of

>losing their children, which has happened. They're afraid of

>losing insurance or housing, they may have lost their husbands

>already and we have to encourage these women to get treatment for

>themselves as well as their children. So we have to pay

>attention and not think that this disease is over and look at

>where the disease is going -- communities of color, communities

>of poverty, adolescents and women -- and that means families. We

>need to pay attention to where the disease has traveled and to
>recognize that women are silent because of their fears of the
>stigma, but they exist in greater numbers than any of us could
>imagine" (Paulson, Daily Report, 12/1).

Hi Sandy, Todd, and Daniel -

I just read through the minutes from last Friday's
meeting between PACHA and President Clinton,
and also the press release from December 18.

First, good for you in helping to arrange this
meeting and in making sure that AIDS remains
on the White House radar screen. I am glad
that we have a President who supports AIDS
research and AIDS services as much as Clinton
does. This is important.

BUT let me provide three comments directly back to
you in the interest of voicing my immediate concerns:

1)** If the \$200 million in funding on HIV vaccine research
at the NIH is real, that's a wonderful thing. But you
guys should get the hard numbers from the OAR on

that as you use that number publicly. As far as I know, no one at the OAR or at the NIH can definitely show us now where that \$200 million for HIV vaccines is going in FY99. If you can get the institute-by-institute budgets for this \$200 million, let me know and I'll shut up. I'm concerned that this will be like that microbicide funding promise by Shalala that turned out to be fiction.

2) ** If the \$200 million on HIV vaccines is a real number, then it's technically a 31% increase at the NIH, since FY98 was \$153 million. The White House statement of a "33%" increase is close enough, I suppose, but also I noticed that the 33% increase was used three times without the qualifier "at the NIH". The increase in the overall U.S. budget and U.S. effort for HIV vaccine research should also incorporate the CDC and the DoD WRAIR program, and if you include the \$15 million cut in the WRAIR AIDS research budget, there really wasn't an overall 33% increase for HIV vaccine research effort.

3) ** We support Helen Miramontes' call for additional work to support an international effort and private industry involvement. It would be great if the President could get behind efforts to address declining funds from European governments, Canada and Japan, and at large pharma companies.

This isn't meant to be sniping, just constructive feedback
on the details of your messages on what is overall a comparatively
and increasingly robust effort toward preventive HIV vaccines.
You guys have a good role to play in all of this, and from
our perspective, we appreciate the work that you're doing.

Q: What bearing does today's MMWR article have on the guidance CDC has published on HIV surveillance? Is CDC attempting to use this study to support their recommendation that states use a names-based reporting system, and was it timed to come out during the 30-day comment period on that guidance?

A: This article is part of the research CDC and others have carried out which examines attitudes toward HIV testing, and barriers that prevent or delay early testing. It's important that we look at all data available, and those commenting on the guidance will be able to include their views on this article in their comments.

While CDC's December 10th guidance recommended names-based reporting as the system most likely to provide the best information on HIV infection for public health purposes, CDC understands that the privacy concerns expressed

by many advocacy groups and individuals are real, and we take them very seriously. That is why the guidelines make it clear that CDC will work with each state to put in place a surveillance and reporting system that best meets the needs of that state -- whether it is name-based, or uses a code or "unique identifier." Nothing in today's article affects that position. Additionally, the guidance published December 10th stresses CDC's strong position that every state should provide anonymous testing, and today's MMWR article underlines the need for such testing.

Q: Some would say the data in this study suggest that names-based reporting can be a deterrent to testing among certain high-risk groups. How does that square with CDC's guidance, and the department's attempts to encourage HIV testing and new surveillance?

A: As we said when the guidance was released, the changing face of the epidemic makes it critical that we gather good information about HIV infection rates, so that we can best target resources to fight the disease. CDC will work closely with states to ensure that no matter what form of surveillance a state undertakes, the information gathered will be subject to the strictest confidentiality and privacy standards. We will also monitor the effects of changes in HIV surveillance in the states to see whether there is any adverse effect on testing. CDC will work with public health professionals and advocates at the local, state and national level to make sure that every step is taken to ensure the security and confidentiality of surveillance data -- and to make sure the message goes out to communities at risk that their privacy will be protected.
