Dear Mr. President,

It is with great pleasure that I am writing to you after I was given the opportunity to meet and talk with you in Washington. I am strongly impressed and inspired by your message of support and encouragement to my country and to the Albanians.

I would like to specially thank you for your personal continuous endeavors and the leading U.S. role in achieving a just and peaceful solution for the Albanians in Kosova. Being confident that these efforts would produce positive results and bring peace and prosperity to the region, I would like to reassure you, Mr. President, that Albania will continue to play a constructive and stabilizing role to this end.

I am happy to confirm once more the crucial importance my Government and the Albanian people attach to our relations. For many decades the United States have been strong supporters of Albania's independence and freedom. This fact is strongly impressed in the historical memory of the Albanians, who see in your country the great friend and the powerful ally on their road to consolidating democracy. I am convinced that the Government I chair, the political parties, and the entire Albanian people will translate the American support into new positive and fruitful efforts towards progress, prosperity and a healthier atmosphere in the country.

During my visit to the United States, I encountered the same backing and sentiments in the meetings and discussions with the Secretary of State Madeleine Albright, the Secretary of Defense William Cohen, the Attorney General Janet Reno, the Secretary of Commerce William Daley and many other senior government officials, as well as in the Capitol Hill. This exchange of opinions, to be followed surely by other such opportunities at all levels, will help to further strengthen our ties, and benefit the Albanian people.

As a young leader of an ancient nation that has suffered so much in the past and modern history, together with my people I am prepared and resolute to meet any difficulty on the way to genuine democracy. Albanians have embarked on this road after long years of totalitarianism, isolation, and a ruthless dictatorship. They have made their choice once and for all, aware of the support of Western democracies, where the United States of America occupy the place of prominence.

In concluding, I would like to extend you an invitation to visit Albania, convinced that I share the same wish and sentiments with the Albanian people, who would immensely desire to welcome the President of the United States in their soil. That would be a remarkable day for all Albanians.

Allow me Mr. President, to convey to you and through you, to the entire American people, the best wishes for progress, prosperity and peace.
