I would like to let you know that the United States Institute of Peace has named me as the Director of its Balkans Initiative. Your advice and counsel on how our efforts can best be directed in seeking peace in the Balkans would be much appreciated.

The Institute, which is Federally funded, promotes international conflict prevention and resolution. The Balkans Initiative includes grants, fellowships, training, education and media support, as well as policy discussions in our Balkans Working Group, occasional conferences and issue-oriented task forces, and public appearances by major political figures. These have included in the past year President Clinton, Secretary of State Albright and many Balkan Presidents, Prime Ministers and Foreign Ministers.

The Institute began its work in the Balkans focussed on Bosnia and Herzegovina, in particular Dayton implementation. We have been seeking a more regional focus, one that incorporates Kosovo peace implementation as well as conflict prevention in other parts of the region. We are also seeking to contribute to peace operations, without abandoning the more analytical work for which the Institute is well known.
