Dear President Clinton,

I would like to thank you for your letter and for the wonderful hospitality which you accorded my wife and I as well as the entire Hungarian delegation in Washington. I also wish to commend you on the impressive organization of such a large-scale event, one with such outstanding historical significance.

I share your view that the discussions at the summit, as well as the Washington Declaration and the other documents we approved, confirmed the vitality of the Alliance and helped to strengthen its cohesion. This demonstration of strength and resolve contributed decisively to the success of NATO in bringing an end to the bloodshed and ethnic cleansing in Kosovo. While further, more comprehensive efforts will be needed to bring about a lasting settlement of the conflict and to promote genuine stability in the entire region of Southeastern Europe, we can say that the Kosovo operation has opened up a new chapter in the history of the Alliance in addition to that of post-World War II history.

I would also like to reaffirm my country's staunch and unwavering commitment to the efforts of the Alliance and the international community to develop and enhance security and stability not only in Southeastern Europe, but in the Euro-Atlantic region as a whole.

Please allow me to thank you once again for your support, and I look forward to continuing cooperation between Hungary and the United States both within the Alliance as well as within other frameworks.

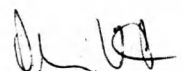

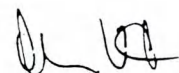
