Dear Bob:

Thank you for your letter of June 3, recommending that the assets be seized and visas revoked of individuals who have acted to sustain the de facto regime in Haiti.

As you are aware, on June 4, I announced that such actions were being taken, effective immediately. In addition, to ensure that the de facto authorities understand our seriousness, we took the initiative to obtain United Nations Security Council approval of mandatory sanctions on Haiti July 16. These sanctions will take effect June 23 unless the de facto regime is by then engaged in a serious negotiating process aimed at restoring democracy and President Aristide.

By imposing an embargo on oil and arms to Haiti and by freezing the assets of its government and de facto authorities, the international community is placing critical pressure on the internal parties to take the steps needed to restore constitutional government to Haiti and to bring about President Aristide's return. We will be working actively with the international community to see that these sanctions are fully implemented and that our goals in Haiti are achieved.

I share your hope that these measures will help achieve quickly the democratic outcome in Haiti to which we all are committed. I appreciate your continuing support for our Haitian policy.

To inform Congressman Torricelli that you ordered the imposition of certain sanctions on Haiti which he had recommended and that the United Nations, at our urging, imposed further sanctions June 16 and to encourage his continued support for the Administration's Haiti policy.

Background

On June 3, Congressman Torricelli wrote to you to recommend that you order the assets frozen and visas revoked of individuals associated with the de facto regime in Haiti. You announced the imposition of such sanctions June 4.
