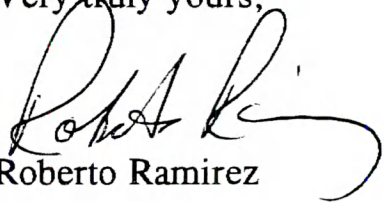
Dear Mr. Ickes:

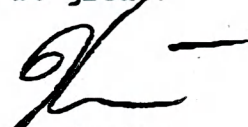

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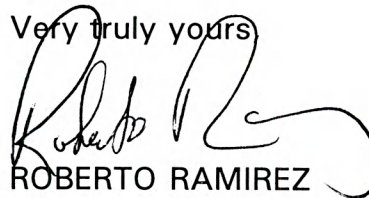

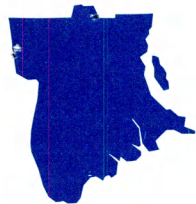

Does this make sense from an Hispanic point of view? Will it be seen as something supportive of Hispanics or merely seen as another Democratic party event?



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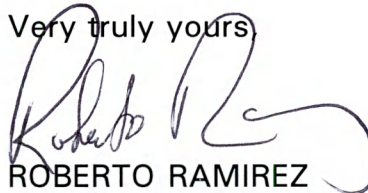
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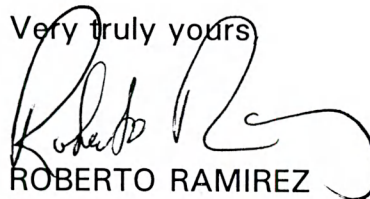
