In that regard, the eight members of the Human Services Committee will be in town specifically to meet with the following departments and officials:

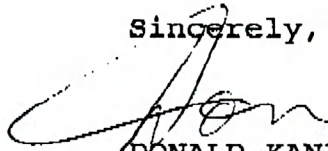
