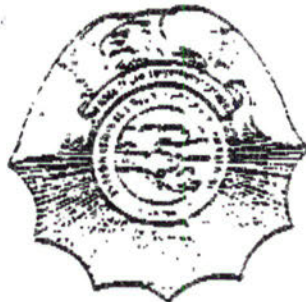

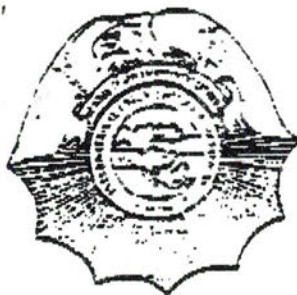

(NAME OF THE SPOKESPERSON FOR YOUR LOCAL) reacted to the President's State of the Union Address. "We are seeing evidence of serious progress in terms of improving public safety. The crime rate is continuing to drop with murders down, 12% robberies down 10% and car theft down 5%."

The reduction in the murder rate is the greatest single drop in thirty five (35) years. According to (NAME OF SPOKESPERSON) much of that reduction was attributed to the fact that the effects of the crime bill are beginning to take hold. Almost half of the promised 100,000 new police officers are on the streets and more coming every day. These additions are not just limited to the larger urban areas, but include many small town and rural departments. In addition, "three strikes and you're out" provisions are now in effect, \$7.9 billion dollars have been earmarked for 100,000 more prison cells for violent offenders, and \$26 million in state grants are becoming available to bolster states' law enforcement, prosecution and victims services to protect women from violent crime.

According to the President, the U.S. is experiencing the lowest combined rate of unemployment and inflation since 1968. (NAME OF SPOKESMAN) attributed improvement in crime rates to an improved economy saying, "With (YEARS ON THE JOB), I am convinced that hard economic times increase criminal activity. If our economy, both nationally and locally can continue to improve, it will reduce some of the pressure on individuals who commit crimes out of desperation or frustration. The President stated that in the last three years 7.7 million new jobs have been created and 700,000 new construction jobs have been created to replace the 800,000 lost during the prior administration.

Education was also considered a factor in improving the overall crime situation. Government figures indicated that an increased number of students were completing high school and attending college. (NAME OF SPOKESPERSON) reacted by saying, "In terms of long range reduction in crime, the better educated our young people become, the more marketable skills they will develop. With those skills, they can get better jobs and be far less tempted by possible criminal activity."

(NAME OF SPOKESPERSON) concluded his analysis of the President's remarks saying, "We think that the Clinton White House has made measurable progress in providing law enforcement with more tools that we can use to better serve and protect the public."

SUBJECT: STATE OF THE UNION ADDRESS

A week from today, Tuesday, January 23, the President will be giving his State of the Union Address. In preparation for the speech, a surrogate working group is in place and I am representing OPL at the working group meetings.

The tone of this year's speech will be one of confidence and realistic optimism (what Americans have done and what we need to do) to convey a sense of "America can do." The President will challenge citizens to take mutual responsibility in five areas: (1) foreign policy---continuing as a world leader by embracing a foreign policy that moves toward peace; (2) jobs---making work pay; (3) education---keeping the dream alive for a better future for our children; (4) Safety---pointing out the sense of safety that has and must continue to be created; and (5) Values---delineating the role and importance of community. That is the working outline of what the speech may touch on (the budget will also be included). In many aspects will be a common ground-type speech. Remember the context of this year's speech is the election and the ongoing budget negotiations.

The rollout plan is to let our groups know the general message and to generate post-speech positive responses. Therefore, Marilyn Yager and I would like to set up briefings with the DC reps of your organizations and conference calls with group reps in specific states. This year, our emphasis is on the state contacts.

To assist you in talking to your groups, by tomorrow at noon, I will have an information packet that will include: (1) state of the union talking points; (2) state specific Administration accomplishments; (3) general accomplishments by issues; and (4) possibly a good sample Presidential speech (for constituents to use if necessary).

What I need from each of you by 2:00 pm TODAY are the following:

1. Key organization leaders (DC reps, etc.) for a briefing

possibly tomorrow.

2. A list of state-by-state organization contacts for the conference calls.

I will put in your boxes a list of the key states. We will discuss all of this in our meeting today at 11:00 am.
