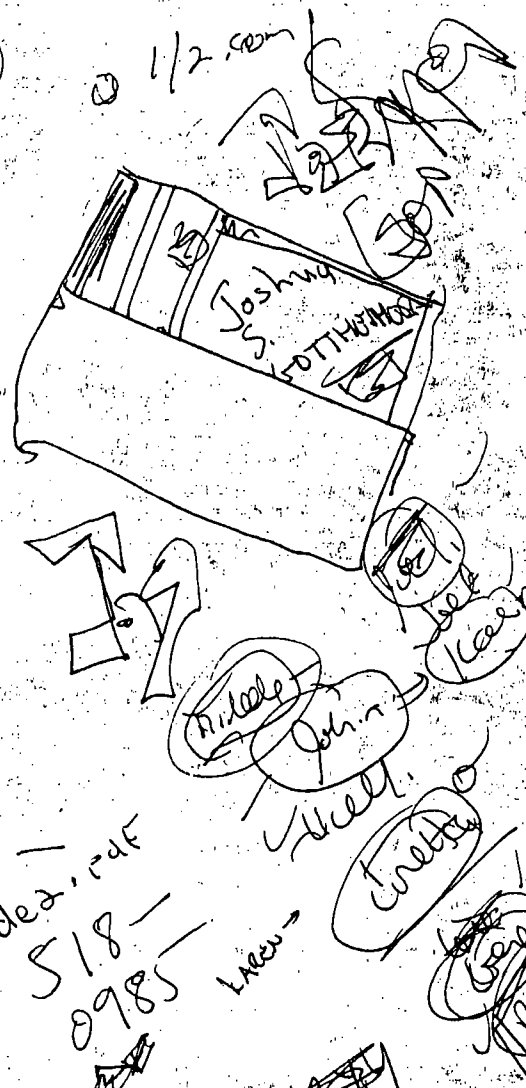
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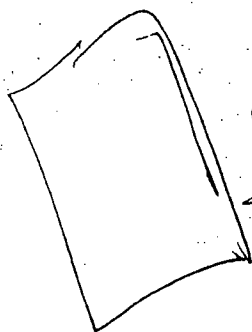

Many fishing communities are suffering unexpected losses that severely threaten their livelihoods. In the Long Island Sound, the lobster catch has fallen sharply. On the west coast, there has been a serious decline in groundfish stocks. I am calling on Congress to provide \$56 million to help communities recover from recent fishing disasters and to study ways we can restore the long-term health of our vital fishing industry.

Today, I am signing a bipartisan bill that can help save lives by giving people access to vital information about poison control. This legislation authorizes funding for our nation's poison control centers. It also establishes a national toll-free telephone poison control hotline that anyone can call, any time, for immediate information if there's an accident in your home.

- **Amtrak:** The President will tape an actuality to be released with the Amtrak Photo on Sunday, February 27. He will announce that his FY2001 Budget will increase Amtrak funding by more than \$400 million -- an increase of more than 70 percent, which follows on this Administration's steadfast support of Amtrak. This funding will help Amtrak increase its efficiency and expand its service, including beginning the nation's first high-speed rail service later this year in the North East.
- **Poison Control Centers:** The President will tape an actuality to be released today to amplify his signing into law a bipartisan bill that can help save lives by giving people access to vital information about poison control. This legislation authorizes funding for the nation's poison control centers and establishes a national toll-free telephone poison control hotline that people can call for immediate information if there's an accident in their home.
- **Fish:** The President will tape an actuality for release today to announce his request to Congress for \$83 million of supplemental FY2000 funds to provide economic assistance to fishing communities struggling to recover from recent fishing disasters and fund new research to help restore the affected fishing industries. Fishing communities on the east and west coasts have suffered unexpected losses that have severely damaged their livelihoods. In the Long Island Sound, the lobster catch has fallen sharply. In California, Oregon and Washington, the fishing industry struggles to cope with a serious decline in the stock of groundfish.
- **Hurricane Floyd:** The President will tape an actuality to be released today. He will ask Congress for an additional \$347 million of supplemental FY2000 funds this year to help farmers with crop damage and to provide economic development and housing assistance to the affected victims of Hurricane Floyd, which caused terrible damage last fall. This will bring the total of federal funding available to nearly \$3 billion for Hurricane Floyd disaster relief.
