What was your impression when meeting Bob Hope for the first time?

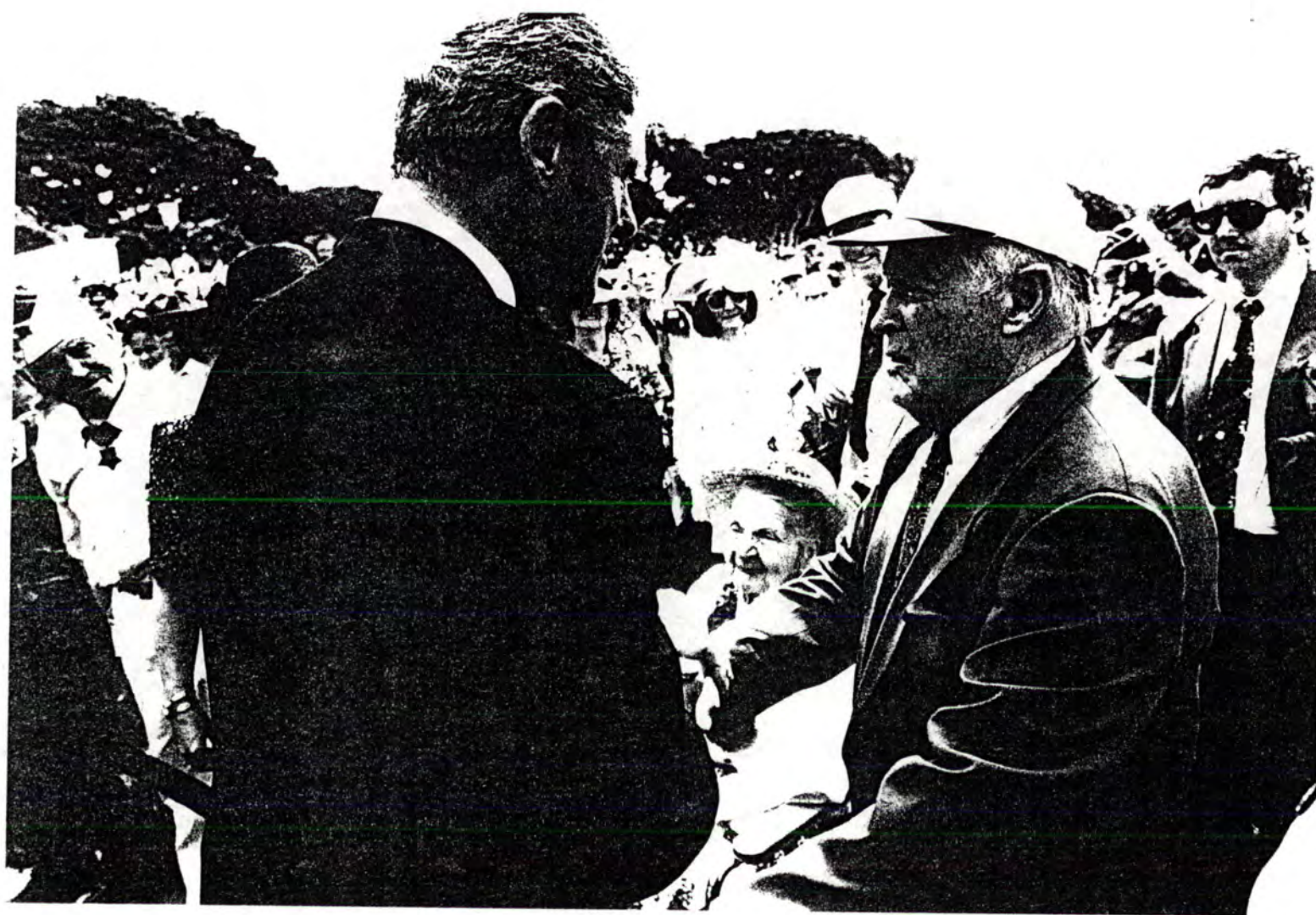
How do you feel when Bob Hope takes what you and the President do -- and continually makes jokes of it?

What was the funniest thing that ever happened when you were with Bob Hope?

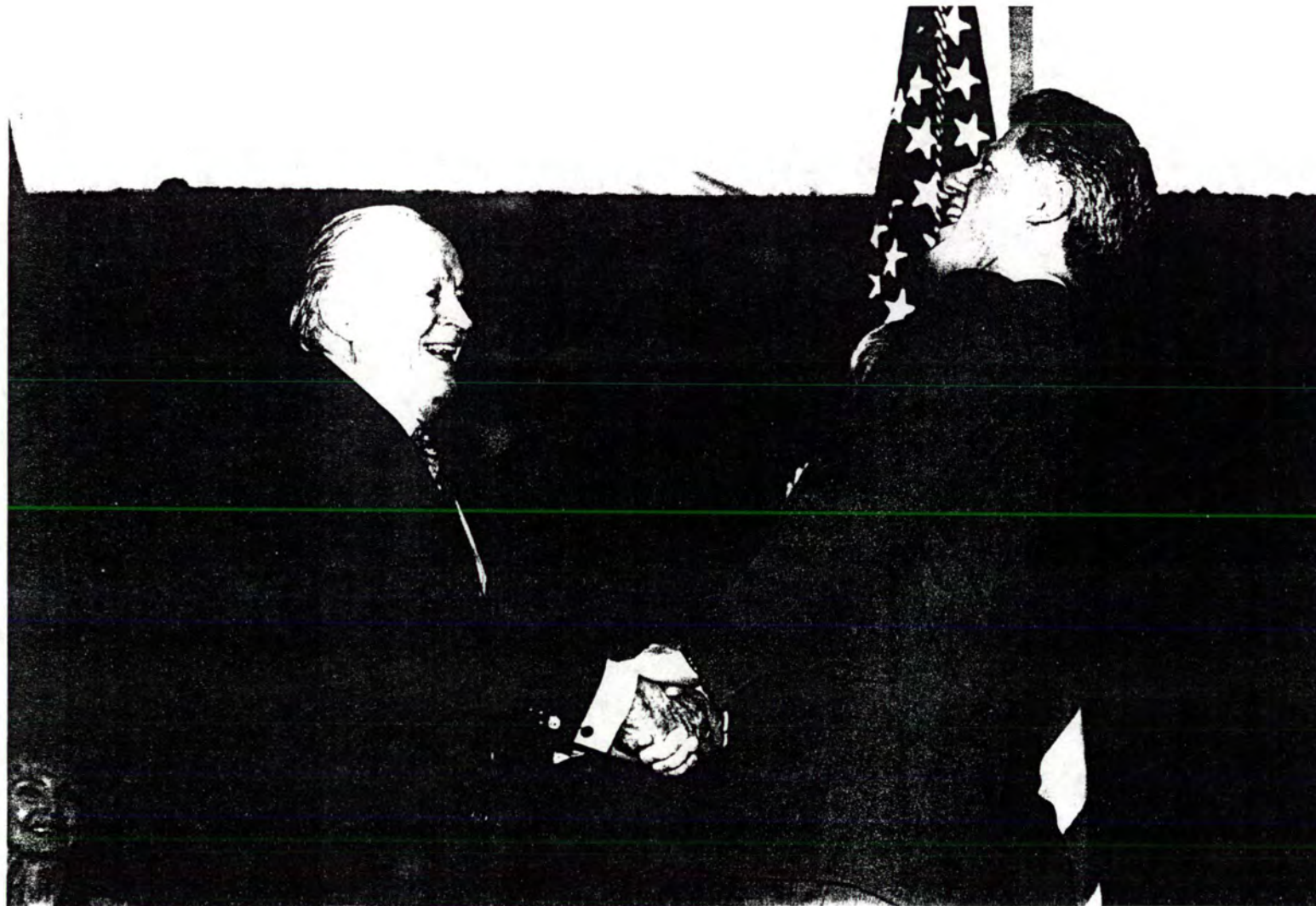
